## Smash Mouth, Jon Pardi highlight 2017 rodeo

*Up-and-comer Cody Johnson to take stage Thursday night*

BURLINGTON - Only shootin' stars break the mold, and The Tri-State Rodeo always bring their share of stars.

The TSR committee announced their national entertainment lineup on Saturday at the Boogaloo Cafe in Burlington. In addition to the wildly popular CINCH Shootout on Wednesday, this year's national entertainment is set to include rock band Smash Mouth and national country recording stars Jon Pardi and Cody Johnson.

The 70th annual rodeo will be held September 6-9 and showcases exciting rodeo acts as well as professional musi-

cal entertainment. And once again this year, new and exciting things are planned for audiences of all ages.

Wednesday night will once again feature the CINCH Shootout featuring the top rodeo cowboys in the nation. This invitation only event will begin at 7:00 p.m. and will bring elite athletes, including many World Champions, to the Tri-State Rodeo in Fort Madison to compete for over \$120,000 in prize money. 7:30 p.m. and will be followed by Smash Mouth. Twenty years after their award winning Fush Yu Mang (FYM) album debuted, Smash Mouth,

Saturday night's entertainment also gets underway at 7:30 p.m. with the PRCA rodeo performers taking center stage. ## Neighborhood watch group wants to help with cemetery flags

FORT MADISON - Not only is this neighborhood group helping fight crime, but now they are taking on a big patriotic task.

The 34th Place Neighborhood Watch, a group of neighbors that have banded together to help protect each other's property and well-being, are now asking for the community's help in replacing the flags on Soldier's Circle in Oakland Cemetery on Avenue O.

The group says the flags are in poor condition and there is no budget anywhere to replace the flags. The Fort Madison Fire Department has taken on the responsibility of putting up and bringing down the flags, but nothing is in place to replace the flags.

"The VFW used to put up all the flags out there, but

they're not here anymore," said group member Berl Cartwright.

"The fire department, through family ties, just kind of inherited the flags and put them up, but there is no funding anywhere whatsoever, to replace those flags."

The flags cost \$32.90 each if purchased in groups of more than 50, so the group is looking to raise \$2,000 to purchase enough flags to replace the worn ones or have flags donated, but they are asking that the flags have the dimensions of 5.5' x9' and be all-nylon, all-weather flags.

What we're trying to do on Soldier's Circle is help the fire department who has said they are all torn and tattered," said Lorie Seager another of the group's members. "We don't necessarily want to do a fundraiser, but more of a 'would you like to

donate a flag' or they can donate money to the project. We thought even if we got more donations than we need then we could just box them up and give them to the fire department and say 'Here's some backups.'"

The group is hoping to have enough flags to replace the worn ones by Memorial Day so they are setting a May 12 goal to have enough flags donated or money raised to purchase the flags.

Two of the group's members have volunteered to take all calls to make donations and provide additional information. Jan Gill can be reached 319-372-7475 and Lorie Seager can be reached at 319-470-9376.

Anyone interested in donating a flag or donating money to the project, would need to call these two ladies," said group member Steve Howard.

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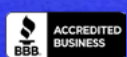

# Lady Hounds take FMHS net invitational

FORT MADISON - The FMHS girls tennis team is winning key match ups and excelling in doubles work as they continue their winning ways this year.

The Hounds hosted a six-team invitational on Saturday and came away with the title as they capitalized on three runners up with two singles and doubles second-place finishes.

The invite scoring gave four points to each first-place finish for each school, with 2nd, 3rd and 4th receiving three, two, and one point, respectively.

The Hounds got 2nd place finishes from Katie Larson at No. 1 singles and Hope Gray at No. 2 singles. Kearnstyn Johnson and Larissa Ferrill took 2nd in No. 1 doubles, while Mercedee Doty and Charissa Smith took

fourth place in No. 2 doubles.

Larson came up against 2016 state runner-up Anatta Charoenkul in the championship match at No. 1 singles and took the first game off her. But after sizing up Larson a bit and some long rallies in the first and second

games, Charoenkul was able to pull away for an 8-1 win.

“The girl Larson lost to was state runner up last year,” said Head Coach Amy Doherty. “She is super good and Katie loves to have the opportunity to play her because it helps her to improve.”

Larson advanced with an 8-4 win over Mt. Pleasant’s Thuan Tran 8-4, and then slid easily by Deepika Vempathi of Fairfield Maharishi 8-0 to face off against Charoenkul.

Larson was the only player to take a game off the Fairfield standout.

At No. 2 singles Hope Gray slipped past Mt. Pleasant’s Quinn Whaley 8-2 in her first match and then rolled past Brigit Bianco of Maharishi 8-1 before running up against Fairfield’s Dayna Price and falling 8-6 for 2nd place.

Johnson and Ferrill received a bye in the first-round and then faced Maharishi’s Bridget Emmanuel and Bhavani Allison.

The two went back and forth through the first four games but ended up running away in the end for an 8-3 win to send them to the finals.

Keokuk’s Madison Etter and Allie Brookhart proved to be too much and took the title after a drawn out match, 8-6.

“Larissa and Kearnstyn had tough competition in the Keokuk team and hung in there really well. They are really developing strongly as a team,” Doherty said.

The team point totals for the day were Fort Madison 10, Fairfield and Keokuk tied with 8, West Burlington/Notre Dame had 7, Fairfield Maharishi had 4 and Mt. Pleasant finished with 3.

The Lady Hounds travel to Keokuk for a 4:30 dual meet on Monday.

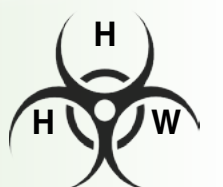
