County to assess IT structure

LEE COUNTY – Lee County will soon be having a review of its Information Technology needs.

At Tuesday's regular meeting, the county took steps to shore up IT issues within county offices including an assessment from an IT team associated with the Iowa State Association of Counties.

The Iowa Counties of Information

Technology, which is comprised of IT Directors from counties across the state, has an assessment team that will be visiting the county in the near future to evaluate Lee County's Information Technology status.

Kevin Harter, the county's new IT director, said he's been engaged in improving the county's IT situation since he was hired last month.

"As you know, we've been working on improving the technology situation here and, as a part of that, we need to

determine where we're at," Harter said.

"There's a group from ISAC comprised of IT directors from around the state. And part of that group is a tech team that comes to a county to evaluate and assess the situation and make recommendations and so forth."

The tech team will visit the county offices for two days and assess the county's IT capabilities and any shortcomings and then provide a report.

CHILD CARE

HTC to add onsite daycare in West Point

Facility at elementary school could be operational by August

FORT MADISON – Holy Trinity Schools has taken steps to offer additional day care at the West Point facility.

With child care slots a rarity in Lee County, and the subject of several studies going on in the county, the HTC board voted at their monthly meeting to create a day care service for three and four-year-olds at the elementary school in West Point.

Savanna Strunk, an onsite childcare supervisor, told the board that several families had inquired about the possibility of daycare in West Point. The system has the HTC Early Childhood Center in Fort Madison, but nothing in the West Point area. That facility cares for 2 to 5 year olds, but she said because West Point's facility would be smaller, they have to start with 3 to 4-year-olds.

The school does have a preschool program, but the only current childcare center in West Point is Sunshine Child Care. Strunk said currently about six preschool students go to Sunshine and five from the PreK program.

"We have to be certified by DHS and then they make yearly visits and we would have to carry a license and all that," Strunk said.

"We're hoping to start in August. We have to have the room approved by the fire marshal and make sure we are meeting their guidelines.

Strunk said if the day care doesn't fill up with parents in the system, they would open it up to the general public. She said the system wants to get everything approved by July to get the facility opened by August.

As long as we can get everything approved with the state, and I don't foresee any problems with that," she said.

Strunk said there would be a daily charge for the day care service, but Board President Loren Menke said the operation would most likely be a wash financially and not generate a profit for the system.

