Keokuk High School gets \$10K STEM grant

KEOKUK – The Iowa Governor's STEM Advisory Council directed additional support for the STEM BEST (Businesses Engaging Students and Teachers) Program through the STEM BEST Program Enhancement Fund to Keokuk High School to enhance school and business collaboration efforts.

The \$10,000 grant will help enhance work-

based learning opportunities made available through school and business partnerships during the 2019-2020 academic year.

The STEM BEST

Program Enhancement Fund supports previously awarded STEM BEST Programs that demonstrated evidence of how the funds would enrich or expand current STEM

LCCD opens online campsite portal

New site will also show dates of available camping

LEE COUNTY – Lee County Conservation is launching a new campground reservation process at the beginning of the year. All reservations will be taken online through mycountyparks.com. Mycountyparks.com is the Iowa County Conservation System's website that provides information about all 99 County Conservation Boards in Iowa. Currently, about 35 other counties are using this website for reservations.

People will be able to start making reservations on January 2nd at 9:00 a.m. The Lee County Conservation staff encourages everyone to visit mycountyparks.com before January 2nd to set up a user account. This action will ensure individuals have everything in place to make their first reservation quickly and successfully.

The online reservation cost will be \$21.00 per night, along with a \$4.00 processing fee per reservation. All reservations must be made five days before the day of arrival. Clint Oldfield, Lee County Conservation Park Ranger, indicates the public supports the new reservation program.

"People look forward to the convenience of the new system as they will be able to make a reservation from anywhere and at any time," Oldfield said.

"It is going to reduce the number of steps it currently takes our campers to make a reservation. They will now be able to see the calendar at all times, and will not have to make a call to confirm the availability of a reservable site."

Not all campsites will be reservable at the Lee County Conservation Campgrounds, he said.

"We will have 15 sites at Pollmiller, 8 sites at Wilson Lake, and all of the sites at Chatfield available for online reservations."

Lee County Conservation has all the campsites on mycountyparks.com, so campers can visit the website to see what sites will be available for reservations on Ian 2nd

Campers with questions are encouraged to call the Lee County Conservation office at (319) 463-7673. Staff members will be available to help answer any questions or help with any technical difficulties people may experience with the new system.

"I would be happy to answer any questions I can to help people through this new process," said Connie Clark-Hudson, Lee County Conservation Office Manager.



area, like a weather joint. We have a non-narcotic nerve med for you to try."

I was almost disappointed. But the nerve med was effective.

Next, my hip and thigh started hurting, especially after jogging on the treadmill. People said I had a hitch in my giddyup. I returned to the doctor. He ordered x-rays. His nurse called with the results. "Degenerative hip and spine disease, herniated disk in lower lumbar, osteoarthritis."

What was I supposed to do with this information? Was it going to be a hip replacement in the future, like Ginnie had? Ye gads, my body was falling apart!

However, remembering when my elbow hurt and the doctor told me to wear a copper bracelet, I had a little something I wanted to try. I be-bopped into the hardware store and bought a roll of heavy copper wire. At home, I fashioned a copper wire belt using needle nose pliers and side cutters. Hounds place 9th at Missouri Invitational

WENTZVILLE, Mo. – Senior Danen Settles and junior Mason Schau both went 4-1 at the Liberty Invitational on Saturday in Wentzville, Mo to lead Fort Madison to a 9th-place finish.

The Bloodhound were the only out-of-state squad wrestling at the 21-team event and captured 125.5 points. Centralia won the meet with 245 points.

Settles, wrestling at heavyweight, and Schau at 160 lbs, both took 5th place in their respective brackets scoring 13 points each for Fort Madison.

Settles lost to St. Charles' Jayden Wilson at 1:24 for his only loss of the Friday-Saturday tournament. Settles would record three pins at the meet and won his first match by forfeit

Schau lost in a tight 9-7 decision to Terrell Williams of Mexico, Mo., in the quarterfinals and then went on to clean up the bracket with two pins for his fifth-place finish

Gavin Wiseman (132 lbs) and Will Larson (138) also battled to a 5th place finish for Fort Madison.

Wiseman went 3-2 on the weekend coming back through the consolation bracket with two pins to end the meet. Larson also went 3-2 and scored a sudden victory 12-5 in an extended 3rd period. He scored a major decision and a decision in the consolation bracket for 5th.

Head Coach Ryan Smith said it's always good to see different competition, but expected a bit more from his wrestlers.

"It was good competition, but I don't feel like we competed to the best of our abilities," he said.

"It was good to see some new competition, though and we will learn from it and move on to the next challenge."

Owen Kruse (106), Aiden Pennock (145), Chance

Hocker (182) and Levi Lowney (195) all finished in sixth place scoring 9 points each for Fort Madison.




