Commissioners look for a better time management system

GIRARD, Kan. — After a brief meeting on Friday, Crawford County Commissioners Bruce Blair and Jeremy Johnson visited the sheriff's office to view the department's time management system, with the idea that a similar system could be implemented for other county departments.

According to Blair, the department uses a system that allows deputies to clock in and out directly from their patrol vehicles, allowing dispatchers and other officers to know instantly who is on or off duty. The system also tracks the number of vacation days an employee has built up, if they are on vacation, sick leave, and other administrative details. All of the information is updated in re-

al-time.

Many of the county departments directly under the commission's control still use paper documentation to track the same information, according to Blair. Road crews still track their hours using time sheets that have to be turned in each pay period.

"It doesn't make much sense for a grader operator working in Walnut to drive to Girard to turn in his time," Blair said. Instead, such a system would allow the operator to clock in and out every day from the cab of the road grader. It would also save department heads time trying to collect time sheets from the various crews scattered around the county, Blair said.

Blair said he thinks the system the sheriff's department uses would

A new way to bond

Wildcat agent to implement gaming program

PITTSBURG, Kan. — The K-State Wildcat Extension District strives to create educational and developmental programs and provide research-based information to the communities in Crawford, Labette, Montgomery, and Wilson counties, and last week, it added Michelle Broxterman, family and child development extension agent, to its team.

Broxterman was born and raised in Pittsburg, and graduated from Pittsburg State University with a bachelor's degree in childhood education

Monarch Cement of Humboldt acquires Pittsburg's American Concrete

PITTSBURG, Kan. — One of the area's pioneer businesses has become part of another area company, according to an announcement today.

American Concrete Company, a Pittsburg business owned and operated locally for more than 50 years, has been acquired by Monarch Cement Company, of Humboldt.

The familiar red, white and blue logos on the white concrete trucks, however, will continue to roll through the community, as the name American Concrete Company will be retained, with the company becoming a wholly owned subsidiary of Monarch, a publicly traded company.

American has grown with the Pittsburg area under a single family's stewardship for over half a century. The recently

completed overpass on Fourth Street over the railroad tracks was built with concrete supplied by American and the structure will be named

"Dennis Crain Memorial Bridge" in his honor, passed by the Kansas Legislature during the last session.

"I was glad to see it

Suspect sought in shooting near Pittsburg

PITTSBURG, Kan. — Authorities were attempting to locate a suspect Friday after a local man was shot Thursday evening at the Whispering Pines Mobile Home Park, according to the Crawford County Sheriff's Office.

Shortly after 7 p.m. Thursday, sheriff's deputies responded to 121 Glennway St. in the Whispering Pines Mobile Home Park, located near the intersection of West Quincy and South 200th streets, just west of Pittsburg's city limits, after receiving a report of a male subject being shot. Upon arrival deputies located the subject, later identified as 34-year-old Anthony C. Hoag of Pittsburg, in

the road with gunshot injuries, according to the sheriff's office.

Hoag was transported to Ascension Via Christi Hospital by Crawford County EMS. A press release from the sheriff's office did not include information about Hoag's condition, and the sheriff's office could not be reached for comment Friday.

"The suspect was described as a black male, wearing shorts, no shirt, driving a silver Chevy Malibu possibly bearing Kansas tag 177 PAT," according to the release. "Vehicle was last seen shortly after the shooting southbound from Quincy Street on US-69 Hwy."

Writer finds solace in words

PITTSBURG, Kan. — The poems are a little dark, the fiction even darker. And it's not just the author's interest in true crime. It's her life story.

Lori Baker Martin, on sabbatical from full-time teaching at Pittsburg State University, shared work from a chapbook she is working on at a reading in Joplin Sept. 19. The reading was part of Joplin's Downtown Poetry series, which is sponsored by PSU's English Department.

During her sabbatical, she is also polishing a collection of short stories.

Her poetry and fiction have appeared in a number of journals, including Prick of the Spindle, The MacGuffin, The Little Balkans Review, Room Magazine, Grass Limb, The Knicknackery, and The Maine Review.

And then there's that novel. She says she has been working on it for 10 years. The book is set in the Ozarks, and her research into Ozark folkways has also made it into her poetry, including a poem about the magical uses of antimony that she read Monday night.

"It's becoming my emotional support novel," Martin joked, because it's been by her side for so long.

"I realized it needs another point of view, so I'm adding that now," she said, explaining that that

means changing the whole structure of the book. "It's frustrating, but I think it's what the novel needed."

Set in pre-Civil War Missouri, Martin said the book, Jubal in Arcady, follows the points of view of three characters. Jubal is a young white man who was born to privilege in the South. Effie, his wife, is an Ozark witch, and Halo is a formerly enslaved man who is now part of the Underground Railroad. Each of the characters faces questions about the definition of freedom and what it means for their lives and the lives of those they love.

Like her novel, her poetry often has a somber tone.

"I'm afraid my poetry is depressing," she said. "It's a little dark." But there's a reason for that. "I was

writing almost all of these through a very dark period of my life, so it makes sense."

She explained, "Within a very short period of time, I lost my dad, my husband, my brother, my brother-in-law, and two very close friends — in, like, a year and a half."

Martin's husband, Jim, died of Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis, or ALS, also known as Lou Gehrig's Disease, a progressive nervous system disease that gradually robs the person of all function. She was his full-time caregiver for the five years between his diagnosis and death, as well as working full-time and driving back and forth from their home in Coffeyville to her job, first at Independence Community College and then at

Boil advisory rescinded for Neosho County Rural Water District 12

NEOSHO COUNTY, Kan. — The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) rescinded a boil water advisory Friday for the Neosho County Rural Water District 12 public water supply system. The advisory was issued Wednesday because of a loss of pressure in the system. Failure to maintain adequate pressure may result in a loss of chlorine residuals and bacterial contamination. Public water suppliers in Kansas take all measures necessary to notify customers quickly after a system failure or shutdown, KDHE said in a press release. Regard-

less of whether it's the supplier or KDHE that announces a boil water advisory, KDHE will issue the rescind order following testing at a certified laboratory. Laboratory testing samples collected from Neosho County Rural Water District 12 indicate no evidence of bacteriological contamination and all other conditions that placed the system at risk of contamination have been deemed by KDHE officials to be resolved. Fort Scott city manager resigns, interim and assistant city manager selected

FORT SCOTT, Kan. — After serving less than a year in the position, Fort Scott’s city manager has resigned, and the city commission this week approved hiring an interim city manager and assistant city manager.

City Manager Kelley Zellner submitted his letter of resignation Sept. 15, and on Tuesday, Sept. 20, the Fort Scott City Commission approved his resignation, although the commissioners did not approve his severance package, according to the Fort Scott Tribune. Zellner reportedly started his job as city manager on

Jan. 4, and is now leaving to take a position as city administrator for the City of Caney in Montgomery County.

Also on Tuesday, the commission approved hiring Jeff Hancock of Camdenton, Missouri, as the new interim city manager, and Brad Matkin as assistant city manager. Hancock was previously contracted as Fort Scott’s interim city manager following Dave Martin’s resignation in the fall of 2020. Matkin will additionally continue to serve as the city’s human resources manager, the Tribune reported.

Zellner’s contract with the city reportedly stipulated that in the event of

his termination, the city would pay “a lump sum cash payment equal to 40 days aggregate salary, any accumulated vacation and sick leave,” but included an exception if the termination was due to “any unethical or improper act involving personal gain to him” and required Zellner to give 45 days advance notice if he intended to voluntarily resign.

Zellner’s annual salary with the City of Fort Scott was \$95,000, while his salary at the City of Caney will be \$85,000, plus benefits. Zellner is expected to start his new job in Caney in late October, according to the Tribune, but he had not yet officially accepted the position as of Tuesday,

as his separation from the City of Fort Scott was not complete without a severance agreement approved.

In other business at Tuesday’s meeting, the commissioners also discussed the process for replacing Josh Jones, who resigned from the commission the same day Zellner submitted his resignation letter. The commissioners on Tuesday reportedly finalized an amendment to the ordinance that governs how the city fills vacancies on the commission. Jones’ resignation marks the third time this year that the commission has had to appoint a new commissioner to fill a vacancy, according to the Tribune.

and a master's degree in educational technology. She has 16 years of experience teaching at the elementary level.

Since her position is brand new, Broxterman said she has been searching for programs that will benefit relationships between family members, as well as parenting, and child development.

One of the programs she is implementing for the district is Bonding Through Board Games, which was initially started in the Wichita area.

When most people think of board games, they think of Monopoly and Candyland from their childhood, but since the

1990s, there has been a slow build of modern or hobby board games that have come to the United States.

The board games used for this program are called Euro-style games, which are based on strategy as opposed to luck. These games generally have indirect player conflict, in which there isn’t so much aggressive competition. Euro-style games often involve collecting resources in order to build, create, or thrive. Some examples of popular Euro-style games include Settlers of Catan, Carcassonne, Castles of Burgundy, Stone Age, and many more.

“The focus of this program is to utilize Euro-style board games so that the people who are playing have a chance

to bond with each other and not really be pitted against each other,” Broxterman said, “and so it’s more of a cooperative type of environment, which I think is really cool.”

Broxterman said she has also started looking into grants to help fund some games to be purchased for the program as well as potentially having giveaways for families.

Broxterman said this program will encourage families to set aside time for one another, help build communication, and give a venue to share values, life skills and beliefs. These games can also help develop soft skills such as self-control, social skills, communication skills, problem solving, critical thinking, the ability to juggle multiple concepts, decision making, and a

sense of well-being and pride.

