Former FM surgeon charged with sexual misconduct

Darrow will maintain license but must comply with state corrections, pay \$5,000 fine

FORT MADISON - A 68-year-old former Fort Madison surgeon has been cited by the Iowa Board of Medicine for sexual misconduct. Joseph C. Darrow, Jr., who, according to a release from the board, currently practices in Kirksville, Mo., entered into an agreement on Dec. 15, with the board that spells out the charges and disposition of the events leading to the investigation. Darrow was an orthopedic surgeon at Fort Madison Community Hospital for a time period that ended in 2016.


The release from the board on Dec. 20 said Darrow was charged with engaging in sexual misconduct when he engaged in a sexual relationship "concurrent with, or immediately following, the physician-patient relationship in Fort Madison, Iowa, in 2014". Darrow and the

patient have since married.

Under the terms of the agreement, Darrow was issued a citation and warning ordering him to pay a \$5,000 civil penalty, complete neuropsychological testing under the direction of a board-approved neuropsychologist, complete a board-approved treatment program for professional boundaries, and establish a worksite monitor with the board.

Darrow is still licensed to practice in Iowa until April 1, 2019. The sexual misconduct falls under Iowa Code



GRMC to start charging copays at ER

Patients without insurance will be asked to make a \$400 down payment

WEST BURLINGTON - Patients will make copayments for Emergency Department treatment at Great River Medical Center beginning Thursday, Feb. 1. The practice has been standard at other hospitals throughout the U.S. for more than five years.

"We will not ask for payment information until patients are screened and receive stabilization treatment," said Michael McCoy, MD, chief medical officer, Great River Health Systems. "Patient care is our greatest concern."

Collecting copayments in the Emergency Department will help ensure financial stability as Great River Health Systems faces reduced reimbursements for care and increasing costs.

A copayment is a fixed amount determined by insurance companies that patients pay for specific services. Some insurance plans don't require copay-

After treatment, Patient Access staff will verify insurance information and request copayment, if applicable. Cash, check, debit and credit will be accepted. Patients who have insurance without copayment amounts will be asked to

pay a \$200 down payment. Patients without insurance coverage will be asked to pay a \$400 down payment.

All patients will receive bills for the remaining cost of their care that is not covered by insurance.

If the Emergency Department visit leads to a hospital admission, copayments will not be collected at that time.

Choosing the right kind of medical care in the right place is important to reducing health care costs. Emergency Department treatment is for serious illnesses and injuries such as heart attack and stroke symptoms, severe breathing problems and deep cuts. It is the most-expensive level of care.

Basic primary- and walk-in clinic care at Great River Health Systems clinics costs about \$150, without tests.

Primary-care clinics should be the first step for medical care and advice. They provide treatments for illnesses like severe colds and flu, earaches and sore throats, and chronic conditions like arthritis, diabetes, COPD and heart disease.

Great River Health System's primary-care clinics are: Family Medicine, Family Medicine, Mercy Plaza, Keokuk, Mediapolis, Medicine Specialists, and Wapello.

Great River QuickCare, 624 S. Roosevelt Ave., Suite 101, Burlington, provides treatment of sudden illness like severe colds and flu, earaches and sore throats. The walk-in clinic is for patients 18 months and older who don't have a primary-care provider or those needing extended office hours.

According to 23.1 "A physician shall not engage in any sexual conduct with a former patient unless the physician-patient relationship was completely terminated before the sexual conduct occurred. In considering whether that relationship was completely terminated, the board will consider the duration of the physician-patient relationship, the nature of the medical services provided, the lapse of time since the physician-patient relationship ended, the degree of dependence in the physician-patient relationship, and the extent to which the physician used or exploited the trust, knowledge, emotions, or influence derived from the physician-patient relationship."





eating. They must have been shut out for quite a spell.

I walked around the hen house, searching the ground and various nooks and crannies for the other two hens. There, up against the back door, huddled our lone red hen, named, Red. She let me pick her up and carry her around to join the others. It was pretty dark by then, so I had to hold the spot light in the hen house (there is no electricity) so she could find water, feed, and a roosting spot. Chickens can't see in the dark, you know. But I was still missing one.

I flashed the light down around the foundation of the hen house. Nothing. I made another trip around the hen house, looking for the lost hen. I was getting worried. Left out at night, the hen could fall victim to a predator. She was nowhere to be seen.

In desperation, I got down on my hands and knees and flashed the light under the hen house. Holy moly, guacamole, did I spy a passel of eggs! Those buggers had been laying eggs in the dirt under the hen house!

Then my light picked up one little brown ball of feathers huddled tight against a bale of straw. (I had placed bales of straw around the foundation for insulation.) I carefully, removed the bale, trying not to startle the hen back under the hen house where I couldn't reach her. I was able to pick her up and return her to the safety of the hen house.

How that door got closed, I have no idea. There was a fierce wind that day out of the south, and that could have had something to do with it. But the door is one of those overhead doors that roll up and down. For the wind to suck it closed would be pretty amazing. Could I have absentmindedly pulled it closed? My mind does wander considerably. I guess we'll never know. The good news is that all 13 hens were safe and accounted for. Whew!

The next morning the hens seemed to have no recollection of their near rendezvous with disaster. When I let them out, they ran for the big house and peered through the open door as if wanting to join Ginnie and I for breakfast (scrambled eggs).

Guard dog, Buddy, was on duty.
