Cruise line to begin docking in FM Aug. 6

American beefs up stops 40% in 2019 with 14 stops

FORT MADISON - With American Cruise Lines sealing a deal to dock at Fort Madison on their way up and down the Mississippi River, plans are quickly coming together to welcome the passengers.

A cruising schedule was released Wednesday and city officials, who were expecting to see 10 dockings this year, were surprised to see 14 on the list



What was more surprising was the time of the layovers in town. Seven of the 14 tours will have six hour ports of call, and the other seven

hours.

City Manager David Varley said both the itinerary changes are good for the city, but unexpected.

"Actually, I was expecting about a

three to four hour call," Varley said after Tuesday night's City Tourism Board meeting.

He said officials with the cruise line have been meeting with Fort Madison's part-time tourism director Jean Peiton to work out the details of the calls.

Peiton said the cruise line has already done it's homework.

"They've been secret shopping us for a while," Peiton said. "They have itineraries set up and are making plans, but not all of the details have been worked out yet."

She said the cruise line has already set up Trailways buses that will provide one city tour on the six hour stays, but

will have two tours on the 8.5 hour layovers.

Varley said the city has already had calls from individuals in town who want to help volunteer when the boats arrive. He's also had calls from many people inquiring about getting permits to sell items.

The America is one of three boats that will be docking at the Fort Madison riverfront when American Cruise Lines begins ports of call here on Aug. 6.

Alliant enacts appliance cycling due to heat

CEDAR RAPIDS – Alliant Energy's Iowa energy company is taking proactive steps to reduce costs for customers because of today's heat.

Energy prices can increase during intensely hot days like today. To reduce the impact of rising energy prices on monthly bills we are activating our voluntary Appliance Cycling program for Thursday and continue to monitor the weather forecast to determine if it is needed for Friday too.

We will remotely control central air conditioners for participating customers in the central and southern zone in Iowa. This applies to electric, residential customers located along and south of Highway 20, extending to the southern border of the state.

Participants will see their central air conditioner cycled in 15-minute intervals from 1 p.m. to 7 p.m. The blower fan will continue to circulate the cooler air already in the home.

The program reduces peak energy use on the overall energy grid, which lowers costs for customers. The last time we activated the program was July 12, 2018.

Program details: Who does this affect – This is a voluntary program for Alliant Energy's Iowa residential customers. When does this start and stop – The cycling goes from 1 p.m. to 7 p.m., July 18, 2019. How do customers save money – Our program syncs air conditioners across the state to reduce the number running at any one time. This reduces the amount of energy we need to generate or purchase on peak days. The energy cost, or fuel cost, line item on bills reflects the cost of generating and purchasing energy for customers, which changes every month based on actual costs.

Residential customers who have enrolled their central air conditioning unit get a credit on their bill of \$8 per month from June through September – even if it doesn't get warm enough to cycle appliances.

Zac Efron, a statement reflecting the close rapport the two have already developed in just three weeks.

"That's probably the only time I'll be referenced to Zac Efron," Woodley chuckled.

Woodley grew up in Donnellson and graduated from Central Lee High School. He has a bachelor's degree in Music Education and a master's in educational leadership.

He was an instructor at Central Lee for 13 years and taught for 10 years prior to that in the Grundy Center, West Liberty, and Wapello school districts.

"Certainly, I'm excited to be here at Holy Trinity and growing up in this area, I've always known that HTC takes great pride in the academics and not only that, but arts and athletics as well," he said.

Woodley said he's had interaction with the staff and students at HTC and found them all to be top of the line.

"When this came open, I thought this would be a perfect opportunity to get into administration, but to still stay in the area and work with these students, great staff, and community," he said.

He said to start off, he wants to get to know the staff and student body and see what he can do to support the needs of the staff.

"We want our staff to be successful because, ultimately, when they're successful, our students are successful," Woodley said.

Sheerin said Woodley brings another dimension to the system's dedication to personalized education and individual instruction.

"I'm Hugh Jackman where I've convinced him to come in for \$9 and buy into this circus we call Holy Trinity, which at times, can appear to be a 3-ring circus," Sheerin said continuing the "The Greatest Showman" analogy.

"But the entertainment value for people going out is hopefully second to none."

Sheerin said the district takes tremendous pride in the students who graduate and hopes Woodley will be able to personalize that track even more.

"That means through teacher certification and continuing education, and finding the niches that our individual students have and helping them propogate that into the best futures for them," Sheerin said.

He said Woodley will be his own individual and will

"We'll be a little like Abbott and Costello, or Laurel and Hardy. And you probably have readers who hear they didn't get along behind the scenes, but we're working on that face value entertainment."