Broxterman said she has plans to have a trial run of the program in November at Westside Elementary School.

“I think what is really good about this program is I think it’s very flexible,” she said. “And I would like to see it utilized also in the community.”

She said she believes that this program will be a very positive and easy program for families to implement.

“I think all of our programming is really positive and informational,” she said. “But I just like the idea behind this. And when I set out to start this job, my goal was to create strong family relationships. I think that’s so very important.”

PSU.

“I just feel like I had a black cloud over me,” she said of the difficult time. “That was exhausting.”

The last two years of his life, Jim needed full-time care, and family stepped in to help. Martin also had help from hospice and a nurse’s aide that came to the house daily.

“There was a lot of help, but I was still doing most of the primary care,” she said.

His death was hard to take in many ways, one of which was losing her primary fan.

Martin said that she had always loved to read and her parents, although very poor, encouraged that love. They always allowed her to buy books from the annual school book sales as long as she would read them, and she was devouring the classics by third grade.

In high school, a teacher praised her writing, and she later worked as the crime reporter for The Coffeyville Journal, also serving as editor there for a while.

“I like that kind of writing a lot,” she said. True crime stories still find their way into some of her poems.

But when she had the opportunity to go to college, she decided to major in education with the goal of becoming a gifted education facilitator.

It didn’t take long for

her to find her niche in the creative writing program, however. She enrolled in the fiction writing class taught by Professor Kathy De Grave.

“I remember her taking me aside and saying, ‘Lori, you’re really good,’” she said. And Martin realized that all she was thinking about was what she was doing in that class, so she switched majors to English with an emphasis in creative writing. She earned both her BA and MA at Pittsburg State.

The next step was to earn a Master of Fine Arts, which is considered a terminal degree in creative fields like writing, art, and music.

She applied to five programs, including the prestigious University of Iowa Writers Workshop, but she said she didn’t really expect to get accepted to any of them.

“I applied to Iowa because I felt I had to,” she said.

Some of her peers had been accepted to various programs, and she was resigned to missing out on the opportunity, when she got a call from the director of the IWW.

Jim happened to pick up the phone, and Martin recalls that as she answered, “Jim stood in the doorway and watched my face. He started crying because he knew what that meant to me.”

In the end, she was accepted to four of the programs she’d applied to, and wait-listed for another, but the decision was an easy one.

“I was a Truman Capote Fellow at Iowa,” she added. “It meant more money, for one thing, but it also meant that I didn’t have to teach if I didn’t want to, leaving more time for writing. But I did teach in the last year because I wanted to say I taught at Iowa.”

As it turns out, she said, “It was a really useful skill to have.”

Back at Pittsburg State, it seems she has come full circle. Her former professors are now her colleagues.

Of De Grave, she says, “Now we’ve been good friends for quite a while. It’s funny to make that shift.”

And she’s making the shift in the other direction as well, as former students become friends. In fact, it’s the students who bring her joy in her teaching career.

“They’re the reason you get excited,” she said. “There’s that student who you see that spark in, that brilliance, and they get better.”

But it’s not just the talented ones, Martin said.

“They don’t have to be the brilliant ones for me to love them. The enrichment that writing gives, what it does for their souls, that’s amazing to me.”

It sometimes makes her job a little harder, though. Each semester, professors receive written evaluations of their courses. Martin said sometimes the evaluations from creative writing students are the harshest.

“It’s because you’re

dealing with their souls,” she said.

And of course, she completely understands, because she writes from her heart as well. Not only did she write her way through the intense grieving of her husband’s death, she writes her way through the everyday changes of life.

Right now her life is complicated by the fact that her adult son and teenage grandson live with her, along with her own dog, Novella, and two grand-dogs. Another son lives in New York and her daughter is in college.

And of course the thing about grief is that it never completely goes away. Even years later, when you think you are doing well, she said, “it catches you unawares.”

Nevertheless, she finds time to enjoy life. She enjoys watching old movies, especially mysteries, visits art galleries and museums, and enjoys baking and sewing.

And her more recent poetry is getting a little lighter, she said, even though her fiction remains fairly dark. She has been known to say that literary fiction, as opposed to popular genres like romance, is almost required to be depressing.

But literature is meant to show the reader that there is hope, even in the darkest of circumstances, something Martin understands in her bones.

“We’re all suffering,” she said. “It is good to extend a little grace to each other.”

FROM OUR HISTORY

Approximately 400 candidates were initiated at an open air KKK meeting

100 Years Ago
Sept. 24-26, 1922

An agreement between the Kansas City Southern railroad and new employees went into effect yesterday, it was announced by C. E. Johnston, general manager of the road, who arrived in Pittsburg on an inspection tour. The new agreement affects only men who have entered service since July 1. Former employees of the road now on strike can make application for re-employment, Mr. Johnston said.

Approximately 400 candidates, as near could be estimated, were initiated at an open air meeting of the Ku Klux Klan last night five miles west of Pittsburg, a half mile north of the Fourth street road and just north of the Joe Page farm. It was the third clan meeting of its kind in the past few weeks. The fiery cross again lighted up the vicinity about, and an American flag was suspended upon it.

Broadway has a new whiteway. Pittsburgers and visitors last night were greeted with a flood of white light in the vicinity of Fourth and Broadway, such as has never before been seen there. Business men on the east side of Broadway between Third and Fourth streets are getting together to make that block an attractive one for shoppers, and already there are four great white lights, each burning 500 watt lamps.

Owing to the popularity and success of the Norcross Players at the Colonial theater, they will remain one more week, presenting the same high standard of plays that has been the talk of the

theater going public of Pittsburg. Mr. Norcross is now in Kansas City engaging new people to enlarge his company, so as to give the patrons of the Colonial theater vaudeville between acts.

Because Frankie Tucker, of Los Angeles Cal., and Jimmy Lanning, of Scammon, lightweights, did not box fairly, Referee George Glover called off their scheduled 10-round match at Scammon last night in the eighth round, after the crowd, estimated at 700, had hooted the principals and demanded a fair boxing exhibition or none at all. Lanning seemed to be in the greatest disfavor with the crowd.

50 Years Ago
Sept. 24-26, 1972

J. D. Haggard, 1502 S. Pine, posted \$1,000 bond Saturday in connection with charges of criminal damage to private property, the result of a complaint by Joe Gendusa, 1414 S. Pine. Haggard is a Pittsburg city commissioner. Gendusa filed the complaint late Friday with County Attorney Vernon Grassie, alleging that Haggard tore down his fence. The complaint resulted in Haggard's arrest, and the case now goes to the city court.

A new cooperative industrial program at Pittsburg High School expands the walls of the school room to the city, takes advantage of specialists in many fields without hiring new teachers and enables students to learn vocational skills while earning high school credit. Under this program, students attend class in the morning and in the afternoon work at an occupation in which they are interested.

One of the sources of notorious criminal antics of Pittsburg's years gone by has come to life again. John Harry Allen, alias Tom Holt, alias Tom Tracy, and to some, Tennessee

Tom, has written a letter from Tennessee to this newspaper requesting news clippings on himself and his escapades for a book about himself. This man may be remembered to many in the area for his fondness for armed robbery in the 1940s and early 1950s.

The Mall Merchants Association has awarded \$50 to the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints for the best booth at the recent community bazaar. The booth depicted an old west motif, using persimmon logs that had been chopped by church members. Antique lanterns and coal shovels completed the decorations. The prize money will be used for the Sunday school or building projects.

The Southwest Missouri State Bears capitalized on Kansas State College miscues to beat the Kansans, 37-20 in a bruising fray at Brandenburg Stadium. The Gorillas made it close during the first half with a total net yards of 175 to 183 for the Bears and trailed the Missourians 16-7 at intermission. SMS boosters filling one end of the stadium went wild when it became apparent the Gorillas would not catch up.

25 Years Ago
Sept. 24-26, 1997

Pittsburg State University faculty unanimously ratified and a negotiated agreement that would give them a "Halloween present," a union official said yesterday. Harry Humphries, acting president of the PSU/Kansas National Education Association, announced that two days of faculty voting had a result in unanimous acceptance of a negotiated agreement that gives faculty at 4.73 percent pay increase.

Expansion of the Airport Industrial Park may soon become a reality, after Pittsburg city commis-

sioners gave permission for staff to request development consultation from engineering firms. The undeveloped land is 235 acres recently purchased by the city for industrial use. The park will be used for heavy and light industrial use with marketing starting before the Northeast Industrial Park is full, officials said.

In the first full year of operation, the Pittsburg Family Aquatic Center boasted attendance of 56,300 – up from 12,000 in 1995, the last year of the old pool. "We'd like to think we had a big impact," John Kennedy director of the Pittsburg Parks and Recreation Department told Pittsburg city commissioners. The swimming facility – which includes the pool, a mammoth slide and lazy river – produced revenue of \$134,492.

enter into force because of the refusal so far of eight nations — including the United States — to ratify it.)

In 2001, President George W. Bush ordered a freeze on the assets of 27 people and organizations with suspected links to terrorism, including Islamic militant Osama bin Laden, and urged other nations to do likewise.

In 2015, a stampede and crush of Muslim pilgrims occurred at an intersection near a holy site in Saudi Arabia; The Associated Press estimated that more than 2,400 people were killed, while the official Saudi toll stood at 769.

