## County reports record turnout

*Numbers attributed to constitutional amendment on the ballot*

GIRARD, Kan. — Crawford County Clerk Lisa Lusker reported record voter turnout for Tuesday's primary election during Friday's county commission meeting.

According to Lusker's unofficial results, 10,386 of the county's 26,183 registered voters turned out to cast their ballots, for a voter turnout of 39.67 percent. Most ballots, 8,588,

were cast on election day with the remaining 1,798 being early ballots.

Party break-down of the total number of votes favored the Republicans with 4,881 votes cast, followed by the Democrats' 3,842 votes and non-registered voters casting the remaining 1,663 ballots.

A different story played out when looking at the ratio of registered party members who voted. Registered Democratic voters narrowly edged out registered Republicans by less than a percentage point (52.14 to 51.47 percent). Only 17.82 percent of nonpartisan voters cast a ballot.

Lusker attributes the high voter turnout to the constitutional amendment issue. In primary elections, party members select their party's can-

didates for the general election, so nonpartisan voters don't typically vote, unless there is a nonpartisan issue to be decided, such as a constitutional amendment. This year, that was "Value Them Both."

Lusker said the election "went fairly smoothly." There were a few signs placed too close to polling centers, prompting a few phone calls from the American Civil Liberties Union, but these situations were quickly rectified without incident.

The county will finalize the official results after meeting with the Board of County Canvassers on Aug. 12.

"We had a great turnout," said Lusker. "I hope it continues."

## Long-time advocate receives award

*CCMHC honors Ron Albertini*

According to Ehling, Albertini served on the Crawford County Board of Mental Health for over 25 years. He was instrumental in acquiring land in Frontenac for use as a nature preserve, often creating and mapping out the trails himself.

"He loved nature," said

PITTSBURG, Kan. — Labor Day is just around the corner, which means Little Balkans Days is also coming up. This year's festival is planned for Aug. 29 to Sept. 4.

You can get your passports in advance at Celebrations by Lori, Crawford County Historical Museum, Kansas Teachers Community Credit Union, the Pittsburg Area Chamber of Commerce or Ron's Supermarket.

If you attend at least four passport events, drop off your passport at any place where passports can be purchased by 5 p.m. Tuesday, Sept. 6. One passport holder will be chosen

at random to receive a \$500 cash prize from Mpix and another will receive \$100 in Chamber Bucks. Wristbands for the Little Balkans Days carnival will also be available at the Pittsburg Area Chamber of Commerce, Ron's Supermarket and online at littlebalkansfestival.com, or you can call 620-231-1000. The cost is \$15 each.

On Monday, Aug. 29, the festivities kick off with a Little Balkans cooking school that starts at 6:30 p.m. at St Mary's Guadalupe Hall. This is a passport event.

At 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 30, another passport event, the Little Balkans Embroidery 101 class, will be held at the Block22 large community room at Fourth and Broadway.

At 6 p.m. Wednesday, Aug. 31, there will be a Paint The Town Red Block Party in downtown Pitts-

burg sponsored by the Pittsburg Area Chamber of Commerce and other community sponsors.

From 6 to 10 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 1, there will be a Carnie King carnival session at Lincoln Park. Wristbands are \$15 per session and available at Ron's Supermarket and the Pittsburg Area Chamber of Commerce. At 7 p.m. there will be the PSU vs. Central Missouri Football Game, following the Gorilla Village Celebration, which starts at 4p.m.

Friday, Sept. 2, at 8 a.m. a Chamber Coffee event will take place at Pritchett Pavilion at the intersection of 2nd and Broadway. The Little Balkans Quilt Guild Quilt Show will be from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. at Memorial Auditorium. This is another passport event.

## One killed, two injured in Barton County crash

BARTON COUNTY, Mo. — A Mulberry man was killed and two Pittsburg men injured in a crash on Southwest 60th Road in Barton County, Missouri, five miles south of Mindenmines, early Wednesday morning, according to the Missouri State Highway Patrol.

Austin P. VanderMeer, 24, of Pittsburg, was driving eastbound in a 2018 Subaru Outback at approximately 3:24 a.m. when the vehicle ran off the roadway, struck a tree, and overturned, according to the MSHP. Vander-

Meer, who was not wearing a seat belt, was seriously injured in the crash and taken to Freeman Hospital West by MedFlight.

VanderMeer also had two passengers in the car, including 19-year-old Tristan R. Davis of Mulberry, who was also not wearing a seat belt and was fatally injured in the crash. A second passenger, 21-year-old Kameron J. Reece of Pittsburg, who was wearing a seat belt, was moderately injured, according to the MSHP. He was taken to Ascension Via Christi Hospital in Pittsburg for treatment.

## TFI names Pitt State grad as new CAO

PITTSBURG, Kan. — TFI, a private 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that provides foster care services and care for children and families in Kansas, Nebraska, Oklahoma, and Texas, has announced that Melissa Briggs, a two-time graduate of Pittsburg State University, has been named the organization's new chief administration officer (CAO).

# Little Rock attorney admits to defrauding US farm programs

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (AP) — An Arkansas attorney has pleaded guilty to his role in a conspiracy to defraud two U.S. Department of Agriculture programs of about \$11.5 million, according to court documents.

Everett Martindale, 75, of Little Rock, pleaded guilty Thursday to conspiracy to commit fraud by acting as attorney for 192 people who filed false claims of discrimination when seeking USDA funds for farming operations, said U.S. Attorney Jonathan Ross.

He faces up to five years in prison, but prosecutors will recommend a two year sentence and dismiss two similar counts as part of a plea agreement.

The claims were filed by people recruited by sisters Lynda Charles of Hot Springs; Delois Bryant of North Little Rock; Rosie Bryant of Colleyville, Texas; Brenda Sherpell of Gainesville, Texas; tax preparer Jerry Green of Grand Prairie, Texas; and notary public Niki Charles, Lynda Charles' daughter, of

Sherwood.

Martindale is the last of the seven to reach a plea agreement in the case. None has been sentenced.

None of the claimants was discriminated against when they sought funds from the Black Farmers Discrimination Litigation settlement and the Hispanic and Women Farmers and Ranchers claim program, according to Ross.

Martindale failed to investigate the claims, despite signing certifications that he had done so,

Ross said.

None of the claimants has been named in the indictment and a spokesperson for the U.S. Attorney's Office in Little Rock did not immediately return phone calls Friday for additional comment.

The two programs were created as the results of settlements of a lawsuit by Black farmers and a separate lawsuit by Hispanic and women farmers in which both groups said they were discriminated against when applying for farm credit from the USDA.

**100 Years Ago**  
Aug. 6-8, 1922  
C. E. Johnston, general manager of the Kansas City Southern railroad company, conferred with Joplin businessman yesterday in regard to the removal of the railroad shops at Pittsburg to Joplin. The conference is understood to have lasted several hours. Businessmen in Joplin said no definite decision was reached to move the shops with their 700 workmen who are now on strike.

The official canvas of the primary election in Crawford county has just been completed by the county commissioners. Judge George F Beasley leads the Republican ticket with 5,373 votes and on the Democratic ticket J. W. Howe, candidate for lieutenant governor leads with 2,254 votes. On the Socialist ticket only 19 votes were cast throughout the county.

The county commissioners have cut the tax level of Crawford County to 9.54 mills for 1922 from 10.70 mills in 1921 resulting in a reduction of 1.16 mills. The greater part of the reduction is made by the county itself, the new county levy is 7.88 mills, a reduction of .585 from the old one. The new state levy is 1.66 mills, a reduction of .575 from the old one. The new levee for bridges is only one mill, while for 1921 it was two mills.

The motorman on the Joplin & Pittsburg air line car leaving here Friday at 6:30 o'clock for Joplin, saw a small child on the tracks near Mount Olive cemetery as the car was under full speed. He applied the

air hard and the speed of the car was checked suddenly, but the motorman saw that the stop would not be soon enough. Leaping out the door, he ran ahead and picked up the child before the grinding wheels of the interurban had reached it.

Any hope the Frontenac Candy Kids might have held for victory over the Vocates was destroyed Sunday afternoon at the Fair Grounds park. The Vocates handed the Kids a 6-0 defeat. Inability to connect with the delivery of Bobby Starns, and a propensity to bobble when that should have been the last thought of act, accounted for the Frontenac defeat. Five visitors' errors accounted for four of the six Vocate runs.

A contract for the purchase of 50,2395 acres of land south of Fourth Street and west of Free King Highway has been signed, it was reported at the meeting of the board of education of Pittsburg Unified School District 250 last night. The tract is the site for the proposed new senior high school. The design for the new school is being prepared for the architectural firm of Edmondson Wilson and Associates of Pittsburg.

