Living the dream at 19

The new owner of Lewisburg Livestock Market is Thomas “Jackson” Bailey Jr. And it’s a dream come true for someone like him who has spent his entire life growing up on and around farms, stockyards, and auctions.

Owning and operating stockyards is in his blood. Family members before him have bought, sold, and auctioned at the very same stockyard that he is now the owner of.

Growing up, when people asked him, “What are you going to be when you grow up?” The answer was simple: “What I’m already doing.”

“It’s just something he loves. He has the passion for it,” said

his mom, Christi Bailey.

When he was 12 years old, Jackson started buying, selling, and trading chickens. When he was 14, he sold goats.

Then, at 16 years old, when he could drive and “wheel and deal” on his own, Jackson told his family he would own a stockyard before he was 40.

But when Jackson graduated from Community High School, and went on to attend the Nashville Auctioneering School in Tulsa, he moved that goal of owning a stockyard down to 30.

After graduating auctioneering school, Jackson became a 3rd generation auctioneer. Not only following in his father’s footsteps, Jackson is also following in his grandfather’s footsteps — Tommy Bailey, who was an auctioneer for 50 years.

But he wanted to take it a step further.

New coalition addresses mental health, addiction

Last Thursday, the Lewisburg Recreation Center hosted the Marshall County Prevention Coalition, a conglomeration of resources and education to spread awareness of and take a stand amidst the suicide epidemic, mental health, and addiction issues. Leading the effort was Liz Bensinger, who started the coalition with two friends, Ansley Hulshof and Tara Tucker.

“The community is in bad shape,” said Bensinger when asked about the reason for the meeting, which was a combination of education with speakers from the community and an opportunity for mental health organizations to come and introduce themselves to those in the area.

People were welcome to receive information from a variety of booths and seek out resources available to them. For Bensinger, starting the coalition was both a professional and a personal investment. In her introduction to the public speaking part of the event, she told the story of how her thirty-year-old daughter died of an overdose in 2020 after years of battling addiction. Her inspiration to improve the community flourished from there into a much larger effort to tackle the way in which mental health is dis-

Chapel Hill faces brief agenda

Chapel Hill aldermen dealt with a brief agenda on Monday evening.

Aldermen signed off on an issuance of bonds through the city of Dickson, enabling the

purchase and renovation of 13 rural apartment developments through middle Tennessee by BTT Development, including one in Chapel Hill.

The resolution does not obligate the town financially for any of the projects.

The developer told the board

that it would be the end of the year before final approvals from the state would allow work to begin.

Aldermen were briefed on the results of the audit completed for the last fiscal year.

Local educators address House Education Instruction Subcommittee

A group of Marshall County educators recently spoke to the Tennessee House Education Instruction Subcommittee regarding a variety of concerns in education. At two occasions in the fall, State Representative Todd Warner and Senator Scott Cepicky traveled to Marshall County to listen to teachers’ concerns. The legislators emphasized the need for teachers to testify to the entire Education Instruction Subcommittee in order for their voices to be heard. A county wide email notified the teachers throughout the county about the opportunity to speak, and a group of six agreed to present pressing issues that they felt needed to be addressed. Chairman Cepicky welcomed the teachers before the session began and informed them they had made history for Tennessee. Never before have Tennessee teachers testified on Capitol Hill on behalf of students.

Nikki Randolph, Marshall Elementary School assistant principal, opened the presentation by painting a picture of a student who came to Marshall Elementary School with insurmountable odds and did not qualify for any learning modifications. Mrs. Randolph explained that her little buddy “G” had moved incredible mountains socially, emotionally,

For this young man, his dream of owning a stockyard came true at just 19-years old.

He officially took control of Lewisburg Livestock Market, located at 1930 Finley Beech Road in Lewisburg, on Feb. 1.

In the short time he's owned the stockyard, Jackson has made several small improvements — such as expanding the parking lot, redoing the auction ring, as well as fresh paint and fencing.

Plus, "He drives about 6,000 miles a month buying and selling and

trading livestock," said Christi.

But he has big plans for Lewisburg Livestock Market and intends on continuing to give back to the local community by drawing more people to the area who travel in for sale day and promote other local business.

