GNBank customers targeted by scam

PITTSBURG, Kan. — The Pittsburg Police Department is warning the public that scammers have recently been specifically targeting customers of GNBank, calling them pretending to be a customer service representative for the bank and asking them for sensitive personal information.

GNBank customers have reported receiving calls that showed up on their caller ID as the GNBank customer service number, 888-675-8223, the police department said in a press release. The fraudster identifies themselves as a bank employee and tells the customer the bank has identified fraud on their account. The customer is then asked to provide personal information such as their Social Security number, date of birth, email address, and digital banking identification number.

GNBank and the police department want to make the public aware of this scam and of the sophistication involved in spoofing

A free fruit orchard proposed for Pittsburg

Crawford County Commission hears pitch from Wildcat Extension District

PITTSBURG, Kan. — Jesse Gilmore, horticulture agent with the K-State Wildcat Extension District, spoke at Friday's Crawford County Commission meeting, discussing the potential of creating a community orchard in Pittsburg that could provide free fruit to local residents.

Gilmore was recently able to get in touch with Pittsburg Beautiful, "which has some potential for putting a community orchard or two in Pittsburg because of some research that is coming down the pipeline, showing that it increases resilience in the

community, as far as local food stores," he said.

"It's an educational opportunity," said Gilmore, "and it has extended nutritional benefits to people in the area, and the real reason that I am here is because one of the locations that we identified as a prime spot for a potential community orchard was 608 West 4th, which is immediate-

ly adjacent to the EMS building."

Gilmore said his purpose in coming to the commission meeting Friday was not to ask the commissioners to approve the plan for an orchard next to the EMS building, "but we are just putting it on your guys' radar that this is something that we are potentially thinking about

pursuing at this spot."

He added that "we want to make sure that we don't inhibit the work of the EMS building at all with any orchard that we decided to put in there."

According to Gilmore, "right now, we are planning on pursuing fruit

Police warn drivers to take steps to avoid vehicle break-ins

PITTSBURG, Kan. — The Pittsburg Police Department is warning local residents that they should take preventative steps to avoid vehicle break-ins, as they have been a problem in the area recently.

"The police department has taken several motor vehicle burglary reports recently," the department said in a Facebook post Thursday, adding that there have already been nine firearms reported stolen in Pittsburg in 2022.

According to the police department, the items most commonly stolen in vehicle burglaries include cell phones, laptops, firearms, and money. Nearly half of such thefts, the department said, are related to driver indiscretions, such as leaving keys in the

Guild presents quilt to county commissioners

PITTSBURG, Kan. — Little Balkans Quilt Guild members Debra Potter and Sherry Jagels presented a special quilt as a thank you gift to the Crawford County commissioners at their meeting on Friday, Feb. 18.

"Thank you to all of you for everything you have done the last couple of years in relation to keeping our county safe," Potter said. "I know you've caught a lot of heat from a lot of people, and I know I speak for myself and Sherry and the maker of this quilt which is Peg Smith, in saying 'thank

you for taking care of us.'"

Peg Smith started the quilt in 2014. She selected her favorite locations in Pittsburg and around the county and traced photographs of each location on the fabric. From there she spent hours embroidering the details of the photos onto the quilt. She also embroidered the history of each location or item on the back. Potter said Peg couldn't be there to present it because she moved to Arizona to be with family, and left the quilt with the Guild to take care of it.

"It's a marvelous quilt and she wanted to donate it to the commissioners and the county to be shared in the county be-

cause this definitely was a labor of love for her," Potter said.

Potter said the Little Balkans Quilt Guild had the quilt appraised, and it was valued at \$1,200. The middle of the quilt had a square of the house where Peg grew up and the story behind it.

"We were hoping it could be displayed in the courthouse or it could be rotated to the museum and various places she embroidered before finding its final home because it really is to honor people in this county and the history of this county," Potter said.

Time to thank your snow plow drivers

PITTSBURG, Kan. — If you drove on cleared roads Thursday and Friday, thank Pittsburg heavy equipment operator Josh Bryant, or one of the crew of five city employees who were up before dawn patrolling the streets with plows and sand spreaders.

On bad weather days, Bryant's job starts early with a phone call from his supervisor, who has gotten the alert from the police department. Depending on the forecast, it may just be one truck sanding an icy bridge, or, like the big storm of Feb. 10, the whole five-person crew.

The city is divided into

four sections with one truck for each, plus a spare. Four drivers go out, with two on standby to relieve them in the morning.

"We did recruit some other guys in other departments," Bryant said.

"It's a team effort. The whole city has to be involved when you get a storm like that, not just the plowers," he explained.

Bryant has a CDL Class A driver's license, which qualifies him to drive all sorts of heavy equipment, so in the summer, he'll switch to driving an asphalt truck as the crew starts doing road repairs. He's been with the city for 15 years.

"I was in concrete construction anyway and I had a family and I wanted a career, not just a regular concrete job, one with benefits and everything,"

he said. "It's been a good move, that's for sure."

"I've always liked equipment," he said.

When he started with the city, new equipment operators went through a training class, but he says now, the new employees simply ride along with an experienced driver until they get the hang of the job. It can get exciting, Bryant said, but he added, "I really don't have any bad experiences."

"You just go out there and do your job. A lot of nerves, with traffic. It makes you use your mind, that's for sure," he said.

"Snow plowing, we counter our blades to push the snow off to the side," he explained. If the blade is countered too much, the driver can lose control "in a second." He said that happened to him

a few times in the early, early years of his work at the city, but now, he said, "I've kind of learned some tricks. It takes experience to get good at it."

"What I like to tell the younger guys, when the ground is clear, drive around and practice until you're comfortable with it."

A big storm sort of changes the rules, though.

"When you get that much snow, you're blind." The obstacles, like curbs, are covered with snow so you can't avoid them.

Another hazard is people on the roads.

"What really gets scary is people passing on the right side and we're throwing snow to the side," he said.

It's also scary when

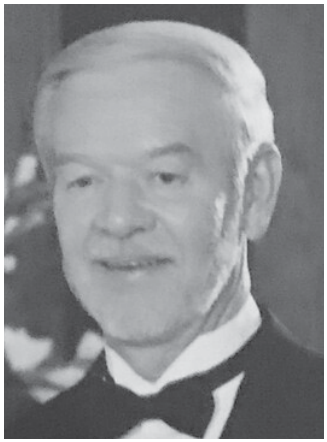

Boil water advisory rescinded for Cherokee County Rural Water District No. 3

CHEROKEE COUNTY, Kan. — The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) has rescinded a boil water advisory for the Cherokee County Rural Water District No. 3 public water supply system, located in Cherokee County.

The advisory was issued because of a loss of pressure in the distribution system due to a waterline break. Failure to maintain adequate pressure may result in a loss of chlorine residuals and bacterial contamination.

Public water suppliers in Kansas take all measures necessary to notify customers quickly after a system failure or shutdown. Regardless of

whether it's the supplier or KDHE that announces a boil water advisory, KDHE will issue the rescind order following testing at a certified laboratory.

Laboratory testing samples collected from Cherokee County Rural Water District No. 3 indicate no evidence of bacteriological contamination and all other conditions that placed the system at risk of contamination are deemed by KDHE officials to be resolved.

someone is stuck in an intersection. "You can't stop those big trucks very quickly."

Although rescue isn't part of his job, he said he has sometimes helped people push their cars out of an intersection for everybody's safety. Occasionally, he said, his supervisor will also send out a couple of guys with backhoes to clean driveways that have been blocked by the bigger plows.

"I just enjoy working here," Bryant said. "Our job is to serve the citizens of Pittsburg, and that's what we do."

But he said he is looking forward to summer. The work day will shift to road building and asphalt work, which is hot and stinky, but he looks forward to time off, which he spends with friends and family at one or another of the lakes in the region. Favorites include Crawford Lake in Farlington, and Stockton Lake.

"We kind of hit them all," he said.

The family includes his wife and three kids.

The oldest son just graduated from Tulsa Welding School in Arizona, but the other two are still in town. His daughter is a freshman at Pittsburg High School, while his youngest son is still in middle school.

Bryant said his off-duty projects are varied. "I just like working on stuff," he said, anything from boats and cars to building projects.

"Last year, I just built a new house. I kind of learned more about building a house than I ever thought I would know," he said. "Other than that, we just hang out with our friends."

The idea of floating on the lake on his pontoon boat, soaking in the sunshine, gets him through those dark, cold 2 a.m. callouts.

He knows he's earning compensation time. "Some guys take the pay, some people take the time off. I like to save the time off for summer and do something fun," Bryant said.

Cherokee County Economic Development director resigns

COLUMBUS, Kan. — The founding director of the Cherokee County Economic Development has resigned her position as of April 1. Janet Miller has been credited with singlehandedly building the CCED from the ground up.

She was hired in late 2013 and spent the last eight years working tirelessly to develop a stronger county economic base but also to put the organization on a track to someday be self-supporting.

Miller will once again be striking out on new project. She will be working with Network Kansas, a statewide network of non-profit business-building resources that help entrepreneurs and small business owners startup

and grow successful businesses.

The organization is dividing and realigning their districts, creating a new district, which will be Miller's area. That district will include Cherokee County. She will be working to create an entrepreneurial environment in the local area by cultivating resources to start and grow small businesses.

"Janet has been instrumental in every success the organization has had," said Brian Smith, board president of the CCED. "She will be missed and difficult to replace. However, we feel in her new position she will still be helping us in the future."

Miller was formerly an economic development specialist in Laredo, Texas, and had worked in a regional development program in western Kansas

prior to her Texas employment.

During her tenure Miller developed the Youth Entrepreneurial Fair, with competition in the local school districts, leading to state competitions and cash prizes for the best presentations.