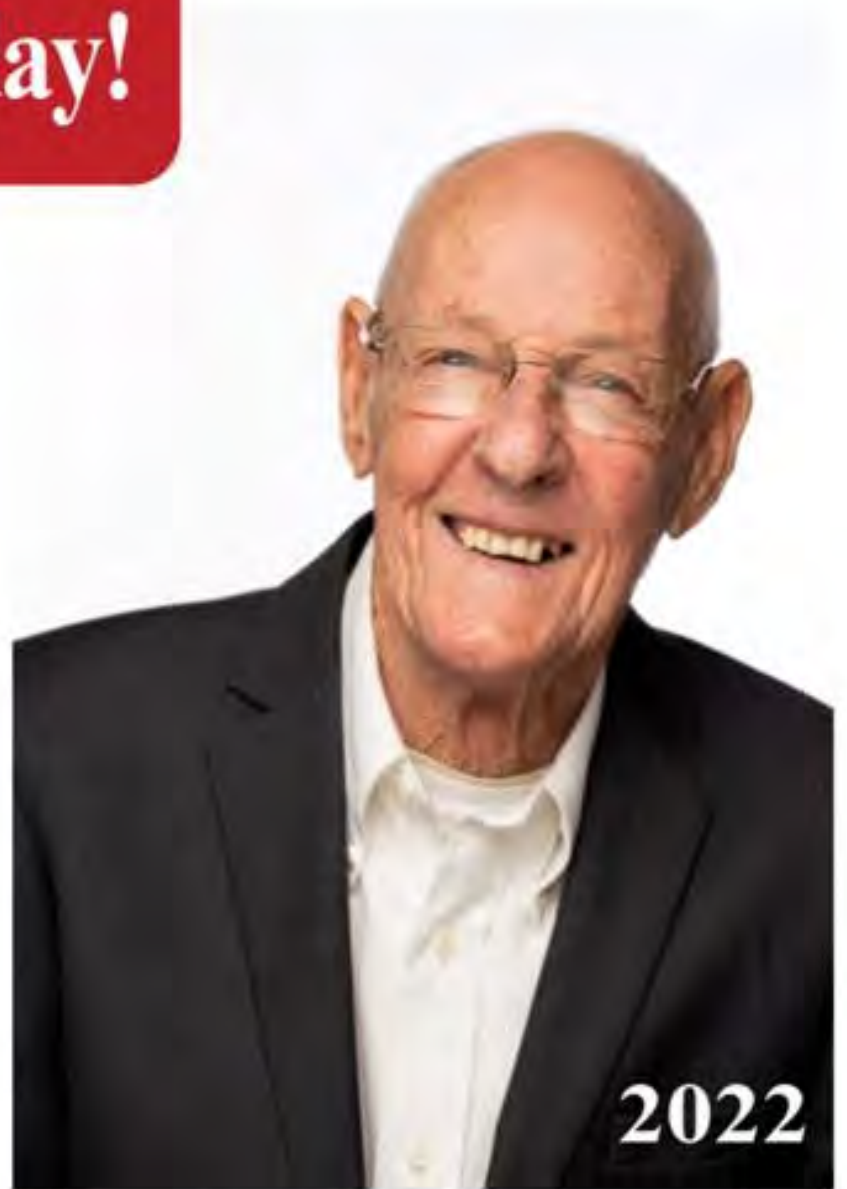

Besides his wife, he was also preceded in death by his parents, one sister, Joan Wright and one brother, Jimmy Bown.

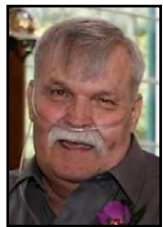

Bloodhounds stay perfect in Southeast soccer play

Wellman suffers knee injury in second half; status unknown

FORT MADISON – The joy was fleeting.

Fort Madison's Xander Wellman scored his third goal of the night 5 1/2 minutes into the second half of Monday's match against Fairfield.

Five minutes later, Wellman was down on the Baxter Soccer Complex grass, holding his right knee.

The injury to Wellman, one of the team's top offensive players, clouded the Bloodhounds' 5-0 victory.

Fort Madison (7-3 overall, 6-0 Southeast Conference) won its fifth consecutive match. The Bloodhounds have outscored their opponents 39-0 in the streak, and the win helped them maintain their one-game margin over Washington heading into Thursday's match in Washington between the two teams.

"It wasn't a good game," said Fort Madison coach Kevin Wellman, Xander's father. "I mean, it was a good game, but it wasn't a good game."

Xander Wellman went down with 29:18 to play in the match, forcing a stoppage of play. Kevin Wellman immediately raced to his son.

"He went down on his own accord," Kevin Wellman said. "Nobody touched him or anything like that. He just planted wrong."

"When I got out there, and he was laying on the ground, the first thing he told me was, 'Sorry, Dad.' Which..."

He couldn't finish the sentence.

Xander Wellman was carried to the Fort Madison bench, and when he sat down he buried his face in his hands.

"He heard a pop, so..." Kevin Wellman said. "I don't know what to tell you. We'll know more later."

Xander Wellman, who is second on the Bloodhounds with 14 goals, scored the first two goals of this match in a 25-second span late in the first half. Fort Madison had been struggling on offense before the two goals with 7:30 and 7:05 to play in the half broke things open.

Fort Madison is already playing without the services of junior Jacob Pothitakis, who was lost presumably for the season with a leg injury suffered during the Hounds Invitational earlier this month. Pothitakis was leading the team in goals

scored when he went down.

"It was stagnant at the beginning," Kevin Wellman said. "It took us a little while to get going. Fairfield did a fantastic job of clogging up the middle, blocking shots, playing good defense, really. We could have gotten the ball wider, and faster. It took us a little while to compensate for that and get things going."

"When they're defending like that, but they can't get the ball out, it's just a matter of time. A lot of times when that first one hits, you put your head down a little bit as a player. And then you almost make one mistake into two mistakes."

Mitchell Pothitakis scored with 54 seconds left, his 16th goal of the season, to give Fort Madison a 3-0 lead. Will Gager's goal with 27:34 left in the game closed the scoring.

IT upgrades on tap for Lee County offices

Typically the group does two different kinds of assessment. One is for counties that don't have any real IT in place, and the other is for counties that do have IT systems in place.