In 2019, House Speaker Nancy Pelosi launched a formal impeachment inquiry against President Donald Trump; the probe focused partly on whether Trump abused his presidential powers and sought help from the government of Ukraine to undermine Democratic foe Joe Biden. (Trump would be acquitted by the Republican-controlled Senate on two impeachment charges.)

In 2020, President Donald Trump's refusal to commit to a peaceful transfer of power if he were to lose the November election drew swift blowback from both parties in Congress, with Senate GOP leader Mitch McConnell saying that the winner "will be inaugurated on January 20th."

Elizabeth II, queen for 25,550 days

We have on our kitchen windowsill a small, solar-powered figurine of Queen Elizabeth II holding a purse in the crook of her left arm. Her right arm is up, parallel to her head, and she waves hello by repeatedly twisting her wrist, her hand slightly cupped.

Last Monday was the first day I waved back — but mine was goodbye.

Although I'm not so enamored with her majesty as my wife (she follows Britain's Royals like I follow Kansas City's) I have to admit the funeral was a smashing affair (watched by meself and 11 million or so other Americans on TV).

The long, measured, processional march toward the chapel at

Windsor Castle (left/right, left/right) included costumed Grenadiers, horsemen, notaries, and royal descendants (some with chests packed with medals). When the hearse stopped, and the rear door opened, eight uniformed pallbearers lifted the coffin to their shoulders and took it methodically up the steps.

The Queen's closest confidants, her two corgi, Muick and Sandy, and her pony, Emma, were led out to witness the funeral procession as it arrived at Windsor Castle.

Once inside, the Queen's crown, orb, and sceptre were lifted from the coffin, and it was lowered slowly into the royal vault below St. George's Chapel. This was the part that I found a little peculiar as it was a bit like watching a plane being lowered to the bottom deck of an aircraft carrier.

I got to thinking about

America and why so many of its citizens are enamored with the royal family, as evidenced by not only by those viewing the queen's funeral but also the popularity of TV shows like "The Crown."

According to The Guardian, some Brits feel that Americans love the royal family more than they do, treating it as a royal soap opera — which of course, it is.

I also found myself wondering about who would be considered royal family in America. As we all know football is sovereign in America, Tom Brady and his wife, Gisele, and their three kids come to mind. (Some might vote for the Kardashians, but they don't quite make it as they've only dated pro-football players.)

When comes to an American queen, though, there's only one possibility— Oprah.

Some reading this will

likely remember "Queen for a Day," a TV show that was popular in the mid 1950s. Each female contestant was asked to talk about some recent financial and emotional hardship she had been through, then host, Jack Bailey, would ask what she needed most — and why she wanted to win the title of Queen for a Day.

Often the request was for critical medical care or therapeutic equipment to help a chronically ill child. Or it might be something as simple as a new washing machine, or a refrigerator. Many women broke down sobbing as they described their plights.

The winning contestant was selected by the audience using an applause meter — the harsher the contestant's situation, the likelier the studio audience was to ring the applause meter's highest level.

The winner, to the

musical accompaniment of "Pomp and Circumstance," would be draped in a sable-trimmed red velvet robe, given a glittering jeweled crown to wear, placed on a velvet-upholstered throne, and handed a dozen long-stemmed roses to hold while her list of prizes was announced.

The prizes began with whatever the woman had requested, and went on to include a variety of extras, many of which were donated by sponsors, such as a vacation trip, a night on the town with her husband, kitchen appliances, or fashion clothing. The losing contestants were each given smaller consolation prizes.

Bailey's trademark sign-off was: "This is Jack Bailey, wishing we could make every woman a queen for every single day!"

Getting back to Elizabeth II, my favorite stories about her are those that

give example to her penchant for pithy remarks, so I'll close with one.

Some of her most candid interactions, it seems, occurred with the artists who painted her official portraits. During a sitting with the painter Juliet Pannett, the Queen described a time at her Sandringham estate where she had personally popped into a local shop to buy cake for afternoon tea.

Inside the shop, a senior citizen looked at the plainly dressed monarch and exclaimed, "Good heavens, you look just like the Queen," to which she quipped, "How reassuring."

A hockey great shares perspective with tennis legends

MONTREAL — Listen carefully at the most storied corner in Canada, right here where Atwater Avenue meets Saint-Catherine Street. Every hockey fan knows the intersection once was the site of the old Montreal Forum, the place where for 44 years the home team dressed beneath the words of the Canadian poet John McCrae: "To you from failing hands we throw the torch/Be yours to hold it high."

Listen carefully and you might hear the echo of the thunderous cheers that greeted Canadiens stars from Maurice Richard to Patrick Roy — or maybe the profound silence that met the procession of 10,000 to view the casket, placed lovingly on wooden boards at center ice in 1937, after the great Howie Morenz, the first true NHL star, died as a result of an injury in a brutal game against the Chicago Black Hawks.

Listen up, Roger Federer and Serena Williams, as you prepare to toss the torch of your sporting greatness, for the cheers are about to turn to silence. As the roar of the crowd fades, listen to the lessons of one of your predecessors in excellence. Listen to how Ken Dryden, who won six Stanley Cups in nine seasons in goal for the bleu, blanc et rouge of the beloved home team, views retirement and came to peace with life when the cheering stopped.

"Retiring from sports is

a real retirement," he told me the other day. "And that's the surprising thing. You enter retirement at a younger age than everybody else does, but you feel the same effects. In my case, I was 31, and for Roger Federer and Serena Williams, in their 40s, you are moving on from something you have done all your life. And even as you have done other things, your sport has been at the center of what you do. And you're very good. And there was always a place for you to be and a place for you to go."

Dryden now is 75. He has been retired from hockey for four decades. He's revered at Cornell University for being the centerpiece of the last undefeated college hockey team (29-0, in 1969-1970) and here in Canada for being the winning goaltender in the famous Summit Series against the Russians 50 years ago, the subject of his ninth book, now the top Canadian nonfiction bestseller. He's served in Canada's Parliament and is enshrined in the Hockey Hall of Fame.

He might be regarded today as a man for all seasons, but for two decades he was primarily a man for the hockey season, and the rink provided him with that place to go.

"Then, just like the person who retires from an office job, up until that last Friday all of those things were true," he continued. "But Monday comes, and most of those things aren't true anymore. You are moving to something that you're less good at, and you know you are less good at it. And over time, although you don't focus on it, you enjoy the fact that you were

good at something and that people looked at you in a special way. Where does that come from now? What are you going to be good at — very good at?"

That is the question Federer and Williams face.

Dozens of athletes (Tony Romo, for example) and coaches (Bill Cowher) face it by becoming broadcasters. Minor league pitcher Blake McFarland faced it by becoming a sculptor. Pitcher Don Schwall, a 1961 Rookie of the Year with the Boston Red Sox, became a Pittsburgh investment specialist. (When I asked him why so many athletes lose their fortunes, he said, "Money talks. It says 'good-bye.'")

Dryden faced it after dominating his sport the way the two retiring tennis aces have. "He was impenetrable," recalled Rusty Martin, who scored two goals against him for Dartmouth in losing games against Cornell. "He gave you nothing to shoot at. He was quick, he was smart." Eddie Johnston, the Montreal-born goalie and Pittsburgh Penguins coach, called Dryden "one of history's greatest goalies" and added, "He had great perspective on life."

Here is the perspective Dryden has about retirement from sports:

"It's not the money you miss, it's the specialness you miss. That's the problem. You're going on to another thing and whether you're 31 or 65, you go through the same thing."

The two retiring tennis players personified specialness.

"If he wasn't the greatest tennis player in history in terms of grim statistics, he

was certainly the greatest tennis presence of our lifetime," Globe and Mail columnist Cathal Kelly said of Federer. "He altered the way we think about tennis and, in turn, all sports."

Williams may be the greatest player in terms of statistics, and she had the same effect, plus this: As the bookend to Althea Gibson (11 Grand Slams in a career ending a quarter-century before her successor was born), Williams (23 Grand Slams) was a pioneer as a Black woman in sports.

Retirement technically may occur on a specific day, but the searing effect of it may come on another

day entirely. At least it did for Dryden.

"The September after I retired, I studied for the bar and the Canadiens started training camp," he said. "That's when it hit me. I was doing what I was doing — and I wasn't doing what they were doing. In a way, that was the day I retired."

