Commissioners voted to appoint Randy Perryman to the 2nd District seat on the Commission left vacant by the resignation of Joseph War-

Mayor Mike Keny said that three residents of the district had submitted letters of interest, with Perryman and Charles Sellars being nominated by a sitting commissioner.

Perryman received 15

out of the 16 possible for the appointment.

The commission voted to appoint Commissioner Nathan Johnson to the vacancy on the county's nominating committee, that had been filled by Warner.

With the fiscal year coming to a close, the agenda was relatively lengthy, with several annual grant applications approved and budget amendments made.

The commission approved the transfer of more than \$3.5 million from the school system's fund balance into capital outlay and tech support accounts in order

Hatchet attack kicks off spree

Maury County Sheriff's Office deputies arrested a Lewisburg man around 1 p.m. last Thursday after a 24 hour crime spree which began on Bethbirei Road.

Kenneth Sims, 61, is facing multiple charges for a series of alleged crimes, starting Wednesday afternoon on May 17.

Sims' landlord, Doug Doyle, had gone to Sims' residence on Bethbirei Road to give him a ride to a bank in order to cash a check.

According to the Marshall County Sheriff's Office report, Sims told Doyle that he wanted to show him something first, at which point

Sims hit Doyle in the head with a hatchet.

Doyle said that he then ran from Sims, suffering another cut on his side.

then Sims took Doyle's truck and drove off. Doyle was treated at Maury Regional for his injuries.

Warrants were taken out in Marshall County for aggravated assault and theft over \$1,000.

Marshall County law enforcement blanketed the county searching for Sims, stopping some vehicles matching the description.

Later in the afternoon, Maury County deputies reported that Sims was on Kedron Road, after carjacking another truck from a resident at

gunpoint.

Sims allegedly forced

the other man into the truck after handcuffing

Initial reports indicated that the hostage was able to escape the vehicle in the area of Exit 46.

No more contact was made with Sims until the next day, when a license plate reading camera alerted police to the stolen truck being driven in Spring Hill.

Officers there performed a felony stop in a theater parking lot without incident.

Sims is facing charges in Maury County as well, including aggravated kidnapping, aggravated burglary, aggravated robbery, carjacking, and aggravated assault.

It took a lot of green to buy a green tractor, almost a record amount of cash.

William "Billy" Hopkins was a popular and well-known person in Marshall County, so Emily and Woody Woodruff of Woodruff Realty and Auction Company in Shelbyville expected a big day on May 13, but they got more than they expected.

They knew the John Deere Model 6430 with a loader was a popular model. Emily said they expected it to attract a final bid of between \$70,000 and \$90,000. The tractor sold new for \$81,000 in 2010 at Baker Equipment Company, now Tri-Green Equipment, in Columbia, Tennessee.



he had maintained it inside and out.

"The Sullivan brothers (Jeff & John) consulted with the Hopkins family. With their knowledge of equipment and their years of experience they were able to recognize the value of the tractor and high demand for an item such as this making the auction such a success.'

"When it got \$114,500, we were super surprised," Emily said. "l didn't realize at the time it was the second highest amount paid in the country for a 6430 model."

"It was all about the condition it was in. The Sullivan Brothers with

J & J Detail cleaned it up as if it was their own and It looked like it was brand new."

It was the highest amount of any vehicle sold by Woodruff Realty and Auction which has been in existence for more than 10 years.

According to "Pete's Machinery Talk" website, it is the second highest price ever paid for a John Deere 6430 tractor with a loader. The tractor had 1,345 hours of use. The website listed a 2011 model with 1,461 hours as the record holder at \$123,000. It was sold Aug. 18, 2022, in Prescott, Iowa. Third place is a 2009 model with 988 hours sold July 8, 2021, in Sleepy Eye, Minnesota for \$114,000. All three were listed in excellent condition.

There was so much interest in the tractor that the staff at the auction stayed on the phone with bidders as well as watching those in the crowd.

"We had a guy from Knoxville," Emily said. "I was on the line with a man from

Union Springs, Alabama. We had someone working the Internet so people could bid. There was so much interest due to the shortage and wait times on getting new equipment.

the bidding Once passed the \$100,000 barrier there was a brief lull in the bidding.

"The last little bit it kind of stalled at \$105,00 to \$110,000 and then another buyer stepped in late, and it

went from there," Emily said. "There were a lot of local people bidding. The successful buyer was from Cullman, Alabama and he was in the audience."

The sale attracted 167 registered bidders despite rain most of the day. She said typically their auctions attract 50 to 100 bidders.

"It was a huge sale over there," Emily said. "He had farmed there for over 50 years.

He was a lifelong member of the community and was very well-respected.