Andrew De Haan, IT director out of Marion County, is one of the tech team members and spoke to the board about the process.

“The assessment we'd do for you guys would be a little different as we would, during our report, provide you with more of an executive summary and not get too in the weeds of the technical details,” De Haan said.

“But then we would also provide a more technical report to Kevin and he could take that report and bring it to you with specific requests or needs, or specific problems and try to make things more safe and secure.”

De Haan said they would also be able to have the team sit with Harter, who is relatively new to county government work, and collaborate with him on best practices and things of that nature.

“The other thing we wanted to help Kevin with is just be able to sit down with five to eight of his peers in county IT and walk through how IT does budgeting, and how IT does some of these other things to give him a boost on being able to do his job well for your county.”

Harter said the cost of the work is minimal and helps cover the cost of the team to travel to Fort Madison and spend the night including meals.

“The cost is pretty minimal for what they do. They're looking for \$3,000 to cover cost of hotels and food that kind of thing and it would come out of my budget,” he said.

Garry Seyb said he sat in on a seminar at the annual ISAC conference in March and said the group is a pretty dynamic team.

“They will be a big help to us. And just having that overall assessment will help a lot.”

The board also approved increasing Harter's credit limit to \$30,000 to where it was under previous directors. Currently the card is set at \$10,000, but Harter said he is bidding new equipment now that will exceed the current limit.

“With the components he's going to be buying, he will need that extra limit,” Seyb said.

“I think he needs the ability to spend the additional money for servers and things like that. Our server, as in singular, is very old,” Seyb said.

Harter told the board he has also negotiated an increase in digital speed at county offices while cutting the monthly cost by close to \$500.

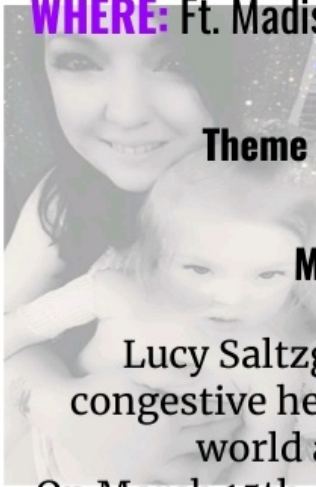

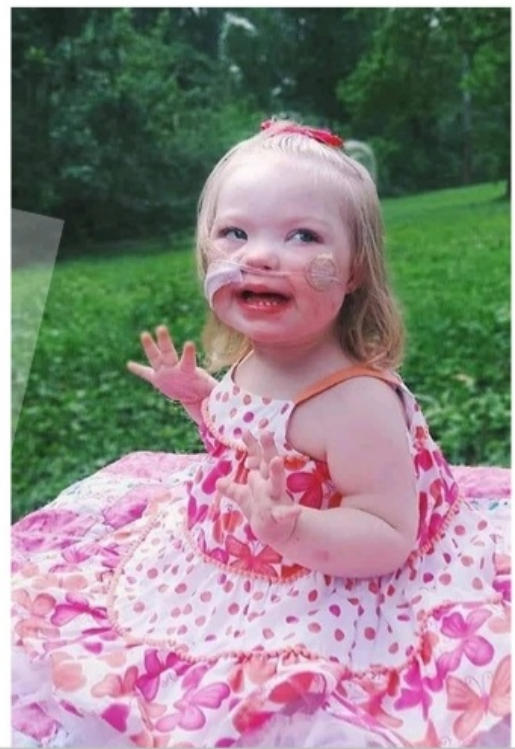
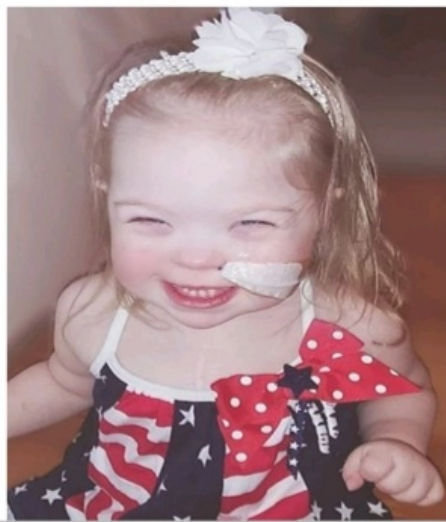
