FORT MADISON - You can see the work - but you really can't see the work.
Ten-foot berms block the view of passersby along Fort Madison's riverfront. The occasional earth mover crawls over the berms, but the real work is taking place on the other side of the hills.

Fort Madison Public Works Director Mark Bousselot

said the city has been building a containment area for dredging material that will be pumped out of the marina as early as next week.
The $\$ 11$ million marina renovation project is quickly getting to the point where winter temperatures and a sep aration of river water from silt will be under way sooner than expected.
While the separation takes place in the containment

## USDA issues final pandemic assistance

WASHINGTON, Dec. 2, 2021— The U.S. Department of Agriculture will begin issuing final pandemic assistance payments to timber harvesters and timber hauling businesses through the Pandemic Assistance for Timber Harvesters and Haulers (PATHH) program starting next week. In total, $\$ 200$ million will be provided to loggers and log trucking businesses who experienced a gross revenue loss of at least $10 \%$ during the period of Jan. 1 through Dec. 1, 2020, compared to the period of Jan. 1 through

Dec. 1, 2019. This support is part of USDA's broader Pandemic Assistance for Producers initiative.
"We know loggers and truckers felt the financial burden of the pandemic," said FSA Administrator Zach Ducheneaux. "This included lack of access to wood processing mills, which caused major disruptions to the logging industry. We made initial payments as we enrolled customers in PATHH and are happy to

## Bloodhounds return everyone from 2020-2 season

FORT MADISON - Fort Madison High School's boys basketball team had a junior-dominated roster that struggled at times in a season affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.
Now, those juniors are seniors, and coach Ryan Wilson said that makes a big difference.
"They all played last year, and those guys took it on the chin a little bit," Wilson said. "They're a whole different group this year."
Every player who started a game last season returns for the Bloodhounds.
"We return everything," Wilson said, "and that's big for us."

Forward Dayton Davis, a third-team all-state selection who was one of the best rebounders in the state last season, averaged 16.3 points and 11.3 rebounds in 2020-21. Wilson said Davis played AAU basketball over the spring and summer, and it's made a difference.
"It just developed him into being a more complete basketball player," Wilson said. "He's bigger, more athletic, stronger, and he's shooting better from the outside."
Miles Dear a, the Bloodhounds' point guard, averaged 10.3 points and led the team with 80 assists last season. Wilson said offseason work has improved his game as well.
"Miles is one of those kids who in the fall was in the gym at 5:30 in the morning, getting up 300 to 500 shots," Wilson said. "He's really developed as a leader and a point guard."
Reiburn Turnbull was second on the team in 3-pointers last season, finishing third in scoring. Landes Williams started all 17 games he played in, and Tate Johnson started 19 of the 20 games he played. Phillip Goldie started 17 games. Matt Hopper was a key piece off the bench.
"Really, any of those eight players can start," Wilson said. "We may go with the same lineup every game, we may change just because of matchups. Having this deep of a team means you can do different things."
The key, Wilson said, is how the Bloodhounds defend "I'm not worried about our offense," he said. "We just have to be better with our defense, and our defensive transition."
Wilson said his roster is full of players who have had success in other sports in the last season.
"You've got guys who have been part of the track success, or baseball, or football, that we've had in the last year," he said. "Hopefully that can carry over into our season."

# Smith, Hounds open year with win over Quincy

FORT MADISON - Teague Smith gave the Bloodhounds the shot in the arm they needed to get past Quincy 51-26 in opening high school wrestling action Thursday night in the Hound Dome.
Smith brought the already-energized Bloodhound fan base to a frenzy when he turned a rough situation into a rally at 170 lbs .
With Fort Madison holding onto a 27-20 lead and senior Gavin Wiseman suffering a 9-0 major decision oss at 160, Smith went up against 14th-ranked Kayden Garrett.
Garrett would score an early takedown out of tie-up on the mat that would last through the first period. The Blue Devil would score another couple points on control to start the second period to take a 4-0 lead. After a non-ac tion breakup, Smith rushed Garrett and was able to get him up and bulled to the mat near the circle for a 2-point akedown to cut the lead to 2-4
That status would hold through the 2nd period, then Smith again would score a takedown and a near-fall to go up 7-5, but Garrett would conjure up a reversal and takedown to tie things up at seven
Smith said he thought he was up by one at that point but looked up and saw he was tied and said he had to make a move
"When I put him on his back and he reversed me I thought I was up by one so i just wanted to wrestle and be smart. But then on the break, I saw it was 7-7 and I was like I had to get the takedown now," Smith said.
"I went in and shot and thought he was going to whip me over to my back, and I fought through it and stuck him.'

