Days of Yesteryear

General news from the Montgomery Standard

May 21, 1920 Mrs. Mary Sharp, known all over this section as "Grandma" Sharp, passed her 100th birthday last Monday. They kept open house that day and many people called to pay their respects and extend congratulations. Among other things 100 American Beauty roses were received from her granddaughter, Mrs. Epsie Brandt Morse and her husband and sister Miss Grace Brandt at Ithaca, N.Y. "Grandma" reclined on a davenport during the afternoon where she received the callers. She reads well, but not as well as 50 years ago, and discusses the events of the day with a clear mind and enjoys the visits of her friends, especially so on this occasion; talks interestingly of the Civil War in which she lost a son in the Confeder-

Raymond Wyatt of New Florence, who went to Kansas City several weeks ago, has secured employment in a large department store there.

Miss Katherine Woodruff is the proud possessor of a beautiful white wire wheel Buick roadster, purchased from the Miller-Buick Auto Co., this week.

Sylvester Algermissen, son of Mr. and Mrs. F.H. Algermissen, met with a serious and most unfortunate accident Saturday noon, which may cost him the sight of his left eye. While working with a storage battery at the electric light plant the battery exploded, throwing acid all over his face and in his eyes. Dr. B.F. Menefee found both eyes were badly burned by the acid, and after easing his suffering advised that he be taken to St. Louis at once. The doctor in St. Louis stated the right eye could be saved, but was not certain he could save the sight in the left eye. Sylvester's face was also burned and since the accident he has been suffering with great pain.

75 Years Ago May 25, 1945

Each year a girl of the senior class is chosen for the good citizenship award of the D.A.R. This student participates in a state-wide contest. The winner is awarded a trip to Washington, D.C. Our chosen representative was Dora Mae Schwaebe. The award was made about the middle of the year by high school principal, B.E. Owings.

In this fourth year of the second World War every American should know the meaning of the poppy. Today, as in 1917 and 1918, our men are again fighting overseas, giving their lives that we may be safe. These boys are our relatives, our neighbors, our friends. It is grievous to us that they must suffer and who better understands the amount of suffering they endure than the veterans of this war and the last? The poppies are made of crepe paper on the pattern of the wild poppy of Flanders. They are made by the disabled veterans. Those on the home front wish to show that they remember and revere those who died in both wars, and to do this they wear the poppy. It is one way of telling the heroic dead that we will all do our best

to "keep up the good fight." Mrs. Alta Worley received a letter from her son, Pfc. Wm. L. Worley, who is serving with the U.S. Ninth Air Force, and is now stationed in Germany. "Dear Mom: Well, here I am in another country. Sorry I haven't written sooner, but as you can tell, I have been pretty busy, in more ways than one. It seems funny not being able to talk

to any of these people. The people don't even bother you much. They just stand around and look at you. But you have to be on the watch for them; you can never tell what they will do. I am really living in style now. We took over some apartment houses to live in. We even have a kitchen. There is a lot of furniture in them. The German people really were well off. They have nice homes and they seem to have plenty to eat. They don't look hungry like the French people did. Lots of love. Mike."

50 Years Ago May 21, 1970

The R-II school page, the "Wildcat Cry," recently won "All-Missouri" honors as the best page in the local paper in its size class. The page won "All-Missouri" honors, the highest ranking and was the only Class B school page so rated. The page is produced by the R-II journalism class taught by Norman Grossman. This year there were 11 members in the class. In other areas of the press competition, Steve Jenisch won second place in the state in photography and Jim Butler and Brad Slatten won honorable mention in sports features.

Three salespeople from Wyatts Electric in Montgomery City attended an introduction to the 1971 line of Whirlpool washers, dryers, dishwashers and new trash master in St. Louis at Stouffer's Riverfront Inn last Wednesday.

The New Florence school patrol was honored for the good work done. A good time was planned by the PTA for all sixth graders. They were taken to Mexico for a skating party.

R-II high school seniors spent last Tuesday morning picking up trash along Highway 19 between the school and the Montgomery City fairgrounds park. The Missouri State Highway Department furnished the seniors with bags for the refuse and picked up the filled bags later that day. The class collected about 20 bags of trash along the road, mostly cans and bottles, during their cleanup hike.

25 Years Ago

May 24, 1995 Just as the residents of southern Montgomery County were looking forward to a good crop year in the Missouri River Bottoms, and moving the last homes in the bottoms at Rhineland out of the flood plain, record May rains hit and sent Loutre and the Missouri Rivers out of their banks, destroying the levees, and cresting at nearly 32 feet, just under the record of the '93 flood.

It rained nearly a foot Wednesday and Thursday and that, on top of already saturated soil and rivers bank full, put all bottom land ground underwater. Montgomery County Emergency Management Director Ron Hansen said Friday that 12,000 acres of bottom land in Montgomery County was under water and that there were 40 people displaced by the flooding in the county and 14 businesses flooded.

The third-grade classes at Montgomery Elementary recently held a "Games Day" to celebrate earning new math games in their classrooms. The Mercantile Bank, as partner in education with the third grades, supplied incentive money to the classrooms and the students earned the games by their participation and success in the math program. 




