City wants options on Main Street sidewalk project

Varley wants to have cost-saving options to council next month

FORT MADISON - Very little headway has been made since a July 7 meeting where a consultant said the city is about \$400,000 over budget on a plan to reconstruct city sidewalks and curbs from 6th to 10th Street

Fort Madison City Manager David Varley said Monday the city is directing HR Green & Associates of "

Cedar Rapids to try and find cost-saving measures that can bring the project back down to budget.

The project would replace the city's dilapidated

sidewalk and curbing on Avenue G from 6th to 10th streets at a cost of approximately \$1.5 million.

Funding for the project is from a reimbursement program from the state where interest paid on the city's waste water treatment plant through the state's revolving loan program can be refunded back to the city for a project that helps promote better stewardship of storm water runoff.

However, at the July meeting, city officials were told current designs had the project over budget and HR Green would come back with options for reducing the

BONDURANT - The Fort Madison Lady Hounds volleyball team took 7th place out of 16 teams at this weekend's ballyhooed Skip Anderson Classic in Bondurant-Farrar High School.

The Hounds opened the tournament with a 23-21 win over Class 4A 8th-ranked Waverly Shell Rock, but then dropped the next two sets 8-21 and 13-15. It was the only set Waverly would give up during the tournament.

Fort Madison then knocked off Pella Christian 23-21, 21-15 and Perry 21-7, 19-21, 15-10.

The Hounds also beat Carroll 21-16, 17-21 and 15-13. The other two losses came to Class 4A 5th-ranked Pella 21-15, 21-15 and to Class 2A 6th-ranked Sidney 21-15, 21-15.

Fort Madison started the season ranked 15th in the state in Class 4A. Southeast Conference foe Fairfield is ranked 13th.

On the day Junior Jillian Wiseman had 40 kills and five blocks to lead Fort Madison at the net. Senior Kaeli Hutson had 36 kills to go with 58 digs and served a perfect 47-47 with three aces.

Senior Josie Pumphrey led the Hounds with 100 digs on the day and aces with 14. She went 47-53 from the service line. Sophomore Lauren Bailey had 114 assists for Fort Madison and served a perfect 40-40 with seven aces.

The Hounds open the home season Tuesday night at the Hound Dome in a 9/JV/Varsity stint beginning at 5:45.

Some options include reducing project size by one block

some other options last week because he doesn't want to see the project stripped down if it can be prevented.

"They came back with some options such as cutting a block off the project and that can be done at either end, but either way people aren't going to be happy with that," Varley said. "We'd hate to tell anyone that their block wasn't getting done. So we asked them to come back with other options last week and we haven't heard anything on that request yet."

He said currently, to get the project under budget, the city would have to cut a block off the project and remove planters from the north side of Avenue G. The planters are part of the aesthetics that go with the pervious brick pavers that would butt up against new curbs and go back about six feet. The pavers

also have approved sand and dirt in them that also helps handle stormwater.

The remaining six feet from the pavers to the buildings would be ADA compliant concrete. Below the pervious brick will be four to six feet of a gravel filter base and then storage tanks that slowly allow the filtered water back into the city's regular storm water lines.

Planters on the south side of the Avenue G have to be kept in the project because the only way the south side qualified for the grant money was if the planters were includ-

"We're pushing them to come up with other options," Varley said. "We're giving them one more chance to see what they come up with, then we'll discuss it, but we're waiting for something else because we don't want to have to go to an

extreme."

Varley said the city approached Fort Madison Main Street to see if there were any grants or funds they could contribute to the project, but the group indicated they did not have the funds.

Denicia Wright, coordinator for Main Street, said she was unaware of any grant applications or funding the group has tried to secure for the project, but said Fort Madison's Main Street budget wouldn't have funds to assist the proj-

"Unfortunately no, unless we can find some grant money somewhere, Main Street doesn't have the money for it at this time. Not that I'm aware of," Wright said.

She said cutting off a block from the program would be a disappointment as it wouldn't be fair to the whole district.

Fort Madison Partners **Executive Director Tim** Gobble said he would be willing to meet with the city to see if there is any way Partners could support the city's efforts.

"Obviously, the city has to stay within their means," Gobble said. "Ultimately you'd want to go from 6th to 10th. It's a dire need to get these sidewalks and curbs repaired, but they only get so much money, and they're trying to do everything they can to get it done. I'd be willing to sit down with them and look at it."

Varley said he's hoping to have information on the project to the council before the end of September. Construction on the project is set to begin in March or April, but Varley said getting the project under budget could push that start time back.

FMHS, Silgan put together vocational industrial program

to play a role in keeping the school on track," he told the board during the interview session.

"It's good to give back to the community. I have a personal interest in improving the quality of our school system and want to be a part of what affects our children and our schools"

Steffensmeier said he has his own business and feels he's good at communication and building relationships with those that are integral to the school's interests.

He said he has the time to commit to the position and considers himself a trustworthy individual who is even-tempered and will be willing to work with all parties involved in the school system.

"I have a willingness to collaborate and a sincere interest in our public schools," Steffensmeier told the board.

In other action, the board heard from FMHS Principal Greg Smith who is working on a partnership with Silgan that now has six students engaged in a curriculum to foster industrial maintenance education.

The students will be taking courses at Southeastern Community College's new Keokuk industrial tech lab four days a week and will need to complete 14 courses, which include both computer and lab coursework. After satisfactorily completing the coursework, Silgan will offer job shadowing on-site and then full-time positions could be offered to the students.

Smith said he's also working on partnering with SCC on a future similar nursing program.
