FORT MADISON - A \$1,000 reward is being offered for information in connection with the Monday morning burglary at Rashid Pharmacy & Wellness in Fort Madison.

Fort Madison Police are looking for suspects involved in the burglary that occurred sometime after 3:30 a.m. Monday.

Pharmacy owner, Joe Rashid, said Monday morning he is offering \$1,000 for information that leads Fort Madison police to the suspects involved in the incident.

Rashid said the burglars cut the phone lines to the building at about 3:30 Monday morning and then broke in a door to see if the alarm had been disconnected.

"They cased the place for about two hours after cutting the lines and then came back and took some narcotics," Rashid said.

He said he couldn't disclose additional information about the theft because the investigation is underway. He said there is video evidence and that will be released today to help with the investigation.

The store was closed for about three hours until

about 11 a.m. when it wasreceivereopened for business.burglaAnyone with infor-7:30 a.

mation on the incident should contact the Fort Madison Police Department at 372-2525.

According to Fort Madison Police Chief Tim Sittig, who was at the scene this morning, authorities received a report of the burglary at approximately 7:30 a.m. Monday morning.

Sittig said investigators reviewed video evidence of the break-in and worked with pharmacy staff to determine what medications and how much were taken.

Our goal wasn't to sway anyone's opinion but to fight for the release of the record. It's our hope to continue to shine a light on public bodies even if that light isn't the best for those public bodies. We also don't hold the district responsible. It's sincerely our opinion that this is a learning curve for everyone.



This year's competition consisted of 20 teams throughout the entire state of Iowa. Students are given a blueprint and materials with 4.5 hours to build. Students come into the competition not knowing what to expect until the blueprint is in their hands and the clock starts ticking. Not only is there a time-pressure, students are only given the materials that they absolutely need. Giving them little room for error.

The FMHS crew was able to finish 20 minutes early while others struggled to finish on time. Kobelt attributes this timeliness to their ability to work efficiency both as a team and independently.

"Most of the teams had to do everything as a group, but the FMHS crew were able to split-off into different side projects and come together to create the finished product." Kobelt said



of the discussion handed out a presentation that went along with a video. The representative said he wasn't really prepared to discuss the specifics of Vikings plans, and asked that the presentations be returned as they weren't ready for public consumption. This was a discussion in front of one of the state's largest cities with an international company, and neither side realized that the information was automatically public when it was handed to elected officials.

Maybe no media was in the room at the time. That's an assumption, but in newspaper's heyday that would have been contested at that moment, at a minimum cleaned up after the meeting.

I can say that covering most public bodies in north Lee County, at one point or another there was an issue where open meetings records or processes came into question and we do our best to question and work with the groups to make sure things are handled correctly. It's not a "gotcha" mentality, but a relationship-building approach.

I didn't take body language classes in high school, but I think I'm pretty good at reading people from the body language. It's no secret that some in the district are upset with the coverage of the video. We just hope it serves to show that we are here to report the news to the best our resources at this point allow.

This business, like all others, is constantly evolving. Relationships change and new sources become part of the fold. It is the sincerest intention of Pen City Current to work with, and not against, our sources and resources. It's our intention to follow the good news, and yes, the unfortunate news. We expend our resources to follow one student eight hours to a state cross country meet just as we would a team.