The Frontenac city council voted 6-2 last night not to change the zoning classification of Parkview Drive from residential to business to permit construction of a 50-bed nursing home. The Crawford County Regional Planning Commission recently recommended that the council change the zoning of the area to permit building of the facility. A capacity crowd of about 50 persons attended the council meeting.

Girl Scout Troop No. 130 was organized in St Paul

less than two years ago, but apparently is already a motivating force in politics. The troop, led by Kay Burr and Boni Kennedy, spent last Tuesday knocking on each door in St. Paul urging residents to vote in the primary elections and offering rides to the polls. Mrs Burr said the result was voters turned out at the polls in record numbers.

Two children were taken to Mt. Carmel Medical Center with minor injuries and two citations were issued in a collision at Walnut and Quincy yesterday. Pete Murry, 211 Crestwood, was cited for allowing an unauthorized minor to operate a motor vehicle after cars driven by his daughter Margaret M. Murry, 15, and Rebecca L. Rice, 16, No. 8 Quincy Court, collided.

Dennis McComak of Columbus, Kan., made the Munich U.S. Olympic Archery team yesterday at Oxford, Ohio, finishing third. McComak will also be competing in world competition in Italy with the U.S. Field Archery team in September and set an unofficial world record scoring 349 points from the 30-meter range. The official world record is 348. The 20-year-old Columbus native attends Kansas State College of Pittsburg.

A Wyandotte County jury said Gary Wayne Kleypas must die for the brutal murder of Carrie Arlene Williams. After deliberating for almost nine hours over two days, the jury delivered a verdict of death a little before 2 p.m. yesterday. As the judgement that one day could mean his death at the tip of a lethal injection needle was read, Kleypas appeared to fight back tears. He only occasionally glanced at jurors.

Students returning to St Mary's-Colgan High School will find a building significantly different than the one they left in May. Expanded Internet access, a new heating and air conditioning system, a renovated auditorium and two new classrooms are part of the massive summer facelift. The changes are the first phase of a \$1.8 million project that also will include the construction of eight more classrooms.

Bray, 74, recently brought home his second world horseshoe pitching championship, winning the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association Senior Class E title in Kitchener, Ontario, Canada. Bray also won the Senior Class E world championship in Biloxi, Miss., in 1991.

Champions. That's what the Pittsburg 14-year-olds became yesterday — the champions of the Midwest Plains Regional Babe Ruth Tournament. Pittsburg defeated Lincoln, Neb., 7-2 in Moorhead, Minn., to cap a backs-against-the-wall run with five straight victories in the losers' bracket after losing in the second round. Pittsburg gets the rate privilege of ending its season with a victory. There is no Babe Ruth World Series for 14-year-olds.

**Today's Highlight in History:**

On Aug. 6, 1945, during World War II, the U.S. B-29 Superfortress Enola Gay dropped an atomic bomb code-named "Little Boy" on Hiroshima, Japan, resulting in an estimated 140,000 deaths. (Three days later, the United States exploded a nuclear device over Nagasaki; five days

after that, Imperial Japan surrendered.)

**On this date:**  
In 1806, the Holy Roman Empire went out of existence as Emperor Francis II abdicated.

In 1825, Upper Peru became the autonomous republic of Bolivia.

In 1942, Queen Wilhelmina of the Netherlands became the first reigning queen to address a joint session of Congress, telling lawmakers that despite Nazi occupation, her people's motto remained, "No surrender."

In 1965, President Lyn-

don B. Johnson signed the Voting Rights Act.

In 1973, entertainer Steve Wonder was seriously injured in a car accident in North Carolina.

In 1978, Pope Paul VI died at Castel Gandolfo at age 80.

In 1991, the World Wide Web made its public debut as a means of accessing webpages over the Internet. TV newsman Harry Reasoner died in Norwalk, Connecticut, at age 68.

In 1993, Louis Freeh won Senate confirmation to be FBI director.

In 2003, actor Arnold

Schwarzenegger used an appearance on NBC's "The Tonight Show with Jay Leno" to announce his successful bid to replace California Gov. Gray Davis.

In 2009, Sonia Sotomayor was confirmed as the first Hispanic Supreme Court justice by a Senate vote of 68-31. John Hughes, 59, Hollywood's youth movie director of the 1980s and '90s, died in New York City.

In 2011 insurgents shot down a U.S. military helicopter during fighting in eastern Afghanistan, killing 30 Americans, most of them belonging to the same elite Navy commando unit that had slain Osama bin Laden; seven Afghan commandos also died.

In 2013, U.S. Army Maj. Nidal Malik Hasan went on trial at Fort Hood, Texas, charged with killing 13 people and wounding 32 others in a 2009 attack. (Hasan, who admitted carrying out the attack, was convicted and sentenced to death.)

**Ten years ago:** Syria's prime minister, Riad Hijab, defected two months after being forced into the position by President Bashar Assad. Marvin Hamlisch, 68, who composed or arranged the scores for dozens of movies including "The Sting" and the Broadway smash "A Chorus Line," died in Los Angeles.

**Five years ago:** Vice President Mike Pence, in a statement released by the White House, described as "disgraceful and offensive" a New York Times report suggesting that he was laying the groundwork for a possible presidential bid in 2020 if President Donald Trump were not to run.

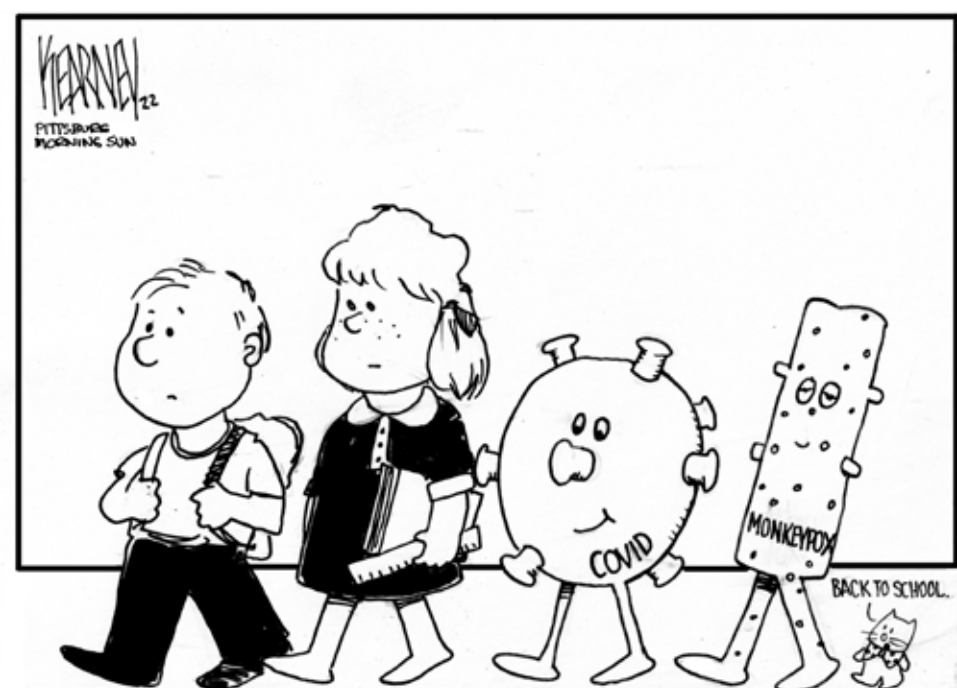

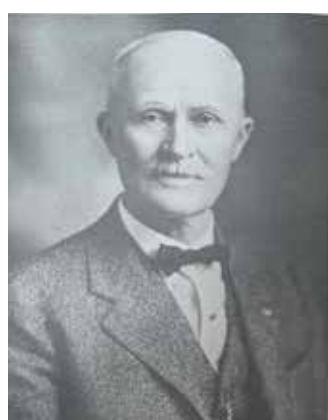
## Rise and Fall of the Invisible Empire, part 7

Crawford County history buffs and readers of this newspaper are typically very knowledgeable about the area's rich roots in bootlegging and coal mining. What they might not know, however, is that Kansas – including Crawford County – has a history with the Ku Klux Klan as well, dating back to the 1920s. Following is the seventh of nine articles (one to appear each Saturday) describing the formation and activities of the Ku Klux Klan in this area as they occurred nearly a century ago.

## Part 7: Battle Over a Senate Bill

Even though the tide was turning against the KKK in Kansas with the state supreme court approving its ouster in January 1925, its successes in the recent November elections prompted a pro-KKK bill to be introduced in February by state senator John N. Johnson of Lawrence. The bill, passed by the Senate, would have allowed the KKK to operate without a charter; the bill was amended to admit foreign corporations of a benevolent, religious, or charitable character to operate without a charter, but required applicants to file a copy of their original charter as well as an annual statement to the secretary of state listing the names of all officers.

