Final arrest made in Feb. shooting

ATTEMPTED MURDER: Garza Jr. surrenders Wednesday night; held on \$200K bond

FORT MADISON – According to Fort Madison police, a 34-year-old man is now in Lee County Jail on a charge of attempt to commit murder.

Roy Michael Garza, Jr., was taken into custody Wednesday night after surrendering to Lee County Sheriff's deputies at the sheriff's office.

He had an initial court appearance Thursday morning and is being held on a \$200,000 cash only bond.

Garza was wanted in connection with the downtown shootings that took place in the early morning hours of Feb.



7, in the 800 block of Avenue G. No one was injured in the melee outside Jus' Try It, but several windows on the block were damaged by bullets and three men were eventually arrested for their roles in the shootings.

FORT MADISON – The 4th of July launch of the "Light Up the Sky This 4th of July" will be slightly different this year, according to Fort Madison Partner's Executive Director Tim Gobble.

"Due to the Business 61 construction, the 2021 Fort Madison Fireworks production will be moved a bit so citizens can watch the show comfortably and safely," Gobble said. These changes will include the following:

• The fireworks will be launched from the frontage road along the Mississippi in Riverview Park; so that walking path will be closed all day.

• The Sixth Street entrance to the park will remain open for boaters to

access the marina and safely launch their boats, but will be closed prior to the show for safety.

• Business 61 will be closed from 2nd to 6th Street to vehicular traffic. However, viewers will be able to sit on the newly finished section of highway during the presentation. As liability concerns prohibit us-

State's jobless rate climbs to 3.9% in April

DES MOINES - Iowa's unemployment rate increased slightly to 3.9 percent from 3.8 percent in April. The state's jobless rate was 8.3 percent one year ago. Iowa's labor force participation rate increased from 66.1% in April to 66.4% in May as the total number of working Iowans increased to 1,584,000 in May. The number of unemployed

Iowans and the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased slightly by 1,300 and 0.1 percent respectively. The U.S. unemployment rate decreased to 5.8 percent in May.

"The positive takeaways from May's monthly job report are that the number of Iowans in the workforce increased by 6,300; the number of Iowans working

increased by 5,000 and claims numbers in May were down significantly from the previous month," said Beth Townsend, Director of Iowa Workforce Development. "While the number of unemployed Iowans ticked up slightly, the overall trend is positive for Iowa as we see more and more Iowans returning to the workforce."

FM man gets 30 years for child porn conviction

DAVENPORT - A Fort Madison man has been sentenced to 30 years in prison by a United States District judge on child pornography charges.

George Freeman Cary, 57, of Fort Madison was given 360 months in prison and then a 20-year supervised probation, and ordered to pay a \$100 fine to the Crime Victims' Fund.

According to a release Wednesday from the U.S. Attorney's Office of the Southern District of Iowa, Cary was convicted of distributing child pornography on the Kik messaging application.

Cary has previous convictions for indecent contact with a child, lascivious acts with a child, and 3rd degree sexual abuse.

He also had two prior convictions for failing to comply with the sex offender registry.

Investigation into the case was Homeland Security Investigations. The case was prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Office for the Southern District if Iowa as part of the U.S. Department of Justice's "Project Safe Childhood" initiative, which started in 2006 as a nationwide effort to combine law enforcement investigations and prosecutions, community action and public awareness in order to reduce the incidence of child





Burlington have already been arrested and charged in connection with the incident.

Ross was charged with carrying weapons, reckless use of a firearm, and being a felon in control of a firearm. Porter is facing charges of aiding and abetting attempted murder.

Ross posted a \$15,000 bond and was released after pleading not guilty to the charges. He is represented by Justin Stonerook out of Burlington. His tentative trial date has been set for July 13th at 9 a.m. in North Lee County Court. Porter is represented by Scott Schroeder of Burlington and has posted a \$50,000 bond and is currently released pending his trial scheduled to begin on Aug. 23, 2021.

Ross was arrested shortly after the incident by Des Moines County Sheriff's deputies as he fled up Hwy. 61 toward Burlington after the incident, and was charged with OWI.

Porter was arrested on April 2 at Catfish Bend Casino by Burlington Police and transported to Lee County Jail.

Police investigators said no additional arrests stemming from the incident are expected.

State Attorney General reviews cases of clergy abuse

DES MOINES — The Iowa Attorney General's Office has completed a review of clergy abuse in Iowa. The office examined records involving about 70 Catholic priests and looked into 50 complaints of sexual abuse and misconduct reported to the attorney general.

"Sexual abuse took place over decades. The complaints, the victims, the duration of the abuse were overwhelming," a report by the AG's Office concluded. "Our hearts go out to the victims of these acts. The consequences are severe and lifelong."

The report concludes that while the Catholic Church in Iowa had a long, painful history of abuse by priests and a cover-up by officials, the Dioceses have enacted many reforms over the last two decades. The Dioceses have become more responsive to victims of clergy abuse and each now reports all accusations to law enforcement authorities.

Five priests in Iowa have been the subject of allegations for actions that occurred during or after 2002, when the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops adopted the Charter for the Protection of Children.

The committee has also purchased commemorative ribbons far each parade participant and trophies as well as prize money will be given to the winners of each category. The prize money for this parade is \$15.00 for 1st Place, \$12.00 for 2nd place and \$10.00 for third place. Several \$5.00 honorable mention prizes will also be awarded.

At the end of the parade, members of the local Moose Club, will be serving treats to all the participants as they have done since 1946 and as the prize winners are being announced items donated by area merchants will be given away to the parade participants. During the last few parades many area businesses have given gift certificates, toys, bicycles, etc. so every child that participates will get more than just being patriotic. Items for this year's parade and raffle may still be left off at the local Moose Lodge or the North Lee County Historical Society Museum.

In case of inclement weather, which seldom happens, the parade will be held on Sunday, July 4th.

The parade got its beginnings back in 1913 when a young AT&SF car department clerk, Charles C. Korschgen, saw his neighborhood kids had nothing to do on the 4th of July, so he purchased a dozen small flags strapped his snare drum around his neck and led them many times around block in the west end of Fort Madison.

Having started a tradition, Charlie continued this routine for many years, gradually increasing the parade route and buying the participants candy with his own money. Finally by the time the 1930's rolled around the participation had grown so that Charlie got help from fellow workers at the AT&SF and neighbors to assist with the treats and the parade. By this time the "east enders" had noticed the importance of the parade and invited Charlie to lead his band of patriots into the Fort Madison downtown district. One loyal youngster who took part in the first parade, Don Valentine, stayed with the parade until Charlie passed away in January 1966 after leading 53 parades. Don Valentine helped the Fort Madison Jaycees keep the tradition alive.

By the 1940's, Charlie was having 500 to 1,000 kids take part in the parade and by 1946, when the Loyal Order of the Moose started providing treats the "grand old-man" as Charlie was called just had to organize the parade. With age catching up with Charlie the Fort Madison Junior Chamber of Commerce volunteered to take over the organization of the parade and continued to do so until the local Jaycee Chapter disbanded in 1999 and since that time a small dedicated group of volunteers have kept the parade going and in 2008 incorporated as a non-profit corporation.

Everyone young and old is invited to take part in the parade to celebrate our nation's birthday, however, the committee reserves to right to refuse entries not in the spirit of the holiday or would create a safety hazard to those participating in the parade.
