SIWRA works to try and save baby fox

Lorrilee McCall-Miller heard something outside their door as she was getting ready for bed. It sounded like a baby crying. She opened the door and looked. There was a baby fox, a kit, looking up at her and whimpering. "What do we have here?" Lorrilee asked. She knew enough to not try and pick it up. "Where's your mamma?"

The little kit just looked at her and shivered.

Lorrilee didn't want to, but she shut the door. Hopefully the kit's mother would come in the night for her baby.

In the morning, Lorrilee checked again. The kit was still there, like a lost kitten. She summoned her husband, Tim Miller. Their two dogs were quite curious as to what was going on outside, but Lorrilee and Tim kept the dogs at bay.

Something needed to be done. The Millers called the Southeast Iowa Wildlife Rescue Alliance (SIWRA).

A friendly female voice, Robin, told her that someone would be out later in the morning to deal with the lost kit.

Lorrilee McCall-Miller is the art director and, with her husband, Tim, owner of the Mt. Pleasant Main Street Art Center. Living on a farm in rural Mt. Union, and being animal lovers, they are quite familiar with wildlife sightings such as deer, turkey, pheasants, rabbits, coyotes, hawks, eagles, etc. Baby foxes

Later in the day, SIWRA let Lorrilee know that the kit was safe and sound and, on their way to the Miller farm, SIWRA had seen what was probably the kit's sibling dead in the road. The mother may have been hit too, so the kit was probably an orphan. SIWRA would care for it. Lorrilee and Tim were thankful and made a decision to donate to SIWRA.

Xrays revealed that the kit had also been hit by a vehicle. He was sleeping almost constantly and showing no interest in food or water. Veterinarian, Dr. Jana, reported there were contusions on its lungs and the excessive sleepiness indicated a possible concussion.

Lorrilee is an avid Facebook user, and this kit rescue was

May is national Motorcycle Safety Awareness month

LEE COUNTY – The U.S. Department of Transportation's National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) is partnering with Lee County Sheriff's Office to remind all motorists that May is Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month. As May approaches with warmer temperatures throughout the country, the unofficial start of the summer road travel season begins. Safe riding and driving practices, and cooperation from all road users, will help reduce the number of fatalities and injuries on our nation's highways.

NHTSA reports that in 2020, there were 5,579 motorcyclists killed in traffic crashes, an increase from 2019 (5,044). In contrast, an estimated 82,528 motorcyclists were injured,

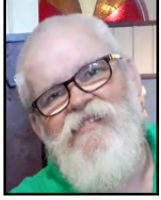

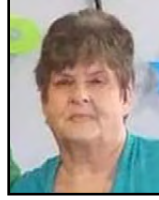

Fort Madison girls get above .500 with win over MP

FORT MADISON – Junior Molly Knipe held off Mt. Pleasant's Savanna Walls Monday night as the Lady Hound moved over .500 on the year in girls high school tennis.

Knipe won 8-5 for her fourth match win of the year at No. 1 singles.

Brianna Wright played at No. 2 singles for the first time and lost 8-4 to the Chief's Melanie Olivas. Kayla Kruse won 8-6 over Keokuk's Malena Yocum. Elizabeth Stuekerjuergen lost at No. 4 singles to Eliana Situmeang 6-8.

Fort Madison then got wins on the Nos. 5 and 6 courts with Lauren Otte downing Victoria Smith 8-5 and Naudia Ruston winning at No. 6 singles 8-2.

Knipe and Wright fell in doubles action to Walls and Olivas 2-8, but Kruse and Stuekerjuergen got a win at No. 2 doubles 8-5, and Ruston and Otte won at No. 3 doubles over Smith and Mary Peterson 8-0.

Fort Madison lost to Davis County to start the year, but then won three straight before taking 5th place at the Fort Madison Invitational last weekend.

Knipe is 4-3 on the year in matches and sets with a 38-40 game record. Kruse is 0-1 at No. 2 singles with a 3-8 game record, but is 3-3 in the No. 3 slot with a 31-42 game record through Monday.

