## Keep cool in the hot weather

CRAWFORD COUNTY, Kan. — Crawford County is set to bake in the hot weather for at least the next two months.

The hot spell is expected to peak next Tuesday, with temperatures reaching the mid-100s throughout the county. Temperatures are expected to reach the low-100s for seven of the 15 days left in July.

According to the National Weather Service, on July 19, the maximum temperature was recorded at 109 in 1934. In addition, the average maximum temperature is 89 degrees, while the minimum temperature was recorded in 2009 at 54 degrees.

With the rising temperatures, My Town Media announced a weather alert for a heat advisory that's in effect in Crawford and

Cherokee Counties on Saturday, July 16, from noon to 8 p.m., with heat index values reaching 103 to 107 degrees.

During warm weather, especially extreme heat events, it is vital to stay cool, hydrated, and informed. If you or someone you know is experiencing symptoms of heat exhaustion or heatstroke, contact a medical provider. If a health issue is an emer-

gency, dial 911.

More than 700 people die from extreme heat every year in the United States, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). In addition, those at the highest risk include people 65 and older, children younger than two and people with chronic diseases or mental illness.

## Pittsburg hown hall to study women's economic well-being in Kansas

PITTSBURG, Kan. — United WE, a nonpartisan nonprofit with a mission to advance all women's economic and civic leadership, is slated

to conduct a town hall on Wednesday, Aug. 3, in Pittsburg.

In partnership with The League of Kansas Municipalities, the Kansas Women's Economic Task Force and Town Hall Series will be held

from 11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. in the Governor's Room in the Overman Student Center on the campus of Pittsburg State University (302 E. Cleveland St.).

Complimentary professional childcare and lunch will be provided. In addition, attendees receive a \$10 gift card at the end of the event.

According to United WE, the town halls are an extension of "The Status of Women in Kansas" research report that was released in early 2022. The report studied the socioeconomic status of women in Kansas comparing the outcomes of women and men across many social and economic indicators such as demographics, income, employment, childcare, poverty and civic engagement.

## New law gives benefits to employers who can provide child care

TOPEKA, Kan. — On Thursday, July 7, Governor Laura Kelly signed House Bill 2237, expanding tax benefits for employers who make child care available for their employees, effective July 1, 2022.

"We're making child care more accessible and affordable to make life easier for our working parents," Governor Laura Kelly said. "The case for Kansas businesses to take advantage of these tax credits is clear: Providing child care helps employers attract more job candidates, retain quality employees, and create a diverse, engaged workforce."

The new law allows

any income or privilege taxpayer to claim the child day care services tax credit and permits taxpayers to claim 50 percent of expenditures paid to an organization providing child care to the taxpayer's employees beginning in tax year 2021. It also aims to make child care more accessible and affordable by incentivizing businesses to provide child care services, either at their place of employment or through contracting with licensed providers.

A child care tax credit for businesses has been around for years, but most were not able to receive it. The previous law limited the credit to corporation income taxpayers and does not permit credit for payments made to

organizations. The new bill extends the credit to all Kansas businesses so all employers can begin providing child care services to their employees through contractors or in-house.

"The announcement from the state is significant and we'll be working with our local employers to ensure that they are aware of the child care tax credit," Blake Benson, President of the Pittsburg Area Chamber of Commerce, said.

Several studies have shown that employer-provided child care has several benefits for the employer, the employee, and the community in general. Employer-provided child care reaffirms to employees that they are cared

for and not just seen as money-making machines. This creates a positive office atmosphere and an employer is more likely to retain valued employees by providing child care services.

It also supports the local economy as the employer needs to create jobs for health care workers in-house, or indirectly create new positions at an established facility. These new jobs then put money back into the local economy.

The downside is the cost of in-house services may be prohibitive. Additional facilities, such as kitchens and bathrooms, need to be built, as well as a playground and toys. Insurance liability, holding the business financially responsible for any injury

or ailment a child receives while on company property, can factor into deterring employers from investing in in-house facilities.

"Imagine Pittsburg, the EDAC, and the new Develop Pittsburg CDC, along with several others, have been discussing how to expand our local child care capacity for a number of years," said Benson.

The City of Pittsburg and several local child care facilities, in partnership with local corporations, have looked into creating and supporting child care slots through sponsorships. Instead of investing in on-site facilities, local businesses could reserve x-number of slots for their employees.

"We feel that employers

are a crucial piece to this puzzle and this announcement could encourage more employers to consider offering child care as a workforce attraction/retention tool," Benson said.

The new law makes child care more affordable overall. By expanding the options available to workers, businesses can help decrease the price of child care for every Kansan.

"With the widening of Highway 69, new employers like the FedEx Ground distribution facility, several new housing developments, etc., we know our local child care capacity is only going to become more strained in the very near future," Benson said. "I'm hopeful we'll see some positive movement on the issue very soon."

## Love of outdoors grows career

PITTSBURG—When Jesse Gilmore was a little boy growing up in Overland Park, being outdoors was something his mother made him do. She was a Master Gardener, volunteering with the K-State Research and Extension program. Sometimes, Gilmore was dragged along as an unwilling volunteer.

"They have a much more structured program up in Johnson County, whereas down here I look for people who are just interested, even if they can't put in 40 hours. I haven't hounded my Master Gardeners very much," Gilmore said.

That's right: He's gone from unwilling volunteer to a career path that has put him in charge of the Master Gardener program in Crawford County.

Gilmore is a horticulturist with the Wildcat Extension District of K-State Research and Extension, which includes Crawford, Labette, Wilson, and Montgomery counties. While his job encompasses all plant life, from crops

to ornamentals, he's most interested in vegetable production, because of his love of systems.

Systems are what led him into horticulture to begin with, in spite of his lack of interest in the outdoors.

"Growing up in suburban Kansas City, I didn't have a lot of opportunities to do outdoors horticulture type of stuff," he said. But he said his experiences with his mom were "really foundational." Those experiences at least put in the back of my mind that plants might be something I was interested in," he said.

He knew he was interested in science.

"Science is kind of a collection of systems, and I have a very system-oriented brain," he explained. "It's all the different types of systems that go into making a plant, all of these seemingly unrelated things that go into growing the food we eat."

He earned his bachelor's degree in agronomy from Kansas State University, following that up with a master's degree in horticulture with an emphasis in urban food systems. In addition to community gardens and farmer's markets, he's interested

in foraging, or using food that grows wild in nature, even in people's back yards: everything from nut and fruit trees to dandelions and other plants most people perceive as weeds.

He said, "I did my thesis on a program evaluation of an apprenticeship program that basically was a crash course in every type of fruit and vegetable production." The program covered cultivation, pests, and different ways to grow crops. The idea was to research ways to improve educational opportunities for those interested in ag businesses.

"That was where people were kind of being bottlenecked," he explained. People were good at producing food, but they couldn't figure out how to make a living from it.

Visiting people in their gardens is one of his favorite parts of the job as Extension Horticulturist. He gets to teach them how to improve their product, whether they are vegetables or flowers. "I love to see things improve," he said.

"Most of the questions I get on the job are related to ornamental plants," he said. The food-related questions tend to be about

ordinary garden crops, questions like what do I do about squash bugs, or why are my tomatoes not doing well?

"Those are fun to answer," he said. They sometimes require a little research, but he loves food-related research, "seeing all the different things that go into food production," he explained.

"It's important, because collectively, I want people in urban areas to have the same experiences that people in rural communities have all the time," Gilmore said.

As an example, he said most people interested in

agriculture in the Wildcat District have been involved in 4-H or FFA (Future Farmers of America) in school. In Overland Park, he didn't have those options. He had no agricultural experience until college. Gilmore said that surprises people he talks to in Southeast Kansas.

Another thing he likes to emphasize is how many good food-related career opportunities there are. They include everything from growing the food to processing and distributing it. Other possibilities are in economics and commodities, and even government jobs. Food jobs can be in factories, fields, laboratories, restaurants, or government offices.

In fact, Gilmore said he first thought he would be working in a lab, but he quickly realized he didn't want to be confined to the indoors. "It wouldn't be the worst thing," he said, "but I wanted to go out and move around."

"The job here opened two weeks before I graduated with my master's degree and I came down and interviewed," Gilmore said. "They offered me the job the day before I graduated."

## The Ku Klux Klan in Crawford County, Kansas

*Rise and Fall of the Invisible Empire, part 4*

*Crawford County history buffs and readers of this newspaper are typically very knowledgeable about the area's rich roots in bootlegging and coal mining. What they might not know, however, is that Kansas — including Crawford County — has a history with the Ku Klux Klan as well, dating back to the 1920s. Following is the fourth of nine articles (one to appear each Saturday) describing the formation and activities of the Ku Klux Klan in this area as they occurred nearly a century ago.*

### Part 4: Two Hotbeds — Pittsburg and Mulberry

As mentioned in earlier articles, the KKK stringently fought the liquor traffic. Bootlegging had existed in Crawford County for years, and the Mulberry Independent — launched in September 1923 and soon to become a pro-KKK newspaper — contended that it was “drunk after drunk and bootlegger after bootlegger” who appeared in the county courts because liquor was available “in Croweburg or a dozen other places” to the south of Pittsburg. The Mulberry Independent also noted that the “booze ring” had protection through men “who handled things, but never appeared in public with dirty hands.” A number of raids on bootleggers were even conducted in Pittsburg by Klan members; over a ten-day period they brought in 4,700 gallons of moonshine and thousands of gallons of “wine, hootch, and other stuff” across the county. Even anti-Klan Crawford Countians admitted that the KKK had accomplished what many others had not been able to for years.

The southeast sector of the state continued to be abuzz with Klan activity in mid-1923, with the largest area Klan meeting ever held conducted at the Crawford County/Bourbon County line; long rows of parked automobiles forming a half mile square and a gigantic (35 ft. high) lighted cross which waved a very large U.S. flag amid many flares and torches. The Girard Press recorded the details: “Flashlights, so brilliant as to dazzle the eye, were kept playing about this space. Cars were continually buzzing up and down the roads, apparently as guards. At the places of entrance to the enclosure, robed knights stood guard, passing in most of them who seemed to have a password or some gesture. It is said that 5,000 people were present, and that the Pittsburg Klan had charge of the program. News of the joint meeting seems to have been kept a secret until...the leaving of so many cars from Fort Scott, Garland, Arcadia, Pittsburg, Bronson, Uniontown, and Redfield attracted attention.”

In July 1923 Klan members in Crawford County were busy again, with more than 850 robed Klansmen participating in a Pittsburg parade — one of the largest crowds seen there in several years. Delegations were present from Topeka, Coffeyville, Independence, and other points. An airplane flew over the city several times bearing an electrically lighted cross. After marching several miles the parade ended at the

north end of town, at the fairground where several thousand Klansmen were assembled to participate in additional ceremonies. A large number of cars came from all parts of the county and those who had the password were admitted. A fiery cross was planted, sentries were at the crossroad to direct visitors.