She also was directly responsible for the creation of the County Neighborhood Revitalization tax abatement project which resulted in refunding 95 percent of the taxes paid on new homes or major revitalization for five years.

Taxpayers have been rebated hundreds of thousands of dollars over the past four years.

This program was developed as a result of a meeting of area contractors and community leaders set up by Miller.

The county being a member of the Kansas

Economic Development Council, Miller attended the meetings as a voice for the county.

She brought the county's mayors together for a mayors' roundtable, in addition to forming a Cherokee County Tourism Roundtable for those involved in tourism businesses.

She also was responsible for procuring a favorable agreement with Liberty Utilities to provide an office for the CCED to operate from.

"We are really sorry to see Janet leave, she has been so important to building the programs and the organization," said CCED Board Member Thomas Niegisch. "How many directors would take a cut in pay to help keep the program going, the way Janet did during the early years."

the validity of the information.

100 Years Ago

February 19-21, 1922
Asserting that the anti-Lewis faction of the United Mine Workers proposes to carry "the cause of the Kansas miners into every mining district in the country," Frank Farrington, president of the Illinois mine workers, characterized the success at the just completed convention of John L. Lewis, international president, as "an empty victory."

A roll call which ended the Indianapolis convention's consideration of the Kansas case was marked by an outbreak of disorder during the morning that blocked all action for a time but quiet was restored by a speech of "Mother" Jones, an 85-year-old union organizer, who beseeched the delegates to give respectful consideration to their officials and settle down to their main work - adoption of wage policy.

A girl held in the county jail at Iola for four months after being arrested in Pittsburg and known only as "Miss Mary Doe," broke her silence yesterday when she testified in district court that her name was Birdie Labarre, that she is 18 years old and that her home is Kansas City, Mo. The girl was charged with cashing interest coupons from defaulted Rock Island railroad company bonds.

night about 7:20 o'clock near an alley on West Fourth street just beyond the United Presbyterian church. The culprit ran down the alley. Also Sunday night an automobile was stolen from in front of the Methodist church. It was the property of A. H. Armstrong.

50 Years Ago

February 19-21, 1972
State Sen Tom R. Van Sickle, R-Fort Scott, who has frequently been at odds with the Highway Commission over the allocation of funds for upgrading U.S. 69 to freeway status along the Missouri border, accused the commission of taking advantage of a newly signed \$320 million highway bonding program to siphon off some freeway fund money for pet projects.

It's down the river today for four National Guardsmen from Pittsburg Guard units as they take part in a float trip down the Neosho River, sponsored by the 3rd Battalion, 137th Infantry, Kansas Army National Guard, headquartered at Iola. The trip has been billed as an exercise to test cold weather clothing and equipment as well as a recruiting incentive for 3rd Battalion unites in southeast Kansas.

William T. Niggemann, 61, county engineer of

Crawford County for about 27 years and former acting postmaster of Girard, died at 8:30 p.m. Saturday at Mercy Hospital in Fort Scott. He had been in ill health for the past couple of years. His condition had been critical for several weeks.

The mile-long strip of North 200th Street may not be vacated officially yet, but it has been

blocked and marked as "closed." And with good reason - it's under water. In the targeted area for Bone Creek Reservoir, the majority of a mile section of 200th between 690th and 700th avenues has been selected by the Crawford County Commission to be vacated.

As Assistant Fire Chief Jim Hobson says, the Sheridan Township Rural Fire Department's new fire truck may not be new, but it's new to the firefighters. The fire department took delivery of a 1972 Ford C-900 pumper truck. The truck, which has a 1,000-gallon water capacity, cost \$19,500 and was purchased from Fire Master Apparatus in Springfield, Mo.

It wasn't your typical break-in, but it's still against the law. Last week a computer hacker broke into the academic computer systems at Pittsburg State University. The system - which houses e-mail, web pages and other services - was down over the weekend. In 1878, Thomas Edison received a U.S. patent for "an improvement in phonograph or speaking machines."

In 1942, during World War II, President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed Executive Order 9066, which paved the way for the relocation and internment of people of Japanese ancestry, including U.S.-born citizens.

In 1945, Operation Detachment began during World War II as some 30,000 U.S. Marines began landing on Iwo Jima, where they commenced a successful month-long battle to seize control of the island from Japanese forces.

In 1959, an agreement was signed by Britain, Turkey and Greece granting

ing Cyprus its independence.

In 1976, President Gerald R. Ford, calling the issuing of the internment order for people of Japanese ancestry in 1942 "a sad day in American history," signed a proclamation formally confirming its termination.

In 1985, the British soap opera "EastEnders" debuted on BBC Television.

In 1986, the U.S. Senate approved, 83-11, the Genocide Convention, an international treaty outlawing "acts committed with intent to destroy, in whole or in part, a national, ethnic, racial or religious group," nearly 37 years after the pact was first submitted for ratification.

In 1997, Deng Xiaoping (dung shah-oh-ping),

the last of China's major Communist revolutionaries, died at age 92.

In 2003, an Iranian military plane carrying 275 members of the elite Revolutionary Guards crashed in southeastern Iran, killing all on board.

In 2019, President Donald Trump directed the Pentagon to develop plans for a new Space Force within the Air Force, accepting less than the full-fledged department he had wanted.

Ten years ago:

Three skiers were killed when an avalanche swept them about a quarter-mile down an out-of-bounds canyon at Stevens Pass, Washington, but a fourth skier caught up in the slide was saved by a safety device.

tree grants through the Fruit Tree Planting Foundation which provides free trees to certain applicants."

Gilmore noted that the fruit tree grants are similar to normal monetary grants "but they're donating in-kind instead of actual money."

If the Wildcat Extension District was able to get a donation from the Fruit Tree Planting Foundation, "the fruit trees would be completely free," Gilmore said. "They would heavily subsidize any irrigation system, meaning that we would have to put forward at most \$250 to the irrigation system to set it up."

Gilmore said he already knows of some gardeners

and organizations that would be interested in volunteering for a community orchard project.

"Master Gardeners, which I have about 20 volunteers who would love to get some volunteer hours doing this, Eat Well / Live Well Crawford County, who is always interested in getting local food sources into the community, Pittsburg Beautiful obviously, since orchards are a beautification goal for them," Gilmore said.

"Although I have not reached out to them yet, Zone Six Garden Flow as well, so there is a lot of volunteer organizations that would not only help install, but would also help maintain the orchard and the life of the orchard."

Gilmore noted that the Wildcat District likes the area adjacent to the EMS building because "it's

a large open space that would accommodate quite a few fruit trees if it was chosen as a location," he said. "It is also adjacent to the Watco trail, which would increase visibility to the area for the general public, especially in that neighborhood where access to the Watco trail is very easy."

Commission Chairman Tom Moody then responded to Gilmore, noting that he would like for him to reach out to Live Well, "and utilize them any way that you can."

Gilmore said that he has been in talks with Matt O'Malley of Live Well, "regarding different objectives of Live Well / Eat Well Crawford County," adding that O'Malley "is probably my strongest contact as far as community food systems go."

O'Malley said in an in-

terview Friday that there is currently the Pittsburg Community Garden that is run by Pittsburg State University students.

"PSU Enactus students are going to try and breathe new life into the Pittsburg Community Garden," O'Malley said, adding that the garden is primarily for vegetable production.

According to O'Malley, what makes Gilmore's proposal so great is the fact that there are no fruit tree orchards to his knowledge in Crawford County, or any orchard of any kind here in Southeast Kansas, versus Kansas City and other bigger cities.

"Fruit trees produce food for maybe 20 to 25 years, some more some less," said O'Malley. "So once these fruit trees are established it might take

Something much bigger than us

"Contradiction itself, far from always being a criterion of error, is sometimes a sign of truth." — Simone Weil

I was listening to an interview with journalist Mathieu Aikins on NPR last week when a phrase jumped out at me.

He was discussing his new book "The Naked Don't Fear The Water," which details his haphazard and harrowing, underground journey with his longtime Afghan friend and other refugees out of their country in 2016.

The phrase that stood

out was his observation that conditions in refugee camps "muddled the morality" of how one sees the world.

I immediately thought of the United States — that "muddled morality" is what we're experiencing. To wit: muddle - "a disordered or confusing state"; morality - "principles concerning the distinction between right and wrong or good and bad behavior."

What's more, I found myself considering the possibility that it's not the muddle that's the problem so much as our resistance to accepting it.

Thomas Merton speaks to this in "Thoughts in Solitude": "Contradictions have always existed in the soul of man," he writes. "But it is only when we prefer analysis to silence that they become

a constant and insoluble problem."

Here in the USA, we spend a lot of time analyzing, examining, breaking things down, etc. — on all sides of the issues. Some analysis is needed, of course, but in probing our muddle 24-7 on the Internet, Facebook, Twitter, blogs and cable TV, our contradictions become more and more "constant and insoluble."

Which encourages people on both sides of any particular issue — racial inequity, Covid, the insurrection, cancel culture, gun control, climate change, vaccination, book banning, etc. to torque up their rhetoric in support of their stance — or pick their respective bullhorns and blast their opinions louder and louder.

It all amounts to dual-

istic thinking, which assumes a universe where there are only two contrasting, mutually exclusive choices or realities. This thinking, that things are either/or, bad/good, negative/positive has a powerful effect on our belief system and actions.

It blocks our progress.

Of course some things in life truly are either/or and we should call people out when they need to be confronted. Need to speak our piece. Vote. But not at the expense of ignoring the many situations that are both/and.

Ancient wisdom traditions of all religions teach the paradoxical nature of reality and encourage the development of a non-dual mind. Holding on to two seemingly opposite views at the same time is difficult, but it is worth prac-

ting. I know from experience, as I've gradually gotten more comfortable with non-dual thinking over time.

