FMCSD considers bonuses

STAFF: Board may try to pick up where Governor left off

BY CHUCK VANDENBERG

FORT MADISON – Fort Madison teacher representatives took a cue from Central Lee and requested bonuses from the district on top of state bonuses coming soon.

Last month, Central Lee paid staff a bonus on top of the money allocated under a program from Gov. Kim Reynolds using a portion of the state's federal pandemic stimulus.

At Monday's regular meeting of the Fort Madison Community School District Board of Directors, several teachers advocated for similar bonuses for Fort Madison staff.



Cory Byrne, the president of the Fort Madison Education Association, said the extra money from the district's Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief funding, is essential to retaining quality teachers in the

"I know you might think we don't teach for the money, but it's important to staff," he said.

"We've been advocating for this for two years. The ESSER funds have been around for quite a while now."

Lee County gets \$50K in federal food, shelter funds

LEE COUNTY - Lee County has been awarded federal funds made available through the Department of Homeland Security (DHS)/Federal Emergency Management Agency under the Emergency Food and Shelter National Board Program.

The county has been chosen to receive a total of \$50,992 under Phase 39 (\$12,465) and ARPAR Fund (\$38,527) to supplement emergency food and shelter programs in the county.

The selection was made by a National Board that is chaired by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency



United Way of the **Great River Region**

Management Agency and consists of representatives from American Red Cross, Catholic Charities, USA, National Council of the Churches of Christ in the USA, The Jewish Federations of North America, The Salvation Army, and, United Way Worldwide.

The Local Board is charged with

distributing funds appropriated by Congress to help expand the capacity of food and shelter programs in high-need areas around the country.

United Way of the Great River Region and Community Development Department, City of Keokuk will convene the local board.

The Local Board will determine how the funds awarded to Lee County are to be distributed among the emergency food and shelter programs run by local service agencies in the area. The Local Board is responsible for recommending

County audit shows some glitches

PERKS: County gets marks for allowing ambulance company to comp rooms

FORT MADISON - A state audit of Lee County books came out relatively clean aside from dings on employees perks that were accepted on an EMS visit, and segregation of duties around cash handling.

At Monday's Board of Supervisors meeting, Budget Director Cindy Renstrom said

the audit came back with some regular segregation issues where the state would like to see more distinct compliance on cash handling within county departments.

The audit also pointed to a visit Lee County Ambulance staff took to an ambulance

manufacturing facility to select ambulances for the county.

According to Renstrom, the manufacturer paid for hotel rooms and meals for four people who went down to visit the facility.

Renstrom said the county personnel policy spells out that employees can't accept those types of gifts.

"We completely missed that, which is a nono," Renstrom said.

"We need to do some kind of training that we can't accept anything from any vendors. We told the state auditors we would implement some training on that."

Renstrom said the auditors spoke with the Lee County Attorney's office about resolving the issue going forward, but no reimbursement was ordered.

The segregation of duties remarks have been common in past audits and several department heads, including Lee County Engineer Ben Hull, said it's a staffing issue.

Renstrom said the county should start to look at options to get the issues resolved because the marks on the audit caused one of



agencies to receive these funds and any additional funds made available under this phase of the program. Under the terms of the grant from the National Board, local agencies chosen to receive funds must: 1) be private voluntary nonprofits or units of government, 2) be eligible to receive Federal funds, 3) have an accounting system, 4) practice nondiscrimination, 5) have demonstrated the capability to deliver emergency food and/ or shelter programs, and 6) if they are a private voluntary organization, have a voluntary board. Qualifying agencies are urged to apply.

Lee County has distributed Emergency Food and Shelter funds previously to local food pantries, Community Action Agencies, and emergency shelter programs.

Public or private voluntary agencies interested in applying for Emergency Food and Shelter Program funds must contact Sue Prochazka at United Way of the Great River Region at vc@unitedwaygrr.org for an application.

Agencies currently funded will receive an email regarding continuation; new applicants should send an email to request the one-page application. Deadline to submit application is March 28, 2022.





Board to discuss bonuses in April

He said the union has been asking for bonuses going back to labor/management talks last year. The district put in a formal request last May and the union was told the board wouldn't be going forward with any bonuses.

