LCEDG cuts Steil, CEO position in restructuring

Press release says cut was needed to help with 2023 fundraising commitment

KEOKUK - A restructuring at Lee County Economic Development group has resulted in the elimination of CEO Joe Steil's position effective immediately.

The group issued a statement Thursday afternoon indicating the group needed to eliminate Steil's position to help meet the commitments of the group's 2023

fundraising campaign. Steil was hired in the fall of 2016 to replace Steve Bisenius, who had led the group for more than eight years.

Dennis Fraise, the current chief operating officer for LCEDG said current staff and board will absorb the position.

"I can't speak to what will happen

down the road, but we won't have a functioning CEO," Fraise said Wednesday afternoon. "We're in a transitional phase obviously, and there's a plan moving forward that Dana (Millard) and I working on, along with the board. We have a good partnership and a great board."

The decision to eliminate the position came before

the City of Fort Madison balked at the final payment in a five-year pledge to the group on Tuesday night. Several city paid and elected officials were not happy with a presentation last month, when Steil clarified some information as to the length of the city's current funding commitment to LCEDG. However at Tuesday's meeting, Mayor Brad Randolph said not budgeting the fifth-year commitment to LCEDG was an "oversight" on the city's part.

Steil was not at Tuesday's meeting where Fraise addressed the city council on the progress LCEDG is making in the area, highlighting some of key areas of growth and reputation of the group's state and national-

# Federal jury awards Orascom contractor \$62.4M in damages

Louisiana subcontractor sued Egypt-based Orascom for breach of contract at IFC

WEVER - A subcontractor that helped build the \$3 billion Iowa Fertilizer Company plant in Wever was awarded a \$62 million verdict on Friday, according to an Associated Press report in the Des Moines Register.

A federal jury awarded Maintenance Enterprises LLC, a Louisiana company \$62.4 million as a result of default on a contract constituting a breach. Jesse Harris, a spokesperson for Orascom E&C USA Inc. said the company is currently considering it's legal options. "Orascom E&C USA Inc. (OEC) is incredibly proud of its work to construct the Iowa fertilizer plant– the first world-scale nitrogen fertilizer facility built in the United States in nearly 30 years," Harris wrote in a statement to Pen City Current.

FORT MADISON - Congressman Dave Loebsack made an afternoon stop at the ever-growing Woodland Heights in the peak of election season and said he was impressed with the community spirit behind the effort. Woodland Heights is a subdivision construction project of Green Oak Development, owned by Michael and Jillian Mohrfeld of Fort Madison. Thirteen of the 23 units that are part of the current subdivision perched on top of the bluffs overlooking Fort Madison and the Mississippi River valley, are already sold. Mohrfeld broke ground on the new housing in May of 2017. An open house has been set at Woodland Heights for Nov. 3-5 from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.

"They, to me, demonstrate what entrepreneurship is all about in this country," Loebsack said. "They've taken a lot of risk and some chances, but it looks awfully nice to me. To see something





# FSA to disburse \$43M to risk coverage enrollees

Additional \$392M in CRP payments to Iowa farmers

DES MOINES - USDA Iowa Farm Service Agency (FSA) Executive Director, Amanda De Jong, announced that nearly \$43 million will be paid to Iowa farms that enrolled in Agriculture Risk Coverage (ARC) and Price Loss Coverage (PLC) for 2017 market downturns. Additionally, Iowa FSA will distribute \$392 million in Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) rental payments to landowners for their commitment to conservation stewardship.

"ARC and PLC were authorized by the 2014 Farm Bill

to protect farmers against unexpected drops in crop prices or revenues," De Jong said. "These payments help provide reassurance to Iowa farm families who continue to persevere, even in this tough farm economy."

According to De Jong, PLC payments have triggered for 2017 barley, canola, corn, grain sorghum, wheat and other crops. In the next few months payments will be triggered for rice, chickpeas, sunflower seeds, flaxseed, mustard seed, rapeseed, safflower, crambe, and sesame seed. Producers with bases enrolled in ARC for 2017 crops can visit www.fsa.usda.gov/arc-plc for updated crop yields, prices, revenue and payment rates. In Iowa, 99 counties have experienced a drop in price and/or revenues below the benchmark price established by the ARC or PLC programs and will receive payments.

in southeast Iowa through the employment of 3,000 workers and partnerships with a wide range of local businesses and contractors. The disputed contract amount with Maintenance Enterprises

LLC, a Louisiana subcontractor, represents about one percent of the total work involved in this project. We are considering what legal options are appropriate at this time." Court records indi-

cate Orascom E&C USA breached a contract when it fired Maintenance Enterprises in October 2015, and refused to pay for work or allow the company to retrieve tools and some equipment from the

site. The Iowa Fertilizer Company plant, located in Wever, officially

opened in April of 2017 with close to \$100 million in tax benefits from the state and Lee County.