One simple way to practice this is when something seems good/bad or either/or to consider that both could be true at once. Muddled, if you will. And consider that within the muddle lies a deeper truth ... and greater hope.

In "Thoughts In Solitude," Merton addresses this with the following, "We are not meant to resolve all contradictions but to live with them and rise above them and see them in the light of exterior and objective values which make them trivial by comparison."

Merton is offering here, that when we get caught up in resolving contradictions, rather than ac-

cepting them, we lose perspective — get lost in insignificant, petty, frivolous arguments.

And are, therefore, unable to see the truth that in America — and in the rest of the world as well — we're all in this together.

This truth is succinctly put forth in Aikins' book when a Greek man yells at some Afghan migrants, then apologizes: "Tell them it's nothing personal. ... We're both stuck in the middle of something much bigger than us."

In 1972, a presidential candidate unadapted to his habitat

MANCHESTER, N.H. — Fifty years ago this week, he cried. Or maybe it was just the snow melting across his face. What happened that day on Amherst Street doesn't matter now. It mattered then.

Two weeks before the 1972 New Hampshire primary, the front-running candidate, Edmund S. Muskie, stood before the office of the Manchester Union Leader to respond to a letter to the editor, which charged that he laughed about the characterization of French-speakers — an important constituency in the state — as "Canucks." Though the NHL's Vancouver franchise today uses that term, it was regarded as a slur then,

and the letter, planted by Richard M. Nixon's "dirty-tricks" team, provoked the Maine senator into an angry response that might have doomed his presidential candidacy and surely changed the trajectory of the Democrats' race to select a nominee to oppose Nixon's reelection bid.

Today, Muskie's campaign can be regarded as one of the most colossal busts in American history. Few political figures embarked on a presidential race with the assets, adviser talent and high hopes of the Muskie campaign, built on the senator's strong showing as Hubert H. Humphrey's running mate in 1968 and his bravura performance in a televised pre-election speech in which he lacerated Nixon before the 1970 midterm elections.

But the Muskie cam-

paigned, which fizzled out weeks after the "crying" incident, today stands as a symbol of the emergence of a new brand of American politics, where press expectations ruled, where the endorsement of traditional political power centers lost their influence, and where rank-and-file voters rather than party bosses held sway. Muskie, whose profile today is the very model of the old-style politician, was a transitional figure, trampled by the new folkways and new party procedures.

"Muskie was really one of the great American figures in the 20th century," says Joel Goldstein, a Saint Louis University legal scholar who is writing a Muskie biography. "He was a far better government servant than a presidential-primary contender. He had a deep un-

derstanding of American constitutional principles and was widely respected by his colleagues."

That was enough in 1952, when Gov. Adlai E. Stevenson won the Democratic nomination. It was not enough in 1972.

Muskie was a casualty of the change in the nominating system that emphasized primaries and caucuses and made it necessary to be a full-time candidate; he was, in short, the perfect smoke-filled room candidate of an era when national party leaders, union bosses and influential county chairs wielded extraordinary influence. Muskie was more interested in polishing the Clean Air Act in the back rooms of a Capitol Hill committee chamber than in mixing with actual voters in a New Hampshire grange hall. He also had a visceral aversion to campaign promises.

Muskie's failure grew out of his success in Maine, where, as a rare Democrat in a Republican state, he seldom faced party challenges, never had to deal with competing political factions and merely had to reassure the dominant GOP voter base that he would not break up the banks and destroy the country clubs.

"The real reason the campaign failed was the candidate," says the commentator Mark Shields, at the time a Muskie strategist and organizer. "He wasn't prepared for the land mines of the party. And he didn't enjoy the politics of politics. Bill Clinton enjoyed them. Barack Obama didn't, but got more out of it psychologically than Muskie. Muskie would have made a far better president than a presidential candidate."

Plus, Muskie had a raging temper.

"Underneath this image of the grave moderate were ... two essential qualities not yet recognized by the public but more than casually troublesome to Muskie's staff," wrote the election chronicler Theodore H. White. "He had a tendency to emotional outburst; and an even graver disability — a lawyer-like, ponderous way of dealing with all issues and even the most trivial decisions."

The brisk sound bite made its debut in the 1968 campaign. It was at the center of politics by 1972. Muskie did not do sound bites.

While there was deep disquiet in Muskie headquarters at 1725 K Street in northwest Washington, all that was masked by the high expectations for his candidacy — as a Maine man positioned to cruise in New England, as a Polish-American likely to prevail in early primary states that, by pure chance, had sizable Polish populations, and with the legions of endorsements he won.

"Muskie had signed up just about every Democratic politician in the country whose name was well known by more than a hundred people," wrote the gonzo journalist Hunter S. Thompson, "and it did him about as much good as a notarized endorsement from Martin Bormann."

Despite the tears, or the snow, Muskie did well in New Hampshire. He won that first primary in a field with Sen. George S. McGovern of South Dakota and the anti-communist, populist Mayor Sam Yorty of Los Angeles. No political powerhouse, Yorty had the backing of Union Leader publisher William Loeb, whose conservative newspaper published 71

stories, 38 photographs and 14 supporting editorials in favor of its chosen candidate.

Muskie took 46% of the vote, higher than any Democratic candidate who followed, with the exception of Al Gore (50% in 2000) and Bernie Sanders (60% in 2016). It was an impressive performance, outpolling McGovern's 37%.

And yet the press, which set 50% as Muskie's target, portrayed him as a loser, a theme his rivals swiftly adopted. "Even if he claims victory, as he will," McGovern said on election night, "it's not the sort of victory he imagined."

Thus, expectations became the leitmotif of American politics.

"I think when you come from a neighboring state, when you are running virtually unopposed, and when you are the front-runner to begin with," Sen. Bob Dole, then the chair of the Republican National Committee, told me just before he died, "you could naturally be expected to get at least two-thirds of the vote."

He understood the peril. The distance between Hamburg, Iowa, and Hiawatha in Dole's Kansas is only 67 miles. Dole took 2.5% in the Iowa caucuses eight years after Muskie's 46% in neighboring New Hampshire.

As for Muskie, he finished behind Humphrey and Gov. George Wallace of Alabama the next week in Florida, and won Illinois with 63% the following week. Then he faded into presidential politics history.

Colgan beats Frontenac to secure CNC crown

Sophomore post player Lily Brown worked inside for 30 points as St. Mary's Colgan defeated Frontenac 52-41 Friday night and clinched the CNC League girls basketball championship at the SMC Fieldhouse.

The Panthers (17-0, 11-0 CNC) secured the outright league title after sharing last season's honors with Frontenac and Girard.

Brown sank 12 field goals and 6-of-10 free throws for her 30 points after being held to just six points in the Panthers 48-44 win at Frontenac last month.

"Lily didn't have her best game against them last time, and I thought she played phenomenal tonight," Panthers coach Abby Farabi said. "I think she was a little more comfortable, and she knew we needed her."

Lauren Torrance, a junior and the other half of Colgan's inside punch, added 15 points, including nine in the second half.

points. Brown's 16 first-half points led Colgan to a 24-19 lead at the intermission -- the largest lead of the half. Colgan added five

points to its lead -- an Emily Imhof 3-pointer from the corner and a Brown layup -- in the first five minutes of the second half. The Panthers led 33-21 after three quarters as Rylee Green's layup gave the Raiders their only points in the stanza.

"The looks we got weren't that bad," Fields said. "When you don't put them down, you have to make up a lot of ground."

The Raiders certainly made up ground, cutting a 16-point deficit early in the final quarter to 40-35 on Pyle's 3-pointer from the top of the key with three minutes left.

"I think we just got looser," Fields said. "We understood that we had to shoot, and that kind of takes the pressure away from you and we got a few to go down."

But the Panthers sank 8-of-10 free throws the rest of the way to maintain their lead.

"We got a good lead, and they started hitting shots they hadn't been hitting," Farabi said. "I think the difference between this game and last game was we were attacking still. Last game we sat back and missed some shots. This game we played to win instead of not to lose."

Colgan's three seniors -- Emily Imhof, Gabi Radell and Lauren Yagmour -- were recognized after the game.

"What they've done for this program is remarkable," Farabi said. "They've put us on the map. They've been great leaders, and I can't say enough good things about them."

Both teams close the regular season next week on the road.

The Panthers visit Girard and Frontenac travels to Columbus on Tuesday night, and the Raiders have a makeup game Thursday night at Riverton.

Gorillas go for sweep over Lions

Pittsburg State's 95-82 victory on Wednesday night at Missouri Southern was the Gorillas' highest-scoring game of the season.

In fact, it was their most points in an MIAA game since a 96-82 victory at Northeastern State on Jan. 27, 2018.

The Gorillas beat the Lions for the third time in their last 13 meetings and the first time in Joplin since 2011. They will be going for their first season sweep over MSSU since 2007 when they clash again at 3:30 Saturday afternoon at John Lance Arena.

"Every game is going to be tough, especially in this conference," PSU guard R.J. Lawrence said. "We have to learn from our mistakes in (Wednesday's) game and definitely be ready to play Saturday. They are going to come hungry. They are going to come ready to knock us off."

"I'm sure they are going to be motivated," Gorillas coach Kim Anderson said. "I hope our guys don't think they are going to walk out at John Lance Arena and win

by 13. I think it will be a heck of a game. There may be a whole different group of people contribute who didn't contribute (Wednesday). If you play well, you get to play."

The Gorillas (7-18, 6-13 MIAA) shot 53 percent while building a 48-35 halftime advantage and hit 48 percent (28-of-59) for the game.