This bill prompted one of the “stormiest” scenes of the legislative session. One anti-Klan senator from Concordia took strenuous issue with the statement that the bill was introduced for the sake of Masons, Odd Fellows, and other lodges in the state, saying they should “stop beating around the bush. This is a Klan bill, pure and simple.” Following final debate over the bill a Klansman called out Protestant opponents of the bill as being “spineless” and made a savage attack against Catholics – thus converting a number of previous supporters of the bill into enemies. Some leaders of the Klan also deplored the speech and agreed that it had done much harm to the organization. The Klansman’s attack also provoked the only Catholic member of the House to make a speech in which he stat-

ed that 80 percent of the people in his county were Catholic but had recently elected a Protestant county superintendent and another Protestant candidate, that religious qualifications were not made an issue with his people, and that he resented the Klan speaker’s argument that the KKK was 100 percent American and the implication that others lacked patriotism. He gave statistics showing that in WWI “his people had suffered and sacrificed to win the war.” The Catholic speaker was said to have given “a quiet, dignified short talk and received a liberal applause.” After four heated battles in the House, the bill was defeated, 64-57.

Also in early 1925 Klan members continued to meet openly throughout the state without fear of arrest. As an example,

a February meeting in Girard gained such an attendance that many Klansmen left without hearing the speakers because they could not find standing room in the gathering space. The editor of the Mulberry Independent observed that 1,500 Klansmen was certainly a large gathering for an organization which the press had claimed was already “ousted from the state.” And in March the Crawford County Knights of the Ku Klux Klan boasted that it had the largest membership in the history of the organization. The klavern had been moved from the fairgrounds to North Broadway in Pittsburg, and a fiery cross burned each night at the city’s baseball park, with members saying they enjoyed seeing the emblem of their order displayed as

“a form of friendly greeting.”

Then in May 1925 the KKK re-applied for a Kansas charter with the state charter board (consisting of the attorney general, secretary of state, and state bank commissioner). The purpose of the corporation was said to be for carrying out its purposes as a mystic, social, patriotic, benevolent association, the conferring of initiation and degree rituals, fraternal and secret obligations, words, grips, signs and ceremonies, and the promotion and establishment of subordinate organizations. The incorporators named in the application included the Klan president and secretary, both of Atlanta, and thirteen additional men from nine different states. The application showed the KKK’s assets as fol-

lows: home office building, Atlanta, \$385,324; office fixtures and furniture, \$340,100; stocks and bonds, \$155,000; merchandise, \$110,000; money on deposit, \$414,500; accounts receivable, \$341,000; bills receivable, \$43,700. The state charter board rejected the Klan’s application in June on grounds that there were no provisions in Kansas statutes for “mystic” corporations. Later, the Klan filed a petition for approval as a “fraternal” organization, and on July 1 that petition was rejected by the board as well.

Ehling.

In addition to serving on the Board of Mental Health, Albertini’s long history of public service includes a tour in the Army after graduating from Kansas State Teachers College in 1970, then serving as the mayor of Arma, as a Crawford County surveyor, and surveyor for the City of Frontenac before retiring in 2019. Mr. Albertini passed away in October of 2021 at the age of 72.

Commissioner Tom Moody shared his experiences in working with

Mr. Albertini, as a surveyor and through the Mental Health Board for 25 years. “He was a wonderful man to work with,” said Moody. “I really appreciate everything he did for Crawford County. He was a good guy.”

“I did not get to work with him for very long,” said Commissioner Jeremy Johnson, “but I did get to view a couple of fences with him, and that was a singular experience that I will carry with me forever.”

“Fence viewings were always interesting,” said Moody.

Mrs. Albertini laughed, saying, “You never knew when you had to take a lawyer and a sheriff with you to look at a fence.”

## 5th abortion clinic opened in Kansas in lead up to vote

KANSAS CITY, Kan. (AP) — Planned Parenthood quietly opened another abortion clinic in Kansas in the lead up to a decisive statewide vote in favor of protecting abortion access.

The Wyandotte Health Center in Kansas City, Kansas, had long been in the works but opened with little notice this summer as neighboring Missouri banned nearly

all abortions in the wake of the U.S. Supreme Court’s June ruling overturning Roe v. Wade. Other nearby states took similar actions.

Emily Wales, president and CEO of Planned Parenthood Great Plains, highlighted the Kansas City clinic while discussing abortion access in a conference call this week. The Topeka Capital-Journal reported Friday.

“The fact that that gives us one more location in Kansas to see patients to support them is really critical at this moment because we’re realistic that this region cannot support the number of patients who need care,” she said after Kansas voters rejected a proposed amendment to the state constitution declaring that it grants no right to abortion.

It brings the number of clinics in the state to five, three of which are operated by Planned Parenthood.

The clinic was supposed to open earlier, but the COVID-19 pandemic led to construction delays, Planned Parenthood Great Plains spokesperson Anamarie Rebori Simmons said in an email.

## Rwanda rejects UN report on support for rebels in Congo

KIGALI, Rwanda (AP) — Rwanda’s government is rejecting a report by United Nations experts saying they have “solid evidence” that members of Rwanda’s armed forces are conducting operations in eastern Congo in support of the M23 rebel group whose deadly resurgence has led to talk of war as well as protests against the U.N. peace-keeping force.

“The report is a tactic to distract from real issues and contains false allegations which should be treated with the contempt deserved,” Rwandan government spokeswoman Yolande Makolo said in a statement.

U.S. Secretary of State Antony Blinken will visit both countries next week, with the deadly turbulence in mineral-rich eastern Congo leading the agenda.

Rwanda accuses Congo of collaborating with another rebel group, the FDLR, and said regional security can’t be achieved until that issue is addressed. The FDLR was created by ethnic Hutus who fled Rwanda during the country’s 1994 genocide that killed at least 800,000 ethnic Tutsis and moderate Hutus. Congo has denied supporting the group.

“Rwanda has a legitimate and sovereign right to defend our territory and citizens, and not just

wait for disaster to unfold,” Makolo said.

In a new report to the U.N. Security Council, obtained by The Associated Press, the experts accused Rwanda’s forces of violating a U.N. arms embargo against Congo by their “direct intervention” into the country, either to support the M23 rebel group or to conduct military operations against the FDLR.

Rwandan military members also violated sanctions by providing weapons, ammunition and uniforms to M23 rebels, the experts’ report said. Attacks by the M23 have become more frequent, longer and stronger, and the territory under the group’s control has

“significantly increased,” causing massive displacement of civilians and indiscriminate shelling, the experts added.

The latest in eastern Congo insecurity has sparked deadly protests against the U.N. peace-keeping force there.

Relations between Congo and its smaller neighbor Rwanda have been fraught for decades. Rwanda alleges that Congo gave refuge to Hutus who carried out the genocide. In the late 1990s, Rwanda twice sent its forces deep into Congo, joining forces with Congolese rebel leader Laurent Kabila to depose the country’s longtime dictator Mobutu Sese Seko.

## Sarwinski returns for final season at PSU

*Gorillas begin fall camp on Monday*

It wasn't difficult for P.J. Sarwinski to stay another year at Pittsburg State and use his final season of eligibility.

"It's never a wrong decision to come back and play the game that you love with the people you love," he said.

Sarwinski, an honorable mention linebacker last season, starts his sixth year in the program when the Gorillas begin their football fall camp with a practice at 9:15 a.m. Monday at Carnie Smith Stadium. They will also practice at the same time Tuesday through

Thursday and again on Saturday after a day off on Friday.

"I'm looking forward to this year," said Sarwinski, who led the Gorillas last season with 84 tackles and 12 tackles for loss. "It's my last year definitely. There's no more coming back from this."

"I'm excited and optimistic about what this team is going to do this year. This is the best summer I've had since I've been here. We have a lot of great pieces on this team and a lot of guys who can make a lot of plays."

Pittsburg State is picked third in the MIAA preseason polls behind Northwest Missouri and

Nebraska-Kearney.

The Gorillas finished 8-3 last season, and they return 11 players who received all-MIAA honors and 15 players (eight offense, seven defense) who started at least four games in 2021. They have 58 total lettermen -- 21 offense, 32 defense, five special teams.

"We played good football last year but obviously not up to our standards," Sarwinski said. "We lost three games very close last year. This summer we've had a great number of guys showing up and putting in good work. We're very excited about this season coming."

It's a dream come true for Sarwinski to play for

the Gorillas.

"We have the Gorilla Walk every home game," he said. "When I see those little kids, I think of myself. I think of a small boy from Galena, Kansas, or from Baxter Springs or Girard or Pittsburg, Kansas, wanting to be a Gorilla one of these days. It's so surreal, and it's a dream come true where I'm at."

