TWO ACCIDENTS: Two killed in separate accidents on opposite sides of county

LEE COUNTY – Two separate accidents claimed the lives to two people Tuesday in Lee County.

An area woman was killed as a result of a collision early Tuesday afternoon west of West Point. Then about five hours later a man was killed when his SUV struck a tractor on Green Bay Road.

According to Lee County Sheriff Stacy Weber, the woman was heading eastbound on J40 and turned into northbound traffic where a semi that was headed northbound on Hwy. 218 collided with her vehicle.

Weber said the name of the victim is being withheld pending notification of family.

Sheriff's deputies had the northbound section of the highway closed for almost four hours until just after 5 p.m. Traffic was rerouted through Pilot Grove. The accident was called into LeeComm at approximately 1:20 p.m.

Iowa State Patrol, West Point Fire & Rescue, and Lee County Sheriff's deputies responded to the scene. Iowa State Patrol is investigating the accident.

Donnellson Fire & Rescue, Lee County EMS, Air-Evac, Lee County Sheriff's Office, Iowa State Patrol, and the Donnellson Police Dept. responded to the scene. An investigation determined that a pickup truck had stopped in front of a residence on Chestnut St. and the driver, identified as Andrew Boone, 36, Donnellson, was talking with a resident. to the bench," Chief Justice Christensen said. "I love that his entire legal career has been in the community where he was born and raised. A total of more than 53,000 cases were filed in the Eighth District in 2020.

The Donnellson Police Dept. would like to acknowledge a witness to the accident, identified as Shelby Dickens, for her quick response and actions during the accident. Ms. Dickens undoubtedly prevented a tragedy from becoming worse.

A second, separate accident Tuesday has claimed the life of another motorist in Lee County.

Emergency crews were called to the scene of an accident Tuesday night at about 6:25 p.m. on Green Bay Road four miles south of 190th Street where an SUV had collided with an agriculture tractor. The vehicle ended up in the south ditch with heavy damage.

Weber said the male driver of the SUV was confirmed dead at the scene, but the name was not released pending notification of family.

Emergency crews from Wever Fire & Rescue, Denmark Fire & Rescue, West Point Fire & Rescue, Donnellson Fire & Rescue, Lee County EMS Ambulance, Lee County Sheriff's Office, and the Iowa State Patrol responded to the scene.

The accident was the second fatality on Lee County Roads Tuesday. Both accidents remain under investigation.



The solar farm will be located on land

that is part of animal science teaching and research farms managed by the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences and its Department of Animal Science. The farms are devoted to beef, sheep, swine, poultry and dairy, and also include the Ag450 Farm, the only student-managed farm at the nation's land-grant schools.

Construction could begin in late 2022 or 2023. Construction and timeline for the solar farm is contingent on survey results, permitting, regulatory changes and equipment supply.