Reserves Magic Reli-

ford, who made five of PSU's 11 3-pointers, and R.J. Lawrence hit 24 and 21 points, respectively. Tyler Hawkins added 18 points, and Bobby Arthur-Williams had 11 -- all on free throws in the last nine minutes.

"We have to continue to trust each other," Lawrence said. "We have to move the ball, make sure we're taking the right shots, making the right moves, the right passes. We have to make sure we're careful when we make high-risk plays. We have to stay calm."

"I think guys relaxed," Anderson said. "We had some guys come and play extremely well who haven't gotten to play a lot ... Magic being one of those guys, and R.J. has been playing more lately. They came in, and they made shots. When you're in our situation, there's not quite as much pressure. You're just out there kind of hoopin'. I think we did a good job of that."

"We did a pretty good job defensively for a while. We had a couple of points in the game when we let them get back in the game because we didn't their pressure properly. Playing against pressure the whole game only turning

it over 11 times, not bad. "You have to give some kudos to Antonio (Givens)," Anderson said. "Antonio didn't have big numbers, but he had big numbers for a short period of time (five points and eight rebounds in 17 minutes). It was hard to leave him in there because they were playing a smaller lineup. He contributed what he could, went and sat down and cheered for his teammates."

Lawson Jenkins had 24 points in 23 minutes off the bench to lead the Lions (13-11, 10-8). Stan Scott scored 15 and Winston Dessesow 13 as Missouri Southern shot 44 percent (32-of-73).

"When you have to coach effort, we're not going to be very good," Lions coach Jeff Boschee said. "We've had to coach it a lot this year."

"One thing we need to adjust to is playing harder. I don't think it's anything crazy (PSU) is doing and killing us. We couldn't guard... We fouled too much. We couldn't slow them down. They made some 3s that killed us in the first half and the whole game. Our defensive transition was awful."

Gorillas face tall task against Missouri Southern

Pittsburg State faces a tall task -- literally -- when the Gorillas and Missouri Southern complete their back-to-back rivalry week series at 1:30 Saturday afternoon on Whetzel Court inside John Lance Arena.

The Lions (19-5, 15-3 MIAA and riding a 12-game winning streak) defeated the Gorillas 80-65 on Wednesday night in Joplin thanks in big part to scoring advantages of 44-18 in the paint and 41-31 in rebounds. A 14-8 MSSU advantage in offensive boards led to a 14-7 edge in second-chance points.

"They are tough to keep out of the paint," Gorillas coach Amanda Davied said. "Any time you have balance like they have with the point guard coming off a ball screen who can score with a post player who can roll and be big and a post player who can pop (and hit the midrange jumper), it causes a lot of concern. In some ways we have a little bit of that but not as much height. It does make it hard to guard."

Madi Stokes, 6-foot-3 sophomore center, set career highs of 25 points and 13 rebounds in Wednesday's game. She averages 10.9 points and 7.4 boards for the season.

Lacy Stokes, 5-4 guard who will be league freshman of the year and a candidate for player of the year, added 22 points, seven assists and six rebounds. It was her fifth 20-point game in the last six games and 10th of the season.

Tristan Gegg, 5-7 senior guard, tallied 25 points for the Gorillas (15-10, 10-9). Guard Sydnee Crain and center Karena Gerber each had 10 points, and Crain had five assists.

"We have to find a way to get us in more rhythm or more flow," Davied said. "The first quarter we had some good looks. We just have to knock them down. We have to get more offensive rebounds if we can."

"We have to box out a lot better," Gegg said. "They know what we do, and we know what they do. We have to be way more aggressive, move the ball more on offense and just play more together."

The Gorillas will look to

play better defense without fouling. While PSU actually had only two more fouls than the Lions (18-16), Missouri Southern went 21-of-24 at the line to the Gorillas' 11-of-15.

The Gorillas shot 41 percent (23-of-56) from the floor, a mark raised by their 50 percent shooting (13-of-26) in the second half.

"The third and fourth quarter offensively, they got some good looks," Lions coach Ronnie Ressel said. "They made some plays. Defensively we have to do a better job on driving and where our help is coming from."

"We made them take tough shots in the first half," Ressel said. "And they made some. Tristan Gegg, she is so good, I have so much respect for her. Her ability to score the basketball is so high. We knew going in she's going to make some shots ... they are going to make some tough shots. Jayme Jackson makes tough shots. We have to understand, you play good defense, OK. Try to make them take another tough shot on the next one. I think you will make them

miss more tough shots than wide-open layups, wide-open 3s. I think our kids did a pretty good job."

The Lions' victory on Wednesday was just

their second in the last 13 games against the Gorillas. Missouri Southern has not won in Pittsburg since 2015, and it hasn't swept the Gorillas in a season series since 2007.

CFP to remain 4 teams through ‘25 after expansion talks fail

What started last summer with the enthusiastic unveiling of a plan for a 12-team College Football Playoff has come to a halt with the winter news that expansion will not happen until at least 2026.

The CFP is set to remain a four-team format through the 2025 season after the administrators who manage the post-season failed to agree on a plan to expand before the current contracts run out.

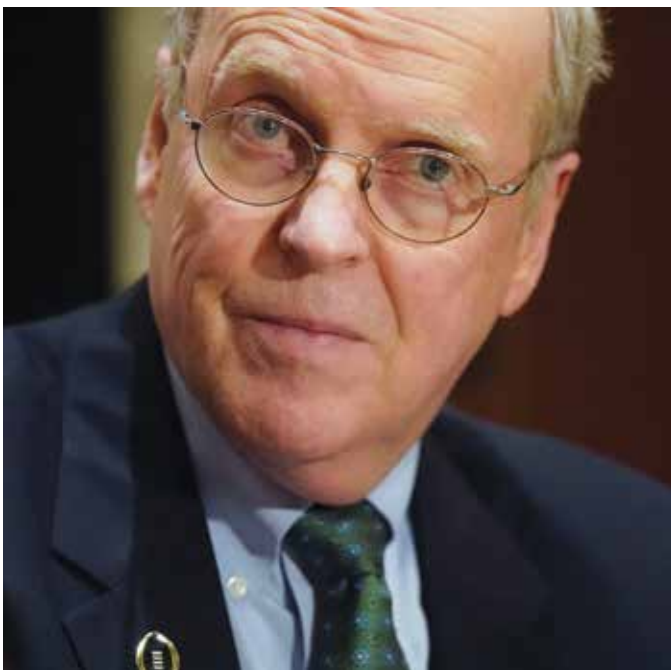
“I’m disappointed we couldn’t get something in place,” American Athletic Conference Commissioner Mike Aresco told The Associated Press on Friday. “Time was running out. The disappointment also stems from the fact that I think we will eventually get there and I think 12-team is still the most likely scenario.”

The CFP management committee, comprised of 10 conference commissioners and Notre Dame’s athletic director, met by video conference earlier this week.

Aresco, who released a letter Monday detailing the obstacles to expansion, said the purpose of the call was to determine if anyone’s position had changed.

“Positions hadn’t changed. So at that point, I guess the implications were clear,” he said.

Unable to break an impasse, the commissioners decided to abandon efforts to implement a 12-team format for the 2024 season

and recommended staying with the current model to the presidents who oversee the playoff.

The Board of Managers accepted the recommendation Thursday and directed the commissioners to continue discussions on a new format to go into effect for the 2026 season.

“Even though the outcome did not lead to a recommendation for an early expansion before the end of the current 12-year contract, the discussions have been helpful and informative,” CFP Executive Director Bill Hancock said in statement Friday. “I am sure they will serve as a

useful guide for the Board of Managers and for the Management Committee as we determine what the playoff will look like beginning in the 2026-2027 season.”

The decision to shelve early expansion comes as no surprise. The commissioners left their last in-person meetings in early January gridlocked and unable to produce the unanimous consensus needed to move forward with a 12-team proposal they had been haggling over since June.

The presidents did not fully close the door on early expansion after that

meeting, but hope for an agreement was clearly fading.

A few days after the meetings in Indianapolis, Atlantic Coast Conference Commissioner Jim Phillips took the strongest public stance yet against early expansion, saying a new CFP format should not be a priority with so much uncertainty throughout college sports.

On Friday, the commissioners finally signaled they have given up on on trying to implement expansion for the final two years of the CFP’s 12-year deal with ESPN — a failure that will cost the conferences an estimated \$450 million in additional revenue.

Now they will focus their attention on building a new model for beyond the 2026 season when there are no agreements in place.

The road to expansion appeared to be much smoother eight months ago, when the CFP publicly unveiled the 12-team plan. Even with details still be worked out, there was hope agreement could be reached by the fall and a new format could be in place by the 2024 season.

About a month later, it was revealed the Southeastern Conference was in talks with Texas and Oklahoma to leave the Big 12 and join the powerhouse league that has produced 12 of the last 17 national champions.

SEC Commissioner Greg Sankey had been part of the four-person subcommittee that worked on

the 12-team proposal for more than two years. The plan called for the field to be comprised of the six highest ranked conference champions in FBS and six at-large teams determined by selection committee rankings.

Relatively new commissioners in the Big Ten, Pac-12 and ACC, already leery of a process that started before they were involved with the CFP, became even more disillusioned after the SEC’s expansion plan became public.

Since then the process has stalled, despite more than half a dozen in-person meetings with the commissioners. All agree the playoff should expand, but they disagree on how and when.

Big Ten Commissioner Kevin Warren has said he favors automatic bids for the champions of the Power Five leagues, instead of the six best champs regardless of conference. The commissioners of the non-Power Five conferences, the so-called Group of Five, are against that — with Aresco the most vocal opponent.

Phillips continued to push for a smaller expansion to eight, if any at all.