Woodley said the physical improvements HTC has taken on at both the elementary and junior/senior high in the past two years was a factor in his decision.

"It's fantastic. It truly is. Even in this building I see our custodians doing things, updating and keeping things fresh and clean. Whether in West Point or here in Fort Madison, the building represents a lot to the community and the students as well."

The high school is currently undergoing IT upgrades, has renovated the chapel in the school, and is currently getting a new roof. He said the volunteer crew that maintains the grounds do an outstanding job.

The system currently has roughly 315 students, and Woodley and Sheerin said the focus is on sustainability and growth where possible.

"Being consistent in enrollment is more important to me than spikes in numbers because we want people to choose us for the right reason. We don't want to be the flavor of the day," Sheerin said.

Woodley said the new buildings, upgrades, and maintained look help keep enrollment going.

"We need to – granted I'm only 18 days into the job – but we need to continue to promote our academics here. When students graduate and go on to college or the military or whatever, they've gone on to do great things from here," he said.

"Our activities, as well, makes this a positively unique situation within the community."

Sheerin said the system has several openings including Science, English, Social Studies, and IT.

"For catholic education, sometimes it's cyclical. They are brand new and start off here and within three to five years we lose them," he said.

"The upside is that they cut their teeth here and learn their craft here and they go on to take the stories of HTC into their new positions which we basically, as a school community, helped them to be able to do. Isn't our overriding goal to get our students on to college and better positions? Why wouldn't we want the same for our staff?"



City issues grass clipping reminder

FORT MADISON – While it may seem a great solution to simply blow grass clippings into the street, remember it is illegal to leave grass clippings on the roadway because it is dangerous and can cause drainage/sewage problems.

Consider either composting or leaving the clippings to naturally break down in your yard (this is like free fertilizer!). In fact, the best way to dispose of the clippings is to use mulching blades on the mower. They have a special shape that shreds the grass after cutting and deposits it on the lawn.

Grass clippings, leaves, and other debris have a tendency to "clump" in storm drains and in the sewers. As it builds up, this can cause the drains to back up since they're not performing at their peak. This, in turn, can cause flooding or drainage issues in the street and our neighborhoods, and that's something we all want to avoid.

Freshly cut grass is slippery and can cause a motorcyclist or bicyclist to lose traction and crash. Engineers have calculated that the coefficient of friction of fresh grass clippings is almost as slick as grease.

Please help your neighbors and the whole city by not blowing grass or debris into the street.

Loebsack touts wage bill passage

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Congressman Dave Loebsack released the following statement today after the House passed the Raise the Wage Act on a bipartisan vote. This legislation would gradually raise the minimum wage to \$15 by 2025 and index future



increases to median wage growth to ensure the value does not again erode over time.

This increase would give 33 million workers nationwide a raise, including 131,000 people living in Iowa's Second Congressional District. Nationwide, there has been no raise in the minimum wage in over a decade, leading to a 17 percent pay cut due to inflation for those living in states like Iowa that are stuck at the current \$7.25 wage.

LOEBSACK

"Having grown up in poverty, I know what it is like to sit around the

kitchen table and worry about how the bills are going to get paid. Anyone working 40 hours or more per week should not be living in poverty, which is the case for millions of people across the country who are stuck at the current minimum wage." Loebsack wrote in a statement Thursday.

"It has been over a decade since the minimum wage has been increased, the longest period in U.S. history, and in order to maintain a basic standard of living, it is imperative that the wage is increased. I will continue to work with my colleagues on both sides of the aisle to create good paying jobs and grow the economy here at home."

City working with volunteers, businesses on plans

ful there. I'm not sure we want to have a gauntlet of vendors awaiting the passengers when they get off," he told the commission.

Mayor Brad Randolph said news is good news, but he said the city doesn't have too many chances to make a good first impression.

"We're going to be bringing 150-200 people into town 14 times. That's 2,500 people and we have to have a plan," he said Wednesday afternoon.

Randolph said he was informed today that the trips will include new visitors, so you won't have the same people visiting on a return trip back up or down the river.

"I was told just today that these will be all new people on each stop. So the people coming to Fort Madison on those boats will essentially be new people each time," he said.

He said he was surprised at the length of the stops as well as the intention of the cruise line to promote itinerary's that keep guests in town.

Peiton said she has been reaching out to area groups like the Fort Madison Chamber of Commerce, local clubs, the United Way's Retired Senior Volunteer Program and other groups to help set up welcoming committees and activities for when the boats arrive.
