## NE Power to build in county

**EASEMENTS:** New project would bring new transmission lines through county

LEE COUNTY – Lee County will have to deal with utility easements for the third time in less than a year, when an electrical coop looks to add transmission lines through the county.

At Monday's Lee County Board of Supervisors' meeting, Douglas Aeilts, CEO of Northeast Power, updated county officials on a project that will emanate out of Missouri through northeast Clark County and move northeast through Lee County.

The project, entitled the Winchester-Franklin Switch Station Line 187 Project, will move along a pre-existing transmission line from Belfast Road northeast over Argyle Road continuing northeast across Ambrosia Lane at 250th Avenue.

The proposed double circuit transmission line is designed to cross Hwy. 218 northeast to 235th Street. At that point, a new single transmission line is planned heading due north across Hwy. 2 across Golden Road and then north across West Point Road just

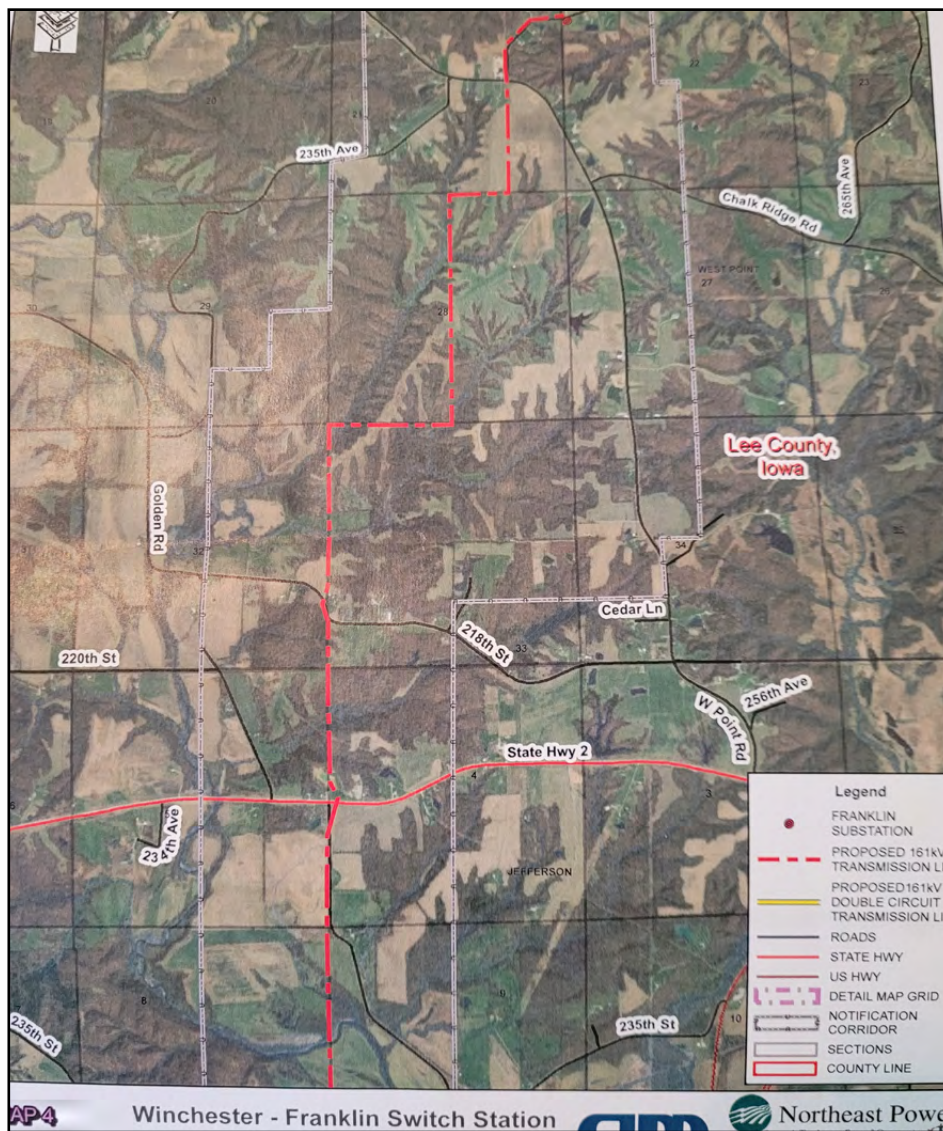
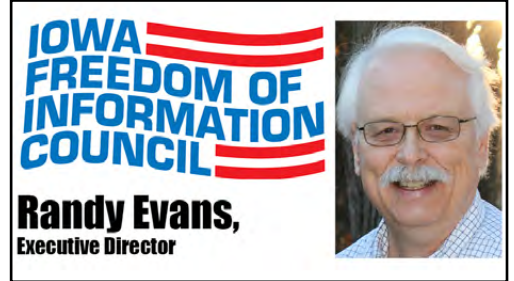

## Lessons from a pots-n-pans salesman

Many years ago, I sat at the kitchen table of a pots-n-pans salesman from Pleasant Valley. We didn't talk about cookware. He was laying out with lots of precision why the United States government had no legal basis for prosecuting him for willfully refusing to file federal income tax returns.

