Airport has \$1M in plans

5-year plan: Pavement repairs and updated weather system in the works

FORT MADISON – A 5-year capital improvement plan totaling \$940,000 was submitted for federal grants Tuesday night.

As part of a brief pre-holiday Fort Madison City Council meeting Tuesday night, the council voted unanimously to authorize a fiscal year 2023 capital improvement program and related documents for a possible 5-year Federal Aviation Administration grant allocation.

As part of the submission, the city had to show the airport had 10% in matching funds which, according to a report filed Tuesday, totaled \$94,000.

The local match would include a \$34,800 payment in the next fiscal year and a \$59,200 payment in fiscal year 2026.

The 2023 project would include replacing an outdated Automated Weather Observing System at the airport to include all new electrical and communications cabling in conduit, and a granular buffer around the system area in conjunction with the Iowa Department of Transportation. The cost of the project is \$348,000 with the FAA tentatively picking up \$313,200 of the project.

The current AWOS area is east of the north end of the runway.

An update of the airport's Automated Weather Observing System is also on the City Airport Commission's 5-year plan. That project and a runway rehabilitation total about \$940,000 with 90% potential federal grants to help pay for

CEDAR RAPIDS – Two Alliant Energy line workers received the Governor's Lifesaving Award for their courage and bravery after helping to save the lives of four Iowans during two separate incidents – a house fire and a home explosion.

Iowa Governor Kim Reynolds presented the awards to Customer Service Mechanic Danny Gutschenritter and Service Responder Alex Schwenke during a ceremony on December 16 at the Iowa State Capitol in Des Moines.

"We are very proud of Danny and Alex. Their ability to remain calm and composed in the face of danger helped save the lives of four people," said Tracy McCampbell, director of operations at Alliant Energy. "Danny and Alex exemplify our company's commitment to safety as well as our purpose to serve customers and build stronger communities."

On May 26, 2019, Schwenke was dispatched to a home in Rose Hill, Iowa after a smart meter indicated a power outage. When he arrived at the address, Schwenke found a large pile of debris. It appeared the home had exploded and collapsed. After calling 911, he turned off the utilities to the area. The couple trapped inside the house saw his flashlight and started calling for help. Schwenke and firefighters then worked to rescue them.

"I thought I was going to a power outage, but I ended up being a first responder," Schwenke said. "It felt great to help them out." The second incident took place months later in Creston, Iowa. On October 11, 2019, Gutschenritter arrived home from work to find a neighbor's house was on fire and his neighbor was yelling for help through a window. Gutschenritter ran

"I just got lucky," Gutschenritter said. "God put me in the right place at the right time."

Council approves ward redistricting

it.

A 2026 project would be to rehabilitate the airfield pavement at a cost of about \$592,000 and would include cleaning and sealing of cracks and joints on the runway, taxiways, turnarounds, and aprons at Fort Madison Airport.

Additional projects beyond the 5-year plan include a four unit tee-hangar at a cost of \$732,000, a wildlife hazard and environmental assessment for exclusion fencing and its construction, at a cost of close to \$2 million.

Those two projects are tentatively planned for 2030 for the hangar, and 2034-36 for the wildlife study and fence construction.

"The airport is just doing an amazing job. They really are. They've got the Is dotted and Ts crossed to get the grants and for a small town they are doing just a great job," said councilman Tom Schulz.

City Manager David Varley said the report is a federal requirement for capital improvements at the airport and shows that the airport does have the funds for matching dollars.

"They want to make sure that these that are being done and we have the match, which the airport does," he said.

"They have a lot of different rules and regulations they have to follow and we have to file these reports."

In an unrelated issue, the city council unanimously approved change orders on the marina project for sediment approval and jetty work. The change orders changed the quantity of sediment removal with a reduction of \$22,527, but adding additional material to the jetty wall. Adding to the jetty wall will add \$31,559 for a net increase of about \$9,000.

In other action, the council:

•approved, 6-0, a change order increasing Phase 3 of the PORT Trail project about \$26,200 in final field adjustments bringing the new total contract amount for the work from 48th Street to Southeast Iowa Regional Medical Center – Fort Madison campus, to \$363,393.

•waived the second reading and approved on third reading, by a 7-0 vote, to amend city voting wards per 2020 census data.

White Chocolate Peppermint Popcorn Bark

5 cups popped popcorn

12 ounces white chocolate baking chips, chopped white chocolate or white candy coating

1 cup crushed hard candy peppermints
