## Fareway exceeds opening benchmarks

FORT MADISON - Having been open just a mere two weeks, Fareway grocery manager Mark Braun said the company has surpassed opening projections for the store.

The Fareway Grocery opened on Wednesday, Aug. 30, in time for the Labor Day weekend and the annual Tri-State Rodeo.



"It's been a terrific grand opening. We exceeded all expectations and this community continues to be amazing in how welcoming they are," Braun said Wednesday.

He said the opening was a little different from other locations because this was the first store he's been a part of where there wasn't a Wal-Mart in the town.

"They're buying absolutely everything... even the oddball stuff. This is the first time I've been in a town without a Wal-Mart, so even things like pet odor remover spray is flying off the shelf. It's the random things that kind of sit and gather dust that are selling

# Troxel joins Wondra, Young in win

Lee County votes in favor of SCC's 6-cent support levy

FORT MADISON - The Fort Madison School district voters have brought two incumbents back onto the board and elected one newcomer to take a seat on the board.



Results of Tuesday's school election show incumbent Tim Wondra won with the highest number of votes at 357, followed by first-time candidate Jillian Troxel with 327, and current board member Gayla Young with 315. Young

was a mere 11 votes ahead of Renee Ehlers who was seeking her first seat on the board. Gunther Anderson finished with 241 votes and Brad Menke finished with 210.

Lee County also overwhelmingly voted in favor of the 6-cent instructional support levy for Southeastern Community College 729-227. The Fort Madison district broke in

he would be open to a nomination for the President's chair.

"Yeah, it's one of those things of being the most senior member and I would look at it as my duty. Timm is leaving some very big shoes to fill and we'll have to do a damn good job to fill 'em," he said.

Lamb steps back after close to half century

FORT MADISON -Current Fort Madison school board president Timm Lamb has done just about everything inside and outside the walls of a Fort Madison School District building and on Sept. 25, he will step back from any official capacity with the district after 43 years.

Lamb did not seek re-election in Tuesday's race for the Fort Madison Community School District saying it's time to officially retire. He retired from teaching about eight years ago, took a year off, and then ran for school board and won. He served the last three years as the board president and the two years prior to that as vice president. "I've got about 47 years in this district as a coach, Athletic Director, and other things," Lamb said.

favor of the measure 345 to 137.

Wondra, who's served as vice president for the past two years, said he was a bit nervous going into election night.

"I'm extremely happy and excited," Wondra said. "I was pretty nervous this time. We had some good candidates running. I felt the district would be in good hands with whomever won. I'm just glad I was one of them."

Wondra said with current board president Timm Lamb not seeking re-election

Wondra said the turnout was similar to the last election, but he would have liked to see more people cast a ballot.

"This is our children's future and we can only get 400 or so to come out and vote in a district this size?," he said.

Young said she too felt very comfortable with the group of candidates.

"No matter what happened, we had some very qualified candidates. If I didn't win the sun would still come up tomorrow, but I'm

here that surprises me."

With the rodeo in town during the first full weekend, Fareway jumped in with donations to a pancake breakfast and some other events and even was able to get a semi and some employees, including Braun and Meat Manager Michael Hanna, to make the long parade trek on Saturday morning.

Braun said he was floored at the size and length of the parade.

"That parade was massive. For the size of town this is, I thought maybe 10 blocks and a couple hundred people lining the streets. I don't know what the numbers were but there were thousands and thousands of people. It was absolutely insane. We ran out of candy and cookies about halfway through and just when we thought we were about done, we hit the downtown area," he said.

One of the characteristics of the Fareway brand is their "To Your Car Service" and Braun said that is taking some adjustments for the customers.

"We're kind of retraining the customer. They aren't used to that and a lot of them are like, 'No, we got it', but we tell them we don't have any cart racks outside so we can unload the groceries for them and then bring the cart back so they don't have to and that usually does the trick. It's just re-introducing that service to them."

He said overall things have run very smoothly but there was a run on ice and beer during the rodeo.

"That was the biggest flux we saw. Every day we got a little busier and now we're getting into more of a normal groove. But this community continues to be very welcoming. It's almost like a celebrity status as I go around the community."