Pac-12 Commissioner George Kliavkoff said his conference, which has only placed a team in two of eight playoffs, supports any number of formats involving eight or 12 teams. But he was asking for the Rose Bowl to retain its traditional New Year’s Day time slot in a new format and the most of the others were not on board.

Meanwhile, the majority of the group remained steadfast in support of the initial 12-team proposal crafted by Sankey, Big 12 Commissioner Bob Bowlsby, Mountain West Commissioner Craig Thompson and Notre Dame AD Jack Swarbrick.

Sankey has said the SEC already made a concession by agreeing to expand from a playoff format in which the conference has never failed to place at least one team. But he acknowledged that allowing more teams to participate could boost interest in the sport nationally.

Sankey made clear: The choices for the remainder of the current agreement were 12 teams or four.

Despite the potential benefits to expanding early, four it is.

Former Angels employee convicted in Tyler Skaggs' overdose death

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) — A former Los Angeles Angels employee was convicted Thursday of providing Angels pitcher Tyler Skaggs the drugs that led to his overdose death in Texas.

Eric Kay, 47, was convicted on one count each of drug distribution resulting in death and drug conspiracy. He faces at least 20 years and up to life in prison when he is sentenced on June 28.

Skaggs' widow, Carli, and his mother, Debbie Hetman, hugged as the verdict was announced. Kay took off his jacket and tie and was placed into handcuffs, nodding toward his family and friends in the courtroom.

A 10-woman, two-man jury revealed the verdict after deliberating for no more than three hours following an eight-day trial. Kay was tried in federal court in Fort Worth, about 15 miles from where the Angels were supposed to open a four-game series against the Texas Rangers on July 1, 2019, the day Skaggs was found dead in a suburban Dallas hotel room.

"We're obviously disappointed in the verdict. We thought there were many reasons to doubt the government's case," said Reagan Wynn, one of Kay's attorneys. "This is a tragedy all the way around. Eric Kay is getting ready to do minimum 20 years in a federal penitentiary and it goes up from there. And Tyler Skaggs is gone."

A coroner's report said Skaggs, 27, had choked to death on his vomit, and a toxic mix of alcohol, fentanyl and oxycodone was in his system.

"This case is a sober reminder: Fentanyl kills. Anyone who deals fentanyl — whether on the streets or out of a world-famous baseball stadium — puts his or her buyers at risk. No one is immune from this deadly drug," U.S. Attorney Chad E. Meacham said in a statement.

The trial included testimony from five major league players who said they received oxycodone pills from Kay at various times from 2017-19, the years Kay was accused of obtaining pills and giving them to players at Angel Stadium. Kay also used drugs himself, according

to testimony and court documents.

Pitcher Matt Harvey, who rose to stardom with the New York Mets nearly a decade ago, said he knew he was threatening his career by admitting to cocaine use in New York and California.

Harvey, one of the players who said he received oxycodone pills from Kay but also obtained them for Skaggs in 2019, said he was subpoenaed and testified only because he was granted immunity from prosecution. Harvey is unsigned after pitching for Baltimore last season.

"The players' testimony was incredibly difficult for our organization to hear, and it is a reminder that too often drug use and addiction are hidden away," Angels president John Carpino said in a statement released by the team after the verdict. "From the moment we learned of Tyler's death, our focus has been to fully understand the circumstances that led to this tragedy."

The Skaggs family has filed wrongful death lawsuits in Texas and California against the Angels, who have said they weren't aware of any employees providing opioids to players, or that Skaggs was using them.

In closing arguments, lead prosecutor Lindsey Beran said the government proved that Kay was the only one who could have given Skaggs the drugs that led to his death, that the delivery was in Texas and that fentanyl was the cause of death. The government argued Kay gave Skaggs counterfeit oxycodone pills that contained fentanyl.

Beran reminded jurors of the testimony of Harvey and fellow major league pitchers Cam Bedrosian and Blake Parker saying Skaggs' death scared them away from using oxycodone. Harvey testified the painkiller was commonly used in a league where players often face surgeries and deal with injuries.

"Blake Parker, 'I had a flashback to 2017 and I thought it could have been me,'" Beran told the jury, quoting the pitcher. "All of those people were one pill away from dying alone in a hotel room from a drug that Eric Kay gave them."

Lead defense attorney Michael Molfetta said prosecutors didn't prove Kay gave Skaggs the drugs after the team landed in Texas on a flight from California, or that fentanyl was the sole cause.

Molfetta pointed to a white board prosecutors said made their case. It was filled with magnetic tiles showing text messages between Skaggs and Kay, and departure and arrival times along with other elements from June 30 and July 1.

"Those tiles, these things they've put up there, they prove nothing but what's on the tiles," Molfetta told the jury. "There are so many assumptions behind it."

Molfetta declined to speak to reporters after the verdict.

Kay served as the team's public relations contact on many road trips, and the trip to Texas was his first since returning from rehab. Kay was placed on leave shortly after Skaggs' death and never returned to the team. He

didn't testify.

Defense attorneys acknowledged Kay lied to police the day Skaggs was found dead by saying he hadn't seen him the previous night. One of his colleagues at the time, current Angels director of communications Adam Chodzko, said Kay confided in him a couple of weeks later that he had been in Skaggs' hotel room. Chodzko testified that Kay told him he didn't give Skaggs pills that night and declined an offer from Skaggs to do drugs in the room.

Carli Skaggs testified she didn't know the extent of her husband's drug use, and would have tried to do something about it if she had.

Hetman testified her son had issues with Percocet, a combination of oxycodone and acetaminophen, in 2013 but that he quit "cold turkey" at the time.

Garet Ramos, Skaggs' stepbrother, testified he couldn't remember the details of trying to help wean Skaggs off Percocet nine years ago and denied deleting text messages from his phone at the police department in Southlake, the suburb where Skaggs was found dead.

The medical examiner who conducted the autopsy testified there was a "greater probability" that fentanyl, which is significantly more potent than oxycodone, caused Skaggs' death. Dr. Marc Krouse also said there was a "reduced probability" that alcohol and oxycodone caused the death. An expert for the government said it was a near-certainty fentanyl led to Skaggs' death.

MLB cancels spring games through March 4 due to lockout

NEW YORK (AP) — Major League Baseball canceled the first week of spring training games through March 4 in the first public acknowledgment of the disruption caused by the lockout.

The announcement Friday came with the work stoppage in its 79th day, and a day after talks on economics between management and the Major League Baseball Players Association lasted just 15 minutes.

Negotiators are set to resume bargaining on core economics on Monday in Jupiter, Florida, and MLB said members of the owners' negotiating committee will attend the session, just the seventh on the central issues of the dispute since the lockout began Dec. 2.

Spring training was to have started this week, and the exhibition schedule on Feb. 26. There were 16 games set for that day, including the World Series champion Atlanta Braves playing Boston in Florida and the renamed Cleveland Guardians taking on Cincinnati in Arizona.

"We regret that, without a collective bargaining agreement in place, we must postpone the start of spring training games until no earlier than Saturday, March 5," MLB said in a statement. "All 30 clubs are unified in their strong desire to bring players back to the field and fans back to the stands."

MLB told the union it thinks Feb. 28 is the last possible date to reach an agreement that would allow a timely start to the season. The union didn't respond to MLB on whether it agrees with that date or thinks there is additional time.

Players issued a statement criticizing management for the stoppage.

"Nothing requires the league to delay the start of spring training, much like nothing required the league's decision to implement the lockout in the first place," the union said. "Despite the decisions by

the league, players remain committed to the negotiating process."

Baseball Commissioner Rob Manfred has said the lockout decision was made to control timing and prevent a late-season strike in the absence of a labor contract, such as the August 1994 lockout that led to the first cancellation of the World Series in nine decades.

This is the third straight disrupted spring training, damaging local tourism economies in Florida and Arizona.

Games were cut short on March 12, 2020, because of the coronavirus pandemic, leading to opening day being pushed back from March 26 to July 23 and each team's schedule cut from 162 games to 60.

While spring training started on time last year, pandemic restrictions led to capacity limits that depressed attendance.

Negotiations had been taking place at the offices of MLB and the union in New York. The switch in venue for next week was to accommodate players who are in Florida.

For the most part, owners and players have joined the bargaining by Zoom. Colorado Rockies CEO Dick Monfort, chairman of the owners' labor policy committee, and free agent reliever Andrew Miller both attended the Jan. 24 session, the first in-person bargaining during the lockout.

"We are committed to reaching an agreement that is fair to each side," MLB said. "On Monday, members of the owners' bargaining committee will join an in-person meeting with the players' association and remain every day next week to negotiate and work hard towards starting the season on time."

Spring training workouts were to have started Wednesday.

"The clubs have adopted a uniform policy that provides an option for full refunds for fans who have purchased tickets from the clubs to any spring training games that are not taking place," MLB said.

Celebrating 75: Cleveland again welcomes back NBA's greats

CLEVELAND (AP) — The NBA is honoring its 75th anniversary team during Sunday's All-Star Game, though the league likely won't be able to duplicate the magic from 25 years ago in its return to Cleveland.

In 1997, Michael Jordan climbed up first, the game's reigning superstar a fitting leadoff to the 50th anniversary team celebration.

George Mikan was last, the player considered the

NBA's first superstar getting a helping hand onto the platform in front of him from Bill Russell.

The golden anniversary ceremony was simple yet stirring.

Celebrating the 75th anniversary team is anything but simple. Some players have died and others are unwilling — or unable — to travel amid the coronavirus pandemic. Back in 1997, all but one of those 50 greats were still alive and 47 of the 50 were in attendance.

The players who will be in Cleveland are cherish-

ing another chance to remember the past and celebrate the present.

