Hound grapplers start season with win

QUINCY, Ill. - The Fort Madison Bloodhounds started the season on a winning note edging Quincy High School on the road 40-35 Wednesday night.

Senior Sam Hayes, who was rated as high as 9th in the state last year in an injury-shortened season, started a string of pins for Fort Madison with a fall over QHS' JC Lackey in 1:09 at 195 lbs. in the first match of the night. Junior Diego Lozano then followed with a quick :53 pin of Lucas Bodi at 220. Junior Danen Settles continued the streak of quick falls with a 1:01 pin of AJ Miller at the heavyweight 285 lb division.

The Bloodhounds Owen Kruse recorded the fourth fall in a row when he dumped Dalton Vallee in 1:35 at 106 lbs.

Quincy started to then turn the tables recording three wins in a row including a 3-0 decision by Hunter Carter at 120 lbs over the Bloodhounds Dayne Cordray who went to the state tournament last year as a junior.

FMHS's Gavin Wiseman got a pin at 126 over Brayden Oenning at 4:47 and Will Larson scored a major decision over Carson Neally 10-1 at 132. Mason

Hopper got hot in the 2nd half with four from the field and a 3-pointer as HTC outscored Danville 17-8 to pull ahead 31-24 at the end of the third period. Hopper scored six of her 11 in the fourth quarter and

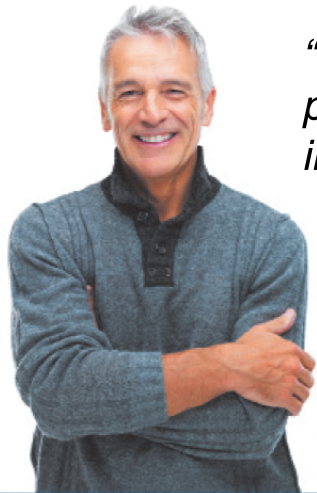
Burial will be at Calvary Cemetery in West Point, Iowa.

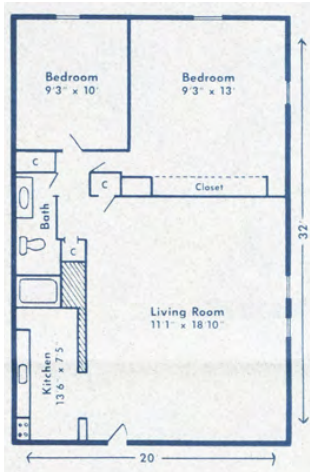
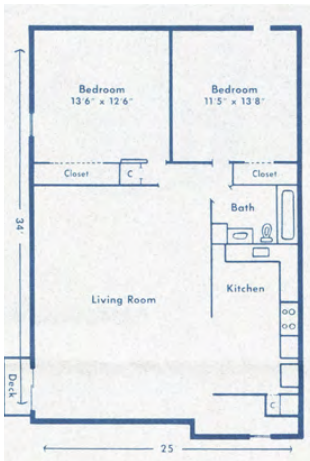

Bloodhounds fall to Ottumwa

FORT MADISON - The FMHS boys basketball team dropped its home opener Tuesday night despite having three players in double figures.

Ottumwa came to the HoundDome in non-conference action and downed the Bloodhounds 54-47 behind 18 points from sophomore Trae Swartz. Senior Lathan Hamm scored 14 converting just two from the field, but was sent to the free throw line 12 times converting 10.

Fort Madison was led by junior Jayden Fedler who scored 13 in the post for FMHS. Senior Brandon Keester had 12 points, including three 3-pointers, and senior Logan Rashid added 10.

The game started slow with Ottumwa holding a small 4-3 lead with just under three minutes remaining in the first period. The Bulldogs then stretched the lead to 19-11 just one minute into the second period. Ottum-

wa would outscore Fort Madison 14-10 in the second period and held a 32-19 lead going into the half.

The Bloodhounds looked to make a game of it in the third period when they closed the gap to six at 36-30 with three minutes left in the third quarter, a byproduct of a 11-4 FMHS run. Fort Madison would cut into the lead again with a bucket to make it 36-32. Trailing by four going into the final period, Ottumwa would put up a 7-0 run of its own before Fort Madison would counter to make it 44-38. With a minute remaining, the Hounds had cut the lead again to four at 46-42, but Ottumwa sealed the win outscoring FMHS 8-5 in the final minute to put the game away.

Senior Jordyn Gerdes had six points, junior Parker Denning had three, senior Lennon Barker had two points and Jace Burgher had a point to round out the scoring for Fort Madison.

The Bloodhounds travel to Keokuk on Friday to open Southeast Conference play.