"It couldn't have been a worse day for an auction, due to the weather conditions. However, we are so thankful for a great turn out and the success for the Hopkins Family."

See what baby names were the most popular last year

WASHINGTON (AP) — Dutton and Wrenlee are on the rise but they're no match for champs Liam and Olivia as the top baby names in the U.S. last year.

The Social Security Administration released the annual list Friday. The agency tracks baby names in each state based on applications for Social Security cards, with names dating to

It's Liam's sixth straight year as No. 1. Olivia has reigned since the name unseated Emma four years ago. Emma is No. 2.

Coming in third for girls' names is Charlotte, followed by Amelia, Sophia, Isabella, Ava, Mia, Evelyn and Luna. For boys' names, Liam is followed by Noah, Oliver, James, Elijah, William, Henry, Lucas, Benjamin and Theodore.

Luna is the only newcomer in the Top 10, booting Harper. The agency has been compiling the list since

1997, often revealing the impact pop culture has on baby naming trends. The smash hit "Yellowstone" has clearly influenced new parents. The neo-Western starring Kevin Costner debuted in 2018, with characters surfacing among baby names ever since. Dutton moved up the Social Security list to

835, a change of 986 spots from 2021. It's the last name of the fictional family featured on the series, and it counts Costner's John Dutton in its ranks. Dutton is the fastest rising name in the Social Security rankings.

Another Dutton name follows actual Dutton as a star with a bullet among baby names. Kayce, as in Kayce John Dutton on the show, moved to the 587th most popular name, up from 1,077 the year before. Luke Grimes plays Kayce. Rip, also from "Yellowstone," has grabbed

some naming attention, but it didn't crack Social Security's top 1,000. Cole Hauser's Rip Wheeler is Dutton adjacent as the son-in-law of John. Other names rising fast for boys: Chosen,

Neriah, Arlet, Georgina and Amiri. The Social Security Administration's latest data shows 3.64 million babies in the U.S. were issued Social Security cards last year, up slightly from 2021.

Is my drinking water safe?

Yes, our water meets all of EPA's health standards. We have conducted numerous tests for over 80 contaminants that may be in drinking water. As you' II see in the chart on the back, we only detected 9 of these contaminants. We found all of these contaminants at safe levels.

What is the source of my water?

Your water, which is surface water, comes from the Duck River. Our goal is to protect our water from contaminants, and we are working with the State to determine the vulnerability of our water source to potential contamination. The Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) has prepared a Source Water Assessment Program (SWAP) Report for the untreated water sources serving this water system. The SWAP Report assesses the susceptibility of untreated water sources to potential contamination. To ensure safe drinking water, all public water systems treat and routinely test their water. Water sources have been rated as reasonably susceptible, moderately susceptible or slightly susceptible based on geologic factors and human activities in the vicinity of the water source. The Lewisburg Water System sources rated as reasonably susceptible to potential

Lead in Drinking Water

If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. Marshall County Board of Public Utilities is responsible for providing high quality drinking water but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. The friend of sinners!

"The Son of Man came eating and drinking, and they say, Behold a man gluttonous, and a winebibber, a friend of publicans and sinners..." - Mat-

One of the greatest sins is that of "misrepresenting" God. Interestingly, that's the very charge that the Pharisees, the religious leaders of Christ's day, brought against Jesus Christ. When Jesus performed His many miracles in public the religious leaders could not explain them away because everyone saw them. Therefore, they claimed that what Jesus did was of the devil (Matthew 12:24). However, the opposite was true. 



The two teams met last season for the Class 2-A state championship, with Alcoa outlasting Forrest to claim the 2022 championship.

Abby Ferguson then mashed a two RBI triple and then scored on another Alcoa error to break the game wide open.

Two more Tornado errors set up a fifth Lady Rocket run of the inning before Carli Warner singled home the sixth run

The Tornadoes got one back off a one-out home run in the top of the second—only to see Forrest get back to work in the bottom of the inning and plate three more runs on an error that scored Parker Wales and a two-RBI single off the bat of senior Macyn

While Moreland has been a cornerstone for the Lady Rockets all season long from the pitcher's circle, she had to work around some struggles on Tuesday afternoon.

Even with Moreland not at her sharpest from the circle, the Lady Rocket fireballer was able to do just enough to keep the Alcoa bats

from heating up.

"She actually struggled today finding the zone. But her ability to get the ball down and mix in her off speed kept the hitters off balanced," Lightfoot said.

Heritage outlasts Forrest in marathon 2-A state opener

SMYRNA — The standard high school baseball game goes seven innings.

In Tuesday afternoon's Class 2-A state tournament opener between the Forrest and White House Heritage, the game stretched nearly three hours and went 11 innings before the Patriots walked off against the Rockets for the 7-6 win.

