## Thursday storm beats up on city

FORT MADISON - A storm that blew into the area at about 2:30 p.m. has city crews scrambling around Fort Madison cutting trees and picking up debris from heavy winds and lightning that accompanied downpours for about an hour.

Crews first responded on the east side of the town where a tree had fallen across Avenue E in the 200 block. City workers were also on the scene of a large tree that had fallen across the road in the 1500 block of Avenue E. Workers were out with bucket tractors and chain saws cutting that tree that was blocking traffic for about 45 minutes before crews got a lane open.

LeeComm dispatch operators were busy sending emergency crews throughout the county, including Denmark where a powerline had fallen in town.

Another large tree fell on a vehicle near Shopton park on Avenue O. Behind a home at the corner of 24th and F, another large tree fell to the east and took out power lines running across the property where Fort Madison firefighters stood by until Alliant Energy crews were on the way.

The Fort Madison Athletic boosters fireworks tent was damaged by the wind and sales at that location are temporarily suspended until the tent can be secured and dry product can be obtained. Efforts were underway Thursday night to have the tent up and running again by Friday.

On Tuesday, June 19th, the Crusaders split with New London 6-15 and 15-5.

In the first game loss Breanna Peterson and Kelli Meierotto each had two hits. Lora Mehmert, Rachel Menke, Kayla Box, Mary Hellige, Paige Wasielewski, Alesha Hellman and Reagan Holvoet all had one hit. Rachel Menke was the losing pitcher with Anna Sobczak and Natalie Randolph pitching in relief.

HTC won the second game 15-5 with Box leading the way at the plate with four hits. Hellige and Mehmert had three hits each, while Raquel Schneider, Sobczak and Wasielewski each had 2 hits. Hellige lead with four RBI, Schneider, Box, Mehmert each had two RBI, Sobczak, Wasielewski and Alexa Dingman each had one RBI. Hellige went the distance to pick up the win striking out four batters.

## Mild temperatures trigger better fishing in local watering holes

DES MOINES - The following is the weekly fishing report for Southeast Iowa from the Department of Natural Resources for the week ending July 4, 2018.

Big Hollow Lake Channel Catfish - Fair: Try down along the face of the dam. Bluegill - Fair: Work the 6 to 7 feet of water in the flooded timber. Iowa River (Columbus Junction to

Mississippi River) River levels dropped a

few inches earlier in the week, but are headed back up. Less than a foot below flood stage at Wapello.

Lake Belva Deer All the rains last week clouded the water; water clarity is about 3 feet. For most lakes that's not bad, but for Belva Deer that's muddy. Largemouth Bass - Good: Work the



shallow flooded timber in the early morning and late evenings. During the day, hit the deeper mounds at the upper end of the lake. Bluegill - Fair: Work the flooded trees in deeper water, especially over in the area near the beach. Channel Catfish - Fair: The face of the dam is a good place to start. Try also around the mounds at the upper end of the lake.

**Lake Darling** The water temperature is in the mid 80's this week. Water clarity is not bad (about 30 inches); last week's multiple downpours made it a bit muddy. Largemouth Bass - Fair: Early morning. Work the brush piles in shallow water in early morning before the bass move out in to deeper water for the day. Bluegill - Fair: You can still find pockets of bluegills in shallow water, especially around the flooded trees. Channel Catfish - Good: Work the rip rap around the island and down at the dam to find some nice catfish.

### Lost Grove Lake

Black Crappie - Good: Anglers are picking up crappies later in the day around the fishing piers, especially those on the north side of the lake. Bluegill - Good: Try the deeper water around the north side of the lake.

### Skunk River (Rose Hill to Coppock)

Water levels is just under bank full. Boating is not advised.

### Mississippi River Pool 19

Tailwater stage is 11.59 feet at Lock and Dam 18 above Burlington and is forecast to reach 13.4 feet by Monday. Flood stage is 10 feet. River stage at Burlington is 16.36 feet and flood stage is 15 feet. Fishing has been slow with the high and muddy water conditions. River stages are on the rise due to recent heavy rains. River stages are at or above flood stage. Current forecasts have river levels rising through the weekend. Some boat ramps are underwater due to the high water conditions. Main channel water temperature is around 75 degrees. We have not received much for fishing reports due to the high water conditions. #### **PUBLIC NOTICE ORDINANCE NO. D-48 AMENDING TITLE 6** - HEALTH & SANITA-TION **CHAPTER 3 – SOLID** WASTE DIVISION

Section 1: The following is a brief summary of Ordinance No. D-48, with changes to Title 6, Health and Sanitation, Chapter 3, Solid Waste Division:

1. Collection Requirements were changed to require residents to use a 65 or 95-gallon cart provided by the City.

2. Garbage is to be placed out not earlier than 4:00 p.m. the day before collection and no later than 6:00 a.m. the day of collection.

3. Allowance for the City to collect garbage for small commercial accounts which are churches, non-profits, or are located downtown.

4. Allowance provided for up to 40 extra gallons of trash to be picked up during the holiday week between Christmas and New Year's.

5. Setting requirements on the placement of carts for collection and storage and allowing the Public Works Director or his/her designee to approve an alternate location for placement of carts for collection or storage.

6. Requiring placement of the cart on collection day to be no more than three feet (3') from the public street or alley and requiring three feet (3') of clearance around the cart.

7. Setting requirements for usage of the cart.

8. Requiring all solid waste fees to be set by resolution of the City Council.

9. Setting a 15% penalty for delinquent inactive accounts and a 10% penalty on

delinquent active accounts.

10. Removal of recycling discount.

Friday (with the exception of scheduled holidays) from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and is also available at the City of Fort Madison website at fortmadison-ia.com.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 3. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or constitutional.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.


