WP stamps sewer rate bump, ATV ordinance

WEST POINT – Two large ordinance changes were swept through the West Point City Council Monday night.

An ordinance that will bump the city's sewer rates to help pay for \$1.9 million in upgrades to the city's lagoon was approved on second reading 4-0. The City Council then voted 4-0 to waive the final third reading of the ordinance and set the new rates in motion.

At a meeting in May, Travis Squires from the city's bond consulting firm, Piper Jaffray, proposed a set of increases over three years and then inflationary increases to follow, but Mayor Paul Walker said he felt a one-time increase would be easier to explain to city

The council then moved to accept a 63% increase in the minimum user charge and an increase in the charge per 1,000 gallons.

The current minimum charge for all users is \$11 and that will go to \$19.25 for the first 2,000 gallons of water used per month. In addition, each contributor will pay

a rate of \$9.98 per 1,000 gallons used until 2025. That current rate is \$5.70/1,000 gallons.

The city set a public hearing for its August 5th meeting for a budget amendment to cover the increased costs of the lagoon work. Original estimates had the work projected to cost \$1.5 million, but additional costs have pushed the work to \$1.9 million. That hearing will take place at 5:30 p.m.

The council also approved, on a waived third reading, a new ordinance that will allow golf carts, all-terrain

FM blades to anchor new wind power field

FORT MADISON -Siemens Gamesa has been selected by MidAmerican Energy Company for the Rolling Hills wind power project for a total of 429.3 MW, the largest repowering order to date in North America. The company will repower the project with 163 SG 2.7-129 and 18 previously sold SWT-2.3-108 wind turbines.

Rolling Hills is located in Adair, Adams and Cass counties in Iowa and currently features 193 SWT-2.3-101 turbines. The repowering project includes replacement of the blades, hubs and nacelles for all units, and top tower sections for the SG 2.7-129 units. Commissioning of the project is expected for late 2021.

The SG 2.7-129 turbine builds on the robust and successful 2.3-MW geared product series.

"We are excited to provide upgraded equipment and technology to the Rolling Hills project in Iowa, a national leader in the wind energy industry. This new project is a testament to MidAmerican Energy's confidence in us as well as Iowa, where we have supplied them with more than 2.6 GW," stated José Antonio Miranda, CEO of Onshore Americas at Siemens Gamesa Renewable Energy. "The blades will be produced right there in Iowa and the nacelles and hubs will come from neighboring Kansas, making this a truly local project."

The company will supply and install 163 SG 2.7-129 wind turbines, operating at 2.38 MW and 18 previously sold SWT-2.3-108 wind turbines to repower the Rolling Hills wind project (429.3 MW),

New London's 6-run sixth dooms Hounds

FORT MADISON – New London came away with the 11-7 win against Fort Madison baseball Monday night at Fort Madison High School.

On the surface the matchup was just like any other game. But for those with background knowledge of the coaches and players on both sides, this game was a fun one.

For starters, Fort Madison Head Coach Ron Walker got into coaching thanks to New London's JV Head Coach and Varsity assistant Justin Schulte. The two also coached together at Southeastern Community College after Schulte asked Walker to come back and help with the program having had Schulte as a coach during his college playing days at SCC.

"He's done a great job," Schulte said of Walker.
"You can tell there is a little pride in what they're doing. He brings energy to the ballpark and demands how you are going to do it ... He cares about the kids and really genuinely loves his players and you can see

it every time he steps on the field. I saw it for three years and enjoyed every minute of it."

The third piece of the puzzle was the fact that many of the players starting for both the Bloodhounds and Tigers had played on the traveling Junior Blackhawks together, a team coached by Ron Walker after Schulte asked if he would take over the program.

"I'm not going to treat it different from any other game," Walker said. "He's taught me the mindset and mentality that it doesn't matter who we're playing, we're playing out of our dugout. We will be playing out of the Bloodhound dugout (Monday) night and playing the game we've been taught to play."

New London gained the upper hand in the top of the first inning. An error to begin the game put the Tigers' lead-off runner on, before a walk and a single loaded the bases for New London with no outs.

Another walk then scored the first run of the game. The Hounds regrouped for back-to-back outs, but a hit by pitch plated the second run and

gave the Tigers the 2-0 advantage.

In the top of the third inning Carter Allen blasted a home run over the left field fence, giving New London a 3-0 advantage.

The Bloodhounds responded immediately as they've done many times this year coming from behind.

Landes Williams started

the bottom of the third with a single, before a Kane Williams groundout moved him to second. An error allowed Reed Fehseke to reach safely and move Williams to third. Jason Thurman then singled in Williams, before Jordryn Gerdes singled in Fehseke to cut the lead to one. Thurman followed by crossing home on an error to tie the game at three.

A walk, a hit by pitch and a single to start the fourth gave the Tigers back the lead. Another fielding error from Fort Madison allowed another run to score in the fourth, as New London built a 5-3 lead.

Once again the Hounds responded.

Dayne Cordray singled in the bottom of the fourth, before Tate Johnson followed with a single of his own. Landes Williams laid down a sacrifice bunt and moved the runners up, before Kane Williams brought in Cordray on a groundout. Fehseke then singled in Johnson to tie the game at five.

The game fell apart for Fort Madison in the sixth.

A single, a double and a triple with two outs gave New London a 7-5 lead, but that was just the beginning. The triple was followed with three-straight singles and a double to extend the Tiger lead to 11-5.

"There were about four or five plays that inning that weren't good baseball," Walker said. "They took advantage of our laziness .. then leaving 0-2 pitches over the plate. 0-2 you have to execute a pitch, you can't throw a fast ball right down the middle of the plate and let them hit a ball down the right field line."

Johnson was hit by a pitch in the bottom of the sixth. Landes Williams then doubled to put runners at second and third with no outs. Jason Thurman came through with a two-out double to plate both Johnson and Williams to cut the lead to 11-7.

That would be all the closer Fort Madison would

get, as New London went on to win by the final of 11-7.

"Tip your hat to New London," Walker said.
"They came out and created their own breaks. They took some great at bats and worked some balls up and they took advantage of all of our mistakes. A lot of our mistakes are from not being ready to play and going through the motions. I'm not really thrilled with the way the guys played tonight, not going to lie."

Jason Thurman led the way at the plate with three RBIs, while Fehseke, Gerdes and Kane Williams each had one. Landes Williams was hit with the loss after coming on in relief, going 2 1/3 innings, and allowing seven hits and six earned runs. Brandon Reichelt drew the start and gave up four hits and two earned runs over three innings.

Fort Madison is now 13-13 on the year and will take on Central Lee tomorrow back at home for a doubleheader.
















vehicles, and utility vehicles on public streets as long as they are licensed by the state and permitted by the city.

Walker said the new ordinance allows the vehicles on the streets, but removes parks.

"I do know what's not going to be allowed any more is parks. We're going to get rid of riding through the parks...going through the parks is out now. The only place they can is on the south end of South Park to get to the ball fields," Walker said.

The ordinance says operators can use public streets in a direct route to their destination. Walker said excess revenues from the permitting will go into the police department budget, but he doesn't expect that to be a lot of money.

"I don't expect a whole lot, we'll have some golf carts, but I don't know how many ATVs we'll get," Walker said.

In an unrelated item, the council also approved an amendment to the city code allowing for temporary permitting of vendors for the Register's Annual Great Bicycle Ride Across Iowa (RAGBRAI).