"You look at P.J. walking on to the football program and earning a scholarship and then becoming an All-American and then being voted captain, I think what a model that is to our program and our community," Gorillas coach Brian Wright said. "To see how hard work pays off and you

stick with something and you put great effort and you have a great attitude every day and you're surrounded by great people, you can do great things. P.J. is a testament to that."

Looking back on college, Sarwinski says it's an example of time flies when you're having fun.

"I went to the Shrine Bowl (in July at PSU), and I played in it five or six years ago," Sarwinski said. "It's crazy to think that it feels like it was yesterday. Going in to college, I was thinking this is going to be a long time, but honestly, I feel like college has gone a lot faster than high school for me. I've enjoyed every moment of it."

The Cardinals erased that in the eighth. Nolan Arenado hit a one-out single, and Tyler O'Neill worked a two-out walk on a full count.

DeJong, playing his sixth game since being recalled from Triple-A, doubled to right against All-Star Clay Holmes (5-3) to score both runners.

Andre Pallente (5-4)

threw four scoreless innings in relief. He gave up three hits with two strikeouts.

Ryan Helsley earned his 10th save by pitching the ninth. He retired Carpenter on a groundout to end the game on a close play at first.

The Cardinals, who had just four hits in the game, have won five straight. St. Louis extended its home winning streak to six games.

New York starter

Nestor Cortes threw 5 1/3 innings before being lifted after a walk. Cortes, who pitched in the All-Star Game last month, allowed one hit and two runs. He walked four with four strikeouts.

Judge scored his second run in the fifth, giving New York a 3-1 lead. He led off with a single to chase starter Dakota Hudson, who gave up seven hits. After stealing second and advancing on a groundout, he was

knocked in on a single by Gleyber Torres.

Donaldson drove in New York's first two runs. His one-out single in the third drove in Judge, who led off with a single and went to third on Carpenter's second single. Donaldson doubled home DJ LeMahieu with two outs in the first inning.

Yadier Molina singled up the middle with two outs, scoring Arenado from second to tie the game 1-1 in the second.

# Scully honored with video tribute, banner at Dodger Stadium

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Dodgers manager Dave Roberts ended a pre-game ceremony honoring broadcaster Vin Scully by running the crowd through a chorus of Scully's famous line, "It's time for Dodgers baseball."

Scully, who called Dodgers games for 67 years and retired in 2016, died on Tuesday at age 94.

Behind a beautiful blue sky, there was a moment of silence at Dodger Stadium on Friday for the lovable Scully, followed by a video narrated by Dodgers broadcaster Charley Steiner and accompanied by Israel "IZ" Kamakawiwo'ole's memorable version of "Somewhere Over the Rainbow."

Scully once described a beautiful night as "a cotton candy sky with a canopy of blue." He was the soundtrack of baseball games for generations of

Dodgers fans and a masterful storyteller.

Roberts said Scully wouldn't have liked all the attention.

"Vin, as he's looking

down on us right now, well, he hated the spotlight on him," Roberts said. "Well, this is going to be a very uncomfortable moment right now but he deserves it. Vin was a man of character and integrity and class, a true gentleman. He wasn't just a Dodger. He loved the game of baseball that we all love and care about."

Dodgers and San Diego Padres players stood along the first- and third-base lines during the ceremony.

When Scully called his last game at Dodger Stadium in 2016, he had a banner that hung from his booth that read: "I'll miss you."

Scully told the crowd that he needed them far more than they needed him. His last visit to

Dodger Stadium was on June 9, 2021.

Later during the ceremony, the Dodgers gathered at the mound for a photo with the broadcast booth in the background. There was a new banner, unveiled by broadcasters Joe Davis and former Dodger Orel Hershiser, that read, "Vin, we'll miss you."

Fans gave a standing ovation when the video concluded with a picture of Scully waving from the field with a rainbow behind him.

The umpires gathered at home plate and looked up to the broadcast booth and tipped their caps in honor of Scully. Dodger starter Tony Gonsolin did the same from the mound.

# Lamet's eventful week continues with Rockies picking him up

DENVER (AP) — The Colorado Rockies have claimed Dinelson Lamet off waivers, capping a week in which the right-hander was traded by one organization and designated for assignment by another.

Lamet was part of the package the Milwaukee Brewers received Monday in the trade that sent four-time All-Star closer

Josh Hader to the San Diego Padres. The Brewers announced two days later that they had designated Lamet for assignment.

The Rockies announced Friday they had claimed Lamet and designated right-hander Ashton Goudeau for assignment.

Lamet went 3-1 with a 2.09 ERA and finished fourth in the NL Cy Young Award voting during the

pandemic-shortened 2020 season, but he has struggled since while dealing with injuries. The 30-year-old Lamet had an 0-1 with a 9.49 ERA in 13 relief appearances for the Padres this season.

The Brewers also received reliever Taylor Rogers, outfield prospect Esteury Rodriguez and pitching prospect Robert Gasser in the Hader trade.

After the Hader trade, the Brewers brought in reliever Matt Bush on Monday from the Texas Rangers for two minor leaguers, left-hander Antoine Kelly and utilityman Mark Mathias. They then acquired reliever Trevor Rosenthal from the San Francisco Giants on Tuesday.

"Dinelson has a good arm and was included in

the trade to help balance out the deal," Brewers president of baseball operations David Stearns said on Wednesday. "As subsequent transactions played out, the roster fit became a little tougher. We are hopeful we will be able to keep him in our system."

"It's just going to take a little bit of time now for the younger players on the Royals to blend together like the 2014 and 2015 teams did with (Mike) Moustakas and (Eric) Hosmer and the rest of them," Pryor said.

Pryor said when you're on a team that is losing three out of four games in a series, you have to get some kind of mix in order to find answers.

Pryor said that he wished the Royals had a consistent starter at third base.

"Because I enjoy watching the infield play when I go to games," he said. "And it seems like every game that I go to in the past few weeks we have had a different third baseman."

He thinks highly of the Royals young middle infielders Witt Jr., Nicky Lopez and recent call-up Michael Massey.

"They moved Lopez to

short, and he kind of proved that he's the best shortstop we have," Pryor said. "With Massey coming up and playing second, you got Lopez at short and Witt at third. I think those three should play those positions the rest of the season."

"I think with the right mix that they could be in the playoffs next year. A lot of people would laugh at that, but I'm looking at everything combined. All they need is a little bit more power and health, and they can compete."

### PRYOR'S CAREER

Pryor said he didn't really like the Royals that much as an opposing player.

"Not that I was trying to fight them, I just didn't like their attitude," Pryor said. "They were a pretty cocky group of guys."

"When I came here in 1982 to a team that I really didn't like, Amos Otis walked up to me and said, 'hey Pryor, it's different over here. We're expected to win.'"

Those were the only

words Pryor needed to hear.

"Because when you're around players who know how to play the game, you want to add to the value," Pryor said. "In baseball you can be the nicest guy in the world, but unless you show that you belong on the field with better players, you're not accepted in the clubhouse like you want to be."

According to Pryor, Royals teams in the late 1970s spoiled fans with great baseball.

"Sometimes when you see perfection, you just don't appreciate it," he said.

The Royals' playoff teams from the mid-1970s to mid-1980s certainly had their share of disappointments.

"They had a thick skin of pain and of suffering playoff losses that I was brought into when I got traded here," Pryor said. "So, in '84 when we came close again (losing to Detroit), it was like a carryover. We went into the '85 World Series knowing that we're a darn good

team."

He gives much of the credit to General Manager John Schuerholz for assembling the 1985 World Series championship roster.

"Getting Lonnie Smith into the fold, and calling up Bret Saberhagen and

Mark Gubicza and Danny Jackson," Pryor said. "That band of veterans on that team and the young pitching was all that we needed."

Today Pryor is a co-owner along with his wife of Life Priority Nutrition in Kansas City.

# WR Jordan Addison says move to USC was only about football

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Jordan Addison said he didn't know Southern California was the school for him until the moment he set foot on campus for his recruiting visit shortly after entering the transfer portal in May.

And the Biletnikoff

Award-winning receiver said anybody who thinks his decision was about anything but football really doesn't know him at all.

Addison realizes he left behind hurt feelings at Pitt, where he was the nation's most prolific receiver last season while catching 100 passes for 1,593 yards and 17 TDs. Panthers coach Pat Narduzzi

has strongly suggested star players like Addison have been swayed by huge name, image and likeness deals at higher-profile schools like USC.

Addison said there's no truth to those insinuations, and they're disappointing.

"It was definitely frustrating, but I wasn't too concerned because the

truth always comes to the light," Addison said while wearing his new No. 3 cardinal jersey. "I know what my focus is and my intent, so all of that is just outside noise."