"It's just nice to be here and to be remembered and an opportunity to see and visit with some of the old guys that I remember and watch the new ones," Hall of Famer Bob Pettit said Friday. "And that's special good."

The former St. Louis Hawks star of the 1950s and '60s is 89, carrying a cane to help him with his balance. He said there's still a few, though not many players from his day that he sees when players from the past come together.

Hall of Famer Elvin Hayes caught up with Archie Clark, an old teammate from the Baltimore Bullets who told him that he should have passed the big man the ball more.

Not that that acknowledgement means much nearly 50 years later.

"When he was playing with us, he didn't give it me," Hayes laughed, before turning more serious when discussing these reunions.

"But I think that it also gives you an opportunity to miss people," he said. "I miss Wes Unseld not being here. I miss Nate Thurman not being here, so it's one of those kind of things that you appreciate a lot of the guys who are here, but you miss also those guys who are not here."

Only Pete Maravich had died when the 50th anniversary team was honored, being represented by his sons. Jerry West couldn't make it and Shaquille O'Neal, then an active player, was injured. Charles Barkley was

still active when he took part in that celebration and recalled meeting Wilt Chamberlain, the larger-than-life center who died about 2 1/2 years later. Russell, the towering centerpiece of the Celtics dynasty of the 1950s and '60s, is now 88.

"Just to be around all those legends was pretty special," the Hall of Famer and TNT analyst said. "And this year, obviously now I've been retired over 20 years, so I don't get a chance to be around LeBron and Kevin Durant and guys like that and take pictures, so it's going to be an amazing, special time."

"I mean, you think about, there's a couple guys maybe had a gripe, but it's going to be realistically like a who's who of basketball royalty."

Pettit has tickets to New Orleans Pelicans games. Hayes attends many Houston Rockets games. The old-timers enjoy watching today's players — though Rick Barry would have liked to test himself against them.

"You know how much better I would be if I was playing today?" the Hall of Famer said. "Seriously. I had no weight lifting. We had no strength coach, no agility coach. We had no dietician. We did nothing to help us. I'd be faster, stronger, quicker, more endurance, jump higher. I'd be so much better a basketball player today than I was back when I played because of the training and the sophistication of what goes on in every sport."

Olympic ideal exposed as farce on sad night in China

BEIJING (AP) — No matter how the IOC tries to spin it, the enduring symbol of the Beijing Games — and really, the entire Olympic movement — is a sad little girl put in an untenable position by adults who have no shame.

A lot of serious issues will need to be addressed after the flame is extinguished, from doping rules to age limits to tyrannical coaches, but we shouldn't lose sight of the bigger questions:

What will it take for the Olympics to truly live up to its ideals?

Is meaningful change even possible at this point?

“Who will save Olympic and Paralympic sport in our time?” asked Max Cobb, the president and CEO of the U.S. biathlon program. “I don't think the movement can take many more years of this doubted authenticity before its value is so eroded that other interests eclipse it and it's lost for another millennia.”

Kamila Valieva flew away from the Winter Olympics on Friday, her dreams crushed at the tender age of 15, and there's no reason to think she'd ever want to return after what she went through in Beijing.

The Russian child — and let's not lose sight that she is just a child — shouldn't have been allowed to compete in women's figure

skating after testing positive for a banned heart medication.

But compete she did, setting up the heartbreaking spectacle of a gold medal favorite, thoroughly overwhelmed by the scrutiny of the past two weeks, stumbling and tumbling completely out of the medals on an extraordinary night at the Capital Indoor Stadium.

As difficult as it was to watch, maybe it was a good thing it happened. The hypocrisy of the Olympic movement has never been more apparent than those four minutes when the world came together to watch a train wreck in real time.

Each time Valieva

botched a jump, the images should've flashed through our consciousness.

The Olympics being held in a country accused of genocide against its Uyghur minority. The Russians getting one pass after another despite repeated doping violations and cover-ups. Sponsors concerned only with their bottom lines. The International Olympic Committee turning a blind eye to it all, content with the status quo as long as it comes with first-class flights, five-star hotels and per diems that are more than some people make in a year.

If anyone tried to turn away, they should've had

their eyes pried open like Malcolm McDowell in “A Clockwork Orange.”

IOC President Thomas Bach took to the microphone the morning after the figure skating debacle to feign all sorts of outrage at the way things went down, which should carry about as much weight as one of Kanye's Twitter rants.

“I must say I was very, very disturbed when I watched the competition on TV,” Bach said, trying to sound earnest. “To see her there struggling on the ice, seeing how she tries to compose herself again, how then she tries to finish her program, you could in every movement in the body language, you

could feel that this is an immense, immense mental stress and maybe she would have preferred just to leave the ice and try to leave this story behind her.”

Of course, Bach and his minions at the IOC would love nothing more than to leave this story behind.

Rest assured, in the days and weeks and months to come, they'll speak glowingly of their 2 1/2 weeks in China, undoubtedly portraying Valieva as a mere blip in another hugely successful games. Once all the checks clear, they'll tally up their profits and look giddily toward an even bigger haul in Paris, two years down the road, when hopefully the scourge of COVID-19 has waned.

We can't let them get away so easily.

The Olympic movement needs a total reset of its priorities, which probably won't happen until big-money sponsors and influential broadcasters such as NBC actually threaten to put away their checkbooks.

“It's time for NBC, Visa, Proctor & Gamble, Alibaba and all the rest to step in and get this right for the athletes,” said Travis Tygart, CEO of the U.S. Anti-Doping Agency. “Enough fence-straddling by companies that financially prop up the Games. They're the real power and they need to step in and do the right thing for athletes.”

Tygart's main focus is the doping code that was largely a sham in Beijing.

Valieva's youth — and the special treatment it afforded her under the rules — has already led to calls for raising the minimum age of Olympic athletes to 18.

That's a start, but only the tip of an enormous iceberg. The system seems largely designed to protect the dopers, at the expense of those athletes who try to do things the right way.

“With probably well over \$100 million spent on global anti-doping efforts annually, how did all that well-intended effort leave athletes and the sport-loving public so utterly unsatisfied, disillusioned and feeling that the integrity of sport hangs in the balance right now?” Cobb rightly asked.

Don't be distracted by the shiny object the IOC is already trying to throw our way, to distract us from the bigger, systematic issues.

Yes, Valieva's bully of a coach, Eteri Tutberidze, deserves all the scorn we can muster for the way she treated the crestfallen teen coming off the ice. “Why did you let it go? Why did you stop fighting?” Tutberidze asked Valieva, like a shark circling its prey.

“When I afterwards saw how she was received by her closest entourage, with such a what appeared to be a tremendous coldness, it was chilling to see this,” Bach said.

Even more chilling is what the Olympic movement has become.

The whole world saw it during four pathetic minutes in Beijing.

Gu's global coming-out party ends with 3rd Olympic medal

BEIJING (AP) — Eileen Gu turned the Beijing Olympics into her own personal playground.

In the city. In the mountains. Spinning, flipping and flying above three different venues.

The American-born Gu came into the Games hoping to win three gold medals in freestyle skiing while representing China, where her mother was born. She didn't, but she did come away with two golds and one silver, making her the first action-sports athlete to win three medals at the same Olympics.

The 18-year-old Gu capped her global coming-out party Friday by winning the gold medal in women's halfpipe. She had such a big lead after two runs that she was able to take a carefree final run down the halfpipe.

“I was very emotional at the top and I chose to do a victory lap,” Gu said. “Because I felt like, for the first time, I like really deserved it and I really

earned it.”

She won the gold medal in the Olympic debut of women's freeski big air in front of an old steel mill in the city. She took the silver in slopestyle on the Secret Garden course, where elements were carved out of snow to resemble portions of the Great Wall. Finally, she dominated in the halfpipe.

Well known in China before these Games, she's now a household name back in the United States and around the world. Part of that had to do with the criticism she received for competing for China rather than the United States.

But a lot of it was due to her skill, confidence and personality.

If there's a face of joy at the Beijing Games, it's Gu and her ever-present smile. It was a remarkable contrast to the tears of Russian figure skater Kamila Valieva after her shocking litany of mistakes left the heavily favored teenager off the podium in women's figure skating, and the disappointment and self-doubt of U.S. skiing superstar

Mikaela Shiffrin after she failed to medal in any of the five individual races she entered.

Gu is also a model and her face is on advertisements all over Beijing. She's been photographed for Vogue, Victoria's Secret, Louis Vuitton, Tiffany and more. Born in San Francisco, she will enroll at Stanford in the fall.

On Friday, she remained undefeated in the halfpipe with exceptional performances on her first two runs. She scored 93.25 on her first run and 95.25 on her second run.

“She has basically set a level that's pretty unattainable for a lot of us,” said American Carly Margulies, who finished 11th.

She also has three stuffed Bing Dwen Dwen mascots that are given to

all medalists. The mascots are so popular that people stand in line for hours in the city trying to buy one. Gu got into the spirit of the Beijing Games by wearing a furry panda hat on the podium.

MEN'S SKICROSS

Ryan Regez led a 1-2 finish by Switzerland in the Olympic skicross final at Genting Snow Park, taking the lead early and never giving it up. He raised his arms in triumph after finishing the course filled with jumps, bumps and rolling terrain. Teammate Alex Fiva finished with the silver medal and Russian athlete Sergey Ridzik grabbed the bronze.

SPEEDSKATING

Thomas Krol won gold in the 1,000 meters, giving the Netherlands its third straight Olympic

speedskating title in the event. The Netherlands earned its fifth gold medal in 12 events in Beijing with one day of competition remaining. Laurent Dubreuil of Canada took silver and Haavard Lorentzen, the 2018 silver medalist, earned bronze.

BIATHLON

Johannes Thingnes Boe of Norway dominated throughout and stayed composed during the four shooting stages to win the gold medal in the men's mass start race.