In September 1923 the editor of the pro-Klan Mulberry Independent, a pastor of the United Brethren Church in Pittsburg, claimed the paper existed to “battle its enemies” and proclaimed that Roman Catholicism and liquor were its most bitter enemies. The Independent also claimed that the city of Mulberry held the distinction of being the “only town in this part of the country” with a pro-Klan publication, arguing that the paper was created because the anti-Klan newspaper of that same city, the Mulberry News, was not giving the “Kluxers a chance to put their side of the case before the community.” Eventually a Mulberry physician, the head of the Mulberry Klan and a longtime contributor to the Independent, would purchase the paper and quickly begin defending Klan principles: “The Crawford County Klans clashed more violently with the Catholics than with any other opposition, (being against) the monopolized Catholic political system of bloc voting. We firmly believe that the Catholic people... will in time throw off the power vested in the priesthood and take unto themselves this power.”

The Klan genuinely feared the Catholic Church, with the Imperial Wizard writing that “We cannot allow any worldwide system of religious teaching, highly organized and entirely secret, to gain control of the free channels of government in America.” In that same regard, another contributor to the Independent would later add that the Ku Klux Klan was against the Catholic Church “and ‘Popery’ because the Catholic ‘system’ was threatening American principles of equality and democracy; he added that the ‘foreign’ hierarchy

was attempting to control economics, politics, and religion in the United States and using ‘the great sacred order of Knights of Columbus’ in order to gain control of the Democratic party,” through bloc voting, in order to rule America. Indeed, Klan publications often reinforced the order’s fear of the Catholic Church, and its speakers often railed for hours on the subject.

Also in September 1923 the Independent noted that 279 new members had been initiated into the Crawford County organization at an open-air ceremony held at the Pittsburg fairgrounds; more than 100 of the candidates were from the Mulberry area and were “taken into the mysteries of the order by the light of the large fiery cross of the order.” Many women supporters of the KKK were in attendance as well (but kept out of hearing distance of the initiation, which was conducted by the Pittsburg team); the Girard KKK chapter served coffee, cigars, and sandwiches. Meanwhile, the Mulberry News editor was doing just the opposite: organizing people into a society to combat the Klan. Crawford County citizens who

joined this group (which became known as Loyal Constitutionalists) met at the Owl Hall in Mulberry to oppose the “Cult that would bind this free land...with a philosophy which springs from greed, bigotry, and intolerance and tends to overthrow all that our forefathers build-ed (sic) for us.” The group adopted its constitution in August 1923.

The role of the Women’s Ku Klux Klan (WKKK) should not be overlooked or undervalued. A unified national movement composed of white Protestant women, the WKKK was devoted to the Klan’s principles and formed on the heels of the suffrage movement. Chartered in 1923 and numbering as many as 250,000 members, the WKKK would often hold bazaars and meetings to raise funds for Klan projects and provide masks and costumes for male members. Initially, during Reconstruction, the women may have played a symbolic role within the Klan by allowing the males a rationale for “shielding innocent females from the terrifying Black demons.” Later, the WKKK of the 1920s appears to have been more of a way to “promote racist, intolerant, and xenophobic policies but also a social setting in which to enjoy their own racial and religious privileges.” Children were invited to participate as well; sensing their economic potential and an opportunity to spread their message to a new generation, the KKK opened its ranks to and initiated two auxiliary groups: teenaged boys (the Junior KKK, active in fifteen states) and girls (the Tri-K Club) and the Ku Klux Kiddies.

### Sinclair Crude Oil Purchasing Company announces reduction of 25 cents a barrel

**100 Years Ago**  
July 16-18, 1922

The old route of the Jefferson highway through Kansas, touching the county seat towns between Kansas City and Girard, is the official Jefferson highway routing in Kansas. L. J. Pettijohn, secretary of state, yesterday wrote in letters to conflicting Jefferson highway delegations, refusing to recognize the change in routing that would establish the road down the Marais des Cygnes bottom through Pleasanton.

Lone Elm lodge of the A. H. T. A., near Scammon, one of the largest lodges in Cherokee county, held a big initiation at the Lone Elm school house Friday night, taking in 15 new members and voting on eight more new members. In the days gone by, the A. H. T. A. made continual war on horse thieves. As the means of travel changed from horse to car the local associations were requested to make war to the end against auto thieves.

The Sinclair Crude Oil Purchasing Company today announced a further reduction of 25 cents a barrel in crude oil in the Kansas and Oklahoma territory, making the new price \$1.50 a barrel. A similar reduction in price was announced last Saturday. The company also lowered its price for crude oil from the Healdton district 25 cents a barrel, making the price there 75 cents.

The police are trying to solve a double misfortune which happened to Charles Hansen, 501 W. Quincy. While Hansen was driving home Sunday night, he was halted at the corner of Catalpa and Quincy streets by hold-up

men and robbed of \$58 in money and a gold watch. He was compelled to leave the machine on the spot and when he returned for it yesterday morning, found it was nothing but a mass of ashes.

**50 Years Ago**  
July 16-18, 1972

Nineteen candidates for local and state office spoke before a sizable crowd yesterday at the Mall Shopping Center in a Meet the Candidates Voter Service presentation. The event was sponsored by the League of Women Voters in conjunction with the shopping center. A larger crowd than in past elections was on hand with the 1,100 capacity Mall parking lot nearly full.

If size is any indication of the noise they will make, Pittsburg's new storm-warning sirens should be able to frighten away any tornadoes which might appear in the city's vicinity. The first of six sirens which will form Pittsburg's emergency warning system has arrived. It's a hefty unit. It weighs 650 pounds and is powered by a 25-horsepower, three-phase electric motor. The other five sirens should arrive immediately.

Ed Hoff, 15, 115 East 22nd, captured a dinosaur recently. Well actually, actually, it was only an iguana lizard but iguanas are cousins of the extinct reptiles. Ed and his

brother Wayne, 15, were mowing grass at 22nd and Grand. They saw the lizard and first thought it was one of those rubber creepy crawlers. But the lizard proved itself alive by running away. The two boys chased it and finally captured it.

The long period of dry weather this summer is beginning to show its effect upon water lines in Pittsburg. Bob Yeager, director of public works, reported yesterday. **25 Years Ago**  
July 16-18, 1997

"Improper, little-thought-out statements to the press, I'll be watching for," he said in Crawford County District Court. Gill, 19, has been charged with the first degree murder in the death of Dana Sisk, 24, found dead in her Pittsburg home in May.

**Today's Highlight in History:**

On July 16, 1969, Apollo 11 blasted off from Cape Kennedy on the first manned mission to the surface of the moon.

**On this date:**

In 1790, a site along the Potomac River was designated the permanent seat of the United States government; the area became Washington, D.C.

In 1862, Flag Officer David G. Farragut became the first rear admiral in the United States Navy.

In 1945, the United States exploded its first experimental atomic bomb in the desert of Alamogordo (ahl-ah-moh-GOHR-doh), New Mexico; the same day, the heavy cruiser USS Indianapolis left Mare (mar-AY) Island Naval Shipyard in California on a secret mission to deliver atomic bomb components to Tinian Island in the Marianas.

In 1951, the novel "The Catcher in the Rye" by J.D. Salinger was first published by Little, Brown and Co.

In 1957, Marine Corps Maj. John Glenn set a transcontinental speed record by flying a Vought F8U Crusader jet from California to New York in 3 hours, 23 minutes and 8.4 seconds.

In 1964, as he accepted the Republican presidential nomination in San Francisco, Barry M. Goldwater declared that "ex-

tremism in the defense of liberty is no vice" and that "moderation in the pursuit of justice is no virtue."

In 1980, former California Gov. Ronald Reagan won the Republican presidential nomination at the party's convention in Detroit.

In 1999, John F. Kennedy Jr., his wife, Carolyn, and her sister, Lauren Bessette (bih-SEHT), died when their single-engine plane, piloted by Kennedy, plunged into the Atlantic Ocean near Martha's Vineyard, Massachusetts.

In 2004, Martha Stewart was sentenced to five months in prison and five months of home confinement by a federal judge in New York for lying about a stock sale.

In 2008, Florida resident Casey Anthony, whose 2-year-old daughter, Caylee, had been missing a month, was arrested on charges of child neglect, making false official statements and obstructing a criminal investigation. (Casey Anthony was later acquitted at trial of murdering Caylee, whose skeletal remains were found in December 2008; she was convicted of lying to police.)

In 2015, a jury in Centennial, Colorado, convicted James Holmes of 165 counts of murder, attempted murder and other charges in the 2012 Aurora movie theater rampage that left 12 people dead. A gunman unleashed a barrage of fire at a recruiting center and another U.S. military site a few miles apart in Chattanooga, Tennessee,

killing four Marines and a sailor before he was shot to death by police; authorities identified the gunman as Kuwaiti-born Muhammad Youssef Abdulazeef of Tennessee.

In 2016, Republican presidential nominee-apparent Donald Trump formally introduced his running mate, Mike Pence, during an event in New York, hailing the Indiana governor as his "first choice" and his "partner in the campaign" a day after announcing the selection on Twitter.

**Ten years ago:** Singer Kitty Wells, whose hits such as "Making Believe" and "It Wasn't God Who Made Honky Tonk Angels" made her the first female superstar of country music, died at age 92.

**Five years ago:** Ten people died at a popular swimming hole in Arizona's Tonto National Forest after a rainstorm unleashed a flash flood. Roger Federer won a

record-breaking 8th Wimbledon title, beating Marin Cilic (CHIHl-ihch) 6-3, 6-1, 6-4. British actor Jodie Whittaker was announced as the next star of the long-running science fiction series "Doctor Who" - the first woman to take a role that had been played by a dozen men over six decades.

**One year ago:** A federal judge in Texas ruled illegal an Obama-era program that prevented the deportation of thousands of immigrants who were brought into the U.S. as children. Rapper and DJ Biz Markie, known for the 1989 song "Just a Friend," died at the age of 57. The Eiffel Tower reopened to tourists for the first time in nearly nine months, even as France introduced new rules aimed at warding off a fourth surge; they included mandatory COVID-19 passes to enter restaurants and tourist venues.

# Can you hear me now?

*"Life is difficult. This is a great truth, one of the greatest truths. It is a great truth because once we truly see this truth, we transcend it." — M. Scott Peck*

I received an email from longtime friend, Ann Rainey, last week that included a section titled "When the Going Gets Tough, Listen." It went on to describe an upcoming session on abortion and Amendment 2 to the Kansas Constitution being held at her church, St. Andrews Episcopal, on July 21st. What follows is excerpted from the bulletin sent to the congregation from the Rector, Father John Spicer.