Addison is fitting in well with the Trojans, who are completely rebuilding a proud program from its worst season in 30 years. He'll also play with extra

motivation after the rumblings from Pitt — and more overt insults from fans on social media.

"I definitely feel like I got drug through the mud a little bit with the media," Addison said. "But I like being the underdog, and I'm always going to come out on top. I feel like it'll be a great story at the end."

USC has put together a

remarkable roster under first-year coach Lincoln Riley while recruiting extensively through the transfer portal at the same time NIL deals are rapidly changing the sport. The conjunction has led to conflict, with veiled, anonymous accusations of tampering and unfair advantages leveled at the Trojans.

# NFL lets bad boy owners get off with slap on wrist

After Donald Sterling's racist ramblings were exposed to the world, the NBA moved quickly to banish him from the league.

Sure, the forced sale of the Los Angeles Clippers made Sterling even richer, but it sent a clear signal that such behavior would not be tolerated, even from the guys with the biggest checkbooks.

Then there's the NFL, which seems content to let its bad boy owners slide with nothing more than a slap on the wrist, no matter how egregious the offense.

Tampering with some of the game's biggest names? Suggesting it would be a good idea to lose games intentionally?

No problem, says the league which likes to throw around the word "integrity" at every opportunity — except when it really matters.

In the eyes of Commissioner Roger Goodell, some mandatory vacation time, a fine that roughly amounts to loose change in the sofa, and surrendering a couple of draft picks should be enough to smooth things over.

That's exactly what Goodell imposed this week on Miami Dolphins owner Stephen Ross, whose conduct was so reckless that it wouldn't have been out of line to shove him out the door — or at least give him a gentle nudge.

Of course, in its version of the just-before-the-weekend news dump, the NFL brilliantly unveiled the case against Ross — and it's quite a doozy — while most fans and pundits were fixated on what's next for quarterback Deshaun Watson, who received a six-game suspension for multiple allegations of sexual misconduct during massages.

The NFL appealed, which could have sent the case to Goodell for harsher, more appropriate punishment, but he timidly handed it off to an outside arbiter.

The Watson case is bad enough. Ross' shenanigans were also worthy of outrage.

But Goodell would prefer we all just move along from a week of disturbing revelations and get to what's really important: a season that conveniently began Thursday night with the Hall of Fame exhibition game in Canton, Ohio.

Pay no attention to that man behind the curtain!

The great and powerful commish has spoken!

By now, it should be crystal clear to everyone that Goodell couldn't care less about integrity as long as the league's

coffers — and his own — keep growing at a rate far ahead of surging inflation.

Sure, he'll swing into action when a player who hasn't been with his team all season dares venture onto a casino app to place legal bets on NFL games. Never mind that the league has fully embraced sports gambling and has no problem cashing all the massive checks it brings in.

Calvin Ridley's waging, which he readily admitted to with no suggestion that it impacted games, led to his suspension for at least the 2022 season and means the Atlanta Falcons receiver has no chance to receiving his \$11.1 million salary until he's reinstated.

Compare that with Ross' case.

Goodell issued a harsh statement, singling out "violations of unprecedented scope and severity," but showed he didn't have the stomach to actually back up his words with decisive action.

Sure, the Dolphins will be hurt by the loss of a first-round pick next year and a third-round pick in 2024, but the remainder of the sanctions were laughable.

Ross was fined \$1.5 million, which is roughly 0.018% of his estimated net worth of \$8.2 billion and a blip compared to the salary Ridley isn't receiving. Ross also was

suspended from his team through Oct. 17, meaning he won't be around for the first six games of the regular season — at least 11 games fewer than Ridley's banishment.

Somehow, Goodell was able to justify the disparity of his punishments — maybe because his mind is filled with nothing but dollar signs — even though the league determined Ross improperly negotiated with seven-time Super Bowl winner Tom Brady and former New Orleans Saints coach Sean Payton while they were working for other teams.

"I know of no prior instance of a team violating the prohibition on tampering with both a head

coach and star player, to the potential detriment of multiple other clubs, over a period of several years," Goodell said. "Similarly, I know of no prior instance in which ownership was so directly involved in the violations."

The league's investigation, which grew out of former Dolphins coach Brian Flores filing a racial discrimination lawsuit after his firing, was more vague about Flores' accusations that Ross offered him \$100,000 per game to intentionally lose so Miami would get a better spot in the draft.

While the league found that Ross never followed through on the alleged offer, he did express several

times that draft position should take priority over won-loss record.

Goodell — remember, he's the guy who was so concerned with the integrity of the game in Ridley's case — appears to have totally brushed off Ross' clear belief that tanking wasn't a bad thing, comments that so disturbed Flores he passed them on in writing to senior team executives.

Flores, now an assistant with the Pittsburgh Steelers, noted that Ross avoided "any meaningful consequence" even though — and it sounded like he was mocking Goodell here — "there is nothing more important when it comes to the game of football itself than the integrity of the game."

Of course, Flores and anyone else who has paid off lick of attention to the Goodell regime should have known that Ross would get away with it.

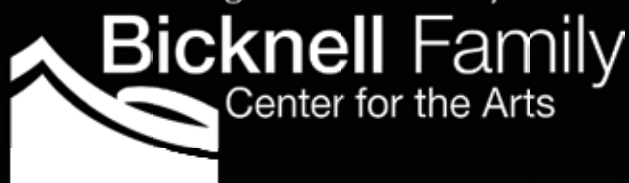
Look no further than Washington owner Dan Snyder, who has faced numerous allegations of a toxic workplace environment without facing any significant punishment.

# NFL hopes to reduce head injuries with helmet experiment

The mushroom-like contraptions NFL players are wearing on their helmets during training camp may look strange, but they're a part of an ongoing safety experiment the league hopes will lead to a reduction in head injuries.

They're called Guardian Caps, and they're now mandatory for all 32 NFL teams through the second preseason game — the time when the league says head injuries are most prevalent.

"There's a density of exposure, and a density of injury, at the beginning of training camp and the competition committee has been looking for ways to change that," said Jeff Miller, executive vice president for NFL player health and safety.

The league said laboratory research indicates the 12-ounce Guardian Caps result in at least a 10% reduction in severity of impact to a player's brain. It says that number climbs to at least 20% if both players involved in a collision

are wearing them.

Miller said mitigating those forces "will have a cumulative effect for the betterment of health and safety of the player."

Not everyone, however, is convinced Guardian Caps are the answer.

Chris Nowinski, co-founder and CEO of the Concussion Legacy Foundation, is "more than a little skeptical" that the extra padding helps prevent head injuries — and wonders if it could be doing more harm than good. "Adding weight to a helmet can make things worse for the brain when it comes to rotational impacts," said Nowinski, who previously served as a co-director of the Boston University Center for the Study of Traumatic Encephalopathy.

"Adding size to the helmet does the same thing. It's very difficult to recreate this in a lab. We aren't sure if this will be a net positive or a net negative."

New York Jets coach Robert Saleh also has concerns.

He questioned whether players are using their

heads more now because the Guardian Caps soften the blow — something he believes could be an issue once the caps come off and actual games begin.

"Anyone who's played football before knows that the first time you take those (caps) off or you hit with your helmet, or you have a collision, there's a shock," Saleh said. "If you're waiting until the first game for that shock to happen, I think it's ... I don't know. Time will tell."

"It's just interesting

with those Guardian Caps, and what exactly are we trying to accomplish?"

Buffalo Bills defensive tackle Ed Oliver isn't seeing the benefits of the caps either and Philadelphia Eagles center Jason Kelce even openly mocked them. Oliver said the padded shells "aggravate" him, making him feel like "a bobblehead" on the field.

"It's just heavy," Oliver said. "I like the way my helmet feels without it. I have been playing without it for this long, I just don't

like it."

Kelce showed up to an Eagles practice with extra bubble wrap on his helmet.

"They say the Guardian Caps add 20 percent protection," Kelce quipped. "I figure the bubble wrap gave me another 2 or 3" percent.

Despite the skepticism, Miller said the feedback from most players has been positive — even if they feel the Guardian Caps look a little funny.

"I wouldn't say they're aesthetically pleasing, and I think we look a little goofy," said Eagles tight end Dallas Goedert. "But they're there for good reason. They did studies with them. Anything to keep us safer, why not do it?"

"Obviously you only get one brain. May as well keep it as best you can."

Added Tennessee Titans tackle Taylor Lewan: "Honestly, at first I was like, 'What a stupid looking thing. This is the dumbest looking thing I've ever seen.' But honestly, I'm not gonna lie, it's kind of nice."

Safety concerns about

head injuries in the NFL has been on the rise for years.