It was a lengthy conversation that day in the late 1970s. I will spare you many of the details. It is enough for you to know two things about his salesmanship:

First, it was his assertion that the 16th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, the one creating the income tax in 1913, was unconstitutional — in part, because the amendment was never properly ratified because Ohio was not properly admitted to the Union until 1953.

Second, neither the U.S. district judge, nor the U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals, bought his analysis — and he ended up spending a year in federal prison.

Last week, I found myself recalling the Iowa guy who was a cross between a kindly uncle and something of a crackpot. The trigger for my memories was news about two appearances in Sioux City by a lawyer from Florida with some, uhh, unconventional views of her own.

The world has changed significantly since the 1970s. Back then, while people grumbled about having to pay taxes, almost everyone did, and the Scott County salesman was a sideshow, someone who was a better cookware salesman than legal scholar.

But the appearances last week in Sioux City by attorney KrisAnne Hall of Florida come at a time when public opinion is not

## Basco man killed in grain bin accident

HANCOCK COUNTY – A 75-year-old Basco man was found dead in a grain bin in Sutter, shortly after 12:30 p.m. Wednesday.

At 12:34 p.m. Hamilton and Warsaw Fire Departments were dispatched by Hancock/Henderson County 911 for a report of a person trapped in a grain bin in the 1000 block of E. County Road 650 in Sutter.

Upon arrival at the scene emergency personnel were met by farmers and family of the victim who said Calvin Baumann, 75 was trapped in the bin.

"We were advised that he had been in the bin trying to clear a blockage in the bin's unloading auger," Warsaw Rural Fire Protection District Fire Chief Steve Siegrist wrote in a release of the incident.

Fire personnel cut relief holes in the sides of the bin and began removing grain with the help of farmers, deputies, and EMS staff. After removing a substantial amount of grain, Baumann was found and couldn't be resuscitated.

Hancock County Coroner Kendall Beals was contacted and responded the scene and pronounced Baumann dead.

"Condolences of the emergency responders to out to the family and friends of Mr. Baumann," Siegrist wrote in the release Wednesday afternoon.

### Miller-Meeks wants to honor Ukraine defenders

WASHINGTON, D.C.—Today, March 16th, 2022, Rep. Mariannette Miller-Meeks (IA-02) joined Reps. Victoria Spartz (IN-05) and Dusty Johnson (SD-00) to introduce legislation that would collectively award the distinguished Congressional Gold Medal (CGM) to the Defenders of Ukraine, in recognition of their crucial role in the defense of democratic values and against Russian President Putin's aggression.

"Over the last few weeks, the Ukrainian people have shown the world what real courage looks like. Against all odds, the Ukrainians have held their ground against Russia's illegal invasion," said Miller-Meeks. "Our legislation is the least we can do to honor them. I am proud to stand in full support of the people of Ukraine."

"Those fighting for democracy in Ukraine, and for regional security in Europe, deserve this medal," said Spartz. "Putin, his generals, and his cronies must

know the United States Congress stands firm behind all those fighting against his illegal and unprovoked war in Ukraine."

"The Ukrainian people are truly resilient," said Johnson. "Despite looking down the barrel of the Russian military, thousands of Ukrainians answered the call to defend their homeland and volunteered to protect their republic. The United States stands behind Ukraine and is opposed to Putin's act of war – our House Resolution makes that clear."

The medal would be presented to the democratically elected government of Ukraine on behalf of the Ukrainian people.

The CGM is an award bestowed by Congress and is the highest civilian award in the United States. The decoration is awarded to an individual, or group of individuals, who perform an outstanding deed or act of service for the security, prosperity, and national interest of the United States.

# Easements sought again for private utility project

north of Chalk Ridge Road.

Aielts said the Iowa section of the project is valued at about \$8 million.

Northeast Power is a generation and transmission cooperative and they own all the transmission lines that serve their electrical systems. The company has five distribution coops in Missouri and three in Iowa, including Access Energy out of Mt. Pleasant.