Although located in Missouri, the church is so near the Kansas border that about half of St. Andrews' parishioners are preparing to vote on Amendment 2, so Father Spicer decided the time seemed right to build on the civil-discourse class and listening sessions the

church held last spring. "When the culture models either uncivil discourse or polite silence on hard issues, I believe a big-tent church like ours has a responsibility to model a different way to seek and share Christ's healing love — by listening to each other."

Fr. Spicer and Ann Rainey, a licensed professional counselor, will lead the session. Ann is also the convener of St. Andrews' Discernment Commission," Father Spicer noted, "so she will bring both expertise and faith to this work. To foster a sense of safety and trust, the session is to be offered in-person only."

The bulletin went on to set context and some ground rules that stated the floor will be opened for any parishioner to speak for a maximum of 3 minutes and for the rest of those gathered to listen in love. No one is required to speak. It's perfectly acceptable just to listen.

Further guidelines for preparation and sharing were outlined as follows by Fr. Spicer:

"Speaking in a setting

like this takes careful and prayerful preparation. By that, I don't mean gathering statistics or expert opinion to back up your point of view. This is not a debate. It's not even a discussion. Instead, as you prepare your contribution, Ann and I ask that you look to your own heart. Specifically, please ensure that you share only what you believe, using "I" statements, not what you think "they" think. To discern what you might say in a limited time, we recommend that you ask yourself these questions:

"What core values, ethics, and beliefs guide me in my position? • Is there a story from my experience that illustrates this? • Why is this important to me? • Is there a dream or ideal behind my point of view? • Is there a fear behind my point of view?"

"Practically, I'd also recommend that you write out what you plan to say so you can be sure to say just what you intend. Plus, by writing your comment, you can know whether it fits within the allotted 3 minutes (and we will enforce that time limit by

asking participants to stop speaking). Here's a tip from an old speechwriter: People speak at about 125 words per minute, so give yourself a limit of 375 words as you prepare what you'd like to share."

The email from Ann arrived just as I was consulting with Bert Patrick on his endeavor to establish a talking and listening forum covering various viewpoints on Amendment 2 here in Pittsburg last week. As Bert was grappling with how to get it accomplished, I remembered the following quote from Rilke and passed it along to him.

"I want to beg you, as much as I can, dear sir, to be patient toward all that is unsolved in your heart and to try to love the questions themselves like locked rooms and like books that are written in a very foreign tongue. Do not now seek the answers, which cannot be given you because you would not be able to live them. And the point is, to live everything. Live the questions now. Perhaps you will then gradually, without noticing it, live along some dis-

tant day into the answer."

It was an insightful moment and call to mindfulness for both Bert and me. A reminder that we live in an age where the Internet or a talking head on TV provides a solution to every problem before us. And Google beckons to find an instant answer to all that we don't have the patience to contemplate.

It was, in short, a call to appreciate the value of not only loving and living the questions inherent in Amendment 2, but of appreciating uncertainty in general.

Uncertainty is something we all naturally steer away from ... but don't the bigger questions require it? Life's deepest questions can't be answered by a phone search or a Twitter post. We have to embrace them. Live them, as Rilke asserts, "along some distant day into the answer."

On issues such as the Amendment 2 vote we might well take a lesson from the Quakers. The heart of the Quaker way is the silent Meeting for Worship, a time for communal, gathered stillness,

to be open to inspiration from the Spirit of God or the Light Within, as they sit together in common purpose.

Getting back to the bulletin, Bert suggested I share it here in case another church, civic organization, family or couple, etc. might want to use their method as a guideline in the daunting task of talking and listening to others' views about Amendment 2 — or any other problem in their lives.

To be sure Fr. Spicer knows the tremendous challenge the congregation faces in taking on the "responsibility to model a different way to seek and share Christ's healing love." He ended his call to the listening session with the following assertion, "This will be hard. But the best and holiest work usually is."

The FY2023 NDAA improves the lives of our soldiers and their loved

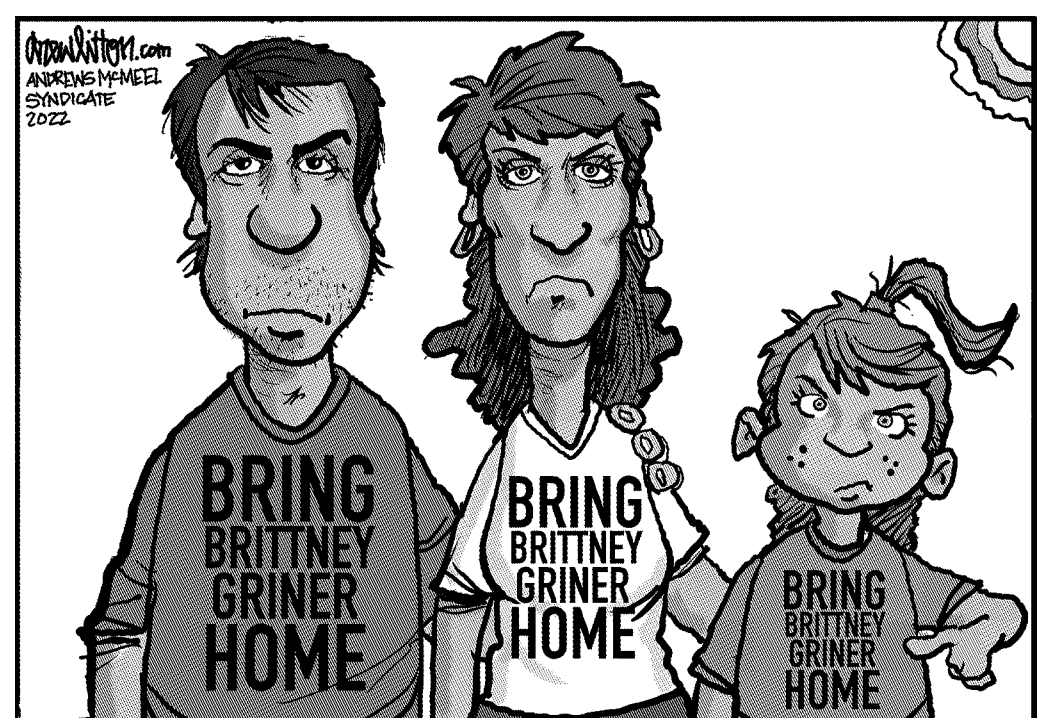

“The overall objective of doing the town halls is to gather some qualitative data,” United WE President and CEO Wendy Doyle said. “Really testing some quantitative research that we invested in previously this year which was ‘The Status of Women in Kansas’ and as an organization we are an evidence-based research driven organization and this was a second update to the original research study and we could commission that study with the University of Kansas.

“But it’s great when you have some quantitative information. We just want to be able to pass it and make sure we really have the facts nailed down. So we have put together a Kansas Women’s Economic Task Force and this task force is, to our knowledge, really the first in the history of Kansas that something like this has been put together. It’s a composition of women by industry, geography, ethnicity, really a good cross section and representation of Kansas.”

Doyle noted that there are 44 business and civic leaders across the state involved in the program. “They provide leader-

ship to some of the town halls we are doing around Kansas,” she said. “So we are really getting out and doing a listening tour and the discussion points that we are really focused on really is economic development and understanding, especially as we are coming out of the pandemic, what recovery looks like for women in your families, what are they experiencing in the workplace ... It’s really just been a great experience. We kicked it off in June and we will be wrapping it up at the end of August.”

The Kansas Women’s Economic Task Force and Town Hall Series has already visited several sites

around the state including Wichita State University, Garden City Community College, The Beacon in Topeka and Fort Hays State University.

“They’ve gone extremely well,” Doyle said. “First of all, we’ve been quite pleased and overwhelmed with the interest in the participation of women. So it’s far exceeded our expectations on participation.

“Secondly, with discussions, we are starting to see some common themes ... Our hope or potential outcome is that those conversations continue in their circles in the future and for women to feel comfortable talking about

economic challenges, what’s working well and what’s not. So it’s going extremely well.”

United WE will hold one final Kansas Women’s Economic Task Force and Town Hall Series Wednesday, August 24, through a virtual session. From noon to 1 p.m., the session is free and open to the public. During the one-hour discussion covering key challenges, there will be breakout sessions along with a Spanish translator and a free \$10 gift card for all attendees.

While the town hall is focused on women’s economic well-being, Doyle noted that men and younger women are encouraged

to attend the event.

“This is for women and men and we’ve had several men that have joined just to learn and be a part of the conversation,” she said. “Also, we welcome all women and we get questions ‘can young women come’ and absolutely, it’s a great experience to sit and listen and contribute to the conversation. We also want older women to be a part of the conversation ... This is for everyone to be a part of the conversation for their voices to be heard.”

Common heat-related illnesses are heat stroke, heat exhaustion, heat cramps and sunburn. Symptoms of heat stroke include high body temperature (103 degrees or higher), dry skin, strong pulse, headache, dizziness, nausea, confusion and losing consciousness. Heat

exhaustion symptoms are heavy sweating, clammy skin, weak pulse, nausea, weakness, dizziness, headache or fainting. Heat cramps include heavy sweating during intense exercise and muscle pains or spasms, while sunburn is painful warm skin or blisters on the skin.

To prevent heat-related illnesses, injuries, and death during hot weather, the CDC recommends to:

- Stay in an air-conditioned indoor location as much as you can;
- Drink plenty of water even if you don’t feel thirsty, no caffeine, alcohol or sugar;
- Schedule outdoor activities carefully — Wear loose, lightweight, light-colored clothing and sunscreen and pace yourself;
- Take cool showers or baths to cool down;
- Check on a friend or neighbor and have someone do the same for you;
- Never leave children or pets in cars;
- Check the local news for

health and safety updates;

- Soft, wide brimmed hat, preferably wet;
- Wet towel or handkerchief tied loosely around the neck.

For those in an emergency or need medical care, there are several options, which include Ascension Via Christi Hospital in Pittsburg (1 Mt. Carmel Pl.), Girard Medical Center in Girard (302 N. Hospital Dr.), Crawford County Health Department in Pittsburg (410 E. Atkinson

Ave.), Community Health Center of Southeast Kansas in Pittsburg (3011 N. Michigan St.) and SEK Urgent Care in Pittsburg (200 E. Centennial Dr.).

For families looking to cool off from the warm weather, there are four public pools within Crawford County; Pittsburg Aquatic Center (708 W. 9th St.), Frontenac City Swimming Pool (519 E. McKay St.), Girard Municipal Swimming Pool (511 S.