Of course, it's all in the family, who help when and where they can. Jackson's grandparents, parents, aunts, and siblings have all pitched in to help renovate, upgrade, and support Jackson both mentally and physically to make his dream come true, according to Christi.

She said he and the whole family looks forward to meeting each and every buyer and seller that comes through the stockyard, and that they will continue to appreciate all the local support as Jackson takes on this journey at such a young age.

For the market, "every Saturday is sale day."

When the family had their first sale on their first Saturday sale day, Christi said it was standing-room only. At 11:30 a.m. they sell farm equipment. By 1 p.m. they start selling cows, goats, sheep, horses, mules, donkeys, imus, llamas. Af-

ter livestock, they sell chickens, ducks, geese, turkeys, and even farm fresh eggs. For more information, visit their Facebook page, Lewisburg Livestock Market, or email lewisburglivestockmarket@yahoo.com. Sellers can send in pictures of what animals they want to bring in. Livestock gets taken in as early as 5 a.m. on Saturday.

Christi said she looks forward to the whole family working together to make the market bigger and better—and, of course, for Jackson to live his dream.

"His pop in heaven would be really proud of him," said Christi.

and educationally, but he would still be retained under the Third Grade Retention Law that has come against severe resistance from educators across the state. Mrs. Randolph pleaded for legislators to realize "teachers and our local districts know what's best for our students. Please don't take that away from us."

Sherrie Campbell, Cornersville High School secondary math instructor, explained to the legislators that all students are required to move at the same pace and master the same number of standards as the college-bound students. Because these unreasonable expectations leave no time for practice and mastery, many students "just shut down because of the continual feeling of defeat." Mrs. Campbell went on to say that deflated students often become apathic about their learning and their future, which has a strong impact on their work ethic as they enter the workforce.

Jan Salsman, Cornersville Elementary School 3rd grade math

teacher, presented specific standards that were not age appropriate yet were listed on the standards to be taught and tested. She also shared many teachers' opinion of "we are trying to do too much too soon" and reiterated that as students grew, their development would come. Mrs. Salsman left the representatives with her closing comment "I was taught the foundations of education at an appropriate pace. I think you and I turned out okay. Our students can as well."

Lorrie Clark, Forrest School Special Education instructor, spoke on the drastic increase of standards that are expected to be taught, and she shared the sentiment of many educators that "instead of quality, we are teaching quantity." Ms. Clark ended her comments with an open invitation for the legislators to spend a day with a teacher to see firsthand the challenges teachers and students are facing.

Cornersville Elementary School Counselor Rebecca McKay expressed to the state legislators that every day, she sees students who can't express their emotions and needs. She explained that with growing expectations and academic pressure, and now new impending retention, there is no time to address these needs that are needed more now than ever. Mrs. McKay explained that the pressure to pass a state test has overshadowed the ability to develop a classroom culture of trust and understanding, stating that, "a single test should not be the end all be all for our students. We as legislator and educators have to get back to the basics. We are doing students a disservice."

Vicky Carlton, Cornersville High School business technology instructor, wrapped up the presentation by communicating the need for a tech pathway to graduation, in which upper level academic courses would be substituted with classes that prepared students going to technical schools or entry-level jobs with real-world skills. Mrs. Carlton reminded legislators that only 53% of Tennessee graduates go to college. Six years after graduation of those 53% less than 60% have attained their bachelor's degrees, and less than 40% have received their associate's

degrees. However, 80-85% of TCAT students complete their technical programs. Mrs. Carlton shared the sentiment of many non-college-bound students feeling like a "square peg forced down the same round hole as their college-bound classmates" and offering a tech path would boost student morale and also provide for a stronger workforce.

The Marshall County educators expressed their gratitude for the opportunity to speak on behalf of their students and the desire to continue interchange between educators and legislators. The teachers ended their presentation by proposing legislators consider implementing an Education Task Force "made up of educators who understand the challenges students are currently facing, and who would bridge the gap and offer concrete suggestions as we move forward in a team-based approach to a positive learning environment that results in academic achievements from healthy, well-balanced classroom expectations."

cussed and approached in the day-to-day.

"If we can save one family from the heartache that I've experienced, then we've won," said Bensinger.

