any contact with Gollither would have flagged the missing person listing.

Carle said Gollither had two outstanding warrants for possession of marijuana and possession of methamphetamine. He said at this point, police don't suspect foul play in the disappearance.

Shelton said her son had turned to drugs to help deal with a diagnosed Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder following his tours in Afghanistan. She said she knows he had recently admitted to not taking his medications for the disorder.

"The last time I talked to him, he

FORT MADISON – The parents of a 35-year-old missing U.S. Marine from Fort Madison are looking for answers.

Christopher M. Gollither, Jr., of Fort Madison, was reported missing by his mother Michelle Shelton of Keokuk, on Feb. 7, after hearing from his

Gollither had been sharing a residence with two other people in the 2000 block of Avenue E in Fort Madison. He served two- four-year tours of service in Afghanistan and was on full disability after an honorable discharge from the service.

Fort Madison Police have Gollither in the state's missing person system, the National Crime Information Center, and Capt. Jamie Carle said

"Norik" celebrates first day with FMPD

K9: 2-year-old German Shepherd is 4th canine officer in Lee County

FORT MADISON – The Fort Madison Police may be short a few officers, but now they're plus one K9 officer.

"Norik", a 2-year-old male German Shepherd, went on his first day of work with the Fort Madison Police Department Wednesday with officer Warosh.

Fort Madison officer Greg Warosh spent 120 hours in Ashland, Ohio getting used to handling the brown and black shepherd. The training was a bit different than the other models that train the dog.

K9 Working Dogs International train the dogs on tracking, narcotics detection, bite work, and searches and then pairs the dogs with officers from police departments spending the training time acclimating the dogs to the handlers.

"The biggest difference is instead of getting a dog that's new and needs trained, this company gives you a fully trained ready-to-go dog," he said "The 120 hours is basically spent training you on how to handle the dog and maintain training."

Norik will live with the Warosh family who's had two other shepherds in the house prior to Norik's arrival.

Warosh said introducing the new animal went smoother than he anticipated.

Hancock County sheriff makes drug, vehicle arrests

HANCOCK COUNTY - On Saturday March 19, 2022, at approximately 9:55 PM a Sheriff's Deputy on patrol conducted a traffic stop at the intersection of 10th and Oak Streets in Hamilton, IL. A RED 2006 Dodge Caravan had failed to stop at the intersection of 10th and Broadway Streets. The driver was identified as Andrew D. Baker (M/W age 53) of Keokuk, IA, and the passenger was identified as Amada J. Picton (F/W Age 32) of Keokuk, IA.

The Deputy deployed his K9 partner. After a positive alert the vehicle was searched. Inside of the passenger's purse the Deputy discovered a baggie with a small amount of methamphetamine as well as hypodermic syringes and other drug paraphernalia. Picton was placed under arrest and transported to the Hancock County Jail. She was released the following day on a recognition bond.

On Sunday March 20, 2022, at approximately 10:40 PM a Sheriff's Deputy on patrol conducted a traffic stop at the intersection of 8th and Walnut Streets in Hamilton, IL for an equipment violation. The driver, Ike L.

Byers (M/W Age 28) of LaHarpe, IL was operating a white 2003 Chrysler Van. Byers was driving on a suspended Illinois license and had a warrant for his arrest in Hancock County for Failure to Pay - Unlawful Possession of Methamphetamine. Byers was transported to the Hancock County Jail.

On Monday March 21, 2022, at approximately 1:15 AM a Sheriff's Deputy attempted to make a traffic stop in rural Carthage on a silver Infiniti Q30. The Infiniti had registration on it which belonged on a Ford truck.

The driver, Scot A. Flora (M/W Age 53) of Carthage, IL, did not pull over and fled from the Deputy. The Deputy apprehended Flora after he eventually stopped at a rural Carthage, IL address.

Flora was transported to the Hancock County Jail where he was charged with Fleeing or Attempting to Elude a Peace Officer, Operating Uninsured Vehicle, and Improper Display of Registration.

cut it short and said he wasn't feeling right and he would talk to me later," Shelton said.

She also said her son told her there was some arguing going on between Gollhofer and his roommates several days before he disappeared, and one of the roommates reported the disappearance to Fort Madison Police.

Carle said police have spoken with the other residents of the home as part of the investigation.

Gollhofer spent the weekend at his mother's home in Keokuk before he turned up missing.

"He stayed with me Friday and Saturday before he disappeared. We talked about doing things together because I've had my own battles with depression. We talked about some things we could do together that would help both of us," she said.

"If he's turned back to drugs and doesn't want to see me again, I'll live with that, but I want to know he's safe. My plea is that if anyone knows where he is or if he reads this, that his nieces and nephews miss him. We all miss him. Just call us and let us know you're safe."

Lee County Sheriff Stacy Weber said he hadn't been contacted regarding the missing person and wasn't aware, but spoke with Gollhofer's father, Christopher Gollhofer, Sr., Wednesday and offered to help. Weber turned the investigation over to a detective after speaking with Gollhofer, Sr.

Keokuk Police Chief Dave Hinton said they re-

ceived a call from Shelton on Feb. 14 letting Keokuk Police know she had filed a missing person's report, but didn't have any other information on the case. He said the police arrested Gollhofer about a year ago.

Gollhofer, Sr., said it was unlike his son to not make a phone call to him or his mother for such a long time. Shelton said the same, adding that he always returned her phone calls.

Gollhofer, Sr., said there has been no activity in his son's bank account since his disappearance. He said he wasn't notified by family or the police until the middle of March about their son's disappearance.

"I don't expect the outcome to be good," Gollhofer, Sr., said. "It's the money. There's been no movement at all in his account and he didn't take his wallet."

Shelton is of the same mindset.

"I just feel like this isn't going to come out well," she said. "He never doesn't return my calls and won't go more than a couple days without just calling me. It's been six weeks."

Shelton is asking anyone with information on her son's whereabouts to contact the nearest police department. She's offering a \$1,000 reward for information that results in the location of Gollhofer.

"He does pretty good with them. It went better than I thought, but he's got his own separate kennel and fenced-in area that he stays in. He comes out for training and he's off the leash when it's just me and him in the yard."

Warosh's vehicle has a make-shift kennel at this point, but is scheduled to be retrofitted with state-of-the-art accommodations, including a temperature-alert system and automatic doors that can be released with a button that Warosh carries with him on duty.

Warosh said the K9 came from the same kennel that provided animals to the Burlington and Keokuk Police Departments. Keokuk's K9 team went with Warosh to the training sessions.

He said he wasn't surprised by anything during the training. Working with other K9 officers in the area gave him a pretty good idea on what to expect.

The Fort Madison Police Department is planning a K9 Euchre Tournament fundraiser on April 22 at the Fort Madison Pavilion from 5:30 to 9:30. Food and soft drinks will be provided with a free-will donation. Participants can bring their own beer/alcohol. Euchre starts at 6 p.m. for \$5 per person with a .50 euchre fee.