Carbon St.) and Arma City Pool (800 Crawford St.). Schlanger Park, located at 725 E. 6th St. in Pittsburg, also has a recently built splash pad.

Despite the hot temperatures, Kansas’ most ‘perfect day of the year’ will be on Wednesday, July 27, according to historical weather data. The analysis factored in the date with the most predicted sunshine and the date with the best temperature.

That was December of 2019.

“Going from Manhattan to Pittsburg was not much of a culture shock,” he said. It’s also a bonus that his family in Overland Park is only 90 miles away.

He has lots of goals for his position.

“I wish I did more work with the farmer’s markets,” Gilmore said. He would like to have a booth with relevant publications on pests and nutrition. “We’re working on that. We’re not quite where we want to be.”

Another project is creating a community orchard. He is working with the

hospital in Parsons, in conjunction with the Fruit Tree Planting Foundation in Pittsburgh, Pa., which donates trees. The hospital, in turn, will donate the fruit to local food pantries.

“I would like to do something like that in Pittsburg,” he said. “The one problem is figuring out who is going to be responsible for taking care of it and having a really structured plan for how it’s going to last. You get people who start out really motivated and then you just have the fallout.”

He added, “If I could accomplish one thing, that is absolutely something I would want to get done before moving on to other things to do.”

While he’s enjoying his

current job, he’s also looking ahead to future possibilities. One of the other systems he’s interested in is government.

“I’ve always been interested in how food systems relate to government,” he explained. “In the future, I would definitely love to kind of analyze policy. Kansas is a great place to do that because we have more food policy councils than anywhere else in the country.”

He’s especially interested in working with local government, he said, and although he is enjoying Pittsburg, he would be interested in a job that focused on urban agriculture.

He’d also like to earn a doctorate degree in public policy and management, studying how laws affect constituents.

“I would totally try and be a politician,” he said. “I don’t know why I like government so much. I think it has a lot of appeal because it has a lot of systems I don’t understand yet. I really want to dig into the process behind it.”

He’s come a long way from the boy who didn’t

really want to hang around outdoors, he said. When he’s not working, he enjoys foraging for his own food, and he’s a fan of mountain biking.

“Lots of outdoors stuff, which is weird because I hated outdoor stuff when I was a kid,” he said. “I was definitely a kid with nature deficit disorder.”

He said there just aren’t a lot of outdoor opportunities in Kansas City, and there were “too many easier ways to occupy my time.” In addition, it’s hot and humid in Kansas. “The weather definitely plays into it,” Gilmore said, “When you’re feasted on by mosquitoes as much as I am, that definitely discourages you from being outside.” Then, he jokes, he discovered bug spray, and things got easier.

In Manhattan, there were a lot of recreational opportunities close by, so he spent a lot of time biking trails and exploring the parks and rivers.

“That’s one of the reasons I like Pittsburg so much,” he said. He loves Gunn Park in Fort Scott as well. “It has some of the best trails I’ve ever been on.

“There’s a lot of outdoor activities here,” he added. “Everyone has an ATV, a boat, a hunting license, some kind of outdoor activity.”

Gilmore also likes to pull weeds.

“People always used to think I was crazy when I would volunteer to pull weeds,” he said. “I can shut my mind off for an hour or two. Or you’re thinking about something else while you’re doing it.”

He does confess to a liking for board games, though, so it’s not all about the outdoors.

Thinking about what changed, he said, “I’d say part of it is down to necessity. When you major in horticulture, you can’t really be an indoor person all the time.”

He said, “As far as jobs go, I’ve had every type of horticultural job, outside or working in a greenhouse, an urban farm in Kansas City.” The farm was a high-intensity fruit producer on two acres. He got to learn about marketing as well as production.

At Monticello, Thomas Jefferson’s home in Virginia, he got to learn about the president’s gar-

den, and of course, gained experience in working for the parks service, a different kind of outreach.

He even worked for an urban vineyard, where he learned about irrigation and grape production. He worked for the City of Leawood, learning about government horticulture, and finally, he slotted in commercial landscaping. Now at the Extension office, he’s gaining the educational piece.

“I’ve been around the block as far as horticulture goes,” he said.

If he could pass on one message, Gilmore said, it’s not to be intimidated by plants.

“Gardening is just one big experiment,” he explained. “A lot of people are kind of hesitant to get into it because there’s that fear of failure, but there’s very low risk trying to grow plants, and infinite rewards. Just jump in and do it.”

And there’s always Extension. “If they have any questions, they can just give me a call,” Gilmore said.

## Garlits knows his speed limit

How fast should a 90-year-old drive?

"I don't think maybe he should go over 225 (mph). I think that would be about the limit."

See ... even "Big Daddy" Don Garlits, who turned 90 on Jan. 14, knows his boundaries.

"The NHRA has been canceling the drag racers' license in top fuel and funny car when they get to be about 89," he said. "I think it's up to the individual and whether they can do it or not. I wouldn't say you should just use that number. It still should be does the guy pass a physical and does he still drive OK."

"I personally know that I shouldn't drive a top fuel car. I don't see good enough and my reactions are not what they used to be. I think 225, I could probably handle that OK. My electric dragster should go about 215, and I'm comfortable with that."

It's not every day that a bonafide legend of a sport comes to your neighborhood. But Garlits came to Mo-Kan Dragway near Ashbury, Mo., for this weekend's Nitro Chaos program, part of the drag strip's 60th anniversary celebration.

Garlits believes this was his fifth time coming to Mo-Kan, the first being in 1962 when the dragway opened. The last time before this weekend was 1984.

Garlits could be found outside his trailer on Friday afternoon sitting near one of his cars -- Swamp Rat 12-A, his first nitro fuel dragster. Garlits helped sell hats, T-shirts, posters and books while visiting with fans. Some fans brought old newspapers and articles that resulted in a big smile from "Big Daddy" and trips down memory lane.

"It's unbelievable," he said. "I'm honored. God has been good to me, allowed me to be this healthy this long. Almost all of my friends are gone. I can count on one hand the people who I know real well who are older than me."

"My mother told me that would happen. She lived to be 96. She said, 'It is so sad that originally you'll lose a whole bunch of friends in their 70s. Then you'll make new ones and lose them in their 80s. ... Finally there will be nobody because you get so old and young people don't want to associate with somebody 95 years old.'"

Correction: Fans of all ages want to be associated with Garlits.

"He's been doing the drag racing for so long, and I used to watch him when I was a little kid on TV," said Terry Burros, a resident of Willard, Mo., who races at Mo-Kan. "I loved it. I didn't get started in hot rodding and drag racing until later on in my life. I just couldn't afford it. Now that I'm in it, I had the chance to come down and see him and see one of his cars. I wasn't going to miss it for anything."

Garlits estimated he's made more than 5,000 passes in excess of 200 mph. He was the first drag racer to officially surpass the 170, 180, 200, 240, 250, and 270 mph marks in the quarter mile. He also was the first to top 200 mph in the eighth mile.

Garlits was hands-on with all parts of his racing operation.

"I loved the mechanical part of it," he said. "I built my own cars. I built my own engines. I drove them. I tuned them. That's the way it used to be. I was the last guy standing that actually did that."

## Drag racing legend Don Garlits returns to Mo-Kan Dragway

ASHBURY, Mo. — Drag racing legend Don "Big Daddy" Garlits has returned to Mo-Kan Dragway for its 60th anniversary, and he has no intention of slowing down.

If it was up to 90-year-old Garlits to continue drag racing, he would race until his age matched his top speed.

"I'm honored and God has been good to me," Garlits said. "He's allowed me to be this healthy and live this long."

Don's love for racing started on his first day of his senior year of high school. It was September 1949 in Tampa, Fla., when he drove his 1940 Ford to school and never looked back.

"I had just gotten my '40 Ford, my first car, and my buddy and I were in the 12th grade," Garlits said. "He pulled up in the other lane, and his father had just bought him a brand new 1949 Chevy Coupe. Mine was an old '40 Ford with 100,000 miles on it that I bought with my own money."

"He said 'let's race!' And I said what are you talking about? And he goes, 'when that light turns green, step on it!' So, we did."

Garlits said his friend shot right ahead of him.

"It was a little stick shift Chevy," he said. "It was pretty spunky, and my little '40 Ford was weak, but it was really exciting. I loved it. And that got me going."

"Two people contest the issue," Garlits said. "One wins, one loses. They don't bump into each other. It's person

against person. Machine against Machine. It's not about how daring you can be, or how reckless you can be."

He gave an example of a recent NASCAR race he saw on TV, and he did not agree with the racing style.

"The guy led the race for quite a while, then the other guy pulled up and he just kind of eased into him," he said. "The guy was running really close to the wall, and he pushed him just enough. It was like putting on the brakes."

"The minute that car rubbed a wall a little bit, he pulled back, and he shot ahead because this guy is stopping. He's putting on the brakes, but the guy made him put on the brakes. Oh they were mad."

Garlits prefers the drag strip over the oval track.

"Drag racing isn't like that," Garlits said. "If your car is the fastest and you're good, you

usually win, and that's what I like about it."

Garlits said that the times were much different than today.

"In the beginning it was not expensive," he said. "We used the car that we went to work in and drove every day, and the trick was to have a nice fast motor that was reliable." With a few races in the streets of Tampa under his belt, Garlits was ready to turn his hot rod into a dragster.

"It was a hot rod motor that went 17 seconds, but that wasn't fast enough," Garlits said. "So, I took the motor out and put in a '36 Ford, and it went 15 seconds, but it still wasn't fast enough."

"So, I took it out and put in a roadster, and it went 13 seconds. I took the roadster body off, made it a dragster, and it went 12 seconds," Garlits said.

He then got his Chrysler hemi, took the motor out of that dragster and put it in a '32 Essex Coupe.

"That's why we like drag racing," Garlits said. "See, that one motor did all that work, and never got rebuilt."

Garlits' advice to young dragsters is to start small.

"I would pick a lower class that I could compete in that was inexpensive," he said. "I would set my sights on doing as good as I could in that and not worry about trying to be top fuel, or a top funny car, or even top alcohol. They are all expensive."

"The competition dragsters with the unblown engines in them that run about 180 miles per hour in the low 7s, that's where I would set my sights," he said. "To have a car like that would be the top, because that's a car that can be easily maintained and it won't cost a lot of money."

## Emotional exit for Woods, big chance for Smith at St Andrews

ST. ANDREWS, Scotland (AP) — Tiger Woods made an early and emotional departure Friday from the British Open, possibly for the last time at St. Andrews. Cameron Smith can only wonder if the 150th Open will be his arrival as an undisputed elite player.

Smith already won The Players Championship this year and has risen to as high as No. 3 in the world. His 8-under 64 gave him his first lead in a major, by two shots over PGA Tour rookie Cameron Young. Rory McIlroy was lurking another shot behind.