Chronic Traumatic Encephalopathy, or CTE, has been found in the brains of more than 300 former players, according to the Concussion Legacy Foundation. Junior Seau, Andre Waters and Jovan Belcher are just some of the players who have died by suicide and later were determined to have the degenerative brain disease associated with repeated blows to the head.

The league announced in February there were 187 concussions during practice and games in 2021.

That's one reason the NFL's competition committee, given the data presented to them by lab researchers, mandated that offensive and defensive linemen, linebackers and tight ends — players who see the most head impacts during practice — wear the Guardian Caps this summer after five teams and about 100 players experimented with them last year at training camp.

## Raiders give McDaniels happy homecoming, beat Jaguars 27-11

CANTON, Ohio (AP) — The Las Vegas Raiders gave coach Josh McDaniels a successful homecoming in his debut on their sideline.

Josh Jacobs, rookie Zamir White and Austin Walter ran well on a rain-soaked field and the Raiders routed Jacksonville 27-11 in the Hall of Fame game Thursday night, spoiling coach Doug Pederson's first game with the Jaguars.

McDaniels grew up in this historic football town and played for his father, Thom McDaniels, at Canton McKinley High School

on this field at Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium, known as Fawcett Stadium during his time as varsity quarterback and kicker.

"It was a unique opportunity, very grateful that I had it," McDaniels said. "It's the first time I've been to this Hall of Fame game in 22 years. To have an opportunity to do that with him here, my family and people who helped me along the way, it was a special night for them. I really savored it."

Derek Carr and Davante Adams warmed up but they didn't get a chance to play their first game together since Fresno State. Carr, the three-time Pro

Bowl quarterback, and Adams, the All-Pro receiver acquired in blockbuster trade with Green Bay, were among many starters who sat out for both teams.

Jacksonville's Trevor Lawrence wore a backward cap on the sideline while third-string quarterback Jake Luton started.

The NFL's first preseason game began 40 minutes late due to severe weather that forced fans to seek shelter.

As expected, things got sloppy after the opening kickoff.

Top pick Travon Walker committed a roughing-the-passer penalty on Raiders backup QB Jarrett Stidham on the first play from scrimmage. Walker later registered a sack.

The highlight of the game didn't count. Jacksonville's Willie Johnson returned a punt 88 yards for a score on the final play of the third quarter but it was nullified by a holding penalty.

The 46-year-old McDaniels begins his second stint as an NFL head coach after winning six Super Bowls as an assistant under Bill Belichick with the New England Patriots. McDaniels was 11-17 with Denver in 2009-10.

## Pro Football Hall of Fame recognizes women's impact

CANTON, Ohio (AP) — A 15-year-old boy made his way through the the Pro Football Hall of Fame museum on Friday, checking out the memorabilia and bronze busts before stopping to take a picture of Jen Welter's blue-and-pink jersey to send to his younger sister.

"She will love this," said Zach Fleming, a Pittsburgh Steelers fan in town with his dad for the first time. "I want her to know girls can make the Hall of Fame, too."

Welter became the first woman to coach an NFL game in 2015 when she joined the Arizona Cardinals as an assistant coaching intern for training camp and the preseason.

The shirt, pants and sneakers she wore on the sideline in all four exhibition games are on display at a new exhibit in the Pro Football Today area of the museum.

Welter's game-worn Texas Revolution jersey, her Dallas Diamonds helmet and a commemorative helmet signed by Team Australia during her time as head coach of the national team is also

displayed in a separate glass enclosure.

The "Women's Impact on Football" exhibit debuted ahead of this week's enshrinement festivities. It features artifacts from women who have played, coached, officiated and broadcast the game at its highest level.

"There's a lot of women involved in pro football and we wanted to recognize their contributions and tell their stories," said Ben Ankrum, assistant curator at the Pro Football Hall of Fame. "We've had other exhibits featuring women in

## Kremlin says Griner swap must be discussed without publicity

MOSCOW (AP) — The Kremlin said Friday that it's open to talking about a possible prisoner exchange involving American basketball star Brittney Griner but strongly warned Washington against publicizing the issue.

Griner, a two-time U.S. Olympic champion and an eight-time all-star with the WNBA's Phoenix Mercury, has been detained in Russia since Feb. 17 after police at a Moscow airport said they found vape cartridges containing cannabis oil in her luggage.

A judge convicted the 31-year-old athlete Thurs-

day of drug possession and smuggling, and sentenced her to nine years in prison. The politically charged case comes amid high tensions between Moscow and Washington over Russia's military action in Ukraine.

Asked at the White House Friday about the prospects of securing Griner's release, President Joe Biden said: "I'm hopeful ... We're working hard."

In an extraordinary move, U.S. Secretary of State Antony Blinken spoke last week to Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov, urging him to accept a deal under which Griner and Paul Whelan, an American jailed in Rus-

sia on espionage charges, would go free.

Lavrov and Blinken were both in Cambodia on Friday for a meeting of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations. Blinken did not even glance at his Russian counterpart as they took their seats at an East Asia Summit.

Lavrov told reporters that Blinken didn't try to contact him while they were attending the ASEAN meeting.

"We were separated by just one person at the discussion table, but I didn't feel his desire to catch me. My buttons are all in place," he said when asked about Washington's statement that Blinken would try to buttonhole Lavrov

for a quick interaction in Phnom Penh.

Lavrov said Moscow was "ready to discuss" a prisoner swap but that the topic should only be discussed via a dedicated Russia-U.S. channel that Biden and Russian President Vladimir Putin agreed to establish when they met in Geneva in June 2021.

"If the Americans again try to engage in public diplomacy and make loud statements about their intention to take certain steps, it's their business, I would even say their problem," Lavrov said. "The Americans often have trouble observing agreements on calm and professional work."

In Moscow, Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov made the same point more harshly, saying "the U.S. already has made mistakes, trying to solve such problems via 'microphone diplomacy.' They are not solved that way."

He, too, emphasized that any discussions on a possible trade should be held via the previously established confidential channels that Putin and Biden agree to during last year's summit.

"Such mechanisms exist, but they will be thrown into doubt if the discussion continues in the public domain," Peskov said. He said: "If we discuss any nuances related to the issue of exchange via me-

dia, no exchange will ever take place."

People familiar with the U.S. proposal have said it envisions trading Griner and Whelan for a notorious Russian arms trader, Viktor Bout. He is serving a 25-year sentence in the U.S. after being convicted of conspiracy to kill U.S. citizens and providing aid to a terrorist organization.

The call between Blinken and Lavrov marked the highest-level known contact between Washington and Moscow since Russia sent troops into Ukraine more than five months ago, underlining the public pressure that the White House has faced to get Griner released.

# Chun takes halfway lead at Women's British Open

MUIRFIELD, Scotland (AP) — In Gee Chun is making another strong run at a major.

The South Korean golfer took the halfway lead at the Women's British Open after a 5-under 66 in the second round on Friday, putting her in position to challenge for a second major title of the year, and fourth overall.

Chun had an 8-under total of 134, putting her one shot ahead of South Africa's Ashleigh Buhai and Sweden's Madelene Sagstrom, who both shot 65.

Seven-time major winner Inbee Park, also of South Korea, was a shot further back after a 67.

Chun, who won the Women's PGA Champi-

onship at Congressional in June despite consecutive weekend rounds of 75, carded six birdies and a solitary bogey in her round at Muirfield.

Sunday's winner will earn more than \$1 million but Chun said she was also motivated by a slightly smaller cash prize on offer.

"Before the start of the tournament my caddie Dean and I talked about the course and after that we had a little bit of betting," Chun said. "If I make a bogey-free round he's said he's going to buy me dinner and pay me 100 dollars each day. So before each round it's like setting another goal. That mindset helped a lot on the

course. I had two bogeys over the last two days but I want to keep trying to make a bogey-free round."

Of Chun's four LPGA Tour victories, three have come at majors, including the 2016 Evian Championship and 2015 U.S. Women's Open.

On Friday, she even got some help from one of the gusts of wind that make Scottish links golf so tricky.

"I have a great reason to love the Scottish wind now," Chun said. "My ball was around the edge of the hole today, and after like three seconds it dropped. So now I can enjoy more the Scottish wind."

Buhai looked on course to claim the halfway lead

when she made an eagle and four birdies to race to the turn in 30, but after picking up another shot on the 11th she could not make any further gains and dropped her only shot of the day on the last.

Overnight leader Hinako Shibuno followed her opening 65 with a 73 to fall four shots off the pace.

Jessica Korda, who was second after the first round, settled for a 74 and was in a tie for 17th.

Four-time major winner Laura Davies, making her 42nd appearance at the event at the age of 58, missed the cut after an 81 which included a 10 on the 18th.