"It's important to remember that ARC and PLC payments by county can vary because average county yields will differ," De Jong said.

Also, this week, USDA will begin issuing 2018 CRP payments to support voluntary conservation efforts on private lands. In Iowa, 54,631 farms will receive compensation for their efforts to improve water quality, reduce soil erosion and improve wildlife habitat.

"Since its inception in the 1980s, CRP has built upon the voluntary participation of farmers and landowners to take sensitive land out of production and establish land cover to improve the environment," De Jong said.

ly recognized Grow Lee programs.

Fraise said, as with any organization, return on value is always being evaluated.

"Like any organization, public and private, you're always looking at percentage you pay on wages. That's always a concern. Unfortunately, sometimes you have to make tough decisions and say, 'what's the best thing for our stakeholders and how do we return value," Fraise said.

He said the board and staff will be absorbing Steil's responsibilities. Millard, the LCEDG marketing and communications director, said the move won't slow down the strides the group is making.

"I don't foresee this slowing down our momentum at all. As we move forward with Lee County 2023, we have that capacity to execute our plans," she said.

Lee County 2023 -Forward Together is the group's current five-year strategic plan.

Steil wasn't able to be reached for comment, but did send an email to the Pen City Current after the announcement was made. Steil also sits on the Mid-American Port Authority and the Southeast Iowa Regional Riverboat Commission, and the Tri-State Summit - Broadband Task Force, in addition to other volunteer groups.


"I wish the Lee County EDG SUCCESS in the future for the mutual benefit of all SE Iowa and the area," he wrote.

LCEDG established a capital campaign goal through 2023 of \$1.3 million to \$1.6 million, to implement an aggressive public/private economic development initiative in Lee County.

like this happening is inspirational because we can actually build new homes and people will buy them and occupy them and I think it will help rejuvenate the economy. It really speaks to the community spirit here."

Mohrfeld said he subcontracts the major pieces of construction like concrete and framing, but the finishers and painters are Mohrfeld employees. The family also owns Mohrfeld Electric in Fort Madison so a lot of the work is being done by that staff. The project has an \$8 million price tag.

"I think it's fantastic that you folks took the risk and did this," Loebsack said on the tour. "It's what communities need.

this type of construction and activity. As I said earlier, this brings people in with new construction in an old town. This is a great opportunity for people moving into the area."

Dennis Fraise, Chief Operating Officer with Lee County Economic Development Group, said the homes provide a market for company executives and doctors.

"There are plant managers that have already moved up here," he said. "It's a big issue. Our industries have really good positions, but the housing doesn't sometimes match the position. Something like this is huge because it's a recruitment issue and I know, even for the hospital when you look at

physicians, it's important to have housing that fits the bill," Fraise said.

He said the project brings energy to the city.

"Just when you drive up here and look at this, you're like, 'Whoa."

Mohrfeld said Green Oak started with the fertilizer plant and the 6,000 people that were going to build that facility needed housing. He said he knew he wouldn't be building specifically for them, because they would be temporary. But there would need to be housing in the area.

"Real estate has been stagnant in Fort Madison with the newest construction being about 40 years ago," Mohrfeld said. "Then the fertilizer plant came in and that was 6,000 people. We knew

we weren't building for them, but buyers were going to take a risk and say, 'Hey I can pay down on this and then sublet it. We knew there would be different plays to get those workers housed," Mohrfeld said.

The Woodland Heights condominiums have twoand three-car garages. Three of the buildings have three condos each, while seven of the buildings have two units each. Three of the two units are single level on grade and the rest are split levels with walkout basements. All the condos are maintenance-free and are situated around a pond that

has been stocked with fish and has a gathering area with led lighting along the decorative fencing that borders the pond.

"