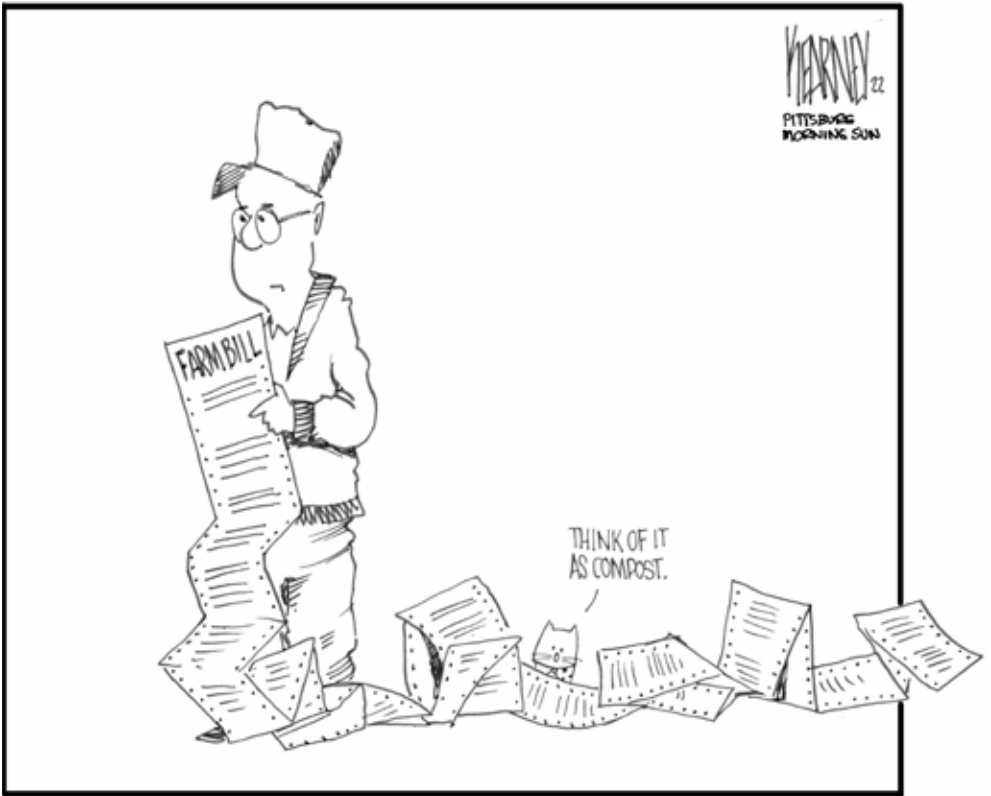
So, you tennis champions familiar with Centre Court the way Dryden was familiar with watching his teammates at center ice: Stand here, at the site of the old Montreal Forum. Listen up here, where Dryden, an outsider from Toronto, became one of the Habs, the Canadiens'

nickname that is a shortened version of "habitant," the early French settlers in Quebec. Hear the silence from the swaying of the half-dozen Stanley Cup banners he helped contribute to the old rafters.

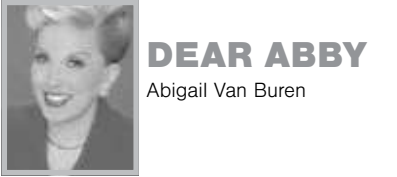
Stand here, listen as the echoes ring, and imagine the torch of tennis supremacy being tossed to Iga Swiatek, who at age 21 has three Grand Slams, and to Carlos Alcaraz, who at 19 already has one. For soon you will rest, in sporting's Flanders Field.

CHCSEK awarded \$500k for cancer screening, early detection

PITTSBURG, Kan. — Community Health Center of Southeast Kansas (CHCSEK) is the recipient of a \$500,000 federal grant to facilitate access to life-saving cancer screenings and early detection services, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) announced Friday.

CHCSEK is one of 11 community health centers funded by the Health Resources and Services Administration to receive part of a total of more than \$5 million to facilitate such services for underserved populations, according to HHS.

“These first-of-their-kind partnerships are bringing health centers together with National Cancer Institute (NCI)-Designated Cancer Centers,” HHS said in a press release. “Today’s announcement advances President Biden’s Cancer Moonshot goals, which aim to close the cancer screening gap, decrease the impact of preventable cancers, and support patients and caregivers.”

Cancer is the second-leading cause of death in the United States, with nearly 600,000 deaths annually, the release noted.

“Tools to fight and prevent cancer should be in

reach for everyone, but, too often, that’s not the case. With so many people having missed preventive care visits and cancer screenings amid the COVID-19 pandemic, we must expand access to life-saving care,” said HHS Secretary Xavier Becerra. “Today’s action takes us a step closer to that goal. With this move, health centers can work to close disparity gaps, delivering critical services to underserved communities in need.”

Significant disparities continue to exist in screening and follow-up care after an abnormal cancer screening test result, based on an individual’s income, insurance status, and race or ethnicity, according to the release. These cancers can be prevented or detected early through appropriate screening and timely follow-up care.

“Getting life-saving cancer screenings and treatment should not depend on where you live or what you can afford to pay,” said HRSA Administrator Carole Johnson. “Today’s investment helps to advance our goal of ensuring that individuals from historically underserved communities have the same opportunities to benefit from the tools we have to detect, diagnose, and treat cancer. We

welcome the opportunity to partner with National Cancer Institute-Designated Cancer Centers to expand access to these critical services.”

The grant awards announced Friday focus on increasing equitable access to cancer screening for breast, cervical, and colorectal cancer. Health centers will conduct patient outreach in underserved communities to promote early detection of cancer, connect patients to screening services, and provide hands-on assistance with accessing high quality cancer care and treatment as needed.

The health centers receiving Accelerating Cancer Screening awards must work with NCI-Designated Cancer Centers, which will deploy their outreach specialists and patient navigators in the health center’s service area. Example activities may include care coordination; patient engagement and activation; enhancing virtual care capabilities; tracking patient screening, referrals, and follow-up; enhancing health IT workflows; and workforce engagement, training, and recruitment. NCI-Designated Cancer Centers are characterized by scientific excellence and the capability to integrate a diversity of research ap-

proaches to focus on the problem of cancer, the release said.

“This partnership between NCI-Designated Cancer Centers and HRSA’s health centers will bring to bear the significant expertise of the cancer centers in engaging the communities they serve and will help provide underserved and rural patients access to follow-up care, including screening and cutting-edge clinical trials,” said NCI Acting Director Dr. Doug Lowy. “This landmark interagency collaboration represents the kind of innovative partnerships that will further advance the Cancer Moonshot and end cancer as we know it.”

President Biden has set goals of cutting the death rate from cancer by at least 50 percent nationwide over the next 25 years and improving the experience of people and their families living with and surviving cancer, according to the release. HHS’ department-wide engagement strategy focuses on making this year the “Year of Screening and Prevention,” aiming to identify barriers and solutions to increase access to early cancer detection and preventive health.

nized.”

be beneficial to the county as a time-saver, both for day-to-day operations and in emergencies. Crawford County EMS already uses a similar system.

“In the case of an emergency,” Blair said, “I could just pull up the information on this system, see who is on duty and

where they’re at and be able to dispatch the closest people.” As it is now, Blair said, he has to make a few phone calls to get the same information.

Undersheriff Scott Tyrell, during a demonstration of the system’s capabilities, told Blair and Johnson that when he started with the department, everything was done by hand on paper and was a nightmare. Johnson said Tyrell gives

the newer system a positive appraisal.

According to Johnson, the system used by the sheriff’s department is not only a way for employees to clock in or out, it also allows them to request leave for vacation or sick days, and for supervisors to approve or disapprove the request. Johnson said it can help eliminate miscommunication and is good for accountability, as well as being a much more accurate system.

The entire system can be accessed as a cell phone app by supervisors and employees.

After the demonstration, Johnson called the system, “impressive.” He went on to say the commissioners may not adopt the exact system the sheriff uses, but will “definitely look at options.”

What’s the real record?

Everyone can agree that New York Yankees slugger Aaron Judge is chasing Roger Maris’ American League record of 61 home runs in a season.

But as far as the MLB record for homers, that’s a debate that likely will never be settled.

Barry Bonds belted 73 home runs for the San Francisco Giants in 2001, but that was during baseball’s “steroid era” from 1998-2002, and many fans do not recognize that as the record because they believe it was “Juiced” as Jose Canseco explained in his book.

Even though the NFL season had started, baseball grabbed attention during the Mark McGwire-Sammy Sosa home run chase in September 1998 when McGwire finished with 70 and Sosa hit 66. It helped bring fans back to the game who were still stinging from the World Series cancellation in 1994. Heck, the Cardinals even opened their stadium gates earlier than normal so fans could enter and watch McGwire take batting practice.

McGwire and Sosa combined for three more 60-plus homer seasons. McGwire hit 65 in 1999, and Sosa had 64 in 2001 and 63 in 1999.

Statistics show the home run increase. There are 47 times in baseball history when a player hit at least 50 homers in a season, and 13 of them -- 28 percent -- occurred from 1998-2002.

By comparison, in the 36 seasons after Maris hit 61 in ‘61, there were eight 50-homer guys and only two from 1962-89 -- 52 by Willie Mays in 1965 and George Foster in 1977. There have been ten 50-or-more homer totals since 2002.

The American League has had three 60-homer seasons by three Yankees -- 61 by Maris and 60 by Babe Ruth in 1927 and Judge this year.

Maris later said he didn’t get much enjoyment from his 61 homers. The majority of Yankee fans wanted Mickey Mantle to be the record breaker. Maris and Mantle were running neck and neck until a late-season injury forced Mantle to miss some games.

Baseball Commissioner Ford C. Frick decided that an asterisk be placed by Maris’ 61 because the baseball season was 162 games, not 154 when Babe played. Maris had 59 homers through 154 games and hit No. 61 in the last game. Maris never saw himself recognized as the record holder as the asterisk remained until 1991 -- six years after his death.

I recognize Bonds as the record holder with no asterisk. Even aided by steroids, it’s difficult to hit a baseball, and no doubt Bonds faced pitchers also taking steroids.

Bonds, McGwire, Sosa and others from that time belong in the Hall of Fame. Just make sure that their plaques include that their biggest seasons came when baseball was plagued by steroid use.

And while you’re at it, put Maris in the Hall of Fame, too. He was the AL most valuable player in 1960 and ‘61 and helped the St. Louis Cardinals to World Series appearances in 1967 and ‘68.

Fern displayed his ability to beat defenses both on the ground and through the air, accounting for three total touchdowns in the first half to lead Pittsburg to a 34-8 victory over Fort Scott.

Following Fern’s 15-yard

Woodruff prefers being the hammer, not the nail

Gorillas, Hornets to clash

Left guard Kory Woodruff and the rest of the Pittsburg State offensive linemen were happy to see the Gorillas' rushing attack become productive last week.