Otte is 2-0 at No. 4 and 0-1 playing up at No. 3 with a 20-40 game record. Stuekerjuergen is 1-3 with an 18-32 game record at No. 5 and Ruston is 2-2 at No. 5 singles with a 22-24 game mark. She's 1-1 at No. 6 with a winning 11-10 game record on the year.

ORDINANCE NO 190 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF DONNELSON, IOWA, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO COLLECTION FEE OF SOLID WASTE.

Be it Enacted by the City Council of the City of Donnellson, Iowa:

SECTION 1. SECTION MODIFIED. Section 106.08 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Donnellson, Iowa, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

106.08 COLLECTION FEES. The collection and

disposal of solid waste as provided by this chapter are declared to be beneficial to the property served or eligible to be served and there shall be levied and collected fees for the same, in accordance with the following:

(Goreham vs Des Moines, 1970, 179 NW 2nd, 449)

1. Fee for Collection. The fee for solid waste collection and disposal service, used or available, is \$17.00 per month, plus a \$2.00 charge for recycling. Customers are allowed two garbage units per week. A garbage unit may be either a plastic bag or commercial manufactured garbage can with a lid. Tags for additional units can be purchased at City Hall.

2. Payment of Bills. All fees are due and payable

under the same terms and conditions provided for payment of a combined service account as contained in Section 92.04 of this Code of Ordinances. Solid waste collection service may be discontinued in accordance with the provisions contained in Section 92.05 if the combined service account becomes delinquent, and the provisions contained in Section 92.08 relating to lien notices shall also apply in the event of a delinquent account.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged

invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 3. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall take effect July 1st 2022 and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Sadly, the kit did not make it. Lorrilee posted SIWRA's condolences on Facebook. "Not the outcome we were hoping for, but the sweet lil kit gained his wings early this morning. This is just one example of how difficult rehabbing can be. Despite his overall appearance and lack of visible injuries, X-rays showed that he had suffered some type of blunt force. Everyone involved gave 110%. Robin is heart broken. We never feel good when an animal doesn't make it. His life was short, but he wasn't shivering in a ditch all alone. Thank you Lorrilee, Robin and Dr. Jana for going the extra mile for this baby."

County plans rider education, training

a 2% increase from 83,814 motorcyclists injured in 2019. Motorcyclist deaths accounted for 14% of the total highway fatalities that year.

Research also shows that motorcyclists are significantly overrepresented in traffic crashes and fatalities each year. In fact, in 2020, per vehicle mile traveled, motorcyclists were about 28 times more likely than passenger vehicle occupants to die in a motor vehicle crash and were 4 times more likely to be injured.

One of the primary contributing factors to motorcyclist fatalities is speeding. According to NHTSA, 34% of all motorcycle riders involved in fatal crashes in 2020 were speeding, compared to 22% for passenger car drivers, 16% for light-truck drivers, and 7% for large-truck drivers. Motorcycle riders 25 to 29 years old involved in fatal crashes had the highest speeding involvement at 45%.

Alcohol impairment also plays a significant role in motorcycle-involved crash fatalities. In 2020, motorcycle riders involved (killed or survived) in fatal crashes had higher percentages of alcohol impairment than any other type of motor vehicle driver (27% for motorcycle riders, 23% for passenger car drivers, 19% for light-truck drivers, and 3% for drivers of large trucks). The highest percentages of alcohol-impaired motorcycle rider fatalities in 2020 were in the 45-to-49 age group (35%) followed by the 35-to-39 age group (33%), 50-to-54 age group (32%), and 30-to-34 age group (31%), when compared to other age groups. Forty-one percent of the 2,158 motorcycle riders who died in single-vehicle crashes in 2020 were alcohol-impaired. Forty-five percent of those killed in single-vehicle crashes on weekends were alcohol-impaired. Forty-one percent of the 2,158 motorcycle riders who died in

single-vehicle crashes in 2020 were alcohol-impaired, compared to 42% of the 2,007 motorcycle riders who died in single-vehicle crashes in 2011. Motorcycle riders killed in traffic crashes at night were almost three times more frequently found to be alcohol-impaired than those killed during the day (40% and 14%, respectively).