Justine Braisaz-Bouchet of France used strong shooting and great skiing to win the women's mass start race.

CURLING

Brad Gushue is returning to Canada with a bronze medal in men's curling and John Shuster

is going home to the United States empty-handed. Gushue won the gold medal 16 years ago in Turin and Shuster won it four years ago, helping to popularize curling in the United States.

The Canadians capitalized on a missed final shot by Shuster in the second-to-last end that turned a one-point edge into an insurmountable 8-5 lead.

Sweden and Britain will play for gold Saturday.

MEN'S HOCKEY

The Russians and Finland will meet in the gold medal game Sunday. The defending champion Russians beat Sweden 2-1 in a shootout, and Finland defeated surprise semifinalist Slovakia 2-0.

Ivan Fedotov made 34 saves in regulation and overtime against Sweden and six more in the eight-round shootout, and Anton Slepyshev scored in regulation. Former NHL forwards Nikita Gusev and Yegor Yakovlev and New Jersey Devils prospect Arseni Grisyuk scored in the shootout.

Tournament MVP candidate Sakari Manninen scored his fourth goal of the Olympics for Finland, and former Florida Panthers goaltender Harri Sateri made 28 saves for the shutout of Slovakia. The Finns are looking for their first Olympic gold medal.

Slovakia will play Sweden for the bronze. It is going for its first hockey medal of any kind since the breakup of Czechoslovakia.

NASCAR Hall of Famer Gordon comfy in new role at Hendrick

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. (AP) — Jeff Gordon called NASCAR races for Fox when his old boss popped in for a visit and left behind a note. Rick Hendrick had good-naturedly posted hours of his 12-plus-hour work days for his former star driver. Those are the grueling demands of the job when you own more than 100 car dealerships and have your name on the winningest organization in stock car history.

"I knew I could never live up to that," Gordon said, laughing.

Now look at Gordon. For the first time in his 50 years, Gordon jokes that he finally has a real job (minus the TPS reports). Yes, he has an office and a desk and if he needs to punch a clock, well, Gordon could start with one of the nine grandfather clocks he won at Martinsville.

And his day starts as soon as the working dad drops his two kids off at school.

Gordon has settled into his daily role at Hendrick Motorsports as the new vice chairman and the second-ranking team official to the 72-year-old Hendrick. The move positioned Gordon to one day succeed Hendrick and run the operation. The real-world gig for the four-time champ already came with an early performance review from Hendrick.

"He's showing up on time with his game-face on," Hendrick said.

Whew! Next stop, employee of the month.

Few drivers ever showed up in the big moments quite like Gordon. He won 93 races — third on the career list — and four Cup ti-

titles before retiring in 2015. He won the Daytona 500 in 1997, 1999, and 2005.

Gordon now has a hand in all aspects at Hendrick, from competition meetings and marketing to securing sponsorship and social media ideas. He's a mentor of sorts to Hendrick's four Cup drivers — defending champion Kyle Larson, 2020 champion Chase Elliott, William Byron and Alex Bowman. And why not? Gordon blended wild success with off-track celebrity like no other driver before him (and maybe since). Gordon has encouraged the drivers to step out of their professional comfort zone and find new ways they could promote themselves and the sport.

Gordon should know how to stretch beyond racing. He hosted "Saturday Night Live," voiced multiple cartoon characters, and acted in various TV shows, movies and commercials.

"If the drivers are growing their following, then likely the sport is benefiting from it, too," Elliott said. "I think he's just

trying to help everybody win."

Winning is still what Hendrick does best.

Hendrick swept the front row for Sunday's Daytona 500 with Larson on the pole and Bowman starting outside. It was the seventh pole in the last eight Daytona 500s for Hendrick.

The team's dominance was launched by Gordon, handed off to seven-time champion Jimmie Johnson and could seemingly continue for decades. Hendrick said he was close to signing Byron and Elliott to contract extensions and hoped both drivers — like Gordon — would finish their careers with the organization.

Gordon, the face of NASCAR as it exploded in popularity in the 1990s, had an equity stake in Hendrick Motorsports since 1999, and his interest in the business side of the sport only grew, even as he called races in the Fox Sports booth. So did his realization he wasn't done making a difference at Hendrick.

Keselowski leads Jack Roush back to Daytona's victory lane

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. (AP) — Brad Keselowski took Jack Roush to victory lane for the first time since 2017 as their rebranded team showed its ready for the Daytona 500.

Keselowski and Chris Buescher won the 150-mile qualifying races at Daytona International Speedway on Thursday night to put them side-by-side starting from the second row in NASCAR's sold-out, season-opening spectacular.

"We have good hot rods here," Buescher said. "They are fast and they handle good. I knew we were in good shape that whole race."

He won the race on the 60th and final lap of the second qualifying race for the Daytona 500 when leader Joey Logano wrecked trying to block Buescher's run. Logano, who was visibly angry after wrecking his Team Penske Ford, said he misjudged Buescher's closing rate.

"Driver screwed up. That's really all there is to it," Logano said. "It's my fault. It stinks because it tore up our car and kind of puts us in a spot as a race team. It's just a dumb mistake."

Across the speedway,

Logano's former Penske teammate was making his second trip to victory lane of the night.

Keselowski celebrated a huge first night of Daytona racing as both the team owner and its driver. He left Penske in November for an ownership stake of Roush's organization — now called RFK Racing for Roush Fenway Keselowski — and is now driver of Roush's flagship and original No. 6 Ford.

He has a long-term vision for RFK and its not a quick fix to get the team back among the NASCAR elite. And yet Keselowski won the first qualifying race and obviously has a fast car for the Daytona 500.

Keselowski said the night was critical for creating a culture that expects to win at RFK, which last won a Cup race in 2017 with Ricky Stenhouse Jr. at this track.

"There's a lot of guys and gals on my team that have never won a race before. The company hasn't won a race in five? Six years now? That's any kind of race," Keselowski said. "It's really important to get that winning habit built up, and the only way you can really do that is to go win. That builds confidence in each other and builds expectations."

Keselowski and

Buescher will start Sunday behind NASCAR champion Kyle Larson and his Hendrick Motorsports teammate Alex Bowman. The Chevrolet drivers locked down the front row in Wednesday night time trials.

Floyd Mayweather Jr. will make his NASCAR debut Sunday when The Money Team Racing starts the Daytona 500. Kaz Grala drove the No. 50 Chevrolet into the race with a pass of J.J. Yeley on the final lap of the first race.

Six teams came to Daytona battling for four "open" spots in Sunday's 40-car field. Two spots were filled in time trials — former Formula One champion Jacques Villeneuve will make his Daytona 500 debut, as will Noah Gragson for Beard Motorsports — and one spot was available in each of the two qualifying races.

Grala earned one of them with a pass for 18th on the final lap of the first race. NY Racing, a team owned by Black entrepreneur John Cohen, raced its way into the Daytona 500 in the second race. The team pulled Greg Biffle out of semi-retirement and at 52, Biffle will be the oldest driver in the field Sunday when he makes his 15th career Daytona 500 start.

Grala said "the word on the street" was that his boss Mayweather would be at Daytona International Speedway on Sunday, but the team faced with the retired boxer from the starting grid.

"He was so pumped up about it. He was ready, jacked up and really confident in us," Grala said. "That was a cool pep talk to get, not one that I've ever gotten before. Definitely a cool moment for us and having that validation that he's excited about this program."

Band together: Premiering drama explores founding of world's first Black-led union

So many lost or forgotten chapters of history tell the stories behind the everyday functions of society. One such lesser-told chronicle is that of the world's first Black-led union, the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters, founded in 1925. A new, joint CBC/BET+ drama series begins exploring the foundation of that union when "The Porter" premieres Monday, Feb. 21, on BET+.

For those who may need a quick history lesson on the subject of "The Porter," the series details the lives of Pullman porters in the 1920s. Porters were Canadian and American railway attendants hired to work on sleeper cars. George Pullman, the founder of the Pullman Company, only hired Black men as porters, and their duties included delivering food and drinks to passengers, shining shoes and keeping the cars clean. Women, meanwhile, were hired as maids to wait on female passengers' needs, such as manicures, washing, mending clothes and child care.

Porters and maids were responsible for giving middle-class passengers the experience of being waited on like the wealthy. As a tough job with tremendously long hours and very little pay, porters were also subjected to discrimination on the job from passengers and their employers. A demeaning practice across many Pullman cars was calling porters "George," regardless of their actual names, effectively referring to them as an extension of George Pullman himself.

After the founding of the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters, wages and working conditions slowly improved until the Pullman Company folded in 1969.

Ronnie Rowe Jr. ("Star Trek: Discovery") and Aml Ameen ("I May Destroy You") star as soldiers-turned-porters Zeke Garrett and Junior Massey, men striving to organize their fellow railway attendants. Mouna Traoré ("Murdoch Mysteries") is Marlene Massey, Junior's wife and a singer in Montreal's Little Burgundy jazz scene, while Loren Lott ("The Young and the Restless") plays Lucy Conrad, an aspiring singer trying to break into Marlene's scene despite facing racism and colorism every step of the way.

Rounding out the cast are Stephanie Sy ("Nobody" 2021), Adrian Walters ("In the Dark") and "Crooklyn's" (1994) legendary actress, Alfre Woodard, as brothel owner Fay. Pulling double duty as series creators and stars of "The Porter" are Arnold Pinnock ("The Listener") and Bruce Ramsay ("19-2").

Set mostly between Montreal's St. Antoine neighborhood (known at the time as "The Harlem of the North"), Chicago and Detroit, "The Porter" brings together stories from both sides of the border, each of which contributed to the formation of the union. A series description from CBC's website boasts that the characters of "The Porter" are, "young, gifted and Black, from Canada, the Caribbean, and the U.S. via the Underground Railroad and through the Great Migration."