The Gorillas, led by Caleb Lewis' career-best 153 yards, rolled up season-high 232 yards on the ground during last Saturday's 49-14 victory over Northeastern State.

"We're finally starting to get healthy," said Woodruff, 6-foot-5, 349-pound senior. "Last week for the whole week we pretty much had everyone practicing. The first two weeks we were banged up a lot."

Given his choice, Woodruff likes to run block.

"As an offensive lineman, I want to run the football," he said. "It brings a

little bit more of a physical aspect to it. Both are important. Pass blocking, you're kind of going backwards and you have to be the nail in a sense where in the run game, you're more of the hammer."

The Gorillas (3-0), up two spots to No. 14 in this week's NCAA Division II poll, certainly could use a strong rushing attack when they battle Emporia State (2-1) on Saturday. Kickoff is at 1 p.m. at Welch Stadium in Emporia.

A time-consuming offense by the Gorillas would keep the Hornets' fast-break offense off the field.

Led by quarterback Braden Gleason, the Hornets have averaged 76.3 plays in their first three games, which are 10 more than their opponents.

"Seventy-five, 80, 85 snaps is definitely going to take its toll on the defense," strong safety Brandon Mlekus said. "Hopefully our offense can help us out a little bit, too."

By comparison, the Gorillas have averaged 64.3 plays, one more than their opponents.

"We try to do on offense what we think is best to score points," Gorillas coach Brian Wright said. "I think there are moments in the game though where you feel like your defense has been out there for a while where we will need to (slow down our tempo). But other than that, we're going to run the tempo that we think gives us the best chance to win."

The game matches two of the MIAA's best quarterbacks.

Gleason leads the MIAA in total offense (1,065 yards) and passing yards (984), and Pittsburg State's Chad Dodson is second in total offense (895 yards) and passing yards (828). Gleason has accounted for 11 touchdowns -- seven passing, four rushing -- and Dodson has nine touchdown passes.

Gleason had 387 yards total offense and accounted for four touchdowns in the Hornets' 30-28 loss at Pittsburg State last season.

Both defenses are near the top of the conference statistics. The Gorillas are second in total defense (263.0 yards per game) and

third in scoring defense (17.3 points) while the Hornets are second in scoring defense (16.7 points) and fourth in total defense (306.3 yards).

The Gorilla defense put up the first points last week on Antione Nunn's 26-yard interception return.

"That was a great feeling," Mlekus said. "We started out really slow at Kearney (on Sept. 8, falling behind 21-7 in the first half). If you can score two touchdowns in the first five minutes before your offense sees the field, (the second one came on Kaizer Newell's blocked punt and 6-yard return), that's a tremendous boost to your team and how you're going to play that day."

Assessing the Hornets, "All three phases, they are very, very good," Wright said. "They have a veteran football team. They are athletic. They execute their schemes to a 'T.' You can tell they are coached well, and I'm impressed with their talent. We have a great challenge this week."

Colts face daunting challenge in rebound attempt vs. Chiefs

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — The Indianapolis Colts understand the predicament. They're winless after two games and have the NFL's fewest points. They've struggled to protect quarterback Matt Ryan or produce turnovers. And they've lost six of their past eight home openers as Patrick Mahomes and the Kansas City Chiefs arrive in town Sunday. So naturally, fans who have seen Indy start 1-5 twice in the past four seasons worry it could be happening all over again. Inside the locker room, though, the Colts don't sound like a flailing team. They're confident, upbeat and determined to move beyond last week's embarrassing shutout at Jacksonville.

"Obviously, last week sucked, but last week doesn't matter anymore," running back Nyheim Hines said. "We've got to defend our home turf against a really great team, one of the best teams in the AFC. That's what we're going to do this week, we're going to defend Lucas Oil (Stadium) with pride."

Backing that up will al-

most certainly prove more difficult. In a league where early season oddities now seem the norm, the Chiefs (2-0) appear to be in midseason form as they chase a fifth straight conference championship game appearance. Mahomes, despite playing with a new cast of receivers, has completed 73% of his throws with seven touchdowns and no interceptions. The defense has played well, too, and because the Chiefs started

this season playing twice in five days, they even had extra time to prepare for Indy (0-1-1). But Mahomes and coach Andy Reid know better than to buy the conventional wisdom. "I know what their record is — you can put that aside. This is their first game back at home and they've got good talent and good coaches," Reid said. "As you saw — or as we all saw (Sunday) with that day off — anything goes on any

Sunday." Besides, the Colts are motivated to prove the doubters wrong. They've climbed out of big holes before by following an old formula — giving the ball to Jonathan Taylor, controlling the clock and stiffening up on defense. Indy didn't do any of those things well last week, but the Colts insist they will again. All they have to do now is prove it. "We've got to do a better job across the board — myself protecting it, we've got to be better up front, we've got to be better outside," said Ryan, the NFL's 2016 MVP. "We've got guys that have been playing at a high level for a long time in this league. I just have belief that we have the right makeup and the guys have the right stuff in them."

BETTER INDOORS OR OUTDOORS? Mahomes has done just about everything since taking over as Kansas City's full-time starting quarterback in 2018. He's won a Super Bowl ring, been the league's MVP and the Super Bowl MVP, selected to four straight Pro Bowls and continued to amass historic numbers. And he's done most of

it while playing in a home stadium that can be susceptible to rain, snow and wind. And while it's unclear whether the Colts will open their retractable roof or keep it closed, Mahomes was asked this week about posting better stats indoors than outdoors. "I think most quarterbacks are usually better in indoors," he said. "But I think you just go out there and play the game. I never really notice it. I try to be better outdoors because that's where we play, and I want the playoffs to be in GEHA Field at Arrowhead."

INJURY UPDATE Three-time All-Pro Bowl linebacker Shaquille Leonard missed the Colts first two games as he worked his way back into game shape following back surgery in June. But it sounds as if he could play Sunday. Leonard told reporters Thursday he felt more explosive this week and was feeling much better than last week. Indy also was missing its top two receivers Michael Pittman Jr. (calf) and Alec Pierce (concussion protocol) last week. Coach Frank Reich won't likely make a decision

about any of the three until at least Friday. Leonard and Pierce were both full participants in Wednesday's practice. Pittman did limited work. "They're both trending in the right direction," Reich said Wednesday when asked about the receivers. "After last week, I'm hesitant to say anything because I thought they both were going to play last week. But they are trending in the right direction."

MISSING OUT The Chiefs will not be at full strength even if kicker Harrison Butker returns from an injured left ankle. It was announced this week Chiefs starting linebacker Willie Gay had been suspended for four games because he violated the league's personal conduct policy. He's expected to be replaced by Darrius Harris on a defense that has played well. "He's smart, he's instinctive, he's tough. He's got a good grasp of the defense," Reid said, referring to Harris. "(Defensive coordinator Steve Spagnuolo) does quite a few things within the scheme, so he's got to be able to process all of that and he does a good job of that."

Browns in good hands with Brissett while Watson suspended

CLEVELAND (AP) — Jacoby Brissett's assignment is clear: keep the Browns competitive and in contention while Deshaun Watson's away. He's doing much more than that. During a 29-17 win over the Pittsburgh Steelers on Thursday night, Brissett, who has zero illusions about his role with Cleveland, effectively moved the offense with pinpoint throws and picked up first downs with timely quarterback sneaks. It was the second straight strong performance by the cool-headed 29-year-old Brissett, who also provided off-field leadership during a short week in helping his young teammates shake off a disastrous loss to the New York Jets four days earlier. "He's doing a great job leading us and he's hungry, too, man," said running back Kareem Hunt. "He's a heck of a football player going out there and showing what he can do." Brissett's steadiness and play is why the Browns (2-1) signed him. He's also given them confidence they'll

be in the playoff mix when Watson returns from his 11-game suspension for alleged sexual misconduct in December. Until then, it's Brissett's show. "He's done great for us," said All-Pro left guard Joel Bitonio. "He's just a charismatic, natural leader. He has a standard that he wants to play to and that he wants to hold guys to. It's cool to see.

"He's been around some of the great quarterbacks in the game, and he just carries himself that way." Some of Tom Brady rubbed off on Brissett when he broke in with New England, and he developed further in Indianapolis as first Andrew Luck's backup and then the Colts starter for 30 games. Brissett's not trying to impress anyone. "I'm not in this to an-

swer anybody's questions," he said after beating the Steelers, something few Cleveland quarterbacks have achieved in the past 20 years. "I'm in here to play good football, play for my teammates and enjoy this moment. That's really what it's all about." Brissett has settled in after an emotional, shaky opener at Carolina, an outing that had Browns fans worried this season might jump the track. In the past two games, he's completed 43 of 58 passes (74%) for 449 yards with three touchdowns and one pick. Brissett's taking care of the ball, spreading it around, and he's developing great chemistry with wide receiver Amari Cooper, who has 16 catches the last two weeks. "I don't think he's proven anything we didn't already know about him," Cooper said. "I don't think he would be in the league if he wasn't a good quarterback at this point. We're really glad to have him." Brissett's soaking in every moment. In the fourth quarter against Pittsburgh, the 6-foot-4, 235-pounder busted through the line on a third-

and-1 sneak for 6 yards. He tumbled to the ground, popped up and punched the air in celebration. "Every time I see a quarterback do that in a game, I'm like, 'Dang, that is so sick. I want to do that one time.' I told myself if I get a sneak, I'm doing it," he said with a smile. "I almost blacked out."

