Kensington goes purple for Alzheimer's



Community joins hands at senior living center

FORT MADISON - The Kensington went purple Friday afternoon as more than 200 community members held hands in a group hug Friday afternoon at the Kensington to recognize the daily struggle of those with Alzheimer's.

The Kensington, as part of the Alzheimer's Assocation's Longest Day campaign, handed out purple balloons, donned purple t-shirts and invited the community out to the facility to join in a human chain to try and wrap the Kensington building in a group hug on Avenue H between 22nd and 23rd streets in Fort Madison.

Leia Morrison, who was named the new director of The Kensington in April, said for the first year hosting the event, she was happy with the turnout.

"It's a reference to the Alzheimer's Association," she said. "They have the Longest Day which is typically summer solstice, the longest day of the year. We wanted to do something a little different. They usually ask to raise funds at that time, but we wanted to do something that showed support. This is a multi-generational disease. It affects kids and family members, so it was really just for the community to come out and say we're here to kind of get the longest embrace."

More details of Thursday crash released

FORT MADISON - The Lee County Sheriff's office says driver fatigue may have been to blame in the cause of an accident Thursday afternoon on the Hwy.

The mishap occurred at approximately 4:46 p.m. when emergency crews were dispatched to mile marker 18 on the bypass, about one mile north of the city's west on ramp.

The nature of the incident was a car accident where two cars had collided and multiple injuries were

When deputies arrived at the scene, they found a vehicle that had been driven by Kendrick Seville of Keokuk, Iowa, in the northbound lanes of Highway 61 facing north, but torn nearly in two pieces. Seville was with his wife Rutchel Seville and their two minor children. All the occupants of this vehicle were injured. One child was



ejected from the vehicle and suffered major injuries.

Lafrenz earns Rotarian "Guardian of Integrity" award

FORT MADISON -District 6000 Governor Mike Ruby presented Fort Madison Rotarian Matt Lafrenz with the Paul E. Hellwege Guardian of Integrity Award.

The award is named after the late Past District Governor Paul E. Hellwege of Boone (1954-55) who, at the time of his death in 2010 had been a past district governor for more than half of the 105-year existence of Rotary, whose life exemplified integrity.

It was the eighth year for the awards that were created in 2010 to recognize individuals who

have made contributions that foster the development of integrity.

The award honors individuals who have made contributions in business, media, academia or government and who have by their actions, writing, policies and public pronouncements strengthened and fostered development of integrity and ethical practices – and who have made sacrifices and/or undertaken risks to uphold Rotary's Core Value of Integrity.

Award Winner Fort Madison Rotarian Matt Lafrenz is in the insurance business. He is an actively involved citizen of his community, working with various service projects that benefit Fort Madison and the smaller Illinois town of Niota, where his business is located.

Already the chair of the Chamber of Commerce Ambassador Club, Matt jumped into Rotary service as a new member by serving two years as president. His creative thinking provided the notion of a child-focused community project and his leadership skills inspired other community organizations to partner to create what became a free annual event. But it all begins at home, where Matt is a great father to his three young kids.

Freshman Thornton shuts out BND 16-0

WEST POINT - Holy Trinity Catholic's Cole Thornton threw four innings of shutout baseball giving up just one hit as HTC unleashed a 16-0 rout of Burlington Notre Dame Thursday night at South Park.

The freshman kept Nike hitters off balance in the run-shortened affair only fanning one and walking two in facing just 15 hitters in the game.

"Cole did a nice job on the mound and also made some good plays fielding his position," said head coach Albert Schinstock.

Thornton also helped offensively with a twoout double in the second inning that scored senior Collin Thornton from second.

Sophomore Reed Fehseke led the Crusaders at the plate going 3-for-3 with two RBI and three runs

scored. Fehseke scored the first run of the game in the bottom half of the first on a Kyle Bredemeyer single to right center.

But the real damage came in the bottom of the second when Vason Thurman opened the inning with a single to left. Two batters later senior Zander Schweiss reached on an error with Thurman moving to second. A wild pitch put Thurman and Schweiss in scoring position with just one out.


Quentin Schneider grounded to short scoring Thurman to five the Crusaders a 2-0 lead. Then the Crusaders, who have been cursed a good part of the year being scored on with two outs, turned the tables and got backto-back singles from Jason Thurman and Fehseke. Thurman's single plated Schweiss. Fehseke's hit moved Thurman to second and they both advanced on a wild pitch. Collin Thornton drew a walk to load

the bases and Bredemeyer singled to center to score Fehseke.. Thornton scored on his brother's double before Vason Thurman fanned to end the inning HTC 6-0.

Thornton gave up a walk to the Nike's Mitchell Brent, one of only five base runners on the night for Notre Dame, to start the third, but then threw just six more pitches getting a fly out, line out, and ground out to end the inning.

The Crusaders then jumped all over Nike freshman Brady Oleson, plating the first eight batters of the inning. Notre Dame brought in reliever Lucas Anderson to face the top of the lineup with no outs but the barrage continued highlighted by a two run double from Collin Thornton. Schneider had two RBI in two at bats in the inning, both singles.

"The boys were hitting the ball hard and early. They got on top quick

and were able to get in the Nike's heads," Schinstock said. "It's great to see our team starting to get some confidence out there. They are a young, talented team with a very bright future."

With the Crusaders putting up eight runs, Anderson finally got

Collin Thornton to ground into a third-out fielder's choice forcing Fehseke at second to end the rally but notching the 15-run rule after four.

Cole Thornton gave up a two out single to Brent and plunked Trenton Blythe before getting Anderson to ground out to deep short to end the game.

The Nikes fall to an even 11-11 on the year, while the Crusaders move to 7-11 on the season and now enjoy a rare three-day break over the weekend before traveling to Van Buren on Monday night.

Report shows driver fell asleep in Hwy. 61 bypass mishap

All of the Sevilles were seat belted and/ or in child safety restraint seats.

The second vehicle was driven by George "Tony" Sargent of Keokuk, Iowa. Sargent was traveling north on US Highway 61 with four minor children in his vehicle when the southbound vehicle driven by Seville struck the bridge railing and caused it to go airborne coming to rest in and striking thei the side of the vehicle driven by Sargent, causing moderate damage to the driver's side of his vehicle. No injuries were reported from any of the occupants in Sargent's vehicle.

All the Seville family members were treated at the scene by Lee County EMS and Montrose Fire and Rescue. All were transported to the FMCH for injuries and one child was later transported to the University of Iowa Hospitals for injuries suffered from the crash and ejection.

The cause of the accident was determined to be that Mr. Seville had fallen asleep and drove into the median and lost control of his vehicle, a Honda Pilot, resulting in the crash. Seville will be cited for failure to maintain control of his vehicle at a later date.

"It needs noted that Law Enforcement and Emergency Responders were assisted on the scene by many good Samaritans and Mr. Sargent and his passengers. Their assistance at such a traumatic scene is appreciated," Lee County Sheriff Stacy Weber wrote in a release this morning.

The deputies were assisted at the scene by the Iowa State Patrol, Iowa DOT, Montrose Fire and Rescue, Lee County EMS, Fort Madison Police Department, Iowa DNR and LeeComm Dispatchers.

Due to federal privacy guidelines, condition reports on the injured will not be available.