## **FMCH offering flu shot clinics**

FORT MADISON - Although it seems hard to believe it is time to start thinking flu season again. Fort Madison Community Hospital is encouraging all community members to get their annual flu vaccine. This year's flu vaccine will help protect you from four identified strains of the flu virus that research indicates will be most common during the 2017-18 flu season. This year's vaccine is a quadrivalent flu vaccine that is designed to protect against four different flu viruses; two influenza A viruses and two influenza B viruses.

The CDC recommends that all persons receive the flu vaccine by the end of October, if possible before flu activity begins. It takes two weeks after you receive the flu vaccine for it to be effective and then will stay effective throughout the flu season. However, getting vaccinated later can still be beneficial.

Fort Madison Physicians & Surgeons Clinic is offering flu shots on a walk-in basis Wednesday afternoons from 1:00 to 6:00 p.m. starting September 6th through December 20th in the Main Clinic (times are subject to change based on demand). Flu shots will be offered to members of the community for a cash discounted fee of \$25.00 per shot payable at the time of service. Insurance will also be accepted and filed and it will become part of your medical record.

## Social media chatter on proposed relocation of depot

Editor's Note: The following is a partial list of responses that have been posted to Facebook in response to a Pen City Current editorial on an upcoming vote by the Fort Madison City Council to possibly move the current Amtrak Depot back to its original location in downtown Fort Madison. Also included is a post from City Councilman Brian Wright who asked his Facebook community for comments on the proposal.

bringing in money, so why not move the depot closer so at least those people can see it? Is there a bus stop for trailways and greyhound somewhere in town? Could they move that to a spot close to downtown? Put some better signage up pointing to the shopping there? People don't shop or visit what they don't know about.

Everett Mungan: How did the city end up with the old Depot? Is the city finished with paying anymore to make the Depot acceptable to Amtrak and Dot? Mick Loebach: I'm not sure if this is a good use of taxpayer money. Don't we have an Amtrak station already? With the possibility of losing Amtrak altogether

Dave Bohnenkamp: I am in favor of bringing the Amtrak depot to the downtown location. However, the threat of Amtrak pulling its stop from Ft. Madison is likely an empty one. This is the stop where they change engineers and is the midway point between Chicago and KC on this line. I doubt that they want to change that.

Cheri Coin: What about those who work for the railroad and ride Amtrak? Would it still be convenient for them to get off downtown and then go back to the west end to conduct business? And is there ample parking for riders?

Joe Diaz: There's quite

a bit of parking by where the Emerald Lady used to dock, and a skywalk over the tracks, if there is not enough by the historic Depot. The depot we have now is nowhere near anything worthwhile, and looks like crap. The inside is dumpy and out of date. Rusty was supportive of tax breaks for a new hotel, but doesn't want to do this. The city council talks about wanting to bring tourism and business to FM....but doing something like this, that would actually bring travelers closer to the downtown area isn't worth investing in? Most people who get off the train now only see the tracks and the outdated depot. I hear complaints about the Fort not





if our POTUS has his way, it should be postponed until you find out for sure that Amtrak will continue.

Jason Huppert: i do not comment much, but i have to ask. We just spent a half million on an intersection. Getting ready to spend 26 mil on a new 3 lane highway (yes 3 lane), that not a sole seems to mind (higher taxes) remind you. I was against spending the money on the depot at the time, but we spent the money, now is the time to finish it. If it was my gamble i would stick my 1/2 million on the depot at this point

rather than an intersection to help local business.

Jim Nagel: If I was a visitor coming to Fort Madison by train, I wouldn't want to do business if when I got off the train the first thing that I saw and smelled was a, sewage plant. Move the Depot to its original location!

Penny Dowell Monroe: Back in the day, their was a restaurant my sister worked in, the old depot. I remember going as a kid. Downtown could benefit. They could put a couple ships in the old casino building as well.

Kris Russell: I think if the truth be told Amtrak will likely have the same agreement with the City they currently have. Some of the councilmen are trying to start dissension to divert attention.

Brian Wright: I would like some feedback from those in Fort Madison in regards to the old depot in downtown being rented for Amtrak to stop there for passengers. Cost is approximately \$50,000 annually for the city to maintain and the city

# Lamb says he's learned from different roles

"You're idea of what it means to be on the board changes. As a teacher you'd say, "Why are they doing this...or why are they doing that. But a lot changes when you sit in the other seat. You start to understand things."