The union brought the bonuses back up in February with four different proposals. One was a stipend for all employees.

On Monday the board had a discussion on a board-generated retention bonus for staff who stay on with the district for next year, but tabled the discussion until the district had specific numbers on what is remaining in the district's ESSER fund.

Teacher Dawn Johnson asked that the district also consider paying the staff that was left out of the Governor's program with the district's American Rescue Plan Act funding.

"It's a teacher's market and I would say a retention bonus needs to happen fast. It's overdue. We're in March and there are lots of positions open. I want to keep my colleagues here. I want to keep these awesome teachers here for our kids," Byrne said.

Governor Kim Reynolds' program pays the bonus to full-time teachers hired prior to Oct. 1, 2021 and finishing out the 2021-22 school year. TLS teachers, guidance counselors, social workers, nurses, and librarians were left out of the state bonus program.

Teachers would get the state bonus on the March 31 payroll paid for by the district and then reimbursed by the state for all eligible teachers. The district also pays the FICA taxes on the bonus and then would be

reimbursed separately. Teachers that are planning on retiring at the end of the year do qualify for that state bonus

Rachella Dravis, a district teacher and National Education Association Director, said 40 school districts in the state have already paid a bonus to staff, in addition to Reynolds' program.

Superintendent Dr. Erin Slater said the district is over budget on HVAC improvements at the high school to bring air conditioning to the entire building. The project was funded with ESSER funds and Slater said the district needed to retool the fund to see how much was left in it.

Slater said she didn't want to get ahead of what the board was thinking so she didn't bring in any payment estimate, but just have the conversation around the retention bonus.

"This would be for those who worked for us last year and will be staying to work for us next year," Slater said.

Board member Brad Menke asked if the bonus would be paid across the board to all staff. Board President Dianne Hope said she would like to see every full-time employee in the district be included in the program and it be equal to the governor's \$1,000 bonus.

Board member Mio Santiago said the discussion should also include trying to fund those that were left out of Reynolds' program, as well as the additional retention bonus.

Hope said she would like to see the payment before the start of the school year, but board member Paul Wilkerson said employees could take the bonus and then not come back at the start of the year. He said he would like to see a fall payment.

District Finance Director Sandy Elmore wasn't in attendance at the meeting and couldn't provide detailed information on the fund so the issue was tabled until the April meeting.



State wants more verification on cash

the county's insurance policies to see an increased deductible from \$2,000 to \$20,000.

"We seriously need to look at that and see if there's a way to try to take care of those issues. It could be as much as sitting down with the state auditor when they are here and go over what we can do to alleviate those dings we get," she

Supervisor Chairman Matt Pflug said one suggestion in the audit was for the sheriff's department to hire an additional full-time person to handle cash received at the department.

"Not happening," Weber said. "This is videotaped and we're in the office and we've never had an issue with anyone being dishonest."

Lee County Auditor Denise Fraise said she thinks the county department heads all do a decent job, and there have been efforts to rotate people in to other departments to open mail to try to satisfy the audit comments in the past.

"I can see where they're at," Fraise said. "They just don't want any potential for fraud. That's why they're dinging us on those."

She said the county also needs to take closer looks at questionable expenditures.

"Before you make a purchase, you have to consider if the whole county is going to benefit from it. That's the definition of a public purpose," she said.

Pflug said the county is in good shape with the state and always has good audits.

"I think overall we always have a good audit and we're always in good graces with the state auditors," he said. "The important thing is as elected officials, we talk about fiduciary transparency and I think we do a decent job in that area."

But he said it might be beneficial to address some of the recurring issues now rather than wait for the next visit from auditors

In other action, supervisors:

- voted 3-1 to approve the 2023 fiscal year budget. Ron Fedler opposed the budget and has since the county approved pay increases for county staff.
- voted 4-0, to approve the hiring of Justin Stonerook, a former Des Moines County Assistant Attorney and Burlington lawyer, as an Assistant Lee County Attorney to replace Jonathan Stensvaag, who was recently appointed to a judicial seat in District 8B.