## Tom Kim going places in a hurry, among leaders at Wyndham

GREENSBORO, N.C. (AP) — Joohyung "Tom" Kim began the Wyndham Championship with a quadruple bogey on his first hole and wasn't the least bit bothered. The kid seems to be going places in a hurry.

Already assured a PGA Tour card for next season, Kim overcame his rough start with a 6-under 64 on Friday that gave him a share of the lead with Brandon Wu and Ryan Moore in the final PGA Tour event of the regular season.

Kim, a 20-year-old South Korean, has to win at Sedgefield Country Club to qualify for the FedEx Cup playoffs because he will not be considered a PGA Tour member until September when the new season starts. Only a victory gives him instant membership.

He doesn't feel extra pressure to get it done. Considering where he was a month ago, Kim is

happy to be where he is.

Kim — he goes by "Tom" because of his fascination as a kid with Thomas the Tank Engine in the TV series "Thomas & Friends" — finished third in the Scottish Open, made the cut in the British Open and 3M Open, and then finished seventh last week in the Rocket Mortgage Classic.

That gave him enough points to be assured of a card next year. And as he has shown in two days, it takes a lot to stop this train.

He took eight shots for his first hole on Thursday. Since then, Kim has made 14 birdies and reached 9-under 131 along with Wu (67) and Moore (67).

## NCAA will have 2 regional sites for 2023 women's tournament

The NCAA Tournament for women's basketball is going to a two-host format for its regional rounds next year with eight teams apiece playing in Seattle and Greenville, South Carolina.

Each of those sites will host two regional semifinal games March 24 and two more on March 25. Each site will host one regional championship on March 26 and another on March 27.

In the past, the NCAA Tournament had four regional sites.

Rick Nixon, the NCAA associate director for media, said the committee announced the eventual switch to two regional sites in 2019 and named the host cities in 2020 in an attempt to maintain neutral sites for the regional rounds. The NCAA men's regionals remain at four sites.

The NCAA Tournament

bracket will be revealed on March 12, the same day that the men's tournament announces its teams.

The First Four opening-round women's games will take place March 15-16 and will be conducted on campuses of teams seeded among the top 16. All sites bidding for round-of-64 and round-of-32 games must agree to the possibility of hosting a First Four game as well.

Ball State athletic director Beth Goetz will serve as the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball chair for the 2022-23 school year. Oregon deputy athletics director Lisa Peterson is vice chair and will take over as chair in 2023-24.

"It's such an important time for our sport and championship," Goetz said in a statement released by the NCAA. "The committee is dedicated to continue to work alongside the women's basket-

ball community and staff in making sure that we continue to serve as stewards for the NCAA Tournament, one of the world's greatest sporting events."

Planning for the 2023 championship also included updates on operations, officiating, travel, ticketing, branding, broadcast, digital/social and media. The committee received a report on planning for the 2023 Women's Final Four in Dallas, which will host the second joint Division I, II and III women's basketball national championship games at the American Airlines Center over two days.

The committee also received an update on the Women's Final Four site selection process, which will conclude with the announcement of the 2027-31 sites in November.

Tickets for the Greenville and Seattle Regionals will go on sale on Oct. 20.

## NCAA hoops leagues grapple with unequal pay for women's refs

The NCAA earned praise last year when it agreed to pay referees at its men's and women's basketball tournaments equally. The gesture only cost about \$100,000, a tiny fraction of the roughly \$900 million networks pay annually to broadcast March Madness.

Now, as the NCAA examines various disparities across men's and women's sports, pressure is rising to also pay referees equally during the regular season. Two Division I conferences told The Associated Press they plan to equalize pay, and another is consid-

ering it. Others are resisting change, even though the impact on their budgets would be negligible.

"The ones that are (equalizing pay) are reading the writing on the wall," said Michael Lewis, a marketing professor at Emory University's Goizueta Business School.

The details of NCAA referee pay are closely guarded, but The Associated Press obtained data for the 2021-22 season that show 15 of the NCAA's largest — and most profitable — conferences paid veteran referees for men's basketball an average of 22% more per game.

That level of disparity is wider than the gender pay

gap across the U.S. economy, where women earn 82 cents for every dollar a man earns, according to the 2020 census. And it is an overwhelming disadvantage for women, who make up less than 1% of the referees officiating men's games.

Dawn Staley, the head coach for the University of South Carolina Gamecocks — the women's national champions — said referees on the men's side should be "stepping up" and advocating for equal pay for women's referees. "They don't do anything different," she said. "Why should our officials get paid less for taking the (expletive) we give them?"

The people who provided AP with data for nearly half of the NCAA's 32 Division I conferences have direct knowledge of pay scales, and they did so on condition of anonymity because the information is considered private.

The Northeast Conference had the widest per-game pay disparity among the NCAA leagues AP analyzed, with the most experienced referees for men's games earning 48% more. The Atlantic-10 paid veteran men's refs 44% more, while the Colonial Athletic Association paid them 38% more. (Only the Ivy League paid veteran officials equally in the data AP reviewed.)

Of the conferences with unequal pay contacted by AP, two — the Pac-12 and the Northeast Conference — said they plan to level the playing field starting next season. A third, the Patriot League, which had a 33% pay gap last year, said it is reviewing equity for officials in all sports.

"Pay is part of that," commissioner Jennifer Heppel said. The Pac-12 paid referees equally a decade ago, but allowed a disparity to build over time, according to associate commissioner Teresa Gould. She said returning to equal pay is "the right thing to do."

NEC commissioner Nor-

een Morris said the decision to equalize pay was an easy one to make once it realized that basketball was the only sport where it was not compensating referees equally.

Relative to the amounts of money these leagues generate, the cost of bridging the pay gap can seem small.

For example, the SEC paid referees for men's games 10%, or \$350, more than those officiating women's games. Over the course of a season, it would cost the SEC a couple hundred thousand dollars to pay them equally — a sliver of the \$3 billion deal it signed with ESPN to broadcast all of its sports starting in 2024.

# Out of this world TV: Sci-fi meets comedy in 'Resident Alien'

When the SyFy series "Resident Alien" first landed on the network in early 2021, it, like its main character, was unlike anything viewers had ever seen before. Now partway into its second season, the out-of-this-world dramedy continues Wednesday, Aug. 10, following a five-month hiatus.

Starring voice and comedy actor Alan Tudyk ("Firefly") in the leading role, "Resident Alien" follows an alien — whose real name is largely unpronounceable due to a complicated series of clicks and whistles — after he crash-lands on Earth. Caught off guard while searching the Colorado mountainside for his lost space vessel, the alien winds up assuming the body of one Dr. Harry Vanderspeigel, a physician who lives part time in a lakeside cottage in the small, nearby town of Patience.

As the show's pilot progresses, the alien/Harry, who has so far managed to fly under the town's radar for four months due to the real Harry's seasonal visitor status, becomes pulled into a sinister murder case when Patience Sheriff Mike "Big Black" Thompson (Corey Reynolds, "The Closer") and his deputy, Liv Baker (Elizabeth Bowen, "Upload"), ask for his help in a medical capacity. While the human Harry is dead and no longer has control over any aspect of his corporeal form, alien Harry agrees to help and immediately becomes

interested in the gruesome details of the crime.

While part of this interest could be based in the alien's sinister interests and overall lack of humanity, it seems more likely that his interest in the murder stems from his favorite human pastime: watching "Law & Order" to learn English.

Having modeled himself after the show's lead, played by Jerry Orbach ("Dirty Dancing," 1987), alien

Harry learns to assimilate into Colorado culture by "becoming human" to the best of his ability — his alien form still sneaks through occasionally, though he does well to ensure he always appears as Harry when in the presence of other humans.

As the sci-fi dramedy continues across its premiere season's 10 episodes, viewers learn many of the intricacies behind the alien living among the

residents of Patience, Colorado. From his complete lack of understanding when it comes to basic human functions — think emotion and social convention — to the details of the mission that accidentally landed him on Earth, Harry's alien side slowly begins to reveal itself to the audience. (That said, most of the humans in his immediate vicinity have yet to figure out his true identity.)

One person who does gain insight into his secret over the course of time is Asta (Sara Tomko, "Once Upon a Time"), the nurse Harry meets in the pilot. As the two become closer the longer Harry stays in town, Asta becomes privy to his secret and is soon the one person who can protect the alien from the dangers around him. After visiting an alien convention together in the series' ninth episode and solving the murder set up in the first episode, Asta and Harry resolve to send him back to his home planet by any means necessary.

Unfortunately, things don't go as planned, and Season 2 begins with Harry back on Earth, this time without any memory of who he is and relying on Asta to fill in the blanks.

