Thunderbirds fly in Houston

Runner-up Rookie: Lee County kids 2nd best rookie unit at International event

LEE COUNTY – The Lee County Robotics team won the chance to attend the FIRST International Competition in Houston, Texas, due to winning the Rookie All-Star award at the Iowa Regionals.

Once there, the team rebuilt their robot and competed with some of the world's top high school robotics teams.

"The amount of growth I've seen with these students from Monday to the end of the competition has been phenomenal," said Robotics mentor Shalisse Johnstun.

When the team found out they qualified to attend the international competition, the students and mentors set to work fundraising, organizing the trip's logistics and upgrading their robot to compete at such a high level. Within 36 hours of being notified, the team was on the road to the International Robotics Competition.

State to merge health, human services agencies

DES MOINES - The Iowa Departments of Public Health and Human Services, soon to be the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), announced the appointment of a key leadership position today.

Jess Benson will serve as the Chief Financial Officer (CFO) overseeing budgeting and accounting for the largest state agency with an overall budget of more than \$10 billion annually.

Benson comes to HHS from the Iowa Legislative Services Agency (LSA), where he served for more than 16 years as a senior legislative analyst, specializing in health and human service budgets, budget negotiations, program analysis, publications and strategic planning for the state



score in the entire competition making the Lee County team the second-highest-ranking rookie FRC team internationally.

"While competing was fun, I enjoyed interacting with the other teams more. It was incredible to see people from all over the world and all different cultures come together for one competition," said Robotics Student Lauren Otte.

"Overall, I am so happy and fortunate our team was able to have this opportunity, and it wouldn't have been possible without the hard work from the team members, mentors, and assistance from our generous sponsors."

High school students compete on a unique playing field with robots they have designed, programmed, and built themselves. They form alliances with other teams and compete to score the most points. The Rookie Seed Award celebrates the rookie team exemplifying a young but strong partnership effort and implementing the mission of FIRST to inspire students to learn more about



science and technology.

This competition had teams from 11 states, 51 countries, and 35,000 participating students.

FIRST Robotics Competition is a program that uses competitive team robotics to expose students to STEM fields and educational paths while also serving as topflight workforce development. Students on FIRST Robotics Competition teams get hands-on experience with the skills today's manufacturers, and employers need.

The team will now turn their attention to next year as they build their program by recruiting new team members, working on community outreach, and fundraising.