Last season, the two teams met in the postseason and it was Heritage, who in similar fashion, knocked the Rockets out of the tournament with an extrainnings walk-off.

"Walk-off fashion in extra innings again same opponent who put us out last year. It's a pretty bittersweet picture there. But I'm proud of our guys and I'm proud of our resiliency. We fought back from being down 5-1 to get the ball game tied. We had base runners on and executed some good things, we just couldn't get that last hit to drop when we needed it," Rocket coach Andy Burkett said.

The marathon between the Rockets and Patriots saw Heritage grab a 2-1 lead, after Forrest got on the board in the top of the first inning on a sac-fly by Carter Walk, scoring Tyler Baxter.

Heritage rallied for two in the bottom of the inning and that score stood for two innings, until the Patriots connected on a three-run homer to bump the lead to 5-1 by the end of the

third. But if the 2023 Forrest Rockets have proven one thing, it's they're never out of a game.

Branham Haynes got one back for the Rockets when he ground into a double play in the fourth and a second run scored on a Patriot error, cutting the Heritage lead to two.

Another two-run inning tied the game at five in the sixth inning with Haynes again grounding into a fielder's choice, scoring another run and then Tyler Baxter knocked in a fifth Rocket run to tie the game at five.

The rollercoaster back-and-forth between Forrest and Heritage continued into the sixth when the Patriots scored the go-ahead run on a passed ball.

Forrest flashed the leather and worked a double play before forcing a fly out to end the threat in the sixth.

And just as quickly as Heritage struck, the Rockets again answered the bell and tied the game on a Luke Allen sac-fly to tie the game at six. From there, the game

settled into the extrainnings marathon that extended an additional four innings, with neither team being able to consistently string together enough hits to plate another run, until the fateful 11th inning that saw the Patriots connect on four singles, including the one-out, bases-loaded single to

walk the game off. But no matter what, and went 3 1/3 innings, Forrest answered Herigiving up five runs on

on one hit and struck out two. Carter walk went 2


1/3 innings and gave up just one hit before Preston Gentry took over and pitched an excellent 2 13/ final innings. " Hats off to Preston



After losing twice to the Forrest Lady Rockets by a combined score of 18-3 a week ago in the District 7-AA tournament, the Community Viqueens came off the deck in the Region 4-AA championship game with a five-run fourth inning to take charge and used a complete game performance on the mound by Annie Prince along with a stellar errorless defensive effort to beat the Lady Rockets 5-2 and claim the school's first region softball

"I love it. I absolutely love it," Coach Cam Farrell of the Viqueens said. "From the jump they came out with a we're going to win attitude."

From the outset, it was a pitching duel between Prince and Taylor Moreland of the Lady Rockets as the base runners were few and far between through the first three innings.

The Viqueens could only manage two runners and the Lady Rockets just one before Community (19-11-1) exploded in the top of the fourth.

Abi Brown reached base on an error to start the inning which opened the flood gates for the

Consecutive singles by Abby Murrill and Zoey Dixon loaded the bases with no outs.

Carlie Blanton came through with a two-run single to give the Viqueens the lead. After the first out, the singles kept coming as Haley Mitchell and Chloe West followed with RBI-singles to give the Viqueens a 4-0 advantage.

Alana Tate, the ninth batter in the inning, connected on a two-out single to score the final Viqueen run and give Community a 5-0 lead.

The Lady Rockets put a dent in the score with one run in the bottom of the inning. Moreland led off with a double and scored

on a wild pitch to cut the Viqueen lead to 5-1.

Forrest (25-11) challenged again in the bottom of the sixth, but the Viqueen defense came up big.

After one out, Moreland and Christa Warren singled, putting runners on first and second.

An Abby Ferguson single to center looked to score a Lady Rocket run, but center fielder Murrill fielded the ball cleanly and threw a strike to the plate to nab the runner for a key out.

A groundout then ended the inning as the Viqueens were unscathed and took their 5-1 lead to the seventh.

North Wilkesboro 'definitely has a place' in NASCAR's world

N O R T WILKESBORO, N.C. — Speedway Motorsports CEO Marcus Smith said North Wilkesboro Speedway "definitely has a place in the NASCAR world" moving forward, despite an All-Star race that lacked drama Sunday night.

In what capacity remains to be seen.

Smith was non-committal about how North Wilkesboro might fit into NASCAR's schedule moving forward. There are no guaranteed dates on the Cup Series points race schedule and future All-Star sites haven't been determined.

"That question's on my mind as well," Smith said. "I think when you see a successful week of events like we've had here it's natural to think, 'Boy, maybe we can come back here.' So, I'm definitely thinking that way. ... It's definitely something that we're thinking about."