In addition to Bensinger speaking on the importance of the new coalition, Lewisburg officers spoke on the current state of drugs in the lives of children and teenagers in the community. According to Captain Lonnie Cook, "it's been a rough six weeks" speaking on the five overdoses that they've responded to in just the past month and a half of the new year.

Detective Ramirez, who specializes in investigating and responding to drug cases in the area said, "When people ask me if Lewisburg has a drug problem... yeah, without a doubt. The United States has a drug problem. Right now, we're just putting a band aid on a huge wound out there."

Ramirez spoke on the prevalence of drugs in the lives of young people, stressing the concern surrounding the latest gateway drug: vapes. Previously touted and marketed as a safer option, vapes have become a source of addiction for even young children, often targeting them specifically to hook them young. According to Ramirez, the youngest person to have used a vape in the area was only nine-years-old.

Among others, one of the organizations attending the event was TN Teen Talks Truth, a club at the local high school, led by high school seniors that were putting their best foot

forward in improving the stigmas around mental health.

"There are so many prevalent issues. There's a need for this," said club member Sam Johnson, who was also joined by Seth Grant, Kendall Adams, and Hailey Bishop.

The club provides mental health resources for teenagers at all times of the year, giving them outlets for both mental and physical health, each month addressing a different issue in the mental health sphere.

According to members, the club originated as one to combat tobacco use, but evolved with the growing needs of teenagers and the challenges that they continue to face in the modern world.

"No one talks about mental health, toxic relationships. I think teenagers are more overlooked," said Adams.

The event was not simply one for small organizations though, hosting companies as large as the TN Department of Health, Homeland Security Investigations, and Centerstone. It provided attendees with resources that spanned from prenatal health and family planning to suicide prevention to sexual assault counseling and haven services. Though there are no current plans for future meetings of this size, Bensinger, as well as the rest of the coalition hopes that it served as a good first step in the right direction, showing Marshall and Lincoln county that there is room for change and those willing to make it.

Generally positive, the audit returned two findings, compared to nine the previous year.

The net position of the water and sewer fund had seen a strong increase, but the auditor

cautioned the board to pay attention to the overall general fund balance moving forward, citing a \$350,000 decrease during the 2022 fiscal year. The decrease was attributed to capital projects, specifically a new fire engine, but as the town grows, capital needs will also increase.

Aldermen approved the purchase of new camera equipment for a police vehicle. Police Chief Andrew Kon noted that roughly \$4,000 of the \$7,000 cost would be offset by a state safety grant.

Town Administrator Danny Bingham told that board that discussions were still ongoing

with CSX and the Tennessee Department of Transportation, seeking improved safety at road crossings of the rail line running through town. An accident last year that claimed the lives of three Nashville siblings as they were crossing the tracks has brought the issue to the forefront of discussion.

Journalism: can't live with it, can't live without it

I was saddened to hear of the death of Dr. Glenn Himebaugh, co-founder of the journalism department at my alma mater, Middle Tennessee State University.

Although I hadn't kept in touch with Dr. Himebaugh since graduation 40 years ago, I have to wonder what he thought of the current reality and public perception of the journalism field.

Sadly, trust in journalism has been underwater in surveys for at least two decades.

Whether you attribute it to bias, hubris or groupthink, newspeople (reporters, editors, publishers and broadcasters) – especially on the national level -- suffer innumerable self-inflicted wounds.

Retractions receive perhaps one-tenth the prominence of the original error.

Stealth-editing of archived articles is the antithesis of accountability.

Sensationalized headlines prey upon readers who don't have the time to trudge their way to the more nuanced information buried in the 13th paragraph.

Some reporters can't get through a press conference without the all-purpose "Some people are saying..." ploy.

"Bombshell" after "bombshell" after "bombshell" fizzles out, revealing more about the wishful thinking of the reporter than the people or institutions they're covering.

One public figure gets asked, "Who do you like in the World Series?" Another gets asked, "When did you stop beating your wife?"

"Ready, shoot, aim" seems to be the default reaction in the dreaded "24/7 news cycle."

Words are tweaked for the most manipulative connotation. Favored people "state" things. The wrong people "claim" things.

