BNSF wants safety item added to depot sublease agreement

FORT MADISON - The Fort Madison City Council will have to vote once again on a finalized version of the sublease agreement with the railroad to move forward with it's decades-long depot relocation.

City Manager David Varley is recommending that the City Council approve the newly requested addition to the agreements that were approved in November.

An agreement will be in front of the council at Tuesday's regular meeting beginning at 5:30 p.m.

The sublease agreements exist between the city, Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railroad, and Amtrak to move the depot from its current location at 1601 20th Street

The city has, for more than 10 years now, been talking to and negotiating with the three entities to put the depot back in the historic depot down in the Riverfront.

After signing the agreements between all three entities in November, BNSF requested that language be added that required any employee or contractor of the city working in the area pass a web-based safety orientation program within one year of entering the premises. The city would also have to renew the orientations annually.

Varley said in his recommendation to the council

Governor Reynolds beefs up Targeted Small Business program

DES MOINES – Gov. Kim Reynolds and Lt. Gov. Adam Gregg, along with the Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA), announced enhancements to the State of Iowa's Targeted Small Business (TSB) program on Monday. Established in 1986, the TSB program is designed to help women, minorities, individuals with disabilities or service-disabled veterans overcome some of the hurdles in starting and growing a small business in Iowa.

"Small business owners drive our state's economy, and their companies are the heart and soul of our communities," Gov. Reynolds said. "Small businesses make up more than 99 percent of Iowa businesses, so it's critical we create an environment where diverse populations can prosper and small businesses can find opportunities and flourish."

Over the past several years, the IEDA, in partnership

with the Iowa Department of Administrative Services and Department of Inspection and Appeals, has made a concerted effort to simplify and streamline the TSB certification process. The latest improvements to the program announced on Monday include the development of an online application portal and upgrades to

the online directory.

"I am pleased to see the TSB program continue to evolve and improve," Lt. Gov. Gregg said. "These new features will minimize hurdles for prospective TSBs and create awareness of, and access to, the diverse small businesses within our state."

To qualify as a TSB, companies must be:

located in Iowa;

- · operating for a profit;
- · making less than \$4 million in gross revenue annually; and
- be 51 percent owned, operated and actively managed by one or more women, minorities, persons with a disability or service-disabled veterans

There is no charge to obtain TSB certification. Benefits of certification include access to the State of Iowa's procurement network, listing in the online TSB directory and business promotion, education and networking opportunities. Additionally, companies with diverse supplier programs recognize TSB certification to verify supplier status.



Fire destroys car/ garage on Ave. E

FORT MADISON - Fort Madison Firefighters were called to the scene of a fully-engulfed garage fire on the city's west side Monday evening at about 6:20 p.m.

When firefighters arrived, the garage of 3408 Avenue E was on fire as was a four-door gold sedan and a large motor home on the outside of the garage.

The home, according to a Lee County Beacon property search, belongs to Delbert Custer. Police evacuated the homes adjacent to the property.

Firefighters were on the scene until 7:40 p.m.

A spokesman at the fire station said the fire is still under investigation and the cause is not known at this time. No injuries were reported as a result of the blaze.







New agreement could yield to much anticipated progress on depot

that the fee for taking the online orientation course is \$20 per person and the city would be footing the bill.

"This is understandable as it relates to construction workers building the passenger platform. However, it also means that anybody who goes on the platform to do maintenance such as remove snow, replace a light bulb, sweep, etc., is required to take this "Safety Orientation" annually and have a card testifying to such on their person."

In order to take the course, employees and contractors would have to set up an account including uploading their photo.

He said the city must sign the updated agreement for Amtrak to sign the three agreements.

The city, along with the Iowa Department of Transportation and Amtrak, are all contributing to the cost of the \$1.2 million platform, but ownership

would revert back to Burlington Northern Santa Fe. They would lease the property to Amtrak, which then leases it back to the city for \$1 per year. The city would be contributing \$360,000, Amtrak would kick in \$150,000 and the difference is paid for with state grants. The city is working to get grants to offset city taxpayers' portion of the cost.

In other action, the council will

- consider a first reading amending Chapter 3 of the city's Health and Sanitation code to reflect the new city trash cart program.
- consider various appointments to boards and commissions.
- -accept completion of the 27th Street and Avenue L intersection improvements at a cost of \$523,963.20.
