COVID-19: LCHD reports nine new positive cases in three days

County hits new high

LEE COUNTY – Over the weekend, the Iowa Department of Public Health (IDPH) and Lee County Health Department identified six additional cases, and Monday identified three additional cases of COVID-19 in the county; one child, three adults, three middle-age adults, and two older adults who are in isolation. This makes 77 confirmed cases in Lee County to date with 48 cases reported as recovered.

The county's rolling 14-day total is now at 19, the highest since the state began reporting data. The previous high was 17 on June 14. Des Moines County has 131 confirmed cases of the virus and has a 14-day rolling total of 24, down from

it's peak of 27 on July 24.

Henry County has 104 confirmed cases with its 14-day rolling total on the rise. That number stands at 10, way off the county's peak of 24 on June 30. Jefferson County has seen 71 positive cases with a rolling two-week total of 3. While Van Buren County has only had 23 confirmed cases with a rolling two-week number of 2.

With updated figures on the state's coronavirus website at <u>coronavirus.iowa.gov</u>, the state has a rolling 14-day total of 5,525 and one week ago that figure was 6,439. Over the past week the state has averaged 361 new positive cases daily.

WEST BURLINGTON - Southeastern Community College will be honoring two alums in the business and medical fields as their 2020 Distinguished Alumni this year.

The college will host receptions for this year's Distinguished Alumni honorees prior to the August 1 graduation ceremonies.

West Burlington 2020 Distinguished Alumnus, John Schulz, will be honored at a reception at 11 a.m. in the banquet hall at Burlington Memorial Auditorium.

Keokuk 2020 Distinguished Alumnus, Dr. Gary Mansheim, will be honored at a reception at 5 p.m. at Keokuk High School, the site of this year's Keokuk campus commencement.

Schulz and Mansheim will present keynote speeches during their respective commencements.

To work around the pandemic, both ceremonies were moved to August 1 after students requested to hold in-person commencements. West Burlington's commencement will begin at 1 p.m.; Keokuk's will begin at 7 p.m.

A Mediapolis High School graduate, Schulz earned his degree from SCC in 1963, after serving in the Army National Guard.

He continued to Iowa State University, where he earned his degree in engineering. He then attended Xavier University in Cincinnati, OH, where he earned his MBA.

Schulz began his career at General Motors in Dayton, OH. He participated in GM's program to develop the first automotive air bag — he also drove the first airbag-equipped automobile out of Detroit.

He and his family returned to Burlington in 1993. He purchased Klein Manufacturing, which is now called Flint Cliffs Manu-

Schulz has contributed to the community a number of ways, including sitting on the Southeast Iowa Regional Airport Board, the Community Foundation Board, and teaching Junior Achievement for a decade. He has earned the Business Person of the Year award, the Manufacturer of Distinction award, the Burlington Chamber's Manufacturer of the Year honor, and was presented with the Mayor's Award for rebuilding the snowflakes on Snake Alley.





paperback and on iPads. Smart boards, used to enhance the learning experience and display materials on a large screen, are also in every classroom. For a larger class, there are two boards on either side of the classroom, ensuring that the entire class can be taught in one room.

Additionally, all teachers will be required to wear masks unless medically exempt. Mass will be held in the classroom every Wednesday, and only the designated class that recites the readings will be allowed in the church.

During lunch, the periods will be divided into four groups. Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten will eat first. The lunch order will then progress by age with fifth and sixth grade eating last. The main cafeteria will seat approximately 40 kids all distanced six feet apart. Larger tables will seat two, and signs will designate where kids can sit at the table. Another smaller cafeteria can fit an additional 15 students. However, this inside configuration isn't the only option.

"We want them to eat outside as much as possible, weather permitting," Michael Sheerin, Principal of HTC Elementary, said.

There will be designated areas for students to eat, and each class will come out in staggered intervals. There will also be a trash can and tray drop-off station.

"We will be asking for parent volunteers to monitor the kids to make sure that they are keeping safe in their designated areas," Sheerin said.

Even with all the protective measures, some families may want to keep their kids home due to additional health concerns. For those families, the option to learn completely online is available.

Because Holy Trinity is utilizing the same programs from last spring (Google Classroom and See Saw), kids will already know how to use them. Parents will be able to watch a live tutorial of the lesson being taught and can learn how to use the program, too.


"Holy Trinity is dedicated to reaching every student, whether in the classroom or online," Sheerin said.