Race and political affiliation get mentioned only when it serves some agenda (*ahem* Higher Purpose).

The media jealously guard the secret blend of herbs and spices that determines how one gets to be an "expert," what constitutes a "person close to the situation," how the valued whistleblowers are separated from the disgruntled cranks, what

distinguishes an "independent fact-checker," what defines an "extremist," when a sensitive topic gets cushioned with "context" and when it's left to twist in the wind, etcetera. "Trust me" requires some minimal basis for trust.

Don't get me started on those three exasperating words: "nothing has surfaced." Nothing has surfaced??? Bulletin: it's not the job of journalists to wait for things to surface!

(I picture an underworld informant going missing for three weeks, his apartment left in shambles and the police refusing to investigate it as foul play until the corpse dislodges from the cement overshoes and bobs to the surface.)

Get off your butts, do some digging, show us your expense report for shoe leather. If you ask the fox guarding the henhouse, "Did you do anything incompetent or corrupt?" and they swear they didn't, don't grin and assert that you've done your due diligence.

Remember the film "The Man Who Shot Liberty Valance"? Too many journalists have adopted the iconic line "When the legend becomes fact, print the legend." No, facts are facts. Legends may become more embellished or more useful for steering the public, but they do not grow more rooted in objective reality with the passage of time. Stuff happens because stuff happens, not because it's needed for some grand, noble narrative.

I'm confident that Dr. Himebaugh and his colleagues trained many journalists who have upheld high standards of accuracy, fairness, honesty and public service.

If there are such dedicated newspeople in your community, don't hesitate to thank them.

But let's all seize every opportunity to shame the bullies who give the journalism profession a black eye.

“Behold the fowls of the air: for they sow not, neither do they reap, nor gather into barns; yet your Heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much better than they?” - Matthew 6:26

When my wife and I moved into our new home, one day we opened our windows and doors to enjoy the fall breeze. It was pleasantly refreshing. Then, it happened. A small bird flew inside. Instantly, the bird was frantic trying to find its way out. In its frenzy, the bird kept making the mistake of flying into the glass window.

The bird would fly as hard as it could and – slam – right into the window. It backed off stunned, and then the bird would do it again. We tried and tried to direct the bird to the open doors. The bird obviously did not understand that our desires were only for its good and safety. So I knew that the only way the bird would find safety and freedom was for me to take a bed sheet and use it like a net to catch the bird. I got the bed sheet and as the bird flew by we threw the sheet over it and caught it. I then took the sheet outside and tenderly drew the

frightened bird out safely releasing it into the open air. Happily it flew away.

Many times we are like this little bird. When we get caught up in life and instantly react and slam ourselves into unseen glass walls over and over. Like the little bird, the problem is that we too do not know the way out. So we frantically slam into anything and everything but to no avail.

The Lord Jesus, talking to a multitude in the open air, points at the birds to teach us not to panic in life. Jesus our Savior kindly taught that all who believe and re-

ceive Him, they too would have the same caring Heavenly Father who would care for all our needs. There was no greater Teacher than the Lord Jesus. He had a way of making the spiritually difficult, simple.

So if you are desperate like a trapped bird, stop trying to frantically free yourself. You will end up causing more harm. What should you do? Kansas City celebrating its latest Super Bowl win

KANSAS CITY, Mo. — Fans lined up Wednesday morning to get a prime spot in downtown Kansas City as the city celebrates the Kansas City Chiefs' second Super Bowl championship in two years.

Chiefs coach Andy Reid and Super Bowl MVP quarterback Patrick Mahomes will join teammates, family and Chiefs officials as they ride in open-air vehicles down a main downtown streets to a rally at Union Station.

Most schools, many businesses and some government offices in the Kansas City metro area were closed to allow fans to enjoy the festivities.

Fans endured a chilly wind as the sun came up to wait in long lines for food trucks and merchandise trucks, and even at a tent where a barber was giving free haircuts. Tents of those who slept overnight to get a prime spot dotted the area around Union Station, and some people were fast asleep hours before the parade began.

A group of about 25 Chiefs fans from Kansas City cooked up a breakfast feast, complete with corn on the cob, bacon and potatoes and all the trimmings — and they had steaks ready for later in the day.

