New RC track open for racing in FM

Creator hopes to build racing interest in FM

FORT MADISON -Two new tracks behind the Fort Madison Christian Church are bringing radio-controlled vehicle enthusiasts a new place to show off their hobbies.

Fort Madison's Dan Horn, with some help from his church, has built two tracks behind the church at 1029 48th Street, one oval and one off-road, and is now offering racing opportunities for enthusiasts in and around Fort Madison.

Horn said he used to race in Mendon, Illinois and would help coordinate the races, but he said the owner of that facility closed the tracks and used the parcel of land to construct a building. So Horn said he scraped together some funds and purchased some of the equipment to build his own track.

He started construction at the beginning of the April with some help from family and friends and took about two months to create the offroad and oval tracks. The oval sets just to the south of the off-road track with a driver's stand constructed between the two for the drivers to stand on while racing.

simple misdemeanor. If convicted, White faces up to 2 years and 30 days in a state correctional facility.

Soice is charged with delivery of less than five grams of methamphetamine, a class C felony, possession of methamphetamine, a serious misdemeanor, maintaining a drug house, an aggravated misdemeanor, and possession of drug paraphernalia, a simple misdemeanor. If convicted, Soice faces up to 13 years and 30 days.

The arrests of these individuals stems from an investigation by the Lee County Narcotics Task Force into allegations that they were involved in the use and sale of illegal narcotics in the Lee County area. Two search warrants were served in connection to this case and items that support the charges were discovered.

The Lee County Attorney's Office, Keokuk Police Department, Fort Madison Police Department, Iowa Division of Narcotics Enforcement, and the Tactical Response Team comprised of Keokuk and Fort Madison Police Officers assisted the Lee County Narcotics Task Force in this investigation.

The defendants are presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

The Lee County Narcotics Task Force is funded in part by the U.S. Department of Justice and the funds administered by the Iowa Governor's Office of Drug Control Policy.