WHAT'S WORKING Cleveland's running game is hitting on all cylinders. With right tackle Jack Conklin making his season debut following knee surgery in December, the Browns manhandled the Steelers' front and gained 171 yards rushing. Nick Chubb had 113 yards, with 86 coming after initial contact. "They ran the ball, we got our (butts) kicked," said Steelers tackle Cameron Heyward. "Simple as that."

WHAT NEEDS HELP Special teams remain a major concern. Cleveland's getting nothing from its return game, rookie Cade York missed another extra point, and the Browns looked shaky on a late onside kick after failing to recover one against the Jets.

STOCK UP Tight end David Njoku

had the best game of his career — 9 catches for 89 yards and a touchdown. The Browns envision big things for Njoku, which is why they signed him to a four-year, \$56.75 million contract extension. Brissett may look for him even more. "He always tells me he's always open," Brissett said. "Every time in the huddle he's like, 'I got you, I got you, I got you.'"

STOCK DOWN York's second missed extra point in two weeks would be more worrisome if he didn't bounce back. He made a 34-yard field goal in the third quarter and his last PAT in blustery conditions.

INJURIES Linebacker Anthony Walker Jr.'s season-ending left quadriceps injury is a major blow. He'll soon undergo surgery. A captain, he's also the defensive signal caller, a role that will fall to Jacob Phillips, who had a sack and broke up a pass after replacing Walker. ... LB Jeremiah Owusu Koramoah (groin), DT Taven Bryan (hamstring) were also hurt but the team didn't have any updates on them.

US survives close matches to double lead in Presidents Cup

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (AP) — The matches felt a little closer Friday in the Presidents Cup. And then Max Homa made two big putts that gave the Americans the same outcome. In the third straight four-balls match that went the distance, Homa poured in a 12-foot birdie putt on the 17th hole for a 1-up lead. After Taylor Pendrith gave the International team hope with a birdie on the 18th hole, Homa matched him with another 12-foot birdie putt for the win. That gave the Americans another session by a 4-1 margin, stretching their lead to 8-2 going into the weekend at Quail Hollow and making another U.S. victory in this one-sided affair start to look inevitable. For the second straight time on home soil, the powerful American team goes into a double session on Saturday with a mathematical chance to win the cup. "This is insane," Homa

said after he and Billy Horschel outlasted the Canadian duo of Pendrith and Corey Connors. "To come down to the 18th two days in a row, man, what a day. Billy made some amazing putts. I just wanted to help him." Former Presidents Bill Clinton and George W. Bush were on hand at Quail Hollow Club, and while it looked for a moment as though the International team might make a game of it, the deficit at the end of the day was as daunting as ever. The lone point for the International team came from two ties. Scottie Scheffler had a 10-foot birdie putt for the win on the 18th, and only a few blades of grass kept it from dropping as he and Sam Burns halved the match with Sungjae Im and Sebastian Munoz. Cameron Young had a 25-foot putt for the win that missed. He and Kevin Kisner settled for a half-point against Mito Pereira and Christiaan Bezuidenhout

in the only match where the International team ever led. The strength of the American team came from a pair of dynamic partnerships. Patrick Cantlay and Xander Schauffele were 5-up at the turn and easily held on for a 3-and-2 win over Hideki Matsuyama and Tom Kim. Jordan Spieth and Justin Thomas improved to 6-2 as a team in Presidents Cup and Ryder Cup matches, leading from the fourth hole in a 2-and-1 victory over the Australian pair of Adam Scott and Cameron Davis. As usual, Spieth and Thomas were far from dull. They were 2 up with five holes to play when Thomas hit 6-iron to 2 feet on the par-3 14th over water to a back pin for birdie. And right when it looked as though the International side might get closer, Spieth was up to his tricks. His approach on the 15th — the 18th hole when Quail Hollow hosts the Wells

Fargo Championship — was headed for the stream when it hit the rocks and caromed over the green into the rough. He chipped 15 feet by, and then holed that par to halve the hole. The Spieth-Thomas and Cantlay-Schauffele teams, formed as much by friendship as their games, are 2-0 this week and are tough to beat no matter whom the International team sends out against them. The passion came from the Presidents Cup rookies. Homa's goal all year was to make the team and he was among six captain's picks by Davis Love III. Homa won twice last season, and started the new season with an unlikely title defense at Silverado in the Fortinet Championship when he chipped in for birdie on the final hole and Danny Willett three-putted from 4 feet. He flew across the country from California and looked energized, particularly at the end of the day with another point on the

board for the Americans. It was the second straight day Homa was in the final match, meaning the entire U.S. team was there to see it. "It's surreal to have 10 of the best golfers I've ever seen in my life watching you and you've got to help them," Homa said. "It's a heavy weight. But it's also really fun." It hasn't been a lot of fun for Captain Trevor Immelman and his International

team that was put together two weeks ago after more players — British Open champion Cameron Smith and Joaquin Niemann among them — defected to Saudi-funded LIV Golf. Saturday is pivotal at every Presidents Cup, and it could be the last chance for the International team to get back into the game with four matches of foursomes in the morning and four matches of fourballs in the afternoon.

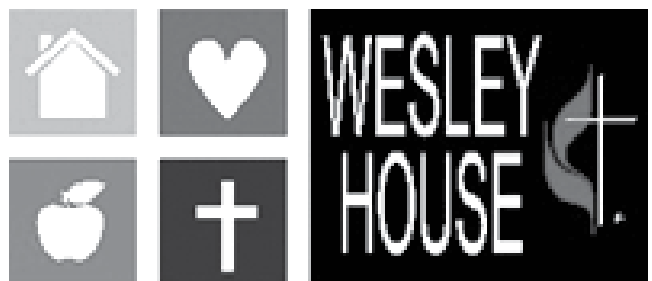

Chris Buescher looks to be playoff spoiler at home track

Chris Buescher’s win at Bristol last week marked the first time in this version of NASCAR’s playoffs that drivers who are not racing for the championship swept the three races of the first round. Buescher wants to play spoiler again Sunday. The second round of the playoffs start at Texas Motor Speedway, and that is the home track for Buescher. Chase Elliott opens the second round as the points leader. Austin Cindric is ranked last in the 12-driver field. The field will be trimmed by four drivers after this three-race round.

One of the first things Brad Keselowski did before buying into Jack Roush’s race team was check the years remaining on the contract for Chris Buescher, the driver he was inheriting with his purchase.

He was pleased to learn that Buescher was locked down. But it wasn’t long enough, in Keselowski’s mind.

“I kind of felt like he was a hidden free agent gem that wasn’t being scouted properly and felt that way for a handful of years,” Keselowski said. “The first thing, it was literally the first thing I did when I signed the papers ... was putting an offer in front of him to give him a contract

extension.

“I thought he was somebody we could build around and get results.”

Buescher picked up the first win for rebranded RFK Racing last week at Bristol Motor Speedway, and the first win for a Roush car in a points-paying race since since Daytona in 2017. Buescher and Keselowski both won a pair of qualifying races at Daytona in February.

It also marked the first time in this format of NASCAR’s playoffs that drivers who are not eligible for the championship swept the three races of the first round. Now Buescher, a native of Prosper, Texas, returns to his home state hoping to again play the spoiler.

The second round of the playoffs open Sunday at Texas Motor Speedway, where Buescher and Keselowski finished eighth and ninth in May in the exhibition All-Star race. Buescher is thrilled to be part of an energized race team.

“I’ve had really good teammates through the years at different organizations at the Cup level, but nobody that’s put in the amount of effort as Brad Keselowski,” Buescher said. “He’s very passionate about it. He puts in the work and the time and the effort to be able to make this thing successful, and we’ve seen it this year.

“For Brad to come over

in the ownership role and have that faith in me early on meant a lot to me. That’s a pretty big pat on the back when we haven’t always had the results to show for it.”

TEXAS TOO TOUGH

Texas Motor Speedway has been in the playoff rotation since 2005, and typically two annual stops for the Cup Series.

Texas swapped its spring race for the All-Star race the last two seasons, but the All-Star race will be at North Wilkesboro in North Carolina next season and Texas will have just one Cup race for the first time since 2005.

The demise of the speedway can be linked to a 2017 repaving and reconfiguration in Turns 1 and 2 that reduced the banking from 24 to 20 degrees. Passing became extremely difficult and NASCAR has been seeking solutions to improve the on-track product.

“I don’t like the racetrack and think they kind of ruined it. Texas, I just don’t enjoy very much,” said 2020 NASCAR champion Chase Elliott.

The race is concerning for the remaining 12 drivers in the playoff field because the second round has so many variables. Texas has been a difficult track for teams, next up is Talladega Superspeedway and then the field will be trimmed by four at The Roval at Charlotte Motor Speedway.

Celtics: Udoka suspended for ‘multiple’ policy violations

BOSTON (AP) — The reigning Eastern Conference champion Boston Celtics suspended coach Ime Udoka after a months-long investigation by an outside law firm that found multiple violations of team policies but did not point to a larger cultural problem of sexual misconduct, owner Wyc Grousbeck said Friday.

“We go to great lengths ... to run the organization with the central core value of respect and freedom in the workplace from harassment or any unwelcome attention,” Grousbeck said at a news conference. “This feels very much, to me, like one of a kind. That’s my personal belief. But I’ll have to verify that.”

Neither Grousbeck nor president of basketball operations Brad Stevens would elaborate on the specifics of the violations or the private report that was delivered to the team two days ago. But a person with knowledge of the matter, speaking on the condition of anonymity because the details were not made public, told The Associated Press that it involved an inappropriate relationship with a woman in the organization.

