#### Union calls out ISP on recent assault

FORT MADISON - An assault on a correctional officer at Iowa State Penitentiary last week has prompted local union officials to meet with prison officials again about ongoing staffing concerns.

On Friday, ISP officials released a statement that a correctional officer had been assaulted by an inmate with punches and then kicks once the officer was on the ground. The release indicated that other officers in the area responded quickly and got the situation under control. The officer was taken to Fort Madison Community Hospital for treatment was released.

On Thursday, the American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees (AFSCME) Council 61 released a statement that the Iowa Department of Corrections hadn't released the full scope of the incident.

In the statement, AFSC-ME Council 61 president Danny Homan wrote that according to eyewitnesses four inmates were involved in the assault. Homan stops short of saying there were involved in the attack on the officer, but instead tried to slow down other

Next up: East Union in Region 8, Class 1A finals with state tourney on the line



The game had an earlier start time of 6 p.m. East Union has won five in a row and knocked off Southeast Warren 3-1 in the bottom half of the regional bracket Thursday. Southeast Warren took five sets from the Eagles without a loss in the regular season.

But the Crusaders were busy jumping all over the Lady Warriors in all three sets of a

match that lasted less than an hour. Senior Mya Lawlor and Bailey Hellweg kick started the night pushing the Crusaders to a 5-1 lead and then missed her only serve of the night as Seymour's defense had trouble adjusting to Head

# State Patrol names other victim of Oct. 6 crash

LEE COUNTY - The
Iowa State Patrol has identified 26-year-old Taylor
Joseph Ruble of Afton as
the second victim in a fiery
two-vehicle collision west
of Fort Madison on Hwy.
2 Oct. 6. that claimed two
lives.

Vincent Seaver, 47 of Hamilton, Ill., was identified as the other victim of the Saturday morning tragedy. Seaver's name was released the day of the investigation, but Iowa State Patrol officials didn't release the name of Ruble pending further identification.

The ISP crash reporting website didn't update the report and only holds about eight days worth of reports so the name was never listed on a published report. ISP officials said this morning the name had been on the report for some time, but doesn't get updated on the website.

Pen City Current only inquired today about the second name at which time ISP officials in Mt. Pleasant indicated the name had been released.

The collision occurred on Highway 2 about three miles east of Fort Madison near Appleberry Orchard and 248th Avenue at 11:53 a.m.

#### DOC official says union leader politicizing staff assaults

officers from helping.

Homan said the offender threw six punches and kicked the at officers head 13 times. Homan also said on Thursday union members met with Warden Patty Wachtendorf over their concerns about the safety of staff at the facility. Details of that meeting were not released.

DOC Communications Director Cord Overton issued a statement via email to Pen City Current indicating the DOC was standing by its original statement, which he stating it was both accurate and timely.

"Our staff and their well-being is the highest priority of this department," Overton wrote. "After any assault on staff or other inmates, the department initiates an investigation into the incident. Any attempt to preemptively release the confidential details and evidence compiled as part of that investigation undermines the integrity of the investigation and the security of the correctional system. Attempts to politicize attacks on our staff, damages the overall security of our facilities and the safety of our staff."

The assault is the fifth attack on an officer since July 2017 and the third this year. On March 28, a correctional officer sustained minor injuries as a result of a head butt to the face from an inmate in restraints. In January, an correctional officer was attacked by an offender while a search was being done on the offender's cell. That officer received medical treatment at ISP and resumed his duties that day.





### HTC junior says agriculture may now be in his future

south regions.

"They don't have much water and it's made worse by infrastructural issues and the large amount that goes toward agriculture," Hellman said. " Another issue they have is they are very successful compared to most African countries because the oil and gas reserves are in that country. That's the only industry, so when that market dips, the whole country dips. To solve that economic issue, you have to solve the water problem."

He said he proposed in his paper that the country invest in technology that makes farming systems more water efficient. He said the proportion of water used in farming and the food that farming produces is off because farming doesn't produce near enough food to feed the country.

"With more efficient farming irrigation systems, you could switch some of the water usage back over to the people and that would be one way to help solve the problem," he said.

But Hellman said the real solution is going to result in a combination of many improvements including shoring up a leaky water supply system, fixing infrastructure, improving agricultural usage efficiency, and then incorporating such technologies as hydroponic and aeroponic crops that don't require as much water.

He said he applied and was accepted at the state level of the World Food Prize events, which is a one-day event at Iowa State University. Both invitations came from Hellman's efforts on his research paper. He said he had to expand a little to be accepted at the Global Youth Initiative, which concides with World Hunger Day, typically in October.

More than 300 students were invited to the Des Moines event, where the \$250,000 World Food Prize ceremony takes place. It was a three-day event and Hellman was the only student from HTC to make the trip and the first to go in many years, he said.

The event also included small group sessions with world ag leaders.
Hellman's group included Dr. Laura Merrick of Iowa State University,
Professor Linus Opara, of

the International Horticulture Congress, and Dr. Li Chemin of the Chinese Academy of Agriculture Science.

He said in the small groups the leaders led discussions on how the students' papers and propositions could be expanded and cultivated into deeper thoughts on solutions.

"My favorite part after the small groups was meeting everyone from across the world," he said. "This is the fist year I've been to the Global Youth Institute. Now having attended that, I have the opportunity to attend the Borlaug Ruan Institute, which is an opportunity for 24 or 25 kids that attended the Global Youth Institute. I'm in the process of applying for that internship now, which is two months at a research facility outside the U.S. That would be an awesome opportunity."

Hellman, who admits to not having any firm plans outside of high school, said the experience has now muddied up that process even more.

"Most of the students there were looking at careers in agriculture. I don't have any firm plans," he said. "This whole thing threw a wrench into it. I didn't have any particular interest in agriculture when I went, but now it has me maybe reconsidering a career in agriculture. Kind of made me think about things all over again."

He said the students in Des Moines represented 27 different states and 10 countries. Seventy of the students were from Iowa.

With Seymour's Acey Jellison serving, Box was all over the place in the middle of the court in a five-side rally and the senior ended the point with a mid-net kill to give a 24-9 lead. A defensive error from the Warriors ended the set.

Seymour jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the early going of the second set with a kill from Jellison to open the set and an attack that went long from Pothitakis. A War-

She said the defensive effort was crisp and there were some great plays, but they still need to work on some things.

"We played very well on defense considering when the ball was hit to us, but we can do better on the little things like picking up tips and things like that."

Freesmeier said this was the type of game the girls needed in preparation for the regional final Tuesday.


