



"Paint the Town Red is one of the best times of the year," Chamber Special Events and Membership Director Daisy Flood said in an email. "The decorating




contest brings a lot of excitement and pride to our community. It is fun getting to see

Along with all of the red you'll see around Pittsburg this week, will be lots and lots of depictions of our favorite mascot, Gus. These days he's looking pretty buff, despite the fact that he is a centenarian.

The first documented illustration of a gorilla as the school's mascot was in 1922, when the Gorillas pep club enlisted an art student to draw



an image for them. It was published in the Kanza yearbook in 1923 and in 1925, the student body unanimously adopted the gorilla as the mascot for all. Of the Kansas State Teachers College athletic teams.

The exact date when the mascot acquired the name, "Gus," is unknown and probably lost in the river of time. However it came about, it is safe to say Gus is one of the best known and beloved university mascots in NCAA Division II.


