Hounds send three to title matches

Settles, Kruses get 2nd as Hounds finish third at Saturday Invite

Danen Settles (285) all advanced to the title match on Saturday afternoon.

In the 285 lb bracket, Settles moved swiftly through pool wrestling on Friday and came out

as the top seed in the C pool. Settles won three matches all by fall with none lasting longer than 52 seconds.

On Saturday, Settles got wins over Owen Reed (14-5) of New

London and Gabe Hayes (11-1) of Louisa-Muscataine, both with pins in the second round setting up the title match with 2nd-ranked Josh Vis of

through life.

Whether Randolph pursues something more is completely a decision for him and his family, but based on the body of work, we could do a heck of a lot worse than this man representing our best interests at the state or even federal level.

Don't think his name isn't on radars in Des Moines and Washington.

And to councilman Chris Greenwald, you were entertaining and at times overboard, but we should take you at your word that your decisions and processing of city issues was done with the city's interests at heart. We all have different takes on what makes a city tick, and it's those differences that we must rely on to get us to the right place. Thank you for your service.

Incoming Mayor Matt Mohrfeld, and councilpersons Rebecca Bowker and Tyler Miller. It is our hope that you continue the open channels of communication that were prevalent with your predecessors. That communication and open discussion of city issues is paramount to discourse that will take us down the right path.

There's very little we believe is outside the purveyance of the public eye. Very little. You're governed by Iowa and federal code on what can take place "behind closed doors" so please be mindful of that going forward.

If you're eholding a meeting in whatever format, panels, exploratories, forums, etc., and the media wasn't asked to be a part of that, ask yourself why and see if your answers passes the test.

A couple other nuggets for our readers to unwrap over the holidays... keep an eye on news about an education center in the county that would increase the

focus on career educational training. Lots going on behind the scenes on that topic.

Keep an eye on what's going on with area school districts. Central Lee construction is set to start in June and last about 16 months. Fort Madison may put a vote on the ballot in March to add a levy to the Physical Plant and Equipment Levy Fund. This could amount to more than a dollar per \$1,000 assessed valuation on property in the district, but officials are saying under current budget projections, it won't increase the overall district tax levy.

With taxpayers barely defeating multiple general obligation bonds to build a new elementary, it's time to start fixing the buildings they want us to keep. A community committee is in the works to help deal with those issues.

City Manager David Varley has been filling in as the City Public Works Director since the departure of Larry Driscoll a couple months ago. With the projected constraints on the city budget, it will be interesting to see how that unfolds. Hand in hand with that item is possibly a new franchise tax to help beef up city coffers. Several meetings with city officials and business leaders have already taken place over that topic.

It's going to be an exciting end, or start, to the new decade, however you perceive it, but we'll be there to help keep you informed.

Oh...and is it just me or has there been a marked decrease in the number of bald eagles usually seen this time of year in the area. I saw one in a tree on the way to West Point but didn't have time to stop to take a photo... But that's Beside the Point.

Hounds take 3rd behind Kennedy, Hempstead

Cedar Rapids Kennedy.

Here's video action from Settles quarterfinal win over Reed.

Kennedy was able to score a takedown 25 seconds into the match and got the pin just over a minute later to take the title at 285.

Emmett Kruse received a couple byes to start pool play and then beat Raed Haque of Liberty High Wentzville for the 2nd time in a week. Kruse scored a pin over Haque last week in Missouri.

In bracket wrestling on Saturday, Kruse knocked off Van Buren's Bruce Claman with a pin at 2:40 and then scored a pin over Dubuque Hempstead Landon Reisen at 2:56.

In the title match, the freshman Bloodhound found himself up against Cedar Rapids Kennedy's Cael Long. Kruse was able to battle out of two near falls in the first two periods, but couldn't score a point as Long won by major decision 10-0 for the title.

At 120 lbs, Fort Madison's Owen Kruse also got two byes in pool wrestling on Friday and then pinned Solon's Kaden Lamm at 1:14. Kruse came out of Friday's action as the top seed in the B pool and faced off with Burlington's Brian Velazquez (3-12). Kruse quickly got Velazquez to the mat and with a pin in just :27. He then won 7-2 over Clear Creek-Amana's Jayden Massey to advance to the title match against the state's top 1A wrestler at 113 pounds in Marcel Lopez.

Lopez wrestled up a weight over the weekend at 120. The sophomore almost scored a pin with about 20 seconds left in the first round, but Kruse was able to fight it off 'til the whistle. Lopez would score takedowns in the second and third periods to set the major decision at 10-0.

Matt Steffensmeier (113 lbs), Will Larson (138 lbs), Mason Schau (152 lbs), Levi Lowney (195 lbs), and Diego Lozano (220 lbs) all earned 3rd place finishes over the weekend.

Cedar Rapids Kennedy won the meet with with 487 points followed by Hempstead with 421.5 and Fort Madison with 421. New London was 4th with 381 points and Solon rounded out the top five with 374.

Other top ten finishes for Fort Madison included Jakob McGowan 6th (145 lbs) Gavin Wiseman 7th (132 lbs), Ace Meierotto 9th (113), Logan Kearns 8th (132 lbs), Aiden Pennock 9th (138 lbs), and Dawson Hunt 9th (145 lbs).

HTC boys get win going into holiday break

MEDIAPOLIS – Seniors Matt Hellige and Blake Crabtree both scored a season-high 18 points as Holy Trinity Catholic downed Mediapolis 62-47 on the road Saturday afternoon.

The Crusaders held just a two-point lead at halftime after allowing the Bulldogs to come back from a six-point first quarter deficit to go into the locker room down 26-28.

But a stifling defense in the third quarter held Mediapolis to just two points while HTC ran up 17 points, led by Hellige's 11 in the quarter.

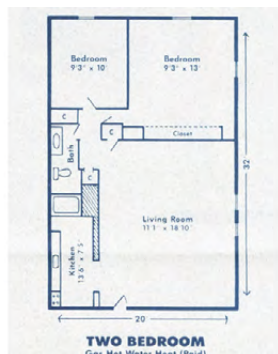
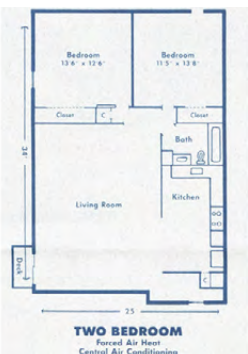