The pin with 1:14 left in the final period gave Fort Madison a 33-20 lead and Smith celebrated with coaches and teammates after getting the fall.
Head Coach Ryan Smith said it was a match to see where Teague was at wrestling two weights higher than last year.
"I knew that kid was pretty tough, but we were gonna see what (Teague) was made of going up from 152, see if he was fit for 170 ," Smith said.
"It was a battle and he got in a hole and then fought through it. That was the message after the meet, that you never know what that guy's breaking point is. It could be one second left in the match. That's what I liked about that match, it was going going, going. There's time on the

clock, you keep wrestling, and that kid hit his breaking point."

He said the win was huge in the match and if it had gone the other way, it would have been a single point match going into the bigger weights.
Senior Jakob McGowan, who's returning after a year out with an injury, battled with Quincy's Bryor Newbold at 182. McGowan had a 3-1 lead in the third period, but allowed Newbold to tie things up on an escape and then suffered a takedown that turned into a fall with just five seconds left to get the Blue Devils back within seven.
Ike Thacher put things away for Fort Madison with a quick pin over Gage Bringer at 195 to give the Hounds a 39-26 lead with just two matches remaining.
Junior Daniel Sokolik got a pin over Gavin Schumacher at 3:08 after scoring a takedown and near-fall for five points in the opening period. Schumacher would get the advantage and pick up a couple points halfway through for a 5-2 Sokolik lead after one.
The senior got a take-out, gave up an escape, and then scored another takedown that led to a fall and an 45-26 lead. Quincy was a no-contest at heavyweight setting the
final score
The Blue Devils opened with a quick 12-0 lead after Tateum Schelich was pinned in 44 seconds in his first varsity match for the Hounds. The Hounds had no one at 113 pounds, but then Logan Pennock and Emmett Kruse got things cooking for Fort Madison to even things up with a couple falls at 120 and 126.
Henry Wiseman suffered a 9-0 major decision at 132 before freshman Burlington transfer Caleb Bolander, in his first varsity match, made quick work of Carson Neally after a quick takedown resolved itself with a pin for the Hounds and an 18-16 lead.

Bolander has been wrestling since preschool and wres tled at 118 last year, but is 20 pounds heavier at 138 this year
"This feels good. I was just focusing on getting the pin and getting six points for our team," the freshman said. "I was pretty focused today and just wanted to beat the guy across from me."
Chaz Fullenkamp and Aidan Pennock both scored wins with Pennock getting a 13-7 win at 152 and Fullenkamp scoring a fall at the 1:31 mark over Brayden Oenning.

# Dredging set to start at marina next week

pits, crews will finish working on the jetty wall that is being extended into the river, eventually being the foundation for a walking path that ends looking into the river.
"What we're doing here basically east of the Memorial is building a containment for the dredge material coming out of the marina," Bousselot said.
"The water and sediment are going to come in through a hydraulic pump off the dredger and then through some piping. The water will drain out back into the river.'
The sediment won't be enough to fill the pits inside the berms, so as the sediment settles out and it becomes workable, crews will take these berms back down to the level of the sediment and regrade the park.
The remaining sediment will become the base for the new Riverview Park on the east side. The residual berms will then be used to raise the road on the north side next to the railroad tracks up to the same level as the new base of the park.
Dirt from the construction of the new highways was also brought over to the park, while some clay was brought in for the future building pad of the new hospitality center at the marina.
Dan Hicks, project manager for DeLong Construction, said the dredge pit will be completed by Monday afternoon and dredging can begin.
Four large lines of white rock were run along the base of the pit and will serve as a "french drain" under the sediment to help move water out of the pits after the sediment, or "silt" is settled into the base. A crew supervisor on site said with the four french drains in place and the other drain pipes, it will take about a year for the silt to dry out.

