City gets \$400K CAT grant | Fiber optics

MARINA MONEY: Project dredging schedule moved up to beat cold weather

BY CHUCK VANDENBERG

FORT MADISON - Every time a bell rings, Mayor Matt Mohrfeld secures more money for the city's \$11 million marina project.

In the spirit of Christmas, Mohrfeld may be ready to say it's a wonderful life as the city was informed Thursday that they will receive a \$400,000 grant from the Iowa Economic Development Authority's Enhance Iowa Community Attraction and Tourism program.

"Last Thursday I went to Des Moines for the awarding of the CAT

grant and I did come home with \$400,000 from the state of Iowa for the marina project, so thank you to Iowa for that," Mohrfeld said.

"That is last-in dollars for that phase, but that's still great." He said a construction meeting Tuesday morning showed that

things were moving along ahead of schedule. Dredging companies will begin dredging this week with an extra

dredger to try and get the pumping down in 25 days as opposed to the 40 days allotted in the contract.

"He's trying to accelerate that 40-day timeline to 25 days on the

HTC's Snaadt snuffs out Van Buren with buzzer-beater

FORT MADISON - Holy Trinity's boys basketball team is young, but there is enough senior leadership there to guide the Crusaders.

One of those seniors delivered at

the right time in Tuesday's 44-43 win over Van Buren at Shottenkirk Gym.

Tyler Snaadt's buzzer-beating shot saved the Crusaders (1-3) after they let a 42-34 lead get away in the final 2 1/2 minutes.

The Crusaders, who took the lead in the second quarter, seemed in command when Snaadt, who finished with 25 points, scored with 2:30 to

work could start in spring

SIREPA outlines what agreements for look like for broadband project in Lee County

LEE COUNTY – A project in the works to bring a new fiber optics network to Lee County could begin as early as this spring.

At a meeting Tuesday of the Southeast Iowa Regional and Economic Port Authority, the group got an update from Danville Telecom president Tim Fencl.

The project will take about two years to complete and could be functional in 2024, but engineering and consulting on the work is set to begin in late February or early March of next year.

The SIREPA discussed five agreements that will need to be agreed upon as part of the fiber optics project.

SIREPA will own the fiber optic backbone upon completion and will receive lease pay-



ments for 10 years that will amount to about \$950,000 that SIREPA Administrator Mike Norris said will be allocated for additional rural broadband projects. Danville Telecom would assume ownership of the project after the 10 year lease is up.

He said the funds would be used for matching funds to leverage other grants to attract larger Internet projects through SIREPA.

"As the board has discussed, we will invest those lease payments back into broadband projects for Lee County," Norris said.



vorite hobby. He spent time finding and documenting family cemetery plots. Raymond lived an accomplished life and will be missed.





play. But Van Buren (1-3) took advantage of two missed free throws, two missed shots and two turnovers to rally.

Jackson Manning's layup with 25 seconds left tied the game at 42. Snaadt had a chance to give the Crusaders the lead, but he missed the shot and then Connor Gehling had the rebound taken away from him. Van Buren's Anthony Duncan was fouled with nine seconds left.

Hellige then drew up a play the Crusaders were going to run no matter what – get the ball to Adam Sobczak, the fastest player on the team.

"I just wanted to go, make or miss, tied or down one or down two," Hellige

Duncan made the first free throw, but missed the second. The Crusaders got the ball to Sobczak, who raced down the right side and put up a shot that was tipped.

"I thought he could have gotten goaltending there," Hellige said.

The shot came off the rim and right to Snaadt, who had just enough time to get off a floating shot that went through the net as the buzzer sounded.

"We haven't been in that situation before where we've got to ice a game," Hellige said. "We've worked on it in practice against our JV, but it's a little different speed out here.

Gehling added seven points for the Crusaders. Manning led Van Buren with 16 points.






dredging because - it gets cold in Iowa and he said when that starts it may not stop," Mohrfeld said.

The dredging will dump water and sediment into a large pit that's been constructed in Riverview park. After about a year, the water will completely drain from the silt leaving it dry and workable.

Crews will level off the silt and remove the berms for the pits to leave an elevated park base out of the 500-year flood plain.

The material from the berms will be used to elevate the road to the north of the park just south of the tracks.

In other action, the council

- approved the first reading of an ordinance amending the city animal control ordinance to allow fees to be set by resolution of the council. It also allows the Police Chief to designate an impound facility, removes collection of adoption fees, and allows police department designated authorities to impound, seize, euthanize, and use a tranquil-
- approved the re-appointment of Chris Sorrentino to the City Historic Preservation Commission for a term expiring Dec. 31, 2024.

The agreements will include a document outlining Lee County's commitment of \$1.9 million in America Rescue Plan Act funds as matching funds for the project. Those funds help trigger an additional \$3.2 million grant from the Iowa Chief Information Officer to cover most of the remaining costs of the 57 miles of fiber optic cable that will run up a western Lee County track to Hwy. 16 and then east to Hwy.

Norris said the port authority will probably be asking for the county's ARPA contribution in March.

The county received \$3.25 million from the U.S. Treasury as part of ARPA stimulus in May and is set to receive an additional \$3.25 million in May of 2022.

Other funding allocations from the stimulus include county projects, child care assistance, housing assistance, and tourism projects.

SIREPA and Danville Telecom will have a funding agreement for the local match and outline the requirements of the work to qualify for the ARPA funding, which is essentially providing Tier 1 service to under-served areas along the network.

SIREPA and Danville Telecom will also have a lease agreement outlining the repayments to SIREPA.

Danville Telecom and the state will have a grant agreement for OCIO funds, and Danville Telecom will also have a vendor services agreement with Vantage Point for engineering on the project.

Vantage Point was also used by Lee County Economic Development Group for a mapping of Lee County's broadband coverage.

The agreement with the county outlines the eligible use of ARPA funds to bring evidenced Internet service to residents who had less than 25 mbps download speed and 3 mbps upload speed. The county will likely make a lump some payment to SIREPA from to provide flexibility to the two groups to engage in the project.

Norris said the project may be funded in phases with the first being permitting and engineering, while phase two would be construction with a cost attached to each phase.

Fencl said permitting and engineering would commence in the spring.

"As soon as we have agreements in place between SIREPA and the county, SIRE-PA and Danville Telecom, at that point we would want to start getting right of way permission, permits, and sight-staking with boots on the grounds to find the path of least resistance," Fencl told the board.

Fencl also referenced the recently passed Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act signed by President Joe Biden last month. The \$973 billion legislation included \$550 billion in new infrastructure investment including, among others, rural broadband.

"They're still working through at the FCC level what that's going to look like. How that money will be dispersed to the states, and how states will disperse to individual counties. I do know there is an emphasis on partnerships like the ones we've created here. That money will be given greater scores, if you will, if there is a partnership like we've created here," he said.

According the National Association of Counties, the infrastructure legislation earmarks \$42.5 billion next year in grants to states for broadband deployment. It also adds \$1 billion over five years in competitive grants for broadband deployment where counties can apply directly to the National Telecommunications and Information Administration to improve "middle mile" infrastructure. Those are projects that connect local networks to high speed network service.