The move doesn't require any approval from the county, but it does have to navigate the state-mandated Iowa Utility Board requirements.

Landowner letters have already been sent out and the next step is a public hearing hosted by the Iowa Utilities Board. The IUB has already had two other public hearings in the county in the past 12 months on pipeline projects associated with a carbon capture line proposed by Heartland Greenway and an anhydrous ammonia pipeline with NuStar.

The purpose of the hearing with the IUB and Northeast Power is to inform property owners of their land rights. That meeting is scheduled for the American Legion in West Point on April 19 at 5:30 p.m. and is open to county residents.

"We can't talk to landowners about easements until we have that hearing," Aielts said. "We can actually talk to them about routes, but then it's hard not to talk about easements in the process, so we just don't do either one."

He said 99% of the easements are usually secured voluntarily and said they don't like to use eminent domain if they don't have to.

Aielts said that with all the other pipelines coming in needing easements, and some of the stories coming out of them, could make acquiring easements a bit tougher. But he said the company's reputation in dealing with property owners should make things easier, coupled with the fact that this project is above ground.

The company still has to go back to the IUB if they do have to move toward eminent domain to secure workspace.

"If we need to do that it's usually the last one or two easements of some landowner that we just can't negotiate with. Then we have to go back to the Utility Board and ask for that permission. We don't have that permission by statute."

Aielts said it takes about a year to get the easements and to get the franchise from the state of Iowa. He said the utility offers 75% of the value of the property to be interrupted to landowners.

All Northeast Power's energy generation comes from Missouri, Arkansas, Oklahoma, and Kansas. There is no generation in Iowa. The transmission lines move the energy into Iowa. The lines are needed to provide enough capacity to serve the company's generation loads in Iowa.

"We need to build another line for the future to make sure we have enough capacity to serve everything we're responsible to serve in Iowa," he said.

The lines would be capable of transmitting 161K volts, but Aielts said normal usage would be about 60k volts once operational.

# Woodbury County sheriff questioned on speaker choice

as polite as it was when I had coffee with the tax-protesting pan man.

Today, opinion polls show that most supporters of former president Donald Trump believe vote-counting conspiracies stole a second term from him — even though there never has been enough evidence to sway any state or federal court. A worrisome segment of the population hails as law-abiding patriots the people who stormed the U.S. Capitol on Jan. 6, 2021, threatening to hang the vice president and speaker of the House of Representatives.

That is why the decision by Woodbury County Sheriff Chad Sheehan to invite Hall to address a training event for his deputies and give a separate community presentation for other interested people is problematic, at best.

Educating law officers and the public about the rights accorded to people by the Constitution is a worthwhile undertaking by Sheriff Sheehan. But there are many lawyers who could make such a presentation — including Woodbury County Attorney Patrick Jennings or Mark Kende, director of Drake University's Constitutional Law Center.

But neither Jennings nor Kende would deliver a message like Hall has given at events around the nation. That is why Sheehan's judgment is being questioned by some of his constituents.

In one video Hall has online, she questions the authority of federal law enforcement officers to go outside the District of Columbia to investigate suspected participants in the Capitol riot.

"We are educating the sheriffs, and the sheriffs are starting to resist," she says in the video. "They are starting to realize there is no jurisdiction for the federal government in their counties, and the sheriffs have the authority to tell the federal government,

'No.'"

She goes on to make some hair-raising claims about the U.S. Capitol Police — those officers you saw during the Jan. 6 riot when they tried to protect the Capitol and the members of Congress inside.

She says in one of her videos, "They will be blind enforcers, like the S.S., just carrying out the bidding of the next tyrant that's in office."

A quick history lesson: The S.S. was Adolf Hitler's security force in Nazi Germany during World War II. Hall's videos criticize government decisions to close some businesses during the Covid pandemic. She says sheriffs could assert their authority and refuse to allow such closings.

In other videos, she says the United States is "full-on Marxist" for trying to force people to get Covid vaccinations.

Sheriff Sheehan said he learned about Hall when she spoke last year during the annual convention of the Iowa State Sheriffs and Deputies Association, the official member organization of the 99 county sheriffs.

He was contacted by another sheriff about holding the events in Sioux City. That sheriff, whom he has not identified, is working with a small group from eastern Iowa called We the People for Constitutional Sheriffs.

"I am in no way a person that's above the law," Sheehan told the county supervisors.

But at a time when it seems like people cannot disagree without going for each other's throats, do we need the sheriff of one of Iowa's largest counties lending his name and the credibility of his office to someone whose legal analyses rival those of a pots-n-pan salesman?