Dominic Zamora, 18, of Kansas City, said the friends arrived about 6 a.m. to set up their tailgate, continuing a tradition whenever he and his friends attend Chiefs games. He said he expects to return for more parades in the coming years.

"With Mahomes, there's more to come," Zamora said. "It's going to be fun, and I'm excited to show up."

Manuel Palacio, 48, of Kansas City, was dressed in a cow's suit in a tribute to Kansas City's "Cowtown" nickname.

He said he was a longtime Buffalo Bills fan who converted to the Chiefs in about 1993 after losing a bet with a Chiefs fan.

"I had to convert," Palacio said. "It's like being an Oakland Raiders fan; at some point you have to cheer for the team who keeps winning," he said, laughing.

Palacio said he and his extended family spend the season watching the Chiefs games at home and decided "when — not if — we win the Super Bowl, we're going to go down there and have some fun, celebrate together."

Officials began planning the parade even before the Chiefs defeated the Philadelphia Eagles 38-35 Sunday on a field goal with 8 seconds remaining in the game.

Officials said that more than 19 local and area law enforcement agencies, along with fire departments and transportation leaders are ready for the anticipated crowd.

The City Council Transportation and Infrastructure Committee agreed to earmark \$750,000 for parade-related expenses, and Mayor Quinton Lucas estimated overtime costs for police and firefighters would total more than \$1.5 million.

The the Kansas City Sports Commission is expected to contribute another \$1 million in private donations, and the Jackson County Legislature voted to add \$75,000.

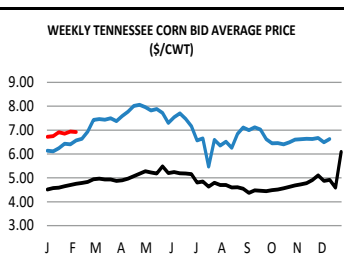
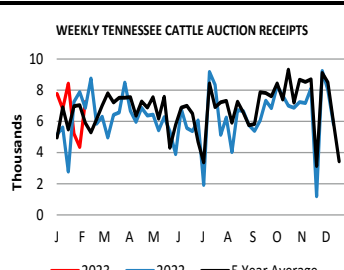
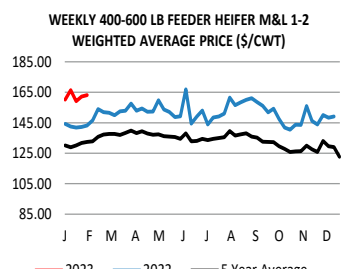
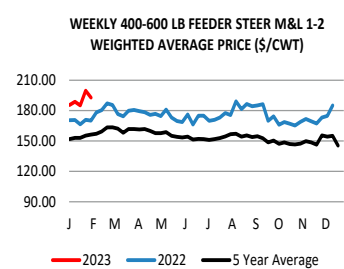

Inlow leads Forrest past Cascade on Senior Night

CHAPEL HILL — On a night set aside to honor its senior class, it was a sophomore who delivered the Forrest Lady Rockets (10-14, 4-2) a huge District 7-AA win over Cascade (2-23, 1-5) that secured the No. 2 seed for the upcoming district tournament.

Lady Rocket sophomore Kinslee Inlow caught fire in the first quarter and led the Lady Rockets to a 71-52 win over Cascade. With 5:31 left in the opening frame, senior Macyn Kirby broke a 2-2 stalemate with a corner three-pointer.

From there, Inlow took off and jumpstarted a massive, 28-point first quarter. In total, the four Lady Rockets connected on shots from the perimeter in the opening frame.

Kirby and Inlow tacked on eight in the opening frame, with Inlow knocking down a pair of treys.

Defensively, Forrest held Cascade to a single made field goal over the

final four minutes of the quarter—a basket by Cascade forward Sophie Ray, which came with nine seconds left.

Forrest closed the opening quarter on an 18-2 run, which included three-straight three-pointers in the final two minutes.

The red-hot shooting eventually cooled into the second quarter, but Forrest was still able to out-score Cascade 9-8 in the quarter, with Kirby accounting for all of the Lady Rockets' points in the frame, including another trey.