Udoka’s multiple violations involved one woman, a Celtics spokesman said Friday. No one else in the organization is facing dis-

cipline, Grousbeck said, adding that the team will be vigilant to make sure that Udoka’s actions aren’t a signal that there is a larger problem.

“I personally don’t believe that they’re a deeper signal,” Grousbeck said. “But we will be — I will be, personally — talking to members of the organization to make sure that that’s the case.”

A first-year coach who is three months removed from a trip to the NBA Finals, Udoka was suspended less than a week before training camp was to open for a team considered among the favorites to win it all this season. Assistant Joe Mazzulla was elevated to interim coach through June 30, 2023; the Celtics say they have not decided about Udoka’s future beyond then.

Stevens grew emotional when discussing the effect the scandal has had on the team — especially the women who were singled out on social media as possibly being involved. The team reached out to employees to offer support.

“We have a lot of talented women in our organization. I thought yesterday was really hard on them,” Stevens said. “Nobody can control Twitter speculation, rampant (expletive), but I do think that we as an organization have a responsibility to make sure we’re there to support them now. Because a lot of people were dragged un-

fairly into that.”

Grousbeck said the team learned of the problem earlier this summer and immediately brought in an outside law firm to investigate. After receiving the report, Grousbeck met with Udoka and he expressed “acceptance and appreciation for how this has been handled.”

Grousbeck would not say whether the suspension was unpaid but confirmed that it comes with a “significant financial penalty.” A year-long suspension is uncommon but not unprecedented for a professional sports coach, but the lack of public detail about Udoka’s behavior has led some — including Celtics Hall of Famer Paul Pierce — to question whether it was too severe.

Grousbeck disagreed, and noted that Udoka accepted the punishment and apologized.

“I personally feel that this is well-warranted and appropriate, backed by substantial research and evidence and facts,” the owner said. “It was clear that something substantial needed to be done. And it was.”


Mazzulla, 34, led West Virginia to a victory in the 2007 NIT tournament and an upset over ninth-ranked Duke in the next year’s NCAA’s. His only head coaching experience was a two-year stint from 2017-19 at Division II Fairmount State in West Virginia.

LONDON (AP) — This day, this match, had to come, of course, for Roger Federer, and for tennis, just as it inevitably must for every athlete in every sport.

Federer bid adieu Friday night with one last contest before he heads into retirement at age 41 after a superlative career that included 20 Grand Slam titles and a statesman’s role. He wrapped up his days as a professional player with a loss in doubles alongside his longtime rival Rafael Nadal for Team Europe in the Laver Cup against Frances Tiafoe and Jack Sock of Team World.

The truth is that the victors, the statistics and the score (OK, for the record it was 4-6, 7-6 (2), 11-9) did not matter, and were all so entirely beside the point. The occasion was, after all, about the farewell itself. Or, better, the farewells, plural: Federer’s to tennis, to the fans, to his competitors and colleagues. And, naturally, each of those entities’ farewells to Federer.

“It’s been a perfect journey,” Federer said. “I would do it all over again.”

When the match, and with it, his time in professional tennis, ended, Fed-

erer hugged Nadal, then Tiafoe and Sock. And then Federer began crying. As cascades of clapping and yells of affection came from the stands, Federer put his hands on his hips, his chest heaving. Then he mouthed, “Thank you,” while applauding right back toward the spectators who had chanted, “Let’s go, Roger! Let’s go!” during the concluding moments of a match that lasted more than two hours and ended at about 12:30 a.m.

The Swiss star announced last week that the three-day team event, which was founded by his management company, would be his final event before retirement, then made clear the doubles outing would be his last match. His surgically repaired right knee — the last of three operations came shortly after a loss in the Wimbledon quarterfinals in July 2021, which will go down as his final official singles match — is in no shape to allow him to continue.

“For me, just personally, (it was) sad in the first moment, when I came to the conclusion it’s the best decision,” Federer said in an interview with The Associated Press this week about his emotions when realizing it was time to go.

“I kind of held it in at first, then fought it off. But I could feel the pain.”

A couple of hours before Friday’s match, Federer tweeted: “I’ve done this thousands of times, but this one feels different. Thank you to everybody who’s coming tonight.”

He had said he wanted this to feel more like a party than a funeral, and the crowd obliged, rising for a loud and lengthy standing ovation when Federer and Nadal — each wearing a white bandanna, blue shirt and white shorts — emerged together from a tunnel leading out to the black court for the last match on Day 1 at the O2

Arena. The spectators remained on their feet for nearly 10 minutes, through the pre-match warmup, holding aloft phone cameras to capture the moment.

They came ready to roar for him, some with Swiss flags, some with homemade signs, and they made themselves heard with a wall of sound when Federer delivered a forehand volley winner on the match’s second point. Similar reactions arrived merely at the chair umpire’s announcement before the third game of “Roger Federer to serve,” and again when he closed that game with a 117 mph service winner.

Training wheels: ABC series 'The Rookie' returns, introduces new spinoff

The LAPD is back on the case when Nathan Fillion ("Castle") returns as Officer John Nolan in the Season 5 premiere of "The Rookie," airing Sunday, Sept. 25, on ABC.

While Officer Nolan has moved up the ranks in the LAPD after his start as the department's oldest-ever rookie in Season 1, the past season of the procedural drama introduced a new rookie character who is at the center of a brand-new spinoff series. FBI Special Agent Simone Clark, portrayed by "Claws" star Niecy Nash-Betts, quickly bonded with Nolan over having both been the oldest rookies to join their departments. She now leads her own series, "The Rookie: Feds," premiering Tuesday, Sept. 27, on ABC.

Nolan and Clark spent two episodes last season on "The Rookie" working together on a joint LAPD/FBI case, where they tried to catch a bomber with ties to the military and who had been a student of Clark's when she was a school counsellor (before her burgeoning FBI career). The pair track down the suspect, who had set bombs all over the Los Angeles freeways, while connecting over their shared experiences of joining law enforcement much later in life than most other new officers.

Viewers last saw Nolan surviving a dangerous shootout between officers and members of a gang in a California border town while there on a training exercise. And while Nolan was in Frontera, two officers in his department cut the will-they-won't-they tension with a long-awaited kiss. After four seasons, officers Lucy Chen (Melissa O'Neil "Dark Matter") and Tim Bradford (Eric Winter "Rosewood")

deepened their professional relationship by making it a bit more personal.

So where do they go from there? "The Rookie" series creator Alexi Hawley gave fans a bit to go on when speaking at a San Diego Comic-Con panel this summer, saying, "There will definitely be repercussions and some fallout from that [kiss], but I do think it's fair to make you wait to see exactly where that goes."

With Bradford having trained Chen when she was a rookie on the force, "repercussions" and "fallout" are more than expected, and Hawley's cagey answer to questions about the fan-favorite maybe-couple are only adding to the excitement of what viewers can expect to see in the new season.

Speaking of exciting developments, Nash-Betts revealed some more about her "The Rookie: Feds" character, Clark, telling the audience at Comic-Con that "we haven't seen this woman before." She pulled out some stats, noting

"less than 1% of Black women make up the FBI," before describing Clark as "serious, funny, sexy, sexually fluid, older and comfortable in her skin." Nash-Betts went on to describe Clark warmly, saying, "We all know someone like Simone. I grabbed a little bit from different women in my life. She is a friend in your head or your favorite auntie. I was like, 'I know this woman. She is a culmination of so many women.'"

This character rundown comes as no surprise if you've seen Nash-Betts in any of her past roles. You could even say that she is known for portraying unserious law enforcement. Having brought Deputy Raineesha Williams to life over the nearly two-decade off-and-on run of "Reno 911!," Nash-Betts will certainly bring some levity to Clark and "The Rookie: Feds." She also gave an unforgettable performance in the short-lived, wacky horror comedy "Scream Queens" as security guard Denise Hemphill before turning the tables for her lead role in "Claws" as nail salon owner Desna Simms, who does some other (far less law-abiding) business on the side.

Most details about the new series are under wraps for now, but Hawley did reveal at the Comic-Con panel that he had been planning "The Rookie: Feds" for a while. Hawley said, "It's a universal experience, the restarting your life, the second chapter. So it always felt like there was room for that to grow. Once we got a couple of seasons under our belt, we started hatching our evil plan to expand the universe."

Filling in the world of "The Rookie: Feds" are Frankie Faison ("The Village"), as Clark's anti-law-enforcement father, Christopher 'Cutty' Clark; as well as Felix Solis ("Charmed"), as supervisory Special Agent Matthew Garza; Britt Robertson ("Big Sky"), as Special Agent Laura Stenson; and Kevin

Zegers ("Rebel") as Special Agent Brendon Acres.

Having secured a new role within the LAPD at the end of last season, "The Rookie" sees the titular rookie start something new again in the upcoming fifth season. Nolan has become a training officer in his department and is taking on a whole new set of responsibilities. Fillion told the audience at the Comic-Con panel for "The Rookie" that Nolan has "elevated to a new level of his job, and he's starting at rock bottom. I get a brand-new rookie who's making all the same mistakes I was making as a rookie."

Don't miss the season premiere of "The Rookie" on Sunday, Sept. 25, on ABC, where "The Rookie: Feds" gets its series premiere two days later on Tuesday, Sept. 27.

