covid-19 IN LEE COUNTY County sees 165 new cases in past two weeks

FORT MADISON – Despite a 14-day average that is fluctuating between 7 and 8 percent, COVID-19 cases counts in Lee County are again on the rise.

According to the Lee County Health Department, the county has seen 165 new cases of COVID-19, the disease caused by the novel coronavirus, in the past 14 days, with 87 of those in the past seven days.

Monday's report from Friday at 3:30 p.m. to Monday at 3:30 p.m. LCHD received reports of 29 more positive tests in the three-day period. Iowa Department of Public Health's <u>coronavirus.iowa.gov</u> site shows 11 new positives over a three-day period from Friday through Sunday, however the two agencies continue to report the same to-date total of positive cases at 869. The different in the two numbers of 18 is not included in the 165 new cases of the past two weeks.

LCHD Administrator Michele Ross said the message to county residents is to mask up.

"Our message is to MASK UP Lee County and continue to practice social distancing and frequent hand hygiene practices and avoid high risk situations such as crowds of people, especially when inside and people are not social distancing or wearing face coverings," Ross said.

"Everyone should work together to protect our most vulnerable populations as well as our family, friends, co-workers, and those we come in contact with in public settings." Ross reminded that Gov. Kim Reynolds health proclamation was extended and still includes requirements for social distancing in public places.

HUMPHREY BUILDING

Mayor says city will enforce court order to the letter

FORT MADISON – With no fresh news on the horizon regarding a court order to force action on the Humphrey building in downtown Fort Madison, city officials are pressing on. A court-order signed by District Judge Michael Schilling gave the building's owner Bryan Humphrey, who resides in the structure, until Oct. 9, to inform the city of his plans to rectify structural deficiencies. As of Friday, the city had not heard from Humphrey or a representative of the former attorney. Last week City Building Director Doug Krogmeier put the matter back in the hands of Pat O'Connell, the city's representing attorney from Lynch-Dallas out of Cedar Rapids.

On Friday, Fort Madison Mayor Matt

"From the very beginning of this pandemic crisis and especially now as we have active community spread with cases increasing, we must all do the right thing and mask up when in public settings outside our own households," Ross said.

"We need to continue maintaining a six foot social distance or more and avoid crowded areas or gatherings of people outside our own households where COVID-19 as well as other viruses such as influenza can spread easily and unknowingly."

Ross said with testing capability at a high level including mass testing at larger institutions and facilities in the county, the 14-day positivity rating is being held in check despite the increased number of positive cases.

The county saw its third highest daily positive results on Oct. 6 with 28 and Lee County now has an overall positive rate of 11.3% among all test results received by the IDPH.

Lee County saw it's highest rates prior between

August 22 and Sept. 8 prompting county officials to investigate the possibility of a countywide mask mandate. That effort was defeated by the Lee County Board of Supervisors at the end of September.

Fort Madison Community School District is also going away from it's hybrid model of learning on Nov. 2 and going back to 100% in-person learning, with optional online coursework available through the end of the school year for parents who choose to have their students at home during the pandemic.

Ross said LCHD continues to maintain contact with the schools and other businesses and facilities that requested follow-up guidance, or for guidance suggested by IDPH.

"We do provide education and mask guidance with the schools upon their request, especially when the recent change in quarantine guidance was released by IDPH," Ross said.

"The importance of all parties wearing masks while attending school or school activities has been encouraged.

The overall state percent of positive test results are 12.2%. Des Moines County has a 14-day positivity rate of 13.9% and two school districts in that county have forfeited post season athletics due to outbreaks. West Burlington volleyball and Burlington football have both withdrew from the post season due to COVID-19.

Sports/From the Front

Area fishing still productive as cooler weather sets in

DES MOINES - The following is the area fishing forecast for southeast Iowa by the Iowa Department of Natural Resources.

Big Hollow Lake

Water temperature is in the low 60's. You can find plenty of places out of the wind on this lake. Bluegill - Fair: Late last week the bluegill fishing slowed down. Look for bluegills out in deeper water. Largemouth Bass - Good: Bass fishing picked up a little bit from last week with a few more fish moving in shallow. Use soft plastics or weedless jigs tipped with crawdad trailers. Black Crappie - Fair: Crappie fishing slowed over the last few days; they went deep again.

Lake Belva Deer

Water temperature is around 60 degrees. Water clarity is back to 5+ feet. Bluegill - Good: Look for bluegill in 12 to 15 feet of water. Black Crappie -Good: Most crappies are sticking to deeper water; some are crashing the surface in spots chasing little bluegills on the surface. Largemouth Bass - Good: Work your way back into the trees in the shallow water. Soft plastics, rigged weedless and good heavy test line helps.

Humphrey now facing at least \$150K in fines

Mohrfeld said the city was moving on.

"That deadline that was set came and went without any face-to-face with Bryan," Mohrfeld said.

"And so right now, by my understanding, and I'm not a lawyer, Bryan has not met the initial criteria and we will follow that order to the letter – and to the day."

Krogmeier confirmed Monday that no contact has yet been made with Humphrey or a representative of Humphrey's.

According the court order signed Sept. 25, Humphrey was fined \$150,000 with all but \$30,000 suspended. That \$30,000 is due to the city by Oct. 31. The suspended portion is contingent upon Humphrey's compliance with the remainder of the order.

Schilling ordered the remainder of the fine to be paid in full with interest dating back to the city's initial citation in September of 2019, if Humphrey fails to comply with the order.

Humphrey has already failed to me a deadline for informing the city by Oct, 9, whether he intended to demolish the building or repair it to city code. He also missed a deadline to shore up the west wall of the building per city code if, in fact, he chooses to repair the structure.

Lake Darling

Water temperature was 60 degrees on Wednesday (10/14). Water clarity continues to improve (3+ feet); a lot of the green color has left the water. Largemouth Bass - Good: Bass haven't seemed to be affected by the rapidly changing weather conditions. Work the wind-swept shoreline with crankbaits. Bluegill - Fair: The weather change over the weekend pushed most bluegills back out deep. If the wind allows you to, anchor over the brush piles in 10-12 feet of water and vertically jig. Black Crappie - Fair: Sometime between last Wednesday night and Thursday afternoon crappies stopped biting; they have started to bite again, but moved back out to deeper water.

Lost Grove Lake

Water temperatures are around 60 degrees. Water is clear, except where the wind is pounding into some of the points and unarmored shoreline. Largemouth Bass - Fair: Bass bite has been hit and miss the last few days. When the wind is blowing, work the back side of the points where there is a little calm spot just out of the wind with crankbaits. Bluegill - Fair: Most of the better bluegills moved to deeper water again with the rapidly changing weather.

Skunk River (Rose Hill to Coppock)

The fishing on the Skunk River is pretty quiet right now. Water levels have stayed at the same low level the last few days.

The order gives the city authority to abate the property in the event neither deadline was met, in a manner "it reasonably believes necessary" consistent with the order. The order also requires Humphrey to vacate the building by Dec. 15 if hasn't complied with either of the two options.

The city can then take possession of the building to take necessary steps to repair or demolish the building at their choosing without obligation and assess the costs to the property.




