# Holtkamp named Holy Trinity's Teacher of the Year

FORT MADISON – Fourteen-year veteran Holy Trinity Elementary teacher Teri Holtkamp knew about 10 seconds into Lucy Arevalo's nomination that she was going to be the teacher of the year.

The award was presented as part of the Holy Trinity Catholic school system's annual Blue and Silver Celebration Saturday night to honor teachers and raise funds that contribute to, among other things,

the holiday bonuses for teachers.

Arevalo was called up by School Board President Steve Link to read the nomination that was summed up by Arevalo telling Holtkamp she was, "the best teacher I've ever had."

The Iowa Wesleyan

University graduate has been teaching for close to 20 years and said she was shaking after hearing her name in the young girl's nomination letter.

"I was absolutely shocked and didn't know what to

# City planning for 2008 flood levels

Current models show waters should crest at around 20 feet

FORT MADISON – With river levels expected to crest at just over 21 feet on Wednesday, city and county officials are preparing for flooding along the Mississippi River that could compare to 2008 levels.

Fort Madison Public Works Director Larry Driscoll wrote in an email to Pen City Current on Friday that he is preparing for a 21-foot river level. However, he indicated the city isn't at high risk looking at current flooding projections

The National Weather Service flood monitoring out of the Quad Cities has the Burlington river flood crest at 20'1" Tuesday, March 19 through March 20, before it

starts to recede. That mark puts flooding in the "major flooding" category on the site. River levels are projected through Thursday and remain in the 'major' flooding category with forecasts at over 19 feet on Thursday.

Burlington has a flood stage of 15 feet and is currently 16'-9" as of Saturday morning. The NWS also tracks flooding in Keokuk, but doesn't show a snapshot for Fort Madison.

Keokuk has a flood stage of 16 feet and is forecast to crest at 19'-7" on Tuesday, which is also considered "major" flooding by the NWS. As of 9 a.m. Saturday, the Mississippi was at 15'-2" in Keokuk.



Numerous breeds of K9's were present: Belgian Malinious, German Shepards, Labradors as well as Golden Retrievers. ISP has utilized K9's since 1994, primarily utilizing the Belgian Malinious, but recently ISP Handler Michael Barnes, added a Golden Retriever. The Golden, named Zeus was recently certified in contraband, which consists of tobacco and electronics. Zeus is the first dog in the State of Iowa to be certified in those areas.

First Place Over-All with his dog Justice. ISP Handler Dustin Yager won 6th place over all with his K9 Maverick.

think. I don't even think I heard the rest of her speech," Holtkamp said after receiving a glass plaque and \$250.

She said the students, parents, and co-workers are what makes Holy Trinity a special place to work.

"I think it's just great how much our parents support us here every year," Holtkamp said. "This provides a good bonus for all the teachers here at Christmas time and I just want to thank everyone for that."

She said teaching has changed a lot in the past two decades with technology changing the education environment almost on a daily basis.

"We don't even hardly use textbooks anymore. When we need to look up the meaning of a word, you just look it up on your computer. You don't even use a dictionary," she said.

"It's certainly brought a different dimension to teaching. Everything is right at your fingertips."

The wife and mother of four said the teaching model has changed a lot since she got into the profession.

"It's no longer teacher-to-student, but now a student-to-student model in a collaborative environment," Holtkamp said. "We still have to teach state assessment goals, but the teaching role is changing."

Her children Kyle, Brant, Abby and Megan all attend or have attended Holy Trinity Catholic schools.







along the riverfront.

"We have sealed off the city owned building at Riverview and Monday we will be dropping off sand bags for the Old Museum location along Avenue H and 10th street. We will also be setting up material at the Waste Water Treat-

ment Plant," he said.

"At this time and projected level we are not at much risk. The ground is wet and spring is just getting here and I think the river will be high much of the spring season. But we'll be ready for flooding up to or around the 2008 level.

Steve Cirinna, the Lee County Emergency Management Agency Coordinator, said the forecast flood crest for Burlington raised a foot from 19'-4"Thursday night to a 20'-4" forecast Friday morning, which was a surprise to him.

He said a Wednesday conference call with the NWS indicated that crests shouldn't get over 20 feet with projected weather models, but things can change.

"As long as we don't have any rain or heavy snow melt, which they weren't seeing on Wednesday, it shouldn't get above 20 feet," Cirinna said Friday.

"I don't think it's a major issue right now. It will bring in some high water, but I think the problem is going to be fluctuating temps up north. If they remain colder that should ease the snow melt," he said.

Temps will have biggest

impact on area flooding

"But they must have seen something Friday morning that indicated possible more snow melt because we don't see any rain."

Cirinna said if the temperatures warm up quickly in the north, that's when problems could start.

"If that pack melts all at once, obviously we're going to have a lot of water that could match or exceed 2008 or even 1993 numbers. It will be dependent on what that snow pack does up north at end of March and the first part of April. With water as high as it is now, it wouldn't have time to get back down."

He said if there is anything good about this type of snow melt flooding, it's that the officials can see it coming.

"Everybody is making preparations now, so we're not going to get caught with our hands in our pockets," Cirinna said. "If there's anything good about this type of flood"

ing, it's that we can see it coming. In 1993 and to an extent 2008, we were surprised due to the rain."

Sand resources are limited, however, Cirinna said. He said he's let all the governmental agencies know that sand available through the Army Corp. of Engineers is limited due to other issues in the country.

"That's the other issue for us right now. I've given sand bags to cities and the county to protect critical infrastructure,' he said. "I get that from the Army Corp. We request it from the state and they go to the Corp. But it's limited, so I'm letting people know they should start looking for it now."