Safe driving and riding practices from all road users will help reduce the number of fatalities and injuries on our nation's highways. Keep the following tips in mind:

- Observe all traffic laws.
- Obey the speed limit.
- Drive and ride defensively.
- Yield to motorcyclists, especially while turning at intersections.

Avoid distractions that place motorcyclists and other road users at risk.

Wear high-visibility personal protective gear and DOT-compliant motorcycle helmets. NHTSA data estimates that helmets saved 1,872 motorcyclists' lives in 2017, and that 749 more lives could have been saved if all motorcyclists had worn their helmets. Learn how to identify a safe, DOT-compliant helmet at www.nhtsa.gov/motorcycle-safety/choose-right-motorcycle-helmet.

Additionally, the completion of a rider education and training course can ensure a safer riding experience. As May nears, we should all commit to safe driving and riding, and to our role in ensuring a safe motorcycle-riding environment. 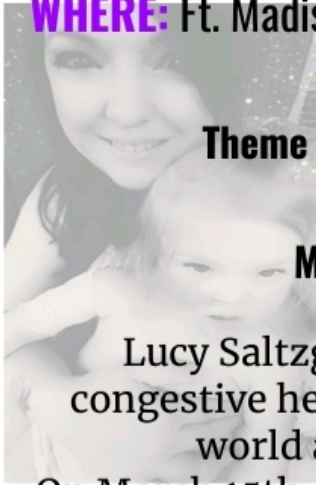

All proceeds will be used to help bring Lucy home to her final resting place close to family, friends, and loved ones.

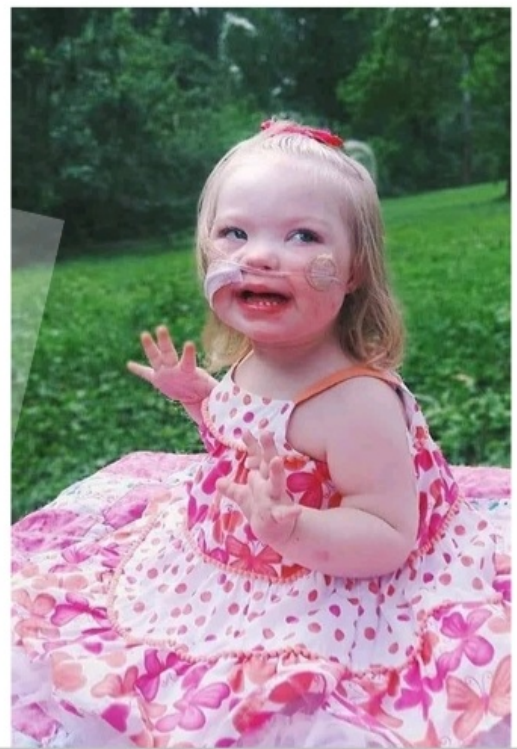
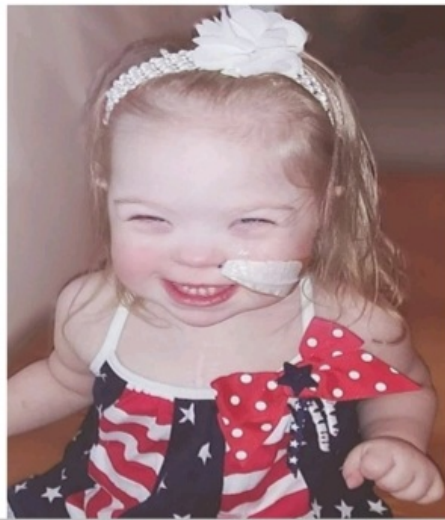