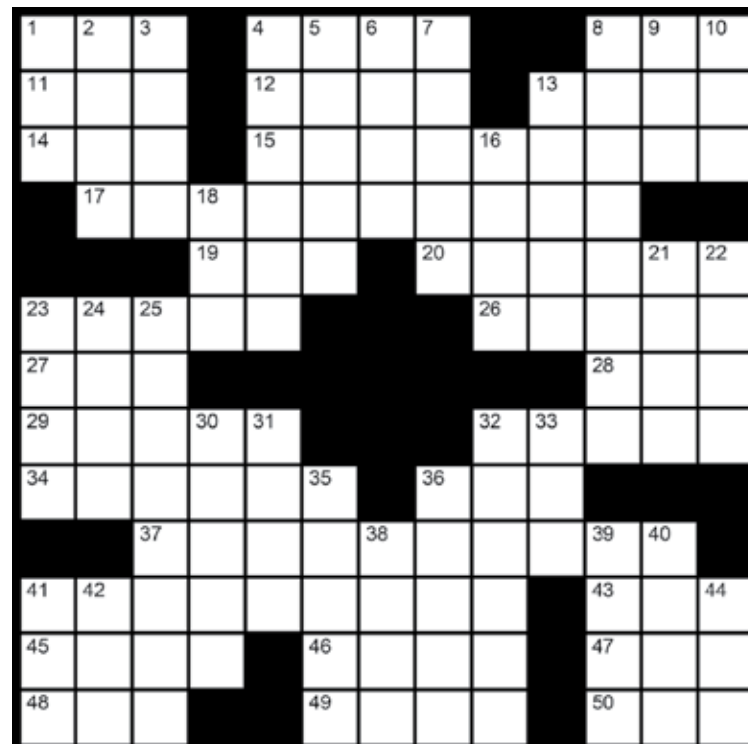

'Battle of the Ages': New Season of 'Hell's Kitchen' pits youth against experience

Viewers can expect more fast-paced challenges, more cooking blunders and, of course, more blunt takedowns delivered by Gordon Ramsay as a new season of "Hell's Kitchen" kicks off Thursday, Sept. 29, on Fox.

Season 21 of Ramsay's flagship series has been dubbed "Battle of the Ages," which means the initial men vs. women team division has been replaced by a veterans vs. up-and-comers format — or "Oldies vs. Newbies," according to a tweet from the show's official Twitter account. The contestants will be split into two groups according to their age, with forty-somethings on the blue team and twenty-somethings on the red team.

The last time "Hell's Kitchen" took this approach was in Season 18. Kitchen veteran (and former Season Six competitor) Ariel Contreras-Fox beat out rookie Mia Castro to win the executive chef position at the Hell's Kitchen Restaurant inside Caesars Palace in Las Vegas. She turned down the gig, but don't assume there's any bad blood: released just last month, Fox's "Spice Kitchen: Healthy Latin and Caribbean Cuisine" cookbook includes a foreword from Ramsay.

Season 20 ("Young Guns") winner Trenton Garvey was the youngest in the show's history. For his efforts, he was awarded a \$250,000 cash prize and a job as head chef at

Gordon Ramsay Steak in the Paris Las Vegas Hotel.

What kind of prize will be awarded to the winner of "Hell's Kitchen: Battle of the Ages?" According to Fox, the show's home network, "at stake is a life-changing grand prize, including a head chef position at the new Hell's Kitchen Restaurant" in Caesars Atlantic City. It is the third Hell's Kitchen restaurant, but the first one located in Atlantic City, where

Ramsay has already had success with two other restaurants: Gordon Ramsay Steak and Gordon Ramsay Pub and Grill.

Season 21 is the first of two new seasons ordered by Fox earlier this year, so viewers can look forward to a 22nd season sometime in the near future. But let's focus on the now: enjoy all the action and culinary chaos when "Hell's Kitchen: Battle of the Ages" premieres Thursday, Sept. 29, on Fox.

Mother knows best

Successful attorney hires bumbling son in 'So Help Me Todd'

While plenty of family businesses thrive, working with your loved ones can be, well, challenging at times. However, a disgraced private investigator has no choice but to take a job at his mother's law firm in a new lighthearted CBS drama featuring an Academy Award winner.

Skylar Astin ("Zoey's Extraordinary Playlist") stars as Todd Wright, the aimless son of successful, no-nonsense attorney Margaret Wright, played by Oscar winner Marcia Gay Harden ("Mystic River," 2003), in "So Help Me Todd," premiering Thursday, Sept. 29, on CBS. Created by Scott Prendergast ("Silicon Valley"), the series will also be available to Paramount+ subscribers.

Despite genuine skill as an investigator, Todd has been struggling since his license was revoked thanks to his creative interpretation of the law a couple of years earlier. Meanwhile, Margaret can't seem to understand why Todd has not reached the same level of success as his siblings: an ER doctor and a governor's chief of staff. Frustrated that he hasn't been able to pull himself up by his bootstraps, she offers him a job as her firm's in-house investigator. Unfortunately for law-loving Margaret, her son's methods are somewhat unconventional and walk the line between legal and less-than-legal. But when his tech savvy and charm lead to results, she has to admit he's very good at what he does. As a result, "So Help Me Todd" offers TV viewers a mother-and-son odd couple in a drama that doesn't take itself too seriously.

"Could you speed up for once? This is technically a car chase," Todd com-

plains as his mother calmly meanders down a street in the show's trailer.

The onscreen banter between Harden and Astin seems very natural, but they weren't the show's original dynamic duo. Astin has been with the series from early on, but fellow Oscar winner Geena Davis ("The Accidental Tourist," 1988) was initially tapped to play the role of the matriarch. In March, Deadline broke the news that Davis had left the show during the pilot stage, though no reason was given. Production paused to find a new actress to take on the role, and, luckily for Harden fans, she signed on to the project.

The award-winning actress is a huge get for the new series. Harden, whose career spans no fewer than four decades, is the recipient of two Oscars — one for the 2000 film "Pollock" and another for 2003's "Mystic River," as well as a Tony Award for her work in the play "God of Carnage." She has earned many accolades for her varied television career as well. Her credits include HBO's "The Newsroom," ABC's "How to Get Away With Murder" and CBS's "Code Black." She has earned Emmy nominations for her work on NBC's "Law & Order: Special Victims Unit," the TV movie "The Courageous Heart of Irena Sendler" and, more recently, Apple TV's "The Morning Show."

Actor and singer Astin first broke into the film industry in the musical movies "Pitch Perfect" (2012) and "Pitch Perfect 2" (2015). Before that, he originated the role of Georg in the musical "Spring Awakening" on Broadway. On the big screen, Astin has appeared in "Hamlet 2" (2008), "Cavemen" (2013) and "21 & Over" (2013). On the small screen, he took over the role of Gregg Serrano on the final season of

CW's "Crazy Ex-Girlfriend" when actor Santino Fontana ("Frozen," 2013) left that series. Astin also starred in the NBC series "Zoey's Extraordinary Playlist" before signing on to "So Help Me Todd."

Of course, Harden and Astin are supported by some solid castmates in the new drama. Actress Inga Schlingmann portrays Todd's ex-girlfriend Susan, who happens to work at his mother's firm. It's clear that stylish Susan has moved on since their breakup. A relative newcomer, Schlingmann's other TV credit includes a guest-starring role on "Law & Order: Special Victims Unit."

Madeline Wise stars as Todd's sister, Allison, an ER trauma surgeon. She strives to keep the peace between her

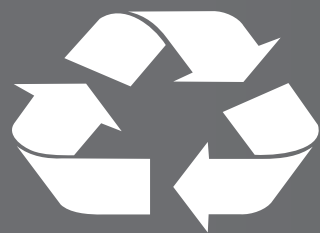
bumbling brother and their overbearing mother, and, despite her success, is dissatisfied with her seemingly perfect life. TV viewers may recognize Wise for her recent guest-starring roles in HBO's "Curb Your Enthusiasm" and "Star Trek: Picard" on Paramount+.

Todd has at least one ally in Margaret's office. Rosa Arrendondo plays Francey, who's described as Todd's "Girl Friday," a term used to refer to a trusted female assistant. Arrendondo was a successful dancer before she transitioned to acting. In addition to roles in other successful CBS series such as "Blue Bloods" and "The Equalizer," the actress is known for her work as Michelle Valenti in the CW sci-fi series "Roswell, New Mexico."

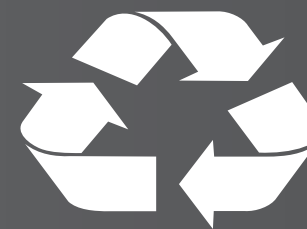
Tristen J. Winger rounds out the supporting cast as Lyle, a licensed investigator at Margaret's firm. Winger made his TV debut in HBO's "Insecure" and appeared in the critically acclaimed web series "The Misadventures of Awkward Black Girl."

"So Help Me Todd's" behind-the-scenes team includes Amy York Rubin ("Dead to Me"), who directed the pilot, writer Prendergast and showrunners Liz Kruger and Craig Shapiro (both of the "Charmed" reboot).

With that kind of talent in front of and behind the camera, the show is definitely one to watch this fall. Don't miss the premiere of "So Help Me Todd," airing Thursday, Sept. 29, on CBS.

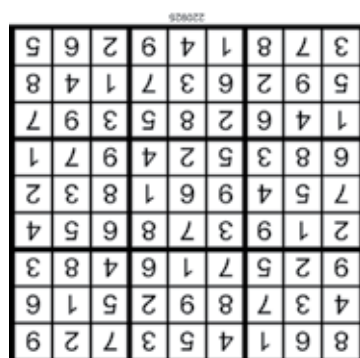