"It's obviously a really good spot to be in," Smith said. "I feel like I've been in this spot a lot over the past couple of years, and things just haven't quite gone my way yet."

Woods strode over the Swilcan Bridge without stopping to pose for pictures and said it "felt like the whole tournament was right there" when he walked the final 356 yards of

what was otherwise a long day of 75 to miss the cut.

# Hernández, Chapman, Manoah lead Toronto past depleted Royals

TORONTO (AP) — Teoscar Hernández and Matt Chapman hit three-run home runs, Alek Manoah snapped a three-start winless streak with seven strong innings and the Toronto Blue Jays beat the depleted Kansas City Royals 8-1 on Friday night.

Kansas City, in last place in the AL Central, was without 10 unvaccinated players and bolstered its roster with Triple-A and Double-A prospects. The Royals lost for the second time in seven games.

Foreign nationals who aren't vaccinated against COVID-19 are not allowed to enter Canada, save for limited exceptions that require a 14-day quarantine. Unvaccinated baseball players are placed on the restricted list, which means they are not paid and do not accrue major league service time.

Among the 10 players on Kansas City's 26-man roster who stayed home were All-Star outfielder Andrew Benintendi, two-time All-Star Whit Merrifield, future cornerstones Kyle Isbel and MJ Melendez and outfielder Michael A. Taylor. Also barred were first baseman Hunter Dozier, right-handed starters Brad Keller and Brady Singer, reliever Dylan Coleman and backup catcher Cam Gallagher.

A second-year right-hander, Manoah (10-4) came in having lost con-

secutive starts for the first time in his brief career. He turned that around by giving up one run and four hits, walking none and striking out six.

Trevor Richards and Anthony Banda each worked an inning of relief.

Chapman and Raimel Tapia each had three hits as the Blue Jays piled up 16 total. Toronto is 5-10 in July.

Hernández connected off Royals right-hander Zack Greinke in the third, his 12th homer of the season. Chapman's homer, his 15th, came off Royals call-up Carlos Hernández in the fifth.

Greinke (3-6) allowed four runs, three earned, in four innings, losing to the Blue Jays for the first time since June 5, 2009. Greinke had gone 3-0 with a 2.38 ERA in five starts

against Toronto since.

First baseman Nick Pratto had his first big league hit, a single in the fifth, but the Royals didn't manage much against Manoah, who improved to 11-1 with a 2.20 ERA in 18 career starts north of the border.

Shortstop Maikel Garcia became the fifth Kansas City player to make his debut this series when he replaced Bobby Witt Jr. on defense in the bottom of the sixth.

Pratto doubled in the ninth to finish 2 for 4.

# Welcome to the Island of Misfit Sports

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) — Like a fish out of water, Elisabeth Hammerstad tracks down a simple garden hose to wash off the sand and drench herself in a bit of relief from the blistering Alabama heat.

The fair-skinned Hammerstad, her hair tied back in a French braid, has just helped Norway to an easy victory over Australia.

In beach handball, of all sports.

Hammerstad sees nothing unusual about her Arctic homeland standing out in an obscure sport that would seem best suited to warm-weather nations.

"We have summer in Norway too," she said with a wry smile.

One other thing: What is beach handball?

Those sort of queries come up frequently at The World Games, a sort of Island of Misfit Toys for a fascinating array of sports that are on the outside looking in at the Olympics, enviously hoping for their chance to someday shine on the biggest stage.

From air sports (parachuting and drone racing) to wushu (a Chinese martial art) — and pretty much everything in between — this 11-day, Olympic-style competition is being hosted by a U.S. city for only the second time in its four-decade-long existence.

Birmingham seems a curious choice for a competition that was delayed

a year by the COVID-19 pandemic, since its sporting history largely begins and ends with college football and a wide array of failed pro teams.

But for a city trying to demonstrate how far it's come from an ugly role in the American civil rights movement, this is perhaps the perfect event to show its tolerance for a wide collection of sports that most locals have never seen — or even understand.

Take beach handball, which features players flinging themselves into all sorts of twirling, twisting contortions to shoot for goals that are worth two points.

It was being held on two land-locked courts filled with sand in the shadow of Sloss Furnaces, a remnant of the long-forgotten era when this was the Steel City of the South.

Then there's korfball, which can best be described as basketball

sport with boys and girls, so it would be very nice if it's in the Olympics," Caluwe said. "The idea behind the Olympics is also what korfball is about."

Thomas Bach, president of the International Olympic Committee, stopped by the Birmingham-Jefferson Convention Center to watch a korfball game between Belgium and his native Germany.

"It shows the diversity of sports," Bach said, standing just off the court. "You can experience sports which are not always on everybody's mind. But you see the same passion of the athletes, just like other sports on the Olympic program."

In a bid to reach a younger, hipper audience, the Olympics have picked off several World Games events over the years, including badminton, rugby sevens, taekwondo, trampolines and triathlon.


Then there are sports that haven't gained permanent Olympics status, such as karate, softball, sport climbing and breakdancing. They are all on the program in Birmingham.

Climbing and breakdancing will also be Olympic sports in Paris, while other sports are making a big push to be on the program at Los Angeles in 2028.

Flag football's debut at the The World Games is also the kickoff to a high-profile campaign — backed by the NFL — to be added to the Olympics in La La Land.

# Chiefs unable to sign franchise LT Brown to long-term deal

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — The Kansas City Chiefs and Pro Bowl left tackle Orlando Brown Jr. failed to reach a long-term deal before Friday's deadline, leaving the blindside protector for quarterback Patrick Mahomes playing on the franchise tag this season.

The Chiefs had been optimistic that they could sign Brown, whom they acquired from the Ravens for a package of draft picks prior to last season, to a long-term contract. But negotiations were slowed initially as Brown settled on representation, and then it became increasingly clear as time ran out that the sides remained far apart.

The Chiefs made a final pitch of six years and nearly \$140 million, with \$30.25 million guaranteed at signing, which would have made Brown one of the league's highest-paid left tackles. But it's unclear how much of the total deal was guaranteed, and that is likely what kept the sides from coming to an agreement.

In terms of average value, the 49ers' Trent Williams remains the league's highest paid left tackle at \$23.01 million per year on the six-year, \$138.06 million contract he signed last year. The Packers' David Bakhtiari set the standard before Williams and is making \$23 million per year on the four-year, \$92 million contract he signed in 2020.

The question facing the Chiefs now is whether Brown will report to training camp next week.

The Chiefs placed the franchise tag on the 26-year-old tackle, which means he would play next season for \$16.7 million whenever he decides to sign the contract tender. But until that happens, Brown can skip training camp — just as he did with voluntary workouts and the Chiefs' mandatory minicamp — without risking any sort of fine.

He would miss valuable practice and conditioning time,

though.

"He's a young guy so there's plenty of room to grow," Chiefs coach Andy Reid said at the conclusion of the minicamp last month. "He's wired the right way to do that, to attack that. I know he's been working out and doing the things he needs to do to get ready for camp. He's a young guy that's new to the position, is on the rise, I would hope."

The Chiefs rebuilt their offensive line following a dismal performance against Tampa Bay in the Super Bowl two years ago, and Brown was expected to be the cornerstone of it. The Chiefs shipped a package of draft picks to Baltimore that included a first-round selection to get him, and the expectation all along has been that he would sign a long-term deal.

Brown started every game for the Chiefs last season, when he was selected to his third consecutive Pro Bowl, and helped to tutor a front five that included rookies in center Creed Humphrey and right guard Trey Smith.

"We love Orlando here. He's a good human being and he's a good professional," Reid said. "He's grown up around it. I think he's got good counsel. So, we just have to work through it."

# Players discuss how NL DH changes game

Max Scherzer misses hitting. He misses pitching to pitchers.

And yet the New York Mets right-hander is just fine with the full-time addition of the designated hitter to the National League as of this season, nearly 50 years after the American League adopted it.

"The biggest benefit," the three-time Cy Young Award winner said, "is that the sport is under one set of rules."

So now all Major League Baseball games, regardless of location, include a DH in the lineup. The ballot for Sunday's All-Star Game at Dodger Stadium included a DH for the NL (reigning MVP Bryce Harper of the Philadelphia Phillies led the voting for that spot but is out with a broken left thumb and will be replaced by William Contreras of the World Series champion Atlanta Braves). And scoring is up in the NL in 2022.

"In the future, you might be able to do some type of realignment, because

everyone has the same rules," Scherzer said. "I don't know what it would look like, but you have more possibilities to do that."

Adding the DH should increase offense by putting a real batter in the lineup. It also changes a manager's job by eliminating some of the decisions about pinch-hitting, double-switching, etc.

"I've thought about it a few times: 'When's the pitcher coming up?'" Arizona Diamondbacks skipper Torey Lovullo said early in the season.

Runs per game for NL teams were at 4.5 through June this season, an increase from 4.31 through June in 2021 (although still down from 4.78 in 2019).

Over that same portion of each year from 2017-21 (minus the pandemic-shortened 2020), pitchers for NL teams combined to produce a .154 batting average, .152 slugging percentage and .306 OPS with per-season average league-wide totals of 7.6 homers and 79.2 RBIs.

Compare that to the NL DH stats this year: .241 average, .408 slugging, .728

OPS, 159 homers and 567 RBIs.

"We don't really think about it anymore. It's just part of the game now," Harper said. "The DH is here and I don't think it's going anywhere anytime soon."

Scherzer said he was hoping for additional tweaks to the way the DH works — he called it the "double-hook DH."

Here's how that would work: Either the player in the batting order as the DH would need to leave the game when his team's starting pitcher gets re-

moved or if the starting pitcher made a qualifying start by some measure — going five innings, say, or lasting 100 pitches — then his team would get to keep using its DH for the full game.

"If you connect the DH and the starting pitcher together, it would help promote keeping the starter in longer," said Scherzer, who is 6-1 with a 2.15 ERA this season. "I feel like the game is using the starting pitcher less and less, and I think that's just a problem from an aesthetic standpoint."

# 30 women settle Watson-related claims against Texans

HOUSTON (AP) — Thirty women who had accused the Houston Texans of turning a blind eye to allegations that their former star quarterback Deshaun Watson was sexually assaulting and harassing women during massage sessions have settled their legal claims against the team, their attorney said Friday.

The terms of the settlements between each of the women and the Texans are confidential, said attorney Tony Buzbee.

While only one of the women had filed a lawsuit against the team, the others intended to make legal claims against the Texans before the settlements were reached, Buzbee said.

In separate lawsuits, 24

women accused Watson of exposing himself, touching them with his penis or kissing them against their will during massage appointments while he played for the Texans. One woman alleged Watson forced her to perform oral sex. Last month, Buzbee announced 20 of those 24 lawsuits have been settled.

