Freesmeier to receive IGHSAU distinction

HTC coach to be honored Friday in Cedar Rapids

FORT MADISON – Holy Trinity Catholic volleyball coach Melissa Freesmeier is the 2019 volleyball recipient of the Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union's Golden Plaque of Distinction. Freesmeier will be honored before the start of the Class 1A championship match on Friday, Nov. 15.

The Golden Plaque of Distinction Award honors the

Iowa coach who has demonstrated a successful career while making notable contributions toward school, community and the coaching profession.

Freesmeier is in her 28th season of coaching volley-ball and has taken 18 teams to the state tournament. In that span, she has won two state championships with four state runner-up finishes. She won her first crown in 1996 at West Point Marquette High School and won the 2014 Class 1A state championship at Holy Trinity Catholic.

Freesmeier has won over 900 matches in her career. She has been named the Iowa Girls Coaches Associ-



ation Coach of the Year twice and the NFHS Iowa Volleyball Coach of the Year for the 2017-18 school year. She has been named regional coach of the year 11 times and conference coach of the year

Freesmeier also serves as the girls golf coach at Holy Trinity Catholic and

teaches physical education, outdoor education and health at HTC Junior-Senior High. Melissa has three daughters; Jessica, Jenna and Jordan and two grandchildren.

Supervisors want BNSF to shore up several crossings

Regular meeting will be held Wednesday this week

FORT MADISON – A resolution is in front of Lee County Supervisors about the conditions of railroad crossings on 255th Street and J50 west of the sheriff's office.

The resolution, which is part of Wednesday's regular board meeting, is a message to Burlington Northern Santa Fe railroad officials asking them to make repairs to the crossings before someone gets hurt. The meeting was moved to Wednesday to accommodate the canvassing of the Nov. 5 election results.

The condition of the crossings was brought up several weeks ago during public comment when a Lee County resident asked the county to look into the issue.

The resolution indicates the crossings owned and maintained by BNSU are "are a public hazard for residents of Lee County in that they have deteriorated to the point the crossings are deficient and unsafe..."

The verbage also asks the rail line to alleviate the safety concerns and limit the county residents' exposure to liability by installing proper crossings that are safe for vehicular travel.

In other action, the council will also be considering







Goeckner's colors take over FMAAA in November

FORT MADISON - FMAAA is always humming with activity in November on historic Avenue G. This year is no exception. Fritz Goeckner, equal parts scientist and artist, provides an inviting photographic landscape to the many programs occurring at the art center this month.

The feature gallery is bathed in color that will grab you like the fall colors of the trees. In fact, Fritz has developed a unique style that places his photos in a category like none other. There is no black, no white, nor shades of grey in the city scenes that he journalizes. Lee County Abstract Company is the sponsor for the exhibit this month. Reception occurs November 15th from 5-7pm. Wine tasting from Baxter's Vineyard and Winery will be featured at the program.


Fritz explains, "When photography was invented, color was impossible. Only light and dark could be recorded. More realistic full color photography is now cheaper and easier than black and white. But black and white hasn't been abandoned; it's still widely practiced and well respected. Why is it accept-

able to withhold the color—half the information of the image? It's not just because it's been done before.

The abstract nature of black and white photography allows a rare and useful combination: a perfect "straight" record of the image produced by the lens, and simultaneously and escape from literal realism. Properly used, it is an expressive and even eloquent form. Let's think instead about making the photograph itself in a new way. We can omit light and dark. We can make photographs using only the pure color that's left out of black and white.

An imaginative person might suspect that recording only color is as valid as recording only not-color. Are there good reasons for making such photos? They would provide the same combination as black and white: a perfect, yet non-literal image. And they can express what black and white never can, color and all those things that come from color. What would such pictures look like? Might they be rewarding to make and view? Some of these questions can only be answered by trying." (Editors note: Indeed very rewarding to view!)

With the advent of digital photography everyone with a smart phone can




A reception for Fritz Goeckner, the artist of the rendering will be held Nov. 15 at the FMAAA at 825 Avenue G.