While the cast of characters in "The Porter" may come from diverse backgrounds, it was not difficult to find the perfect actors for each part,

according to series director Charles Officer.

The "Akilla's Escape" (2020) director told Radheyan Simonpillai for NOW Magazine that in order to find their cast, he and fellow series director R.T. Thorne ("Utopia Falls") simply travelled across Canada, noting, "there's unbelievable talent here." Officer went on to say that "anyone who is looking for Black actors and saying they can't find somebody, well, here you have it."

In that same interview, Thorne also shared the importance of porters in Black communities that were just a few

generations removed from slavery by the time they were unionizing in the 1920s. He noted they "were able to utilize that network and spread some of their ideas and learn, and take that information back into their communities" for added benefit.

Annmarie Morais ("Killjoys"), Marsha Greene ("Coroner") and Aubrey Nealon ("Snowpiercer") all write for "The Porter," with Morais and Greene also wearing producer hats for the series. Morais shared with NOW Magazine the broader mission behind the show: "The struggles within ourselves, the struggles beyond ourselves and the struggles of the world at large."

Like a lot of pas-

sion projects, "The Porter" has been many years in the making. It started over a decade ago in 2010 when Pinnock and Ramsay began pitching the project as a movie. When it was eventually picked up by CBC as a series, it was soon dropped when additional funding fell through. Through its ever-developing lifetime, Morais and Greene moved from writers to showrunners while original creators resisted suggestions from executives to bring on white showrunners.

In the same NOW Magazine interview, Greene said of the long road to the premiere of "The Porter": "It's taken a lot of time for Black creators to break through and get to the level where we're allowed to tell our stories." Morais added, "we all spent a lot of years working and doing our own thing separately to get to this moment where we're all poised and ready to be showrunners and executive producers. ... We really feel like we are the people to tell this story."

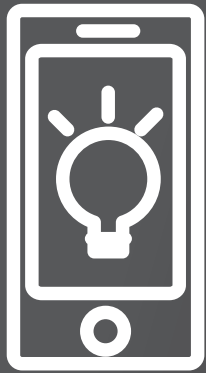

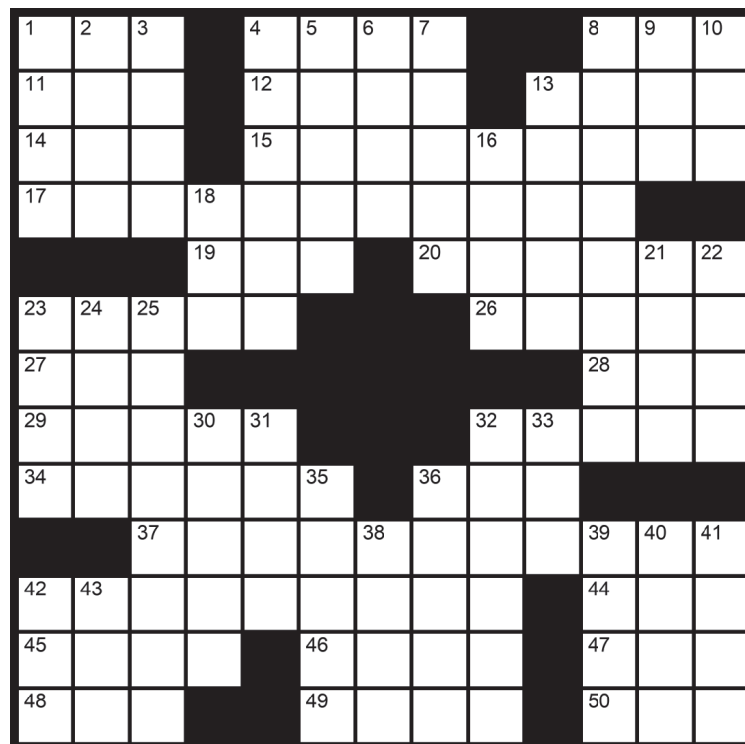

All in 'Order'

Dick Wolf's iconic series returns for Season 21

The original "Law & Order" is back! (Sort of.)

Nearly 12 years since the last episode of the original "Law & Order" aired on NBC, the celebrated legal show returns for a new season. Kicking off with a "clang" on Thursday, Feb. 24, the reboot is expected to incorporate some familiar faces along with a healthy dose of new ones.

There were apparently also plans for a new spinoff, "Law & Order: For the Defense," scheduled for the fall of 2021, but NBC opted instead to bring back the old favorite — a decision many are grateful for.

The 2022 "Law & Order" sees the return of franchise icon Sam Waterston ("The Great Gatsby," 1974) as District Attorney Jack McCoy and Anthony Anderson ("The Departed," 2006) as Det. Kevin Bernard, while "Hannibal's" Hugh Dancy joins the team as an assistant district attorney. And word through the grapevine has it that original cast members Benjamin Bratt ("Miss Congeniality," 2000) and Jill Hennessy ("Crossing Jordan") may also feature.

Of course, there can't be any mention of the original "Law & Order" cast without paying tribute to Jerry Orbach ("Dirty Dancing," 1987), the original Det. Lennie Briscoe. Orbach died in 2004, but we wouldn't be surprised if there were a nod or two to his incredible influence on the show's success.

Since its premiere in 1990, the iconic TV show went on to air a whopping 456 episodes over its 20-season run. Even those with no film-production

expertise know this isn't an easy task. Before its cancellation in May 2010, "Law & Order" came very close to beating *Gunsmoke's* record for the longest-running prime-time drama (it wrapped up after the 24th episode of Season 20).

This isn't the first time the studio has considered a "Law & Order" revival since its 2010 cancellation: There were talks of a "Law & Order" miniseries in 2015, but negotiations fell through before the production even began.

But as much as franchise fans might expect new thrilling and compelling episodes, a reboot is often a modern-day rehashing of the same or similar content. Thankfully, the presence of some original cast members means the show can pick up right where it left off 12 years ago — though perhaps with a few more gray hairs.

According to series creator Dick Wolf ("FBI"), Season 21 of "Law & Order" features everything fans have known and loved from its first 20 years on air — no major adjustments, only new stories for viewers to enjoy. Also like its earlier iteration, the cast features three DAs and three cops. After the police investigate crimes and make arrests, the DAs prosecute the offenders.

Though no official "Law & Order" trailer has been released as of writing, a series of promos and announcement teasers have been making the rounds. If these videos are anything to go by, audiences are in for a big treat with many surprises.

Wolf insists the show will focus on its fundamental values: Good writing, fantastic acting and top-notch production. The goal is to give fans

what they want — that's been the franchise's mantra from Day 1.

Before its eventual cancellation, "Law & Order" went through many internal changes — many of them cast changes — which is pretty normal for any long-running TV show. The stars who stuck around included the late Steven Hill ("The Firm," 1993), who played DA Adam Schiff; S. Epatha Merkerson ("Chicago Med") as Lt. Anita Van Buren; Jesse L. Martin ("Rent," 2005) in the role of Det. Ed Green; and the aforementioned Orbach.

Aside from character changes, there has also been a universe of spinoffs to the original, including "Law & Order: Special Victims Unit"

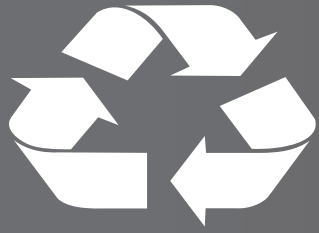
and "Law & Order: Organized Crime." Both of these have so far been largely successful — "SVU" has been on air for 23 seasons to date, while the Christopher Meloni ("Happy!")-led "Organized Crime" just began in April 2021. It seems anything with the "Law & Order" moniker has amassed a loyal fan base.

That said, other spinoffs from the original didn't do so well. "Law & Order: Trial by Jury" was canceled after just 11 weeks on air in 2005. The plan with that series was to take the franchise away from the streets of New York City and focus more on the courtroom drama. Unfortunately, that didn't play out so well, so expect a lot more of the Big Apple this time around.

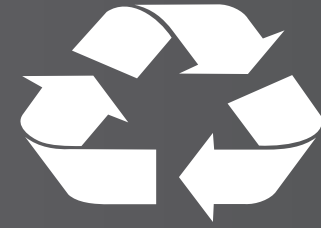
Luckily, it's proven almost impossible to tarnish a legacy as strong as Wolf's leading procedural. In Hollywood, a decade-long hiatus is generally enough to kill off any show. This is one comeback that only "Law & Order" could make.

Wolf, just like his many fans, is excited about the release, saying the reboot was a "dream come true for him." Now fans will be the judge as to whether Wolf and his series have kept the spark all these years. (Though something says they will have.)

The first episode of "Law & Order's" 21st season airs Thursday, Feb. 24, on NBC.

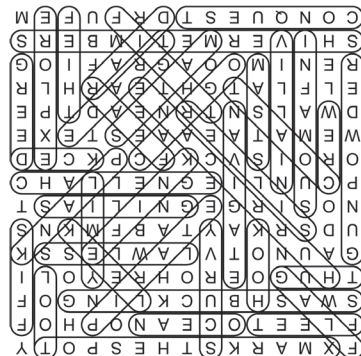
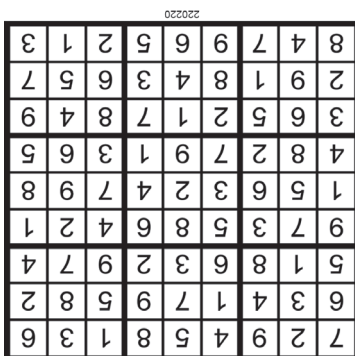
