Viking Cruise ship back on mayor's radar

Plans dashed last year after builder lost financing

FORT MADISON - Fort Madison may have received some reason for optimism regarding Viking Cruise lines recently.

At Tuesday's City Council meeting, Fort Madison Mayor Brad Randolph said he had a discussion over the weekend and efforts are back underway to restart the cruise line's efforts to have tours along the Mississippi.

"I had a discussion over the weekend and you can

ask me about it, but I don't know how much I'll be able to add, but the Viking Cruise Lines project is moving forward on the Mississippi and Fort Madison remains on the schedule, so from the ashes it's back."

In 2016 and 2017, the city was engaged in discussions to possibly bring a port call of about four hours several times a week to Fort Madison, but federal regulations under the Jones Act prohibits maritime commerce on waterways within the United States with ships not constructed in the country. In general purposes, the Jones Act prohibits any foreign-built or foreign-flagged vessel from engaging in coastal trade within the U.S.

In an email this afternoon, a spokesman for the

European-based Vikings Cruise line said the company continues to work on the Mississippi project, "but at this point we are not able to share additional details."

According to a video of a Dubuque City Council work session on Sept. 17, David Simmons, a company consultant for Vikings, said the company had a renewed interest in tours along the Mississippi River and spoke with Dubuque city officials about wanting to do seven-day cruises from St. Paul, Minnesota to St. Louis with three Iowa stops; Dubuque, Davenport, and Burlington.

Viking officials didn't respond to questions about how the maritime hurdles would be cleared, but Simmons told Dubuque officials that plans for domestic

1A, but a tough WACO team made the second set interesting.

After not having much of a contest in the first set, the Crusaders appeared to be rolling out

to another easy time of it in the second set going up 6-3 on a Warriors defensive error, but then WACO went on a 6-0 run and had the Crusaders out of sorts.

Burglars lead FM police on foot chase

FORT MADISON - A morning foot chase has resulted in one arrest and another suspect being sought in connection with a theft from a local auto service station.

According to Fort Madison Police Chief Tim Sittig, police were alerted to a theft in progress at BJs Performance in the 2500 block of Avenue L.

Sittig said when police arrived, two suspects ran into the wooded area around the railroad tracks south of the building, where one male was apprehended and another suspect was able to elude officers.

Officers were led to some auto parts and batteries that Sittig said appear to have been taken over a period of time. Police arrested Johnathon Horn of Fort Madison and released him after charging him with fifth-degree theft, which is the lowest theft class.

Sittig said he thinks the parts were being sold for scrap and for cores.

"Two subjects appear to have been taking car parts," Sittig said. "We identified and located one of the two. The second subject hasn't been identified, but we don't believe that person to be a threat to the community. The guy we caught just ran of gas."

"They were taking old exhaust pieces and batteries and I think they were doing it a little at a time for scrap and cores."

Originally, there were four officers involved in the hunt for the two suspects and then a Lee County Sheriff's deputy assisted.

Viking predicting 165,000 passengers by 2027

cruises are nearing completion.

Simmons told Dubuque city officials that the Mississippi River is an under-served market and he said by 2027 Viking ships could have 165,000 passengers per year on six vessels touring the Mississippi.

The company would offer three itineraries and the one that could include Fort Madison would be the seven-day one way trip from St. Louis to St. Paul. Leaving from St. Louis proposals would include a day-three stop either at Burlington or Fort Madison. The Fort Madison stop is proposed to include a tour of the Old Fort Madison or Historic Nauvoo.

Simmons said if the company begins building ships in October, and he couldn't guarantee building would start then, it takes two years to build a vessel. He said they would be selling the cruises 90 days after they start building.

"That's how successful the Viking's brand is."

He said the company would be interested in helping, specifically Dubuque, with the costs associated with a floating dock that would allow passengers to exit the boat no matter what the river water level is.

Simmons told Dubuque officials that, as a foreign entity, Viking couldn't own the vessel and Edison Chouest, out of Louisiana, will build and own the vessel and charter it to Viking.

"It took a long time for us to make sure we are doing the right thing. It's a lot farther along now. It is going so fast now that I believe announcements will be around the corner," Simmons told the Dubuque council.

Randolph said he thinks that the plan at this point is to dock in Fort Madison. He said the dock here, as was previously discussed with Viking officials, would give the cruise line 24/7 access, something that other stops may not be able to provide.

"I think the plan at this point is that it's Fort Madison. If Fort Madison for some reason doesn't work, whether it's too shallow, or the dock isn't compatible, they would need some sort of back up plan," Randolph said Monday evening.

"Based on our first discussions, the thought was they were going to have an exclusive docking agreement with the city, and they wanted that so they could have unlimited access to that location."

He said original discussions included Viking helping with some of the costs of getting the dock ready. The city currently has city water and electricity available, but Randolph said some designs would need to be created to see exactly what the dock could look like.

Randolph said the city shouldn't take any steps on anything until a docking agreement has been reached.

"As we keep our fingers crossed and things progress, we're going to have make provisions for that first ship that would be late 2020 or early 2021. The clock is ticking now, and I don't want to put the cart before the horse, but if the opportunity comes, we need to be ready to grab it with both hands."