By halftime, Forrest built a 35-17 lead on Cascade.

Not much changed in the third quarter for the Lady Rocket scoring, with Forrest piling on 17 more points, spread among five different players.

Cascade also got the offensive wheels moving in the second half as well, led by Ray, who notched eight points in the third.

The fourth frame ground to a halt in terms of play, with fouls becoming a major issue

for both teams.

In the fourth quarter alone, Cascade was able to work its way to the line and made good on 12-of-14 attempts.

Forrest also shot an efficient 4-of-4 attempts in the period as well, while Inlow closed the game with another seven points and another trey.

In total, Inlow led all scorers with 31 points, including four three-pointers, while Kirby added 10.

Ray caught fire in the second half for Cascade and finished with a team-high 25 points.

With the regular season in the books, it will be a Forrest-Cascade rematch as the No. 2 and No. 3 seeds meet in the District 7-AA semifinals on Thursday night at 7:30 p.m.

CHAPEL HILL — For their second-straight matchup, the Forrest Rockets have punched the No. 4 ranked Cascade Champions in the mouth, but came up just short of knocking off the District 7-AA leaders.

On Friday night, Champion senior Jackson Davis came up with a key steal and layup in the final minute to make it a three-point contest.

Forrest had a pair of chances in the closing seconds to tie the game on a three-point attempt.

Bray McCown launched a three-point-er that caught the iron and bounced off and with less than a second left, Forrest caught the rebound and kicked the ball back to senior Davin Porter on the perimeter, who banked in the three, but was ruled to have made the shot after the buzzer sounded, and Cascade was able to escape with a 39-36 win over the Rockets.

"We went toe-to-toe with them twice, we just have come up short against them both times. The guys have played hard. They're a good team. They're the No. 4 team in the state for a reason. They have guys that can catch and can shoot. We just came up short. We had a chance there at the end,

again, to win it," Rocket coach Shane Chapman said.

It was by no stretch an offensive masterpiece for either team, but both teams kept within a one-to-two possession lead of their opponent.

In the fourth quarter alone, the two teams swapped control of the lead six times before Cascade hit the go-ahead shot with 1:09 to go in regulation.

Forrest locked down Cascade scorer Lucas Clanton from the perimeter, but the Champion senior still rattled loose for a game-high 16 points.

While Porter has been the consistent playmaker for the Rockets all season, on Friday night, Forrest consistently got timely plays from everyone that stepped on the floor.

"Whether it was a rebound, or a charge we had to take, or getting the ball swung around to the corner for somebody else to get a shot—we had eight guys who played a ton of minutes tonight and all eight of those guys gave us a great effort," Chapman said.

With the regular season wrapped up, Forrest now sets its sights on Grundy County in the District 7-AA semifinals.

During their first meeting against the Yellow Jackets, Grundy

County shot the lights out and dealt the Rockets a 61-39 loss. In their second meeting, Forrest had chances to knock off the Yellow Jackets, but came up short in a 66-60 loss.

But they say it's tough to beat a team three times in a season and Chapman feels like his squad is turning a corner at the right time.

"Our guys are super locked into what we're trying to do. We're trying all kinds of things defensively.

Our size has been our biggest downfall all year, not having a big, but we've got guys that can cut to the rim and some guys who can get the open shot to go in. We've got to focus on making the easy ones inside. I think it's a different team you're going to look at in the district tournament," he said.

"Hopefully we can get some stuff squared away against Grundy County in the first round and get to see them again her at our place and make a little run."

The Rockets are set to take on No. 2 seed Grundy County in the District 7-AA semifinals on Friday night at 7:30 in Chapel Hill.

Bulldogs come up short on Senior Night

The Cornersville Bulldogs (7-17) faced the Warriors of Culleoka High School (7-17) Thursday night and both teams laid everything out on the court, most fitting for the final game of the regular 2022-2023 season.

The Bulldogs had prevailed back in November, winning 54-43, but this time it came down to a buzzer beating shot by Culleoka's Dalton Owens that decided the contest, and the Warriors came away with a 51-49 victory.

The Bulldogs were led in scoring by Kel

Ford with 15 points and Ben Franklin with nine points.