In a statement, Texans owners Janice McNair and Hannah and Cal McNair said while the team did not have any knowledge of Watson's alleged misconduct, they were "shocked and deeply saddened" when they first learned about the accusations and chose to resolve the claims against the team "amicably."

"This is not an admission of any wrongdoing, but instead a clear stand against any form of sexual assault and misconduct. We hope that today's reso-

lution will provide some form of closure to the parties involved, our fans and the Houston community at large. As an organization, we will now turn our focus to the future and doing what we can to ensure respect for all," the McNairs said in their statement.

In the lawsuit filed last month against the Texans, a woman accused the team and some of its employees of having been told or being aware of Watson's troubling behavior and "known tendency to push boundaries during massage sessions." The lawsuit alleged the Texans provided Watson with various resources, including rooms at a Houston hotel, massage tables and a non-disclosure agreement the women were told to sign, that allowed the quarterback "to further his misconduct with women."

Buzbee said while he would have no additional comment on the allegations against the Texans, in a statement he added "there is a marked contrast in the way in which the Texans addressed these allegations, and the way in which Watson's team has done so."

Watson, who agreed to be traded to the Cleveland Browns in March after four seasons with Houston, has claimed his innocence and that any sex with the therapists was consensual. The 26-year-old is facing possible discipline from the NFL over the allegations.

Watson, who signed a five-year, \$230 million contract with the Browns, is waiting to see if he'll be eligible to play this season. NFL disciplinary officer Sue L. Robinson will decide whether the three-time Pro Bowler violated

the league's personal conduct policy with his off-field behavior.

A former federal judge in Delaware, Robinson held a hearing last month during which the league and the NFL Players Association presented ar-

guments. The league has insisted on an indefinite suspension for Watson while the union says there are no grounds for a lengthy ban since he did not commit any crimes.

# Tiger Woods gets emotional sendoff from St. Andrews

ST. ANDREWS, Scotland (AP) — Tiger Woods removed his cap a few strides from Swilcan Bridge, knowing Friday might be the last time he crossed over in a British Open at St. Andrews.

This is where the legends pause, pose and wave goodbye.

“Stop! Stop!” a few photographers cried out as they positioned themselves for another historic moment at the home of golf.

Woods kept right on walking, even as tears began to form in his eyes.

“That’s when I started to realize — that’s when I started thinking about — the next time it comes around here, I might not be around,” Woods said.

He said this wouldn’t be his last British Open. Woods just doesn’t know if his 46-year-old body, battered by multiple surgeries on both legs and his back, would be fit enough to compete when it returns to the home of golf. Woods mentioned 2030. The R&A hasn’t announced the rotation that far out.

Still, the moment was not lost on him.

Woods saluted the thousands of fans in the grandstands on the left, and thousands more who watched from hotel bal-

conies and rooftops on the perimeter of the Old Course, some peering through windows, others without a ticket hanging from the top of the fence on the road down the right side of the 18th fairway.

Rory McIlroy looked over at him from the first fairway — he was starting his second round as Woods was finishing a 75 to miss the cut — and tipped his cap. Justin Thomas was on the first tee and nodded to Woods.

“As I got closer to the green, the ovation got louder,” Woods said. “You could feel the warmth and you could feel the people from both sides. Felt like the whole tournament was right there.”

It may as well have been.

This is where Woods won his first Open in 2000 to become the youngest player to complete the career Grand Slam. He won another claret jug at St. Andrews in 2005, the year Jack Nicklaus finished his major championship career.

No one has ever won an Open at St. Andrews three times, and Woods wasn’t about to change that. The only thing ceremonial for him was his golf — a 78 in the first round, only one birdie in the second round despite the most benign conditions of the week.

No matter. The Old Course, which had been

relatively quiet all morning, came to life the closer he made his way to the finish.

“The people knew that I wasn’t going to make the cut,” Woods said. “But the ovations got louder as I was coming home. And that to me was ... just the respect. I’ve always respected this event. I’ve always respected the traditions of the game.”

“I put my heart and soul into this event over the years,” he said. “And I

think the people have appreciated my play.”

Woods gave them little to celebrate on what might be his final round at St. Andrews. He only had four reasonable birdie chances. His flop shot over a pot bunker guarding the front pin on the 16th hit the top and rolled back into the sand, leading to his third double bogey of the week.

By then, it didn’t matter. The people just wanted to see him.

After he ripped his drive over the Old Course Hotel sign and into the 17th fairway, hotel guests and spectators lined up against the wall in front of the hotel and the Jigger Inn. The grandstand was full behind the 17th, and people stood six deep in the space behind the road and the stands.

It was similar to when Nicklaus played for the last time in 2005. He was 65 and had announced months out it would be his last Open, his 166th and final major. Everyone knew it was coming.

Not even Woods knows his future, only that he was thankful — and lucky — to be playing an Open on the Old Course just 17 months after he crashed his car in Los Angeles and sustained so many broken bones that doctors contemplated amputation on his right leg.

He headed to the 18th tee, the home hole. All he said he could think about was whether to hit 3-wood or 5-wood. But as he walked off the tee and got closer to the bridge, he realized his caddie, Joe Laca, was lagging behind. So were Matt Fitzpatrick and Max Homa, who rode shotgun for an emotional day involving the best player of their lifetimes in golf.

“It was amazing. It gave me goosebumps,” said

Fitzpatrick, who won his first major last month in the U.S. Open. “Just looking around, seeing everyone stood up, and giving him a standing ovation coming down 18. It was incredible. It’s something that will live with me forever.”

“It’s thoroughly deserved, and I think towards the end of it, you could see he was a little bit emotional as well. Yeah, it was a big deal.”

Not even Woods could deny that. He just wished he could have written a better ending. He chipped with a mid-iron to about 4 feet for one last chance at birdie, a fitting farewell. Thomas, Shane Lowry and Viktor Hovland were at their second shots to the first hole. They all turned to watch Woods finish out.

He missed the putt. All that mattered to Woods was an ovation he won’t forget.

“It’s very emotional for me,” he said. “To me it felt like this might have been my last British Open here at St. Andrews. And the fans, the ovation and the warmth, it was an unbelievable feeling, I understand what Jack and Arnold (Palmer) had gone through in the past. I was kind of feeling that way there at the end.”

## Former champions at St. Andrews all miss cut at British Open

ST. ANDREWS, Scotland (AP) — The last four British Open champions who won their titles on the Old Course missed the cut at St. Andrews on Friday.

Zach Johnson (2015), Louis Oosthuizen (2010), Tiger Woods (2005, 2000) and John Daly (1995) all finished over par after two rounds. The cut was at even-par 144.

Oosthuizen came the closest to making it the week, posting 74 to miss by one shot. Woods was the farthest out of that group. He opened with a 78 and followed with 75 for his worst 36-hole score in six times playing the Open at St. Andrews.

Woods acknowledged it could be his last.

“The people knew that I wasn’t going to make the cut at the number I was,” Woods said. “But the ovations got louder as I was coming home.”

Plenty of other former Open champions joined them in not making the cut, including Collin Morikawa. The 25-year-old American, who won the title last year at Royal St. George’s, finished his two rounds at 1 over.

Morikawa is the first defending champion to miss the cut since Darren Clarke in 2012. Clarke also won his only major title at Royal St. George’s.

Phil Mickelson, Henrik Stenson, Ernie Els and Padraig Harrington also failed to make the final

weekend.

“It hurts missing the cut,” said Harrington, a two-time champion who birdied his first two holes Friday but shot 78 to end up at 3 over. “It hurts missing when you were 5 under par. Do you want any more hurts?”

**CALIFORNIA DREAMING** The harsh wind and frequent rain of Scotland doesn’t often get confused with the golden sun and mild climes of California.

Then again, Sahith Theegala had never played the Old Course before this week.

The 24-year-old American took advantage of the mainly dry conditions at the British Open to put himself in contention at the oldest major of them all. He credited his upbringing in southern California.

“It’s funny that there’s no water or grass on a lot of California public courses. It’s like hitting off the hard pin,” Theega-

la said. “You kind of learn to hit these spinning wedges, like cutting them or hooking them. I feel pretty comfortable on some of the lies out here because I know some guys change their wedges or stuff, less bounce. But I’m used to hitting off hard pins.”

“It’s a little purer out here, obviously. But, yeah, I think it definitely helped a little.”

Theegala is playing at his first British Open, but it’s not his first time on a British Open course. Not that he recalls his previous experience all that much.

“I was here nine, 10 years ago,” Theegala said. “I remember so little. I played Carnoustie, and I’m like, ‘This is the hardest course I ever played.’ I birdied 18 to break 90, shot 89.”

The birdies came far easier over the last two days. He had five on Thursday in a 3-under 69 and added four birdies and an eagle in a second-round 68.

the lowest 36-hole score in the Open at St. Andrews.

Even a weekend without Woods is set up for great theater.

Dustin Johnson, who already has a Masters green jacket and a U.S. Open title at Oakmont, played early in the best conditions of the week — light rain that took some of the fire out of the Old Course and then a warming sun — for a 67. He was four shots back. Right behind was Masters champion Scottie Scheffler with another 68.

Smith is building a reputation as a great putter, a great weapon to have on the greens at St. Andrews, and he plays without fear. He opened with three straight birdies and then began to pull away around the loop at the far end of the course.

He holed an 18-foot putt on No. 7, made birdie from 30 feet on the par-3 eighth and then drove the 10th green and two-putted from some 90 feet for a third birdie in four holes.

The big blow came at the par-5 14th when Smith buried the long eagle putt. He looked as though he’d just rolled in a short one for par. That’s his game. That’s his style.

“I don’t get too excited

nor too angry. I like to stay in the middle there,” he said. “A lot of people say that it’s boring to watch. But that’s just how I go about my golf.”

On the other end is McIlroy, among the most dynamic players from his generation. With four majors early in his career and always a promise for more, he is seen as one of the better candidates to fill at least some of the void when Woods isn’t around.

That explains the tee times. The R&A was trying to get it close to the right time that Woods and McIlroy would cross paths — Woods going one way toward the 18th, McIlroy the other way heading down the first. That’s about how it played out.

McIlroy looked over and tipped his cap to Woods.

“Everyone hopes it’s not the end of his Old Course career,” McIlroy said. “I think he deserves — we deserve him — to have another crack at it.”

Woods wasn’t he only early departure. Collin Morikawa became the first defending champion to miss the cut since Darren Clarke in 2012. Phil Mickelson missed out on the “Celebration of Champions” exhibition on Monday, the champions’ dinner on Tuesday and the weekend. He missed the cut for the third straight time in the British Open.

