## Boddicker makes final cut for judge's seat

Farmington's Westercamp and Burlington's Stensvaag join list for District 8B

KEOKUK - Three local attorneys have been selected from a pool of seven candidates to interview for 8th District Court Judge Gary Noneman's seat.

Of the three, one is current Lee County Attorney Clinton Boddicker, who won election in May defeating interim Lee County Attorney Ross Braden.

The other two attorneys are Jonathan Stensvaag, a public defender out of Burlington, and Steven Westercamp, a private practice attorney from Farmington.

The three made the cut after Monday open interviews took place at the

South Lee County Courthouse. Other attorneys vying for the seat included Kimberly Auge; a public defender in Fort Madison; Robert Reding, a Fort Madison attorney in private practice; Des Moines County Attorney Amy Beavers; and Lisa Schaefer, a private practice attorney in Burlington.

#### A nominating committee of Braden; 8th District Judge John Wright; Kendra Abfalter, a local attorney and public defender; and district residents Janet Fife-Lafrenz, Ron Welder, and John Dunlap. The three names were certified to District 8B Chief Judge Mary Ann Brown.

Final closed session interviews will take place on Dec. 8 and all five district judges will vote on the person to replace Noneman, who handles cases predominantly in south Lee County.

The judges in the district, which covers Des Moines, Henry, Lee, and Louisa counties, currently are Wright, Brown, Michael Schilling, Mark Kruse, and John Linn.

## Consultants ask county for more funds to repair south courthouse

Funds request tabled to next week



MONTROSE - Just four weeks after securing a \$96,000 change order for additional tuck-pointing at the South Lee County Courthouse, consultants overseeing the project were back in front of Lee County Supervisors again Tuesday for more funds in repairing the 19th century building.

FORT MADISON - A Fort Madison man was sentenced to the maximum 25 years in prison on Wednesday for his role in a 2016 armed robbery of a Fort Madison bank.

Kenneth Lee Lilly, 52, was sentenced by District Court Judge Mary Ann Brown to 25 years after being convicted of aiding and abetting 1st degree armed robbery in September.

The crime is a Class B Felony with a maximum sentence of 25 years. However Lilly would be eligible for parole after 17.5 years according to the 70% rule.

Lilly was arrested in October of 2017 and was accused of dropping Lafayette Antonio "Tony" Evans off in a maroon GMC Suburban at the then Fort Madison Bank & Trust's west branch on June 29 of 2016. Evidence produced at the September 2017 trial showed he then left the immediate area, traveling down Avenue L and stopping at McDonald's for a pop.

Lilly maintains that he was running errands in Fort Madison for most of the morning with his children in the Suburban, filled up with gas at Casey's, and then headed to Illinois. He maintained throughout the trial that he didn't drop off Evans at the bank, had little knowledge of his past trouble, and was trying to help Evans while he stayed at his home. Evans was shot dead after running from the bank with several bags of cash and taking shots at a Lee County deputy before being shot in the chest by Fort Madison Police officers. He was pronounced dead at the scene. The officers were cleared by the Iowa Attorney General's office of any wrongdoing in the shooting.

meeting, a small group of supervisors heard additional updates on the progress of the South Lee County Courthouse Tuesday, including a pending request for additional funds for tuck pointing, electrical, and drainage work.

John Hanson and Mid-

west Construction Consultants and Ed Soenke of Design Partners updated supervisors Rick Larkin, Ron Fedler, and Gary Folluo about progress in the bell tower at the courthouse, Supervisors Matt Pflug and Don Hunold were not in attendance. At a special meeting

earlier this month Hanson requested an additional \$96,000 to continue tuck-pointing work on the courthouse that was originally built in the 1800s. That increase bumped original estimates of \$311,000 closer to \$420,000. A \$13,000 increase had been approved

back in October.

