Fort Madison man charged with vehicular homicide

Charge stems from reckless driving in Keokuk boy's death

FORT MADISON – A Fort Madison man has been arrested in connection with the accidental death of a 14-year-old Keokuk boy on April 1.

According to Lee County Attorney Ross Braden, Jeremy Gillette, 18, of Fort Madison, was arrested Friday evening and charged with vehicular homicide as a result of reckless driving.

The charge is a Class C felony punishable by up to 10 years in prison.

Braden said the complaint filed in South Lee County court alleges that the boy was riding his bicycle while holding onto an open window on the 2012 Chevy Impala that Gillette was driving.

The boy, who was identified in earlier reports as Brandon Scott Fitzgerald, lost control of his bicycle and struck his head on the pavement on South 7th Street in Keokuk near the intersection of K Street.

He was taken by Lee County EMS to Unity Point Hospital in Keokuk where he died from injuries sustained in the accident.

Braden said 1st Assistant Lee County Attorney Jonathan Stensvaag filed the complaint Friday.

"This is just a terrible situation – we're talking about kids. The driver himself was still a kid," Braden said.

"We didn't take this charge lightly. We had a pretty good idea what happened, but this is one of those things we wanted to approach cautiously. This wasn't a charge we wanted to throw around lightly because of the young people involved in this accident."

No information on bond was available as of this posting.

FORT MADISON – The Iowa Board of Corrections voted unanimously today in support of the appointment of Randy Gibbs as the next warden of the Iowa State Penitentiary (ISP). This appointment was recom-

mended to the board by Interim Director Dan Craig. Gibbs will replace retiring warden Patti Wachtendorf on May 23, 2019.

Gibbs, a graduate of Burlington High School, and currently the warden of the Clarinda Correctional Facility (CCF), has served in his current capacity since

May of 2017. He started his career with Iowa Corrections as a Correctional Officer at the Anamosa State Penitentiary in 1991. Throughout his career he has held such positions as: Lieutenant, Captain, Training Officer, Treatment Services Director, Associate Warden of Security, and Assistant Deputy Director of Institutional Operations.

Cord Overton, the communications director for the Iowa Department of Corrections, said Wachtendorf's announcement wasn't a surprise to the DOC.

DONALD ISAAC KERR, JR.

Donald Isaac Kerr Jr. of Warsaw IL passed away on April 5th, 2019 at the age of 86.



Don was born November 11, 1932 at Graham Hospital, Keokuk, Iowa to Donald I. Kerr Sr. and Anabel Lyell Kerr of Warsaw, IL, Rocky Run Township.

He attended White Prairie Grade School and graduated from the 8th grade in 1945 and Warsaw High School

in 1950. Don graduated from Western Illinois University in Macomb with a degree in Vocational Agricultural Education in 1953 after which he enlisted in the U.S. Army. He served during the Korean Conflict from 1953-1955 in both Texas and Germany.

On March 6, 1954 he was united in marriage to his high school sweetheart Marilyn (Polly) Thornton at the First Presbyterian Church in Warsaw by the Rev. McMaster Kerr. They enjoyed



5 months together in Germany as Don finished his tour of duty during which they had the opportunity to tour Germany, France, Italy and Switzerland. After his honorable discharge from the U.S. Army in January 1955 he enrolled at the University of Illinois at Urbana. He received both his Bachelor of Science Degree in 1956 and his Master of Science Degree in 1957 while at the University. From 1957-1961 Don was employed as the Agricultural Education Instructor at Wyoming Illinois High School. His love of the farm brought him and his family back to his home town to farm in the Warsaw bottoms in 1961.

Don loved his Lord, his wife (Polly) of 65 years, his family and farming with all of his heart. He was a member of the Hancock County Farm Bureau and served on the Board of Directors for 6 years. He also served on the Hancock County Grain Company Board for 10 years serving as President when the new elevator in Warsaw was built. Don had a 9-year tenure serving on the Warsaw Community District 316 Board of Directors and was President of the Board for a number of years during the time when the New Grade School was built in 1976. Other memberships include the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 05177, the American Legion 0682, Corn Growers Association and the American Soybean Association. Don was a member of the First Christian Church Disciples of Christ Keokuk, Iowa and served as leader of the Sunday School "Friendly Class" for a number of years.

