ALL IN THE FAMILY: 2000 grad joins brother in FM district; follows in dad's footsteps

FORT MADISON - Fort Madison has found a new Activities Director, the third one in less than two years.

But this one just might stick around.

2000 FMHS graduate Jeff Lamb was officially hired as the Fort Madison Community School District AD starting June 20. The move was approved by the Board of Directors at Monday's regular school board meeting.

Lamb is the son of Timm and Kate Lamb, and the brother of current Fort Madison Middle School Principal Patrick Lamb.



Timm is a past Activities Director and track coach at Fort Madison High School, providing Jeff with a built-in mentor and resource for his new position.

Retired Lee County IT director dies in area accident

IOWA NEWS Million dollar lottery ticket sold in WB

Someone purchased the ticket at MK Mini Mart

CLIVE, Iowa - Someone who bought a Mega Millions ticket at a West Burlington convenience store won a \$1 million prize in Friday's drawing. That win came during a very busy week for Mega Millions news: There also were back-to-back jackpot winners in the game's Tuesday and Friday drawings.

The \$1 million-winning ticket was purchased at MK Mini Mart, 101 E. Mount Pleasant St. in West Burlington. That ticket came within one number of having a share of Friday's \$20 million jackpot, matching the first five numbers but missing the Mega Ball. A ticket sold in Tennessee matched all six numbers in Friday's drawing to win that night's \$20 million jackpot.

Friday's big win followed a \$20 million jackpot winner in Minnesota in Tuesday's Mega Millions drawing.

Friday's winning numbers were: 4-17-20-46-64 and Mega Ball 23. The Megaplier was 4. With Friday's jackpot being won in Tennessee, the game's big prize remains at an estimated \$20 million annuity, \$11.9 million lump-sum option, for the next Mega Millions drawing on Tuesday.

The West Burlington prize is the second of at least \$1 million won this year in Iowa. In January, a New Hampton couple won a \$2 million Powerball' prize.

MK Mini Mart will receive a \$1,000 bonus from the Iowa Lottery for selling the \$1 million-winning Mega Millions ticket.

The \$1 million prize must be claimed at Iowa Lottery headquarters in Clive. Lottery offices are open Monday through Friday and prize claims are available by appointment. Winners can call the lottery at 515-725-7900 to make an appointment. Powerball and Mega Millions are both lotto games with jackpot prizes that have climbed to more than \$1 billion. But while Powerball's drawings are on Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays, the Mega Millions drawings are on Tuesdays and Fridays.

LEE COUNTY - The Lee County Sheriff's Office responded to a single vehicle accident near Highway 2 and West Point Road Friday at 5:11 p.m. Upon arrival, deputies observed a GMC Arcadia stuck in a fence in a field northwest of the intersection with an unresponsive female driver behind the wheel.

Bloodhounds take early lead in Southeast Conference

FORT MADISON – Following Thursday's 10-0 shutout of Keokuk, Fort Madison Head Coach Kevin Wellman said Monday's game with 15th-ranked Burlington wasn't going to be easy.

Whether it was the cold, windy climate, a home field advantage, or the Hounds just playing really good soccer right now, something made Monday's 10-0 shutout of the Grayhounds seem easy.

"I just have to chalk it up to every one of my players played a great game today. Each player played well individually and the combination of all of them together – they just had really good chemistry. We're just playing really well right now," Wellman said following the shutout.

"Burlington's a better team than they showed today and I'm going to tell my guys when we go to Bracewell, they'll be a better team than today. So we'll hopefully be ready for them the next time." The two squads played a

fairly even match through the first 10 minutes with Fort Madison controlling the field position battle. With the defense pulled up, midfielder Austin Miller sent a ball over to junior forward Xander Wellman who raced down the center and faked out BHS keeper Adrian Salas to the left and buried one in the right side of the net to break open the scoring.

Mitchell Pothitakis, who had four goals on the night, scored just 2:40 later unassisted and then Wellman, who also had four goals in the win, swiped the reset pass and raced in for a 3-0 lead just 11 seconds later.

He would complete the hat-trick less than three minutes later with another goal to make it 4-0, and Fort Madison began to feel the pressure of the matchup between the two Southeast Conference front runners begin to ease.

Burlington came into the match at 4-0 and ranked 15th in Class 3A. Fort Madison just climbed into the rankings at 4-3 in Class 2A at No. 13. The Hounds lost to 10th-ranked Burlington Notre Dame to open the year without Wellman and starting goalie Rieburn Turnbull, who had to sit that game after getting a red card.

Fort Madison then lost to Class 3A No. 2 Iowa City Liberty 7-0 at the Hounds Invitational last Saturday. They also fell to Class 3A No. 10 Davenport North 2-1 in a sudden-death penalty kick session. They won 3-0 over Clear Creek-Amana in the tourney.

The biggest loss may have come when junior Jacob Pothitakis went down with season-ending injuries to his leg on a penalty kick.

Xander Wellman, who has seven goals in the last two games, said it's a different feel without the second Pothitakis on the field.

"We have to give a lot more. When you take a really helpful player like Jacob out, you have to work to get that position back. Losing him really hurt," Wellman said.

"We kept the same offense from last year so we have that chemistry. Mitchell and

I still have that same connection. But it's harder to find the paths because Jacob isn't there."

At the 20:28 mark Wellman would find freshman Leif Boeding near the goal for a 5-0 lead and then Boeding would pay it forward with an assist to freshman Henry Graham with 17 minutes remaining in the first half and the route was on.

Mitchell Pothitakis would

score with 2:43 left on assists from Miller and Phillip Goldie who had pushed all the way up from his defender spot. Pothitakis would get his 3rd goal with 18 seconds left in the half off a free kick at the half circle that he blazed past a 3-man fence and into the right side of the net for an 8-0 halftime lead.

Pothitakis would score five minutes into the 2nd half off assists from Miller, his third of the night, and Phillip Goldie. Wellman would finish things off with a nice steal and forward from Oliver Santiago that was then pushed by Boeding over to Wellman racing up the left side and through the middle to set the 10goal mercy rule. Kevin Wellman said

Xander, who sat out the Hounds' first six games after getting his second red card