Hicks said he wants to work with the city to cut the extra "surcharge", or dirt, used for the pad for the hospitality center down to a height of about five feet, which would be out of the 500 -year flood plain Then use that extra surcharge to raise the parking lot to the same height as the hospitality center, and possibly raise the rest of the park road that runs from the boat ramp east to the new jetty wall, if materials are sufficient.
"Currently under contract I have to raise this road up to a certain elevation to the parking lot," Hicks said.
"The thought is that in spring, or even this winter, we'll negotiate that into the contract and we'll just leave our equipment here."

He said the dredge pit will be complete by Friday night. Then they bring rock in as the new base for the jetty. Part of the new jetty wall has been constructed and a silt screen runs the rest of the way around the marina held up by yellow floats. Hicks said they will bring in enough rock to go another 600 feet out into the river toward the park.
Bousselot said the Army Corp of Engineers require that silt disturbed during the dredging not make its way back out into the river.
Hicks said material already on site will go on top of that initial rock for the jetty. Then the bigger rock or "rip-rap" will be brought in to work along the outside of the jetty wall until the dredging begins along the inside.
He said crews will continue to work as long as the weather holds up.
"We'll continue to work right up until Christmas and we may even work from Christmas to New Years if the dredge is running and I have a place to put rip rap, I'm gonna keep working - until I get froze out,' Hicks said.
"If we get the dredge guy going, that's about four weeks so by the middle of January, provided we don't get froze out, all the dredge work should be done and we'll continue to place rip-rap until we get froze out. Then as soon as the ice goes out we'll complete the rest of the rip-rap.
Bousselot said the removal of sediment on the river side of the jetty, which is part of FEMA reimbursements, has been taken care of. The other aspect is dredging the marina six feet deeper. Hicks said the bottom of the marina is at about 518 feet above sea level now, and dredging should take it down to 512 feet giving another six feet of depth in the marina. Then crews will continue to finish the jetty wall, which will include a walking path that triggered some funding from the Great River Health System - Fort Madison Community Hospital Community Foundation to assist the project.
The dredging will consist of a pumping operation where the water and silt will be pumped through 12 -fppt hard plastic piping that was part of the work of Superior Seawalls, Docks and Dredging out of Illinois City. The piping will be six 250 -foot sections that will carry sediment and river water to the dredge pits where it will settle out for a year.

The city has committed $\$ 1.5$ million to the project, and Fort Madison - Southeast Iowa Regional Riverboat Commission has committed to an equal investment. FEMA's reimbursements cover an additional $\$ 1.5$ million, and the GRHS-FMCH foundation also committed $\$ 1.5$ million to the project.
Fort Madison Mayor Matt Mohrfeld was able to secure funding through a federal grant program and \$100,000 from Freeport McMoRan. He's also applied for state block grants and funding through the county's America Rescue Plan Act's $\$ 6.5$ million pool.

## USDA launches PATHH program

now finalize payments to provide this much needed assistance."
"We are grateful for the partnerships with other USDA agencies to recognize the tremendous need and to mobilize quickly to assist loggers and log truckers adversely impacted by the pandemic," said Forest Service Chief Randy Moore. "The American Loggers Council, Intertribal Timber Council, National Association of State Foresters, and Forest Resources Association were critical to helping us better understand the impacts and tailor a program that best serves these two sectors that are critical to forest management across the country."

Eligible PATHH applicants must have derived at least 50 percent of total gross revenue from timber harvesting and/or timber hauling. Specifically, eligible activities included cutting timber, transporting timber and/or the processing of wood on-site on the forest land, such as chipping, grinding, converting to biochar or cutting to smaller lengths.

The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, authorized up to $\$ 200$ million for PATHH. FSA issued initial payments up to $\$ 2,000$ as applications were approved. Now that signup has ended and FSA has evaluated remaining funds, FSA has started to issue second payments to those applicants whose calculated payment amount was over $\$ 2,000$.