Amid poker games, girls' nights, bomb building and a trip to New York to find one of his own, Harry grows more human with each and every adventure. In fact, by the time Season 2 went on break in March, the alien doctor even had a surprise party held in his honor — though,

of course, it wasn't without its own oddities and setbacks.

Upon its Aug. 10 return, "Resident Alien" fans can expect more high jinks and surprises, spanning everything from more dead bodies to a whole new alien species that has touched down in Patience (move over, Roswell!). Series creator Chris Sheridan ("Family Guy") also shed some light on the final eight episodes of Season 2 in an interview with Parade back in March.

"There's so much happening in the second half of Season 2," Sheridan teased. "Terry O'Quinn ["Lost"] will be back as the Alien Tracker, this time tracking an alien in Patience — two guesses who that is. The mystery of why Sam Hodges [Jan Bos, "When Calls the Heart"] was murdered will finally be solved."

In the same interview, Sheridan later added that when Season 2 returns, "Harry is searching for the alien baby ... so he can get the rest of the message and find out information about the alien race on Earth. Of course, Harry does have human emotions now, so when he does find the baby, it's possible it won't be as easy as he thinks."

In truth, it seems nothing is as easy for the alien as he ever thinks it will be. Though perhaps that naiveté is a part of his endearing, child-like charm — even if it's also one of the (many) things that frequently gets him into trouble.

Tune in to the newest episode of "Resident Alien" when it returns to SyFy after five months off the air. It all begins Wednesday, Aug. 10, with subsequent episodes airing weekly until its finale (estimated as of writing to be Oct. 12).

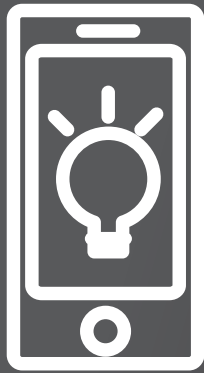

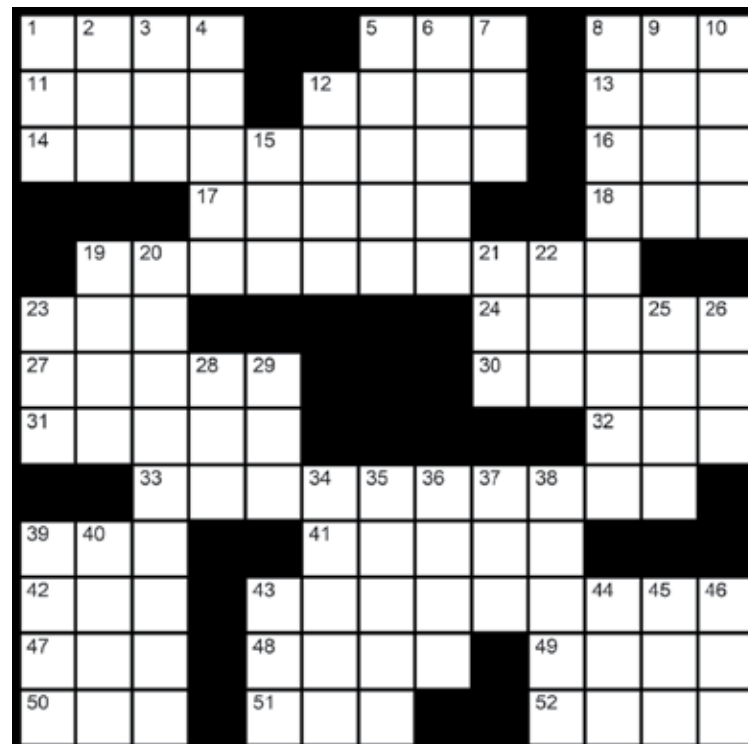

### Season opener

Amazon Prime debuts fresh series adaptation of 'A League of Their Own'

One of the most iconic sports film classics now has its own series adaptation. Friday, Aug. 12, Prime Video premieres all eight episodes of its much-anticipated baseball comedy-drama, "A League of Their Own." Based on the 1992 film of the same name, this updated version retells the story of the formation of the Rockford Peaches and the World War II-era all-female baseball league.

Series co-creators Abbi Jacobson ("Broad City") and Will Graham (executive producer of "Mozart in the Jungle") announced the project in an August 2020 statement, causing fans of the original film to eagerly await the premiere date.

Acknowledging a popular obsession with the source material and appreciation for the film's director, Penny Marshall's ("Laverne & Shirley"), impact, Jacobson and Graham noted that "with the help of an enormously talented team of collaborators, an amazing cast and the devoted support of Amazon to this project, we feel beyond lucky and excited to get to bring these characters to life."

Jacobson does double duty in "A League of Their Own," acting behind the scenes as co-creator and co-writer and stepping in front of the camera as series lead Carson Shaw. Rounding out the roster are Chanté Adams ("A Journal for Jordan," 2021) as Max Chapman, Gbemisola Ikumelo ("Famalam") as Clance, D'Arcy Carden ("The Good Place") as Greta, Roberta Colindrez ("I Love Dick") as Lupe, Priscilla Delgado ("Julieta," 2016) as Esti and Kelly McCormack ("Killjoys") as Jess.

The original film version of "A League of Their Own" is responsible for, inarguably, one of the most memorable lines in film history, as performed by Tom Hanks ("Elvis," 2022) in the role of the Rockford Peaches' luckless manager Jimmy Dugan: "There's no crying in baseball!"

The role is a big one for any actor to step into, but Amazon Prime has cleverly cast another beloved actor to manage these new Peaches.

After bringing the stern man of few words Ron Swanson to life in the award-winning sitcom "Parks and Recreation," Nick Offerman is on Dugan duty, portraying the man who helps the Peaches settle into the titular league of their own.

Jacobson, meanwhile, while discussing the challenges of creating a unique adaptation while remaining true to the real-life All-American Girls Professional Baseball League and paying homage to the film, told The Hollywood Reporter, "I think it's as original as we could make it being based on that real league."

"I don't think any characters are really mapped on anyone," she continued before going on to explain in the same interview that "in the pilot, we nod to the movie the most, and there are nods as you keep going."

A trailer released by Amazon in June may include one of the nods to which Jacobson was referring — specifically, a recreation of the scene where Geena Davis' ("GLOW") character, Dottie, runs to catch the train to the league tryouts in Chicago, only this time with Jacobson's Carson chasing the train.

There is, of course, also a literal nod in the original film that Prime's "A League of Their Own" aims to expand upon.

For a brief moment in the film, a Black woman attending a Rockford Peaches game throws back a foul ball, making eye contact with Dottie before she is never seen again, despite having a killer arm. In a news release, Amazon Prime states its intention to develop the backstories of the series' characters, saying, "the show takes a deeper look at race and sexuality, following the journey of a whole new ensemble of characters as they carve out their own paths towards the field, both in the league and outside of it."

Amalgamating three real-life Black female baseball players into the character of Max is one such way "A League of Their Own" further develops

the Rockford Peaches. Series writers found inspiration for Max in Connie Morgan, Toni Stone and Mamie Johnson, the first three Black women to play major league baseball, all of whom competed alongside men in the Negro American League.

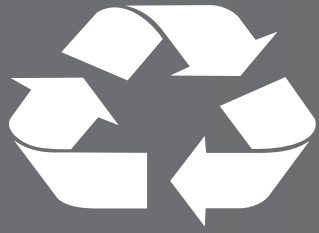
In an interview transcribed on RogerEbert.com, Adams, who plays Max, discussed the history of Black women in major-league baseball.

"I think the fourth woman to ever do it [play major-league baseball] was Kelsey Whitmore, one of our coaches during this process," Adams said. "That was this year, 2022. These women did this back in the '50s. We should know their names and we should know their stories."

Speaking of legacies, there is one particularly fun cameo in "A League of Their Own" for fans of the original film.

Joining the series as a guest star is Rosie O'Donnell ("I Know This Much Is True"), who played Doris in the film. While not returning as Doris, Entertainment Weekly reported that O'Donnell will take the screen as Vi, "a local bar owner" and "fan of the Rockford Peaches," who "crosses paths with Jacobson's catcher, Carson, and soon welcomes her into her orbit."

Grab your peanuts and Cracker Jack; it's time to settle in for the premiere of "A League of Their Own." All eight episodes of the series drop Friday, Aug. 12, on Prime Video.

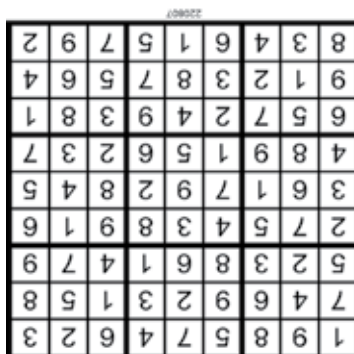
### Men
