Lady Hounds battling illness, injuries in seeking first win

BURLINGTON - Fort Madison Head Coach Todd McGhghy said with a smile after his Lady Hounds dropped a 60-42 loss to Burlington Notre

McGhghy: Hounds close to first win

McGhghy said. He is in his first year in a re-boot of the FMHS girls basketball team.

Fort Madison hung with the Nikes in the first period with the game just two points apart at 12-10 with 1:24 remaining.

Senior Braxtyn McGhghy hit a three pointer at the 2:08 mark from the left wing to give Fort Madison a 10-7 lead, but Notre Dame responded with a 3-ball from Maddie Stutsman. Fort Madison committed back-to-back turnovers and then the Nike's Taylor Ackerman converted from just outside the lane to give Notre Dame its first lead of the game at 12-10.

Fort Madison called a :30 time out to quash the momentum and then Kylie Cashman committed a foul right out of the time out and Ackerman converted both free throws.

Brandy Walker, who's starting to find her stride shooting inside the lane in traffic, converted to cut the lead to 12-14 but three straight turnovers led to an Ackerman 3-pointer at the top of the key to

set the first quarter with Notre Dame up 17-12.

The Lady Hounds shooting then went cold for about two periods. Aside from a Walker bucket, where she yanked down a rare offensive rebound off an Anna Kester miss, FMHS wouldn't convert another bucket until the 5:51 mark of the third period when senior Jassmine Bass scored inside. But with that bucket, the Hounds were down 40-23.

Bass would convert a free throw at 4:31 in the third as the only other point in the quarter for Fort Madison as the Nikes pulled away 44-24 at the end of three.

The Hounds' leading scorer, Maddie Rashid, was held to just four points in the first half. She got hot in the fourth quarter when Fort Madison had cut the lead to a dozen. Rashid scored on a drive from the right side and was fouled by Notre Dame's Molly Johnson. Rashid missed the freebie but the bucket cut the Nikes' lead to 47-35 with five minutes left.

The Bloodhounds held Notre Dame without a bucket in the fourth quarter until Johnson scored from about 8 feet along the baseline at the 4:37 mark. Then the Nikes' Riley Todd hit a long 3-pointer to shut down the Fort Madison comeback attempt.

Kester and Rashid led Fort Madison with 10 points each. Bass had eight points and Walker added seven. Nadia Boeding and McGhghy each finished with three and Dalyn Wondra added a free throw.

McGhghy said he was impressed with the effort the girls gave and said getting that first win is key to the girls' confidence they can play with the other schools in the area.

"Again, they didn't give up. They played 32 minutes," he said. "We got some really good looks at shots again, and those baskets will come. We just need to get that win. We thought we could get one here and there were others here the past week or so that we should have won."

Wilson: Bloodhounds lacked urgency and will to win

leaving Fedler visibly frustrated. So much so at one point, Head Coach Ryan Wilson met him at the free throw line on a time out to try and motivate his post player.

But Notre Dame kept Fort Madison's entire team at bay as the Hounds only managed 15-44 shooting on the night. Senior Logan Rashid was just 4 of 15 on the night, but finished with 12 points to lead Fort Madison.

The Hounds fell behind quickly 9-0 on three straight 3-pointers, two from Gavin Kies and one from Mitchell Brent. Hound freshman Dayton Davis countered with a 3-ball, but the Nikes' Ryle Koenig hit one of his own to keep Fort Madison at bay. Fort Madison would miss its next four shots from the field and trail 3-17 before senior Brandon Keester would score underneath and get fouled by Koenig. Keester missed the free throw and Notre Dame would race to the other end and feed Axel Tjaden for a bucket and a comfortable 19-5 lead for the Nikes.

Davis would connect on another 3-ball for Fort Madison, but that would be all the scoring they would get in the first quarter as Notre Dame, on a 7-0 run to end the quarter, held a 26-8 lead.

Head Coach Ryan Wilson said the Hounds had no urgency and hung their heads after the early poor start.

"Our effort was horrible," he said. "From the tip we just acted like we didn't even wanna be here tonight. We were content beating Danville by nine on Thursday and we were just going through the motions. We thought Notre Dame was gonna come in and lay down. We hung our heads. We had no urgency.... no nothing."

The shooting woes continued for Fort Madison as it seemed the quick, lanky Nikes had an answer for every drive, every quick pass, and every scheme the Hounds

set up. Fort Madison hit just 2 of 12 from the field in the second quarter as Notre Dame raced out to a 42-13 lead at halftime behind Koenig's eight points.

Fedler started the second half with a quick bucket in the lane, but then Fort Madison committed two quick turnovers on the Nike end and another block of a Fedler inside move had the Hounds on their heels again. After Kies scored to make it 46-15, Rashid and Fedler would get back-to-back buckets, but Notre Dame's Nick Skerik would have an answer for that with a 3-pointer from the left wing. Kies would hit another 3-ball. Parker Denning would get on the board with a jumper from about 11 feet to make it 23-52. Notre Dame would go on a 9-4 run through the final four minutes for a lopsided 63-28 lead at the end of three.

The Hounds only got seven shots off in the final period and couldn't make a dent in the large Nike cushion and Wilson began substituting heavily with about three minutes left in the contest.

Fedler finished with 11 points, followed by Davis' eight. Keester had six on the night and Denning had three to round out the scoring for Fort Madison.

Wilson said the Hounds practiced everything the Nikes could throw at them, but just couldn't get anything going and they knew the Nikes would key on Fedler early.

"When you come out and score 41 points, of course they were going to be ready for you," Wilson said. "But we talked about everything these guys were going to do to us and our kids knew what they were going to do. We just didn't execute. There was a huge lack of urgency and will out on the floor tonight I thought."

The 3-4 Hounds host Washington on Tuesday night at the HoundDome and then travel to Mt. Pleasant to wrap things up before the holiday break. The Bloodhounds will have played nine of their 21 regular season games before the break.