Donald is survived by his wife of 65 years Marilyn (Polly) Kerr; Sons: Donald (Tad) Kerr III (wife Nancy) of Dixon IL, Victor Kerr (wife Rita) of Warsaw IL, Brian Kerr (wife Elizabeth) of Ames IA, Jason Kerr of Nashville TN, and daughter Tracy Sanders (late husband Jerry) of St Paul MN, seven grandchildren: Garrett, Matthew, Rebecca, Sarah, Nicole, Olivia and Nathaniel, brother Robert Kerr (wife Marie), niece Melody Carr, nephew Bob Kerr Jr and cousins.

Don was preceded in death by his parents, grand-parents, aunts and uncles.

Funeral Services will be held at 11 a.m., Tuesday at the First Christian Church, 3476 Main Street, Keokuk IA with Pastor David Turner officiating. Burial with military rites will be held at the Oakland Cemetery, Warsaw IL.

Visitation will be held on Tuesday from 10 – 11 a.m. at the church with family meeting with friends at that time.

DOC looking into ISP staffer's illness

FORT MADISON – Iowa State Penitentiary officials are looking into an incident Friday that caused a staff member to be taken to the hospital

The staff member became extremely ill after coming into contact with an unknown substance that is believed to have come from a bottle of eye drops.

Other staff at the institution quickly quarantined the substance, and the staff member was taken to the local hospital. Her condition has stabilized, and she has been released to recover at home.

The substance that is suspected to have caused the staff member to become ill has been submitted to the State Crime Lab in Ankeny for testing by the Division of Criminal Investigations.

A graveside service with military rites will be held at 1 p.m., Tuesday at the Hickory Grove Cemetery in rural Keokuk with Dawn Farris officiating.



Televisions; tires; radios; VCR's; construction and demolition materials (bricks, concrete, asphalt shingles, lumber, siding, dry wall); liquids (antifreeze, waste oil, paint - paint cans will be accepted ONLY if the lid is off and the contents are either dried or absorbed by saw dust, cat litter, etc.); hazardous materials (explosive materials, volatiles and flammables, poisons); any substance which may present a hazard to collection personnel; and materials that are normally taken under the city yard waste program.

Any Fort Madison Water Utility bill delinquent as of April 15, 2019 will NOT receive the trash vouchers. A voucher MUST be submitted to the clerk upon entry to the landfill. All loads must be tarped. 

Hellige continues to dominate 1600-, 3200-meter runs

WASHINGTON – Fort Madison' Matt Hellige had two first-place finishes at Thursday's wet Demon Relays at Case Field in Washington.

With both Bloodhound boys and girls running against perennial track powerhouse in Mt. Pleasant and loaded Iowa City Liberty, top finishes were hard to come by.

Hellige took first place in the 1600-meter run just nipping Mt. Pleasant's Cody Mertens by .9 seconds at 4:46.07. The junior from HTC running on the Bloodhound squad then turned around and ran away with the 3200-meter run with a time of 10:17.95 a full 16 seconds ahead of the pack.

The shuttle hurdle relay team and freshman Katie Dennis each garnered the highest place winners for the girls. The relay team finished at 1:17.84 good enough for third. The Lady Hounds Raquel Schneider's 1:17.71 earned fourth in the 400 hurdles, while the 4×800 meter relay team also finished fourth with a time of 12:05.00.

For the boys other top five finishers, Quentin Schneider motored to a third place in the 400 hurdles with a time of 59.22 and finished fourth in the 100 meters with a 12.15 time. Sheymouhr Redd-Donald also earned a fourth place with a 24:90 in the 200. The 110 shuttle hurdle relays squad also took fourth place.

The boys 4×100 and Sprint Medley teams both earned 5th place finishes.

As a team the Bloodhound boys finished with 66 points behind Mt. Pleasant, Washington, and Iowa City Liberty. and Washington. The girls finished in eighth place with 41 points.