Hanson told the board that as plaster is removed crews from E & H Restoration are finding additional areas that need to be taken care of. Additionally, Hanson said there have been some drainage issues

# FM teen pleads guilty to robbery

FORT MADISON - A 17-year-old Fort Madison boy pleaded guilty on Friday to armed robbery in connection with the robbery of a Fort Madison convenience store in January.

Dameyon Virgil, pled guilty in North Lee County court on Wednesday to 2nd degree robbery in front of District Judge Mary Ann Brown. Virgil was tried as an adult in the case after a request to move to juvenile court was denied. Under Iowa Code 2nd degree robbery is a Class C felony, punishable by up to 10 years in prison and a \$10,000 fine.

Assistant Lee County Attorney Ross Braden, who prosecuted the case, said since the case was handled in adult court, the state will be looking for prison time for Virgil. However because Virgil still is a juvenile, state law allows for probation in lieu of the prison sentence.

The charges were the result of a Jan. 7th armed robbery at Garner Oil.

Virgil is also facing in sentencing on Dec. 11 stemming from a conviction on a charge of unauthorized possession of offensive weapons, a case also being handled in adult court in Burlington. Virgil is still being held in the Lee County Jail. A \$25,000 10% allowed bond was set by Associate District Judge Ty Rogers on Nov. 3. Sentencing was set for Jan. 12.

Another Fort Madison man, Noah Gasaway, 18, has also been charged in the case. Gasaway was arrested by Fort Madison police on Nov. 1 and charged with first-degree robbery. He is in custody in the Lee County Jail on a \$100,000 bond. The case is scheduled for a bond review on Dec. 1.



along the walls and some electrical issues that need to be cleaned up as well.

"There's some flashing that has deteriorated and it's allowing drainage to escape from a collection pan and run down the walls and that's causing some problems so we need to get in there and fix that pipe," Hanson told the board.

He said approximately 1,500 square feet of additional brick would need tuck pointed but he said he would get a more firm number and cost for the next supervisors' meeting. Fedler motioned that the additional funding request be tabled until all the supervisors were in attendance. Hanson said the contract is set at 15/

foot for tuck-pointing which would result in an additional \$22,500.

"I got a phone call from Don Hunold and he asked that we table any additional requests for funding until he returns and he's indicated he will be back next week," Fedler said. Hunold has been out with health-related issues.

Folluo drew the ire of Fedler when Folluo said even with the expanded

costs of the repairs, it's still cheaper than the \$20 million for a new courthouse.

"It wasn't \$20 million it was \$8 million," Fedler said. "You need to make sure you have your figures right. This is the same scare tactic you used before."

Folluo said he favored tabling the motion but wanted Hanson to bring back more accurate numbers as to the increased cost of repairs. Folluo was visibly upset at the added cost of the repairs and said he was concerned that there wouldn't be funds remaining in the maintenance for the rest of the building, not to mention north Lee County's courthouse.

Fedler, too, was exasperated with the continued requests for additional funds.

"What I know John and Ed,... I know this is starting to turn into a lot more than was told to the public," Fedler said. "Ed, I have your first survey of the south courthouse for tuck pointing and the clock tower with a 10-year warranty we were looking at \$90,000. We are now at \$441,000 and a lot of the taxpayers in my district say they wish they would have known that before the vote was held last year on what to do. They were under the understanding that it wasn't going to cost

#### this much."

Fedler said he used to be a brick layer when he was younger and said with the amount of cracking going on in the courthouse, they're going to continue to have problems.

He said the county had \$800,000 built up in building maintenance funds, and before the repairs started they had about \$460,000 left in the fund.

"Now we are just over \$100,000 and I'm concerned about how much money we're spending

and if we'll have enough to take care of the other buildings," Fedler said.

Hanson said the interior tuck-pointing should help shore everything up when coupled with the exterior repairs currently underway. He said tuck pointing should be good for at least 15 years.

In other action, • the board voted 3-0 to approve hiring of two candidates Lee County Sheriff Stacy Weber had submitted for full-time correctional officers at the Lee County Jail.