One of the things that Lamb is most proud of as a board member is the reconnection of the board to the staff and the community. Lamb said there was sentiment that the board was disconnected and it was his goal to reestablish that connection.

"I've been excited to watch the board get back with the teachers and the community. We didn't pass a bond, but you see we had 25% to 30% of the voters turn out when typically you get 5 or 6%. But even with that 25% we had 56% say they wanted a new building and I think we're one of only four states that require that supermajority so I think we're doing a much better job at communicating."

He also said bringing the Lighthouse workshops through the Iowa Association of School Boards has helped the board redefine its objective and goal strategies. It also helped

the board work toward a goal of aligning its development with the staff and teacher development.

The Lighthouse sessions were part of a second monthly meeting that Lamb and the board



brought back. "My first five years on the board we only

met once a month, but I thought we should have a workshop and back when I was teaching they had those workshops. What we've accomplished in those workshops and in our Lighthouse sessions has been fantastic," Lamb said.

As a result of the ramped up efforts to increase communication between the board, the staff, and the community, the board was recognized as one of five selected state boards at the annual IASB convention in Des Moines. They were also written about in a national education magazine.

At the 2016 IASB convention, state education officials recognized the Fort Madison board for their efforts in personal

development and their focus on increasing the role the board plays in the district. Along with the awards, 6 of the 7 current board members received personal recognition for their individual efforts as well.

When the district first decided to move forward with trying to pass a bond referendum to build a new elementary school on the campus of the Fort Madison Middle School, the board had a public meeting and invited the community in to discuss the project, prior to voting on whether or not to put a referendum on the ballot.

"When we did that we got a write up in a national magazine commending us for our process and engaging the community in the discussion," Lamb said.

Lamb said he told the board he was leaving despite what happened with the bond. But he said now he can actually do more for the district with regard to the bond issues because there are rules prohibiting board members from soliciting specific votes on a bond issue, but can only encourage people to vote.

"I've had a wonderful 45 plus years here," he said.

"Sometimes I go back and sit and think of the things that have happened to me as a teacher, a coach and AD, and now as a board member and president. I don't have any regrets. We have a great superintendent and I guess on regret would be not being able to work with Erin (Slater) for another year, but I just don't have another four years left in me.

"I'll always be here for the district and, frankly, now I can do more to help with a referendum because I can go out and say more. As a board member there are laws against soliciting votes to pass a referendum. You just can't do it, but now I can be more of a voice for them."

He said now that he will be totally retired, Lamb said his wife Kate doesn't think he'll have enough to do, but Lamb said he will always be there to help the district where he can.

He said the board has great people on it and he would like to see them keep going in the same

direction. His only counsel was to listen.

"We have great administrators... great staff. Just listen to them. We're going in the right direction. .I'm not sure I could tell them what they should or shouldn't be working on because it can change week to week, but listen to

what these principals and staff have to say, they're the ones that are in the trenches," he said.

"They bring stuff to us and we have to listen and then vote your conscience. But when you walk out the door, we all have to be supportive of the direction of the board."

of your good health. It will help you avoid getting the flu; make the flu less severe if you do get it; and keep you from spreading the flu to your family and other people," expressed Heather Oppenheimer, Infection Prevention Nurse at FMCH, "Influenza is a serious disease that can lead to hospitalizations and sometimes even death. Even a mild case of the flu can leave you unable to work or perform normal daily activities for several days."

Fort Madison Community Hospital has implemented mandatory flu vaccines for all employees. All employees are required to receive the flu vaccine to help stop

the spread of flu and to protect patients, the employee and their families.

In addition to receiving the flu vaccine, everyone can take everyday precautions to stay healthy and help stop the spread of the flu. The influenza virus is spread mainly by coughing, sneezing and close contact so it is important that you wash your hands often or use hand sanitizer to stop the spread of germs; cover your coughs or sneezes by coughing or sneezing into your elbow; keep your hands away from your face - eyes, nose and mouth are key entry points for germs; stay away from sick people if possible. If you are sick with flu, stay home from work or school to prevent spreading influenza to others.
