## **LESSONS OF 2020:** Speakers point to unique nature of the Class of 2020

FORT MADISON - Holy Trinity Catholic High School Principal Michael Sheering, chuckled just a bit when he presented the Class of 2020 on Sunday at the high school. It was August after all.

It's safe to say it's the latest graduation ceremony ever held at HTC, but 26 seniors were conferred as graduates in a well-spaced and masked up gymnasium - more evidence of a year wracked by a pandemic.

HTC retired math instructor Brad Kurtz gave the graduation address. Kurtz was a 30-year teacher at Holy Trinity and received a plaque as part of the Governor's Scholar Recognition Program based on a nomination from Samantha Pothitakis, who was a 2020 Governor's Scholar.

"Look forward to the future with confidence and be lifelong learners," Kurtz said. "You're never too old to learn - even at my edge."

Kurtz told the seniors although they went through something unprecedented in losing part of the school year to the coronavirus, lessons were learned that will help define who they are. But realization of those lessons is critical in learning from them.

"Be independent thinkers. Don't let others do your thinking. Analyze from various sources of information

Dog park, grooming, boarding, training, world class Yorkies, pigeons for dog training, wildlife habitat and prairie restoration are all part of the Chaney operation. Have I forgotten anything? Oh, yes. Muffin and Hal Chaney are nice

Muffin's real name is Michelle, but she's British and has gone by Muffin all her life. Cheerio! She was from Creston and, 20 years ago, brought a friend to Mt. Pleasant to look at Hal's bird dogs. Her friend wanted to buy one for her husband. Like a fine tuned English Setter, Hal's eyes locked on Muffin. Muffin never left. Her friend did buy a spaniel pup. The only thing that would have been better, according to Hal, is if the friend had bought two spaniel pups.

Muffin was a dog groomer and Hal a hunting dog trainer. Hal suggested that they open a grooming business, which would be a first in Mt. Pleasant. The grooming business was a success as was Hal's bird dog training. This was in the heyday of upland bird hunting. A mile north of Mt. Pleasant there were pheasants galore, and a mile south it was quail. Magic filled the air and plenty of hunters wanted their bird dogs trained. Hal was one of the best.

But the quail and pheasant population dwindled, as did the need for trained bird dogs. When 80 acres on the Skunk River bottom became available, the Chaneys snapped it up. # Land restores space for wide array of creatures

ing, maintenance, and grounds keeping. His bird dog training has been replaced by domestic dog training. Wouldn't it be nice if your dog actually came when you called?

72 of the 80 acres was part tillable and part CRP ground. Hal has turned all 72 acres into wildlife habitat, mostly for quail and pheasants, but also all native wildlife. This habitat mirrors what was once natural prairie. He drilled in ox-eye, purple and yellow cone flowers (which make tons of seeds for wild birds), and a lot of additional forbs-more than 30 different kinds of native prairie plants, grasses and flowers. It's a veritable smorgasbord or buffet for quail and pheasants. In the morning, Muffin and Hal sit on their deck and listen to Bobwhite quail whistling, pheasants crowing and turkeys gobbling. At night the restored prairie sparkles with lightning bugs. Swallows and bats crisscross the restored prairie for insects. Deer meander up to Chaney's house and look in the windows. Finches and bluebirds are a common sight.

The pigeon coop was designed by Hal, and produces a steep 45 degree flush off the floor as the pigeons fly up to perch in the roof of the coop. In this manner, the pigeons, which are used for bird dog training, are being taught to fly in an upward trajectory rather than low to the ground. The pigeons are also trained to return to the coop.

The dog park, part of "Chaney's Canine Country Club," is the brainchild of Muffin and Hal. It is in a timbered, shady area and is the only dog park in Mt. Pleasant. There are three penned-in exercise areas for small, medium and large dogs, ensuring the safety of dogs as well as people. All dogs must be approved by the Chaney's before being allowed in the dog park, and there are posted rules and regulations. The dog park is a new idea in this area and hopefully will be

a builder. (I took Buddy there and he loves it!)



Whaley hit .422 on the year with seven home runs, tops in the Southeast Conference, and 20 RBI both led the Bloodhounds. Johnson hit .371 with four home runs and 12 RBI.

Junior Kylee Cashman and freshman Neeley Rehm were named to the second team and seniors Dalyn Wondra and Ivy Geerdes made honorable mention. Rehm went 5-7 in the circle striking out 50 with a 3.17 ERA. Cashman playing predominantly at short had an 88% fielding accuracy, while hitting .357 with a couple triples.

On the boys side, Jason Thurman made 1st Team in the Southeast Conference as an infielder for the 11-7 Bloodhounds. Thurman was also a 1st Team All-District pick.

The junior hit .420 to lead Fort Madison and only committed three errors on the year for a .955% fielding. Thurman was clean on the mound going 1-0 with three saves, just one walk and no hit batters on the season.

Sophomore Reiburn Turnbull and senior Brandon Reichelt were named to the second team along with freshman Kane Williams and sophomore Landes Williams, sophomore Matt Hopper and junior Vasin Thurman.

Sophomore Tate Johson and senior Jace Burgher were both named honorable mention.