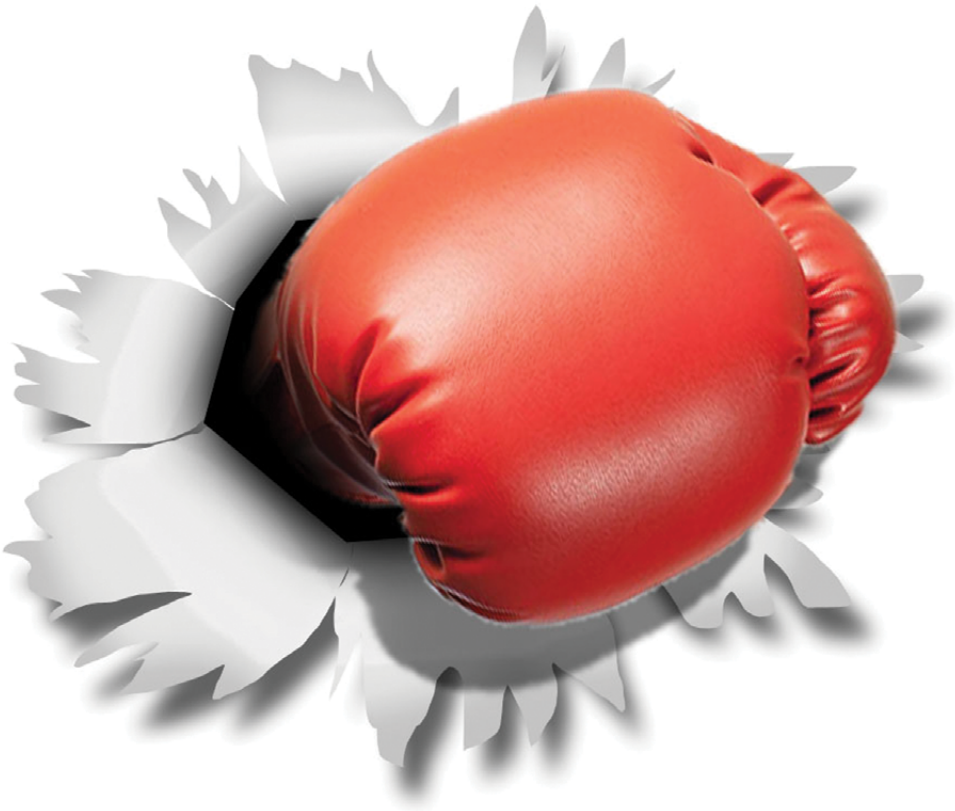

Crusaders shake off tight second set in win

net error and a kill that went deep from Katie Denning had HTC down 9-6. Denning then got a kill to find wood on the left side to stop the run with HTC down 7-9.

The two teams traded points to 9-11 score before senior Eryn Anderson came up with an ace and then Warriors Ellie Miles pinned the ball against the net and HTC had tied it at 11 forcing a WACO timeout.

Out of the timeout, the two teams would trade barbs until senior Mya Lawlor struck four points together from the service line helped by consecutive kills from senior Emily Box to give HTC a two-point lead. A kill by WACO's sophomore Lela-Ann Fort tied the game back at 15. The teams would tie at 16, 18, and 21 when freshman Kassi Randolph served up an ace. Anderson would kill the next point with a firm shot to the left back of the court to give HTC a 22-21 lead.

Then WACO responded to go up 24-23 when Anderson's attack went wide. Box pushed a kill to the right of a block to tie it back at 24. The teams would tie it up again at 25 but a big attack from Box found the floor and senior Taylor Boeding put the Warriors' hopes for a fourth set out of

sight with a kill from her outside hitter spot to end the set 27-25.

HTC turned bully in the third set allowing the Warriors only one point on their own serve to end WACO's season at 16-13 overall.

Senior Mya Lawlor, who repeatedly offered encouragement to the underclassmen on the floor, typically Bailey Hellweg, Randolph, Denning, and junior Avery Hopper, said the team fell flat in the second game.

"I just think that we play better when we have energy and I think we were losing that energy," Lawlor said. "Our underclassmen were getting down and it's important that we stay up and I was just trying to bring that out on the court."

She said the Crusaders got a little nervy when trailing.

"I think nerves is one part of it. We haven't played in 11 days and this is the first game of regionals and that relates to the jitters and stuff, but once we settle in we do a lot better," Lawlor said.

Anderson, who recorded three kills and an ace in the Crusaders' final six points in the second set, said the emotions of tournament play showed up. Anderson finished 21-22 attacking with 14 kills. She was also 19-20

serving with four aces and a block.

"In the second game we let the emotions of regionals get the best of us," Anderson said. "We have some youngin's out there that haven't experienced this and I think that the week off and the emotion came rushing in and we didn't play to the best of our ability. The second set was an off-game, but the third game is more like

how we play."

Head coach Melissa Freesmeier said the seniors on the floor, especially Anderson, kept the Crusaders out of facing a fourth set.

"I could see it in her eyes that she wasn't go to let that one slip by her. That's what I said in the lockerroom that the seniors were out there working their butts off and the underclassmen need to step up. It's time to step up and play and I

thought in game 3 everybody did that," Freesmeier said.

She said for most of the underclassmen this is their first experience in regional action.

"This is a new world for a lot of these kids and they might be a little timid, but they're good, that's why they're out there."

She said the 11 days wasn't really a detriment. The Crusaders hadn't played since Oct. 12 when they swept a four-team

Mediapolis Invitational.

"We needed a good week to practice and focus and you always want that game-like situation, but you can only do so much in practice. I thought game 1 was good and game three was good, but game 2 got away from us."

Box went 28-32 at the net with 20 kills, while Boeding went 18-21 attacking with six kills. Lawlor led the Crusaders on defense with 19 digs.

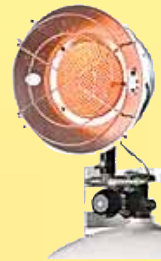