Smith and Hall of Fame driver Dale Earnhardt Jr. spearheaded the effort to bring Cup Series racing bac k to the .625-mile track, a monumental task considering the dilapidated track sat mostly dormant since Jeff Gordon won the last Cup race there in 1996.

Hosting a Cup points race likely would mean Speedway Motorsports needing to take a a race away from one of its existing tracks on the regular NASCAR schedule. It's unclear if Smith would want to do that.

As for another All-Star race, that remains uncertain after the race fell flat in terms of entertainment value. While fans filled the grandstands at North Wilkesboro on Sunday night creating an electric atmosphere, the result was akin to a 51-3 blowout in



After successfully hosting the NASCAR All-Star race for the first NASCAR event in 27 years, there's a demand for the North Wilkesboro Speedway to remain an active component of future races.

There was one lead change in 200 laps, and Kyle Larson dominated the race by leading the final 134 laps. At one point, Larson threatened to lap the entire field after taking an 11-second lead over secondplace Bubba Wallace before a competition caution tightened the field after lap 100. There were no wrecks

and the few restarts provided no big moves. About the only drama

came after the race when Wallace appeared to make an obscene gesture on camera before a live interview

with Fox Sports. NASCAR spokesman Mike Forde said Monday there are no plans to penal-

ize Wallace after discussing

the matter with the 23XI Racing team. However, NASCAR plans to speak with Wallace about not using the gesture.

Representatives Wallace's 23XI Racing team had no comment.

Tyler Reddick, who finished third, said the lack of competitive racing is more a result of NASCAR's ongoing issues with short track racing rather than a reflection of the North Wilkesboro worthiness as

"It's no secret that everybody in the industry and the fans have been vocal about wanting better short track racing, so I think what happened tonight goes along with what that narrative has

been lately," Reddick said.

"NASCAR is working on it and we are all going to put our heads together and try to help make short track racing better."

Reddick said racing should "absolutely" return to North Wilkesboro in some capacity. Larson, who won his third All-Star race, said All-Star venues should vary but he'd like to compete again at North Wilkesboro.

"Really, I just want to see us keep coming back here," Larson said. "I think NASCAR has a lot of roots here, so it deserves a spot on our schedule, whether it be a non-points race or a

points race, whatever." Smith will need to determine whether to repave the

old track, something that

hasn't been done in nearly four decades. He said Sunday night he's leaning toward not doing that right

Larson suggested patching the track in certain spots to make it more conducive to passing. Most of the drivers ran at the bottom of the track where some patchwork had been done leading up to the race.

"I don't think they need to pave the whole thing," Larson said. "But just little patches here and there add character to the track and find grip. ... I think if they can introduce some patches in the middle to upper grooves, I think that'll make the racing better."

PIKEVILLE — Lady Rocket coach Shelby Lightfoot wants her team to deliver two of the three parts of the game, whether it's hitting and pitching, pitching and fielding, or hitting and fielding—she feels like any combination gives Forrest a good shot to win the game.

In Friday afternoon's Class 2A state sectional at Bledsoe County (21-1), the Lady Rockets (26-11) delivered in all three phases and punched their ticket to the Class 2A state tournament, with a 9-4 win over the Lady Warriors.

"We felt like we've had this team all year. It's just finding a way for them to show up. We always talk about if we can do two of three parts of the game, whether that's fielding and pitching or pitching and hitting, we just need two out of three. Especially with (Taylor) Moreland coming in and throwing a gem. That was big for us,' Lightfoot said.

After both teams slotted a scoreless first inning, it was Forrest who got to to work in the top of the second inning with a lead-off double off the bat of Ella Chilton.

Forrest then executed the small ball approach to perfection and loaded the bases with back-to-back bunts, with Carli Warner driving home Chilton for the first run of the game.

Briley Burnham then laid down a sacrifice to score a a second Lady Rocket run of the inning, bringing Parker Wales to the plate.

Wales laid into a pitch and slammed the shot to center field, scoring Warner, and then advanced on to third on a Bledsoe County error.

The final run of the second inning came with a sac fly from Macyn Kirby,

But that momentum shift didn't last long.

Bledsoe County responded with back-toback solo home runs and then proceeded to load the bases, prompting Lightfoot to turn to Moreland, who relieved Chilton in the pitcher's circle.

Bledsoe County then drew two bases-loaded walks to tie the game at four runs apiece.

After a fly out to right field ended the inning, both teams settled into the game and neither was able to push another run across the plate for the next two innings.

It wasn't until an error at first base by Bledsoe County that Forrest was able to break the stalemate in the fifth inning when courtesy base runner Maddy Ille scored. Forrest added to its lead

in the sixth with another dollop of small ball by Warner, who laid down another perfectly-executed sacrifice bunt, scoring Maggie Daughrity. The back-breaker came