# Pedersen posts maiden Tour stage win; Vingegaard keeps lead

SAINT-ETIENNE, France (AP) — Former world champion Mads Pedersen attacked from the start, then delivered in style on the finish line to claim his first stage win at the Tour de France on Friday.

After spending the day at the front, the one-day classic specialist attacked from a group of six riders with 12 kilometers left and dropped three rivals on the road leading to Saint-Etienne. He perfectly timed his final move about 250 meters from the finish to leave his two remaining opponents in his wake with a powerful burst of speed.

Fred Wright of Britain was second and Hugo Houle of Canada completed the stage podium.

Pedersen was crowned world champion in 2019. He also won Gent-Wevelgem two years ago but had never tasted victory in a Grand Tour.

"I finally take the win I was looking for," Pedersen said. "Coming to the Tour, I knew my shape was good but I missed the opportunities in the first week. I took my chance today. It's really nice to get the reward."

It's a very successful Tour for Danish riders, who have posted three stage wins since the start of the race in Copenhagen in addition to the yellow jersey taken by Jonas Vingegaard this week.

"I guess it's super nice to be a Danish guy at the moment," Vingegaard said.

Following two brutal days of racing in the Alps, Vingegaard enjoyed a quiet day in the pack, well protected by his Jumbo-Visma teammates. Two-time defending champion Pogacar, who gave away the iconic tunic in the first big mountain stage at the Col du Granon, did not try anything to unsettle Vingegaard during the 193-kilometer Stage 13 which started in Le Bourg d'Oisans.

Their battle is expected to resume next week in the thin air of the Pyrenees mountains before the race ends in Paris in nine days. Overall, Vingegaard leads Pogacar by two minutes, 22 seconds. The 2018 champion Geraint Thomas was third, 2:26 off the pace.

Pedersen was the first attacker of the day amid

a flurry of unsuccessful moves on large sections of road. A group of three riders finally went clear in the short cote de Brié climb.

Two-time time trial world champion Filippo Ganna was first at the top ahead of Stefan Kung and Matteo Jorgenson. The trio was joined by Pedersen, Houle, Quinn Simmons and Wright.

They opened a gap of about two minutes as the peloton of main contenders looked happy to let them go after a frenetic opening hour of racing.

Sprinters' teams, however, remained vigilant and made sure the breakaway's lead did not grow too much.

Alpecin-Deceuninck and Lotto Soudal joined forces to set a strong pace until Australian sprinter Caleb Ewan missed a turn and crashed. The incident changed the dynamics of the stage, since Lotto-Soudal riders waited for their teammate, leaving the responsibility of the chase to others.

Back on his bike, Ewan found shelter behind a team's car and gradually made his way back but

the Cote de Saint-Romain-en-Gal climb proved too difficult and the diminutive rider was eventually dropped.

The breakaway group

extended its lead to 3:30 until Team BikeExchange-Jayco riders decided to pull the peloton for ace sprinter Dylan Groenewegen. But it was

too little too late and they gave up the chase once they realized they would never close the gap.

# WNBA star had doctor's note for cannabis use

KHIMKI, Russia (AP) — A lawyer for WNBA star Brittney Griner at her drug possession trial in Russia on Friday gave the court a U.S. doctor's letter recommending she use medical cannabis to treat pain.

Griner, a two-time Olympic gold medalist and standout for the Phoenix Mercury, was arrested at Moscow's Sheremetyevo Airport in February after customs officials said they found vape canisters containing cannabis oil in her luggage. She faces up to 10 years in prison if convicted on charges of transporting drugs.

In court last week, Griner pleaded guilty and

acknowledged possessing the canisters but said she had no criminal intent and said they were in her luggage because she packed hastily in her return to Russia to play for the UMMC Ekaterinburg basketball team during the WNBA's offseason.

In Russia's judicial system, admitting guilt doesn't automatically end a trial. Since that plea, her court sessions have focused on in-person and written testimony to her good character and athletic prowess.

Griner wore a Nirvana T-shirt as she sat inside the defendant's cage that is customary in Russian courtrooms. At one point, she held up a photo of fellow WNBA players wearing her name and No. 42 on their uniforms in tribute

during part of Sunday's All-Star Game in Chicago.

"The attending physician gave Brittney recommendations for the use of medical cannabis," said her lawyer, Maria Blagopolina. "The permission was issued on behalf of the Arizona Department of Health."

Medical marijuana is not legal in Russia.

The defense on Friday also submitted tests she underwent as part of an anti-doping check, which didn't detect any prohibited substances in her system.

The next hearing of Griner's case was scheduled for July 26.

U.S. President Joe Biden and Secretary of State Antony Blinken have said they are doing all they could to win her release,

as well as that of other Americans the U.S. considers "wrongly detained" by Russia, including former Marine Paul Whelan who is serving 16 years on an espionage conviction.

Washington may have little leverage with Moscow, though, because of strong animosity over its military operation in Ukraine.

"In the hearings yesterday and today what became very clear is the tremendous amount of respect and admiration both in the United States and here in Russia where Miss Griner has been playing basketball for seven years, not only for her professional achievements but for her character and integrity," U.S. Embassy charge d'affaires Elizabeth Rood said outside the

courthouse in the Moscow suburb of Khimki, where the airport is located.

The director and team captain of UMMC Ekaterinburg testified on her behalf on Thursday.


Russian media have speculated that Griner could be swapped for Russian arms trader Viktor Bout, nicknamed "the Merchant of Death," who is serving a 25-year sentence in the U.S. after being convicted of conspiracy to kill U.S. citizens and providing aid to a terrorist organization.

Russia has agitated for Bout's release for years. But the wide discrepancy in the seriousness of their cases could make such a trade unpalatable to Washington. Others have suggested that Griner could be traded along with

Whelan, who is serving 16 years in Russia on an espionage conviction that the U.S. has described as a setup.

The State Department's designation of Griner as wrongfully detained moves her case under the supervision of its special presidential envoy for hostage affairs, effectively the government's chief hostage negotiator. The classification has irritated Russia.

Asked about the possibility of Griner being swapped for a Russian jailed in the U.S., Deputy Foreign Minister Sergei Ryabkov, the senior Russian diplomat, has noted that until her trial is over "there are no formal or procedural reasons to talk about any further steps."

# Prime-time jewel: Barr, Pernas return for more 'Blood & Treasure'

If there's anything the Indiana Jones, Tomb Raider, Mummy and National Treasure movie franchises have shown, it's that historical fiction and action make a great pair. So, why not make the most of it in the world of prime-time television?

That's exactly what CBS aimed to do when it launched the first season of "Blood & Treasure" on the network in 2019. Now, after three years of halted production schedules due to restrictions associated with the COVID-19 pandemic, "Blood & Treasure" is back for Season 2, this time on ViacomCBS's streaming service, Paramount+. Don't miss the first two episodes when they premiere Sunday, July 17.

Created by Matthew Federman and Stephen Scaia, the writer/producers behind the series "Limitless" and "Jericho," "Blood & Treasure" is an action-adventure series for the historically enthusiastic traveler. When Season 1 first began, viewers were introduced to Danny McNamara (Matt Barr, "Walker") pretty well right out of the gate. Calm, cool and well put together, Danny is an antiquities expert who is forced to team up with an old flame in order to stop a terrorist who is funding his empire through stolen artwork and ancient artifacts.

The old flame is Lexi Vaziri (Sofia Pernas, "Jane the Virgin"), who is hardly old but is certainly full of fire. Explicitly chosen by Danny as his right-hand woman because of her criminal in-

telligence, Lexi is a quick-on-her-feet art thief who struggles to cope with her father's death — something she clearly blames on Danny and which haunts their already tested relationship with one another.

Over the course of the first season's 13 episodes, Danny and Lexi try their best to put their claws away and focus on the big picture: save Danny's co-

hort, Dr. Ana Castillo (Alicia Coppola, "National Treasure: Book of Secrets," 2007), from an art-obsessed terrorist faction, wipe that threat off the face of the planet and make the world a better place in the process. That doesn't mean, however, that the pair of ex-lovers don't still have a sordid history to work out through layers of teamwork and sarcasm.

From the very beginning, audiences learn that Castillo had made a great find prior to being attacked and presumably being taken hostage, along with her team, by Karim Farouk (Oded Fehr, "The Mummy," 1999) and his gang of goons. Told that Castillo found the tombs of Mark Antony and Cleopatra while on location in Egypt, viewers more than likely (correctly) pieced together that the bulk of Season 1 would take place in Egypt. From undercover missions posing as arms dealers to high-octane scenes chasing bad guys through crowded markets, "Blood & Treasure" later takes

audiences on a trip beyond the pyramids of Giza to Spain, Morocco, Quebec and the curious Bermuda Triangle, known for several disappearances in its environs.

Season 2, which begins July 17 with two episodes, titled "The Soul of Genghis Khan" and "Tales of the Golden Tiger," appears to begin in the Far East, more than likely in modern-day China. While this season is also expected to run for 13 episodes, fans of the series should prepare for some of the same good old-fashioned globe-trotting that took them on a whirlwind adventure before the pandemic in 2019.

Given all the on-location filming "Blood & Treasure" has to accomplish in order to provide the best experience for viewers, it's no wonder that Season 2 has been delayed for so long. Taking into consideration COVID-era travel restrictions and physical distancing rules alone, the fact

that such an intricate show is up and running as soon as two years behind schedule is understandable to say the least.

Now that it's back up and running, though, fans of the first season are desperate to know more about what is to come.

While not much news has been released as of writing, Season 2 is likely to begin immediately following the freshman season's massive cliffhanger. For those who need a refresher (spoilers!), Mark Antony and Cleopatra's sarcophagi were found once again, safe and sound, but their return now poses a brand-new set of threats; threats that may well make Danny's job quite a bit more difficult going forward.

It seems viewers are also in store to learn more about Danny's personal life, including his so far fairly undiscussed time spent working as a special agent for the FBI.

Cast members expected to return alongside Barr and Pernas include Coppola as Dr. Castillo, James Callis ("Battlestar Galactica") as Simon Hardwick, Michael James Shaw ("Limitless") as Aiden Shaw, Mark Gagliardi ("Drunk History") as Father Chuck, Katia Winter ("Sleepy Hollow") as Gwen Karlsson and Fehr, rumored to be reprising his role as the villainous Farouk.

Get caught up on last season before diving into the first two episodes of "Blood & Treasure" Season 2, premiering Sunday, July 17. Season 1 is available to stream now on Paramount+, while new episodes will stream weekly on Sundays on the platform going forward.

