Tuesday fire destroys Montrose home

Owner got out just before flames started

MONTROSE - A late night fire in rural Lee County has destroyed a man's home.

Firefighters from the Des Moines Township Fire & Rescue and Montrose Fire & Rescue were called out to the 2100 block of 320th Avenue in southwestern Lee County at about 11:30 p.m. Tuesday night to a home that was burning.

The home belongs to Gabe Arne, 33, of rural Montrose. Firefighters were on the scene for close to three hours extinguishing the blaze and then were called back to the scene at about 7 a.m. this morning when embers reignited the scorched timbers that were left standing.

Arne was at the scene again Wednesday morning and said the cause hasn't been determined. Fire officials at the scene were different than those that originally fought the fire and had no comment on the cause.

Arne said he believed the fire started in his bedroom.

"I was just off shift from Siemens and when I got home I saw smoke so I went in to see what was going on and decided to get out and call the fire department," Arne said.

"Right when I got out of the house, that's when it caught on fire."

Arne said he was the only one living in the home. He said everything was insured and he had a place to stay while the loss works it's way through the insurance claim.

He said the home was built sometime in the 1960s and he had been living in the single-story home for the past seven years.

LCCD to manage 350 acres donated to DNR

MONTROSE - The Lee County Conservation Department is set to take over management of a local farmstand that was willed to the Iowa DNR this past fall.

The Lee County Conservation Board met for their regular monthly meeting Tuesday night in Montrose and one of the first action items on the agenda was a resolution to approve a management agreement with the Iowa DNR regarding the Denning property in northern Lee County.

When Eleanor Denning passed away in the fall of 2018, she willed her 350 acre homestead to the Iowa

DNR with the intent the land be used for conservation

purposes. The property sits at 1653 130th Street which



USDA offers extensions for expiring CRP contracts

WASHINGTON, May 15, 2019 – USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) will accept applications beginning June 3, 2019, for certain practices under the continuous Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) signup and will offer extensions for expiring CRP contracts. The 2018 Farm Bill reauthorized CRP, one of the country's largest conservation programs.

"USDA offers a variety of conservation programs to farmers and ranchers, and the Conservation Reserve Program is an important tool for private lands management," said FSA Administrator Richard Fordyce. "CRP allows agricultural producers to set aside land to reduce soil erosion, improve water quality, provide habitat for wildlife and boost soil health."

FSA stopped accepting applications last fall for the continuous CRP signup when 2014 Farm Bill authority expired. Since passage of the 2018 Farm Bill last December, Fordyce said FSA has carefully analyzed the language and determined that a limited signup prioritizing water-quality practices furthers conservation goals and makes sense for producers as FSA works to fully implement the program.

Continuous CRP Signup

This year's signup will include such practices as grassed waterways, filter strips, riparian buffers, wetland restoration and others. View a full list of practices approved for this program.

Continuous signup enrollment contracts are 10 to 15 years in duration. Soil rental rates will be set at 90 percent of the existing rates. Incentive payments will not be offered for these contracts.

Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program Signup

FSA will also reopen signup for existing Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP) agreements. Fact sheets on current CREP agreements are available on this webpage.

Other CRP Signup Options

Fordyce said FSA plans to open a CRP general signup in December 2019 and a CRP Grasslands signup later.

CRP Contract Extensions

A one-year extension will be offered to existing CRP participants who have expiring CRP contracts of 14 years or less. Producers eligible for an extension will receive a letter describing their options.

Alternatively, producers with expiring contracts may have the option to enroll in the Transition Incentives Program, which provides two additional annual rental payments on the condition the land is sold or rented to a beginning farmer or rancher or a member of a socially disadvantaged group.

District will open property FMHS Color Run Saturday up to bids next year

property while Lee County Conservation will manage the property and receive lease payments from the current farm tenant.

The lease agreement with the current tenant was the second action item concerning the Denning Conservation Area that was taken up by the board. When the property was willed over to the DNR, the current tenant was about to begin a new lease year and according to Conservation Director Nathan Unsworth, the county will honor that agreement for one year.

"Typically we'd want to bid out on a project like this but since Mrs. Denning passed away at such a late time in the year, we couldn't change tenants at that point so we'll honor that agreement that they had. This fall we'll bid that property out for next year's lease."

The conservation department will be paid \$30,000 for the 2019 year by the tenant per the current agreement.

Unsworth said those payments will go into a trust fund for the property which will be used to convert the property over entirely to conservation uses in the future. For now, the property does have a house with several barn and shed structures, all of which will be demolished, with the funds from the lease agreement used to fund those actions.

"The plans for the Denning Conservation Area will be finalized when we sit down with the DNR later this fall to look at ideas for the property," Unsworth said.

In other action, the board unanimously approved of the hiring of two seasonal employees. Alexis Walrath was hired to a part-time position as the Beach Concessionaire. Bryce Solem will work the summer months as a Conservation Aide, working under Operations Coordinator John Pawling performing various maintenance tasks.

"We don't want to give out to much in the way of investigations as it can give the people were looking for a heads up," Weber said.

Stark is currently in the Lee County Jail on two bonds, one of which is a \$55,000 cash only and the other is a \$13,000 surety contempt bond.