The Warriors, coached by Cornersville alumni Mike Lovett, were led in scoring by Elijah Hargrove with 19 points and Owens with 13 points.

Cornersville controlled the tip-off and as fitting, senior Carter Neat took the first shot, a three-pointer, for a 3-0 lead.

Cornersville's Ben Franklin stole the ball and flashing gridiron speed, raced to the basket, laid it in and was fouled, missing the free throw but the Bulldogs led 5-0.

Culleoka began a

six-point run on the strength of two free throws by Jeffrey Pierce and two baskets by Bo Gilliam to lead 6-5.

Kel Ford countered with a short turnaround jumper to make the score 7-6 and the teams began swapping the lead with Owens and Hargrove contributing for Culleoka and Ford and Franklin matching the effort for Cornersville. The Warriors led 13-11 after one period.

After a foul on a three-point try by Culleoka's Hargrove who promptly sank all three to push the Warrior lead to 16-11, Cornersville coach Dakota Brown called time out. Follow-

ing the sideline conference the Bulldogs' Kale Adcox responded with a three-pointer. Ford worked hard down low adding five points and the Bulldogs trailed 23-21 as time ticked away in the second quarter.

Adcox sank his second three-pointer and Hayden Grover drilled a basket to put Cornersville in front at the half, 26-25.

The third quarter saw the Bulldogs maintain their lead thanks to Gage Lovell's seven points and Ford's six points to lead, 41-37.

The Warriors gained a tie on a basket by Hargrove, 45-45, with 4:30 left in the game.

With 3:00 left in the game on the strength of free throws by Franklin and Grover the Bulldogs led, 47-45.

A basket by Culleoka's Owens tied it at 47-47, although a missed free-throw prevented the Warrior from taking the lead.

Culleoka's Beckham Faulkner at the 1:32 mark put the Warriors in the lead, 49-47, but Cornersville's Grover popped a ten footer from the left side and with 57.4 seconds left and the Bulldogs had knotted it up, 49-49.

The Warriors, with the ball in, ran some clock. As time ticked down Owens threw up

a prayer but before the shot. Warriors coach Lovett had called time out to set one last play with 5 seconds left.

The ball came into Owens who dribbled across the lane, turned left, and laid the ball up and as it fell through the hoop the buzzer sounded with the Warriors on top 51-49.

MLB's spring training a test run for new rule changes

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz. — Spring training games might be a little ugly this year, particularly during the first few weeks.

For Major League Baseball, that's a feature, not a bug.

The Grapefruit and Cactus League games in Florida and Arizona over the next month will be used as a petri dish for the sport's rule changes, including a pitch clock, bigger bases and limits to infield shifts. The idea is that the worst kinks will be worked out before opening day on March 30.

Though there's mul-

tiple innovations, one stands above the rest.

"The pitch timer is — by far — the biggest change that's coming this season," said MLB executive vice president Morgan Sword said Tuesday. "Frankly, it's probably the biggest change that's been made to baseball in most of our lifetimes."

The pitch clock has been tested for a few years at the minor league level. Pitchers will have 15 seconds to deliver their pitch with no runners on base and 20 seconds when runners are on base. There will be 30 seconds between batters and 2 minutes, 15 seconds between innings.

MLB games averaged 3 hours, 4 minutes last season following the introduction of the PitchCom electronic device to signal pitches, down from a record 3:10 in 2021. Sword said MLB's research indicates fans prefer games that are around 2:30.

The pitch clock's effect on minor league games in 2022 was substantial. Games that used the clock were, on average, 25 minutes shorter than those that did not.

"Fans want a crisper pace," Sword said.

Sword said umpires will be watching for more balks when runners are on base. Some pitchers — particularly

relievers — have funky idiosyncrasies in their deliveries and never come to a complete stop before delivering a pitch. That's technically a balk, but umpires usually let those ticks slide.

A complete stop with no movement becomes more significant because the pitch clock operator turns off the clock once the pitcher's motion toward the plate begins.

Balks rose to 924 during a 1988 crackdown from 356 the previous year, then declined to 407 in 1989 and 288 in 1990. The total has been under 200 annually since 1989 and was 122 last year.