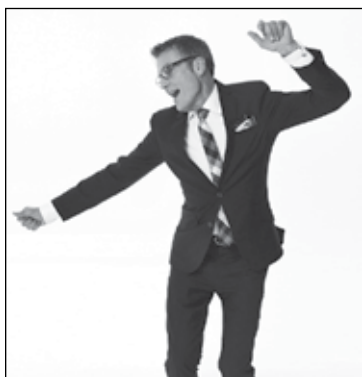

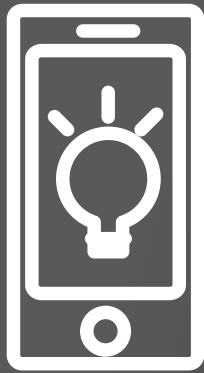

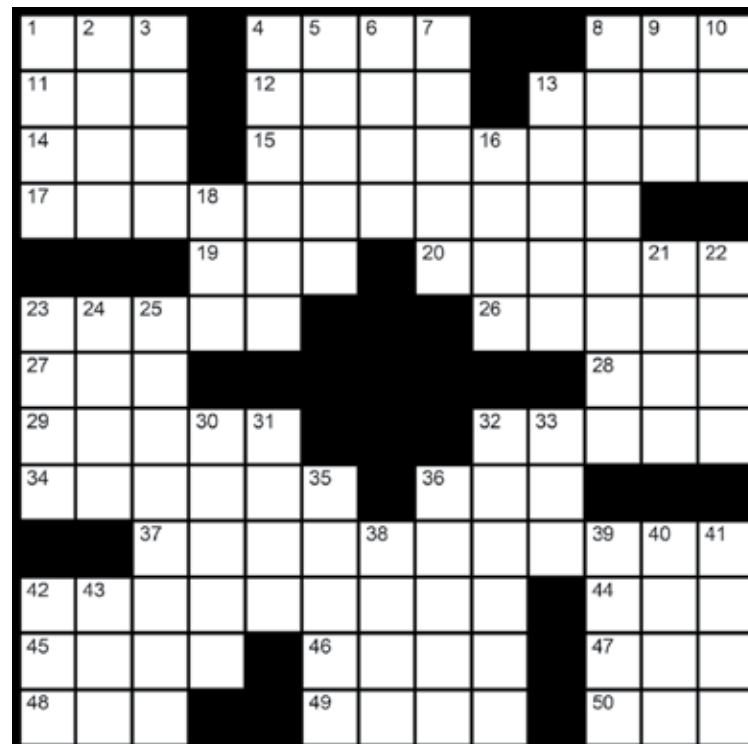

## Back for more: Season 2 of 'Kitchen Crash' continues

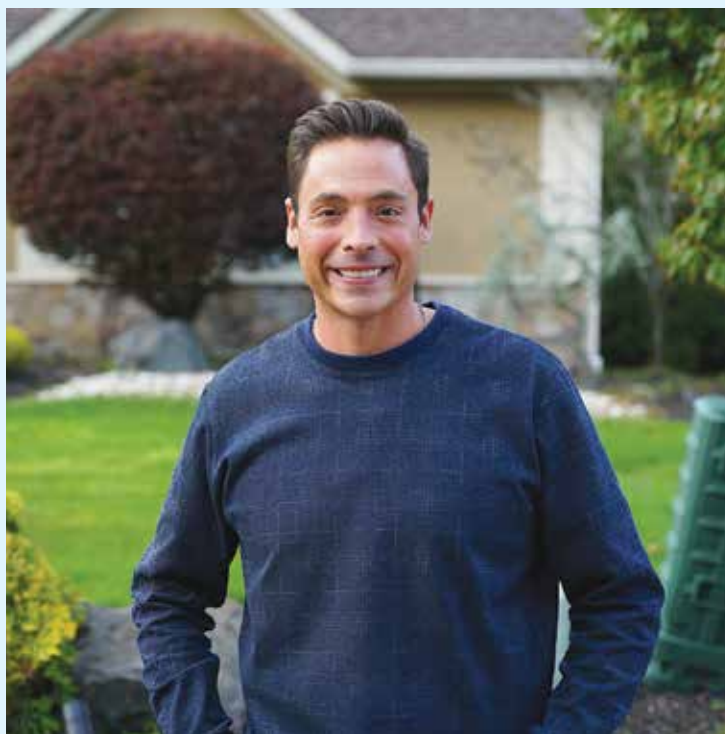
The Sandwich King wants to crash your cookout.

In truth, Jeff Mauro has already crashed all the neighborhood block parties featured in the second season of Food Network's "Kitchen Crash," which premiered last week, but that's no reason not to get excited. A new episode, one of just four hourlong episodes that make up Season 2, airs Tuesday, July 19, on the Discovery-owned network.

In each episode, three professional chefs (and a full production crew) head to a neighborhood, where they have only 10 minutes to convince homeowners to hand over food items from their pantries and refrigerators. Once they get their ingredients, the chefs move to curbside kitchens, where they'll be judged throughout three rounds of challenges.

The show has been described as a cross between "Supermarket Stakeout" and "Chopped," but unlike "Chopped," there's no magical pantry with a seemingly endless supply of ice cream ingredients. In fact, there is no shared pantry at all. The chefs are limited to what they're given by the homeowners, and all items must fit into a single bin, including essentials such as salt and oil.

"No two pantries or fridges in America are alike, making the ingredients in the bins as varied as they can possibly be," Mauro said. "The chefs must be able to communicate effectively with the family to get everything they need,

and they need to be creative and resourceful with what they get. It really is difficult, but fun and exhilarating, to watch."

In Tuesday's episode, the "Kitchen Crash" crew travels to Malverne, New York, where Mauro and the chefs crash a garden block party. Special guest Marc Murphy ("Chopped") assists Mauro in selecting the winner from this batch of contestants after they've each prepared a cheesy Mexican-inspired dish, some surf-and-turf and a dessert with a surprise filling. The win-

ning chef will be awarded a \$10,000 cash prize to share with the family who provided the ingredients.

New Jersey and New York natives may even recognize their own neighborhoods this season, as most of the filming took place across those two states this time around. On Reddit, Mauro explained that Season 1 filming had been limited to "a contained area/state because of COVID restrictions and quarantine laws." That may have also been a factor while filming "Kitchen Crash's" latest season.

# Parenting crash course

British sitcom 'Trying' returns as a family of four

With a sea of family sitcoms about parents and their kids, Apple TV+ debuts a new season about what happens before people become a family. Season 3 of "Trying" premieres on the streaming service Friday, July 22, and tells the story of mid-30s Camden, U.K., couple Nikki and Jason, portrayed by "Cuckoo" star Esther Smith and "The Big Short" (2015) actor Rafe Spall, as they try to build their family from a twosome to a threesome.

Heartbroken by the news that further rounds of IVF would be both costly and more than likely unsuccessful, Nikki and Jason consider joining an adoption agency. Initially intimidated by the competitive and lengthy process, the couple quickly grows bored of the hobbies they take up to fill their child-shaped void and they decide to jump back into trying to become adoptive parents.

Proven to be resilient throughout many of last season's hurdles, Nikki and Jason remain determined to get what they want — even when it seems everything is working against them (especially when compared to the other couples in their council's adoption agency process). Not only do most of the couples they're up against have impressive careers, but they also come complete with impressive volunteering contributions and daunting libraries of parenting books.

Feeling like they don't quite measure up in their careers as an English as a second language teacher and car rental call center agent, Jason and Nikki fill their time with lectures and personal improvements to try to bet-

ter their chances for approval at the agency.

What follows a bout of personal growth is a mad dash of tasks designed to prove their worthiness as potential parents. The couple tries everything from taking a friend's two kids out for an unexpectedly stressful, spend-full day around London to attending a training session where they fail to deal with a hypothetical issue in front of the posh parents-to-be. While both excursions show them just how little they know, the outings also help to gauge their expectations going forward.

Luckily as they move through the steps, they gain an eccentric and loyal player on their team, seasoned social worker Penny, played by legendary English actress Imelda Staunton ("Vera Drake," 2004). She immediately takes to the couple and stands up for them during a difficult panel, ultimately leading to the adoption approval they were so desperately seeking.

Season 2 of "Trying" sees the freshly approved couple move on to the next stage of the adoption process, preparing to finally welcome a child of their own into their lives. Stepping up in their careers and improving their flat, Nikki and Jason come close to adoption several times, always keeping the hope alive that their match is just around the corner. For as fans will recall, the Season 2 finale left the hopeful parents on the verge of adopting not one but two children.

The unvarnished family sitcom has become something of a trend lately, with the Channel 4/Amazon Prime series "Catastrophe," which ran for four seasons, created by and starring Rob Delaney ("Burning Love") and Sharon Horgan ("This Way Up") as Rob and

Sharon, relative strangers who take a gamble on quickly becoming family after Sharon unexpectedly becomes pregnant following their fling during Rob's business trip to London.

Currently airing on FX, meanwhile, is the dark sitcom "Breeders," starring Martin Freeman ("Sherlock") and Daisy Haggard ("Back to Life"), and, on CTV in Canada, "Children Ruin Everything," starring Meaghan Rath ("Hawaii Five-0") and Aaron Abrams ("Hannibal"), which has been renewed for a second season.

In each of these series, the classic family sitcom tropes of yore are turned on their head, showcasing flawed people who come together as a family rather than a seemingly perfect family

unit run by a powerful, do-it-all matriarch and working father.

Favorable reviews from both critics and audiences are bolstered by the real-life experience of series creator Andy Wolton ("The Great Travel Hack"), who was adopted as a child. Spall told GQ Magazine U.K. that Wolton's on-set presence was invaluable during filming.

"He was the person that we went to if we had any questions," Spall said before going on to say that the light-hearted tone of "Trying" is especially appreciated during these past few difficult years living through a pandemic: "There's always comedy in life and that should be celebrated and embraced."

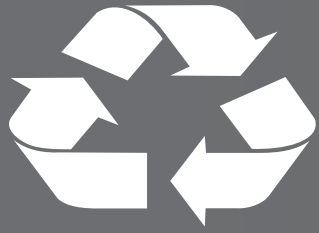
Smith, in an interview with Screen Rant, also spoke about the importance

of balancing the serious subject matter of navigating the adoption process with humor.

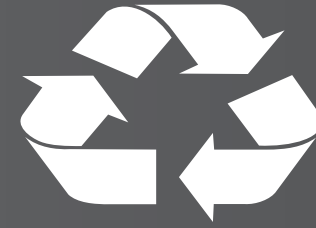

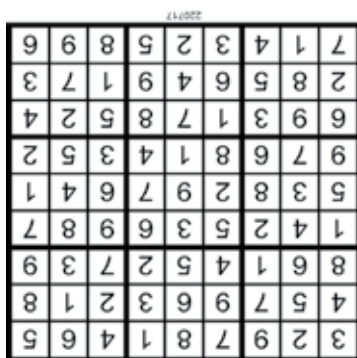
