# Keokuk woman murdered outside mall

24-year-old man in custody after stabbing woman several times in mall parking lot

KEOKUK – A Keokuk murder Tuesday was a result of domestic argument that turned tragic.

Adam Golden McCain, 24 of Keokuk, was arrested by Lee County Sheriff's deputies Tuesday evening after LeeComm dispatchers sent Keokuk Police to the River City Mall for an injured woman, Calove Sackman of Keokuk

McCain was allegedly identified to a witness by Sackman, who had suffered multiple stab wounds to the torso area, and eventually died from those injuries at UnityPoint Hospital in Keokuk Tuesday night.

According to the complaint

in the 300 block of Main Street.

on Wednesday, McCain and Sackman, had been in a long-term relationship and were arguing when Sackman jumped from McCain's vehicle in the mall parking lot



After being taken into custody, McCain allegedly told authorities that he was driving Sackman around in his vehicle and became upset with her and then she jumped from the vehicle, according the complaint information.

McCain then got out of the vehicle and allegedly stabbed Sackman once and she was able to get away from him. But then he got back into his vehicle drove over to her and stabbed her repeatedly before leaving the scene.

Lee County Sheriff Stacy Weber said deputies came across McCain's vehicle on the side of the road after they were informed a possible hit and run in the area

Andy Mehmert, a 12year old at HTC wanted to look at the impact of certain levels of manure on corn growth as well as how planting with manure would impact water runoff.

and the vehicle was attempting to leave the city.

"Deputies were told of a hit-and-run leaving the city and went to the area of the call. They found his vehicle damaged and parked along the highway," Weber said.

He said in the process of investigating the hit-and-run LeeComm dispatchers put together that the man they had detained in the hit and run, could be the same person wanted in connection with the stabbing.

"LeeComm did a good job of putting that information together and making that connection," he said.

Lee County Attorney Ross Braden said District Judge Ty Rogers has set bond at \$1 million cash. McCain was booked into the Lee County Jail at about 1 a.m. Wednesday morning and remains in custody. He is facing a charge of murder in the first degree, a Class A felony carrying a penalty of lifetime imprisonment.



BURLINGTON – Fort Madison senior Logan Rashid put up 26 points in a losing effort Monday night as the Fort Madison boys basketball team fell to Burlington 67-61 Monday night.

Rashid was a perfect 12-of-12 from the free throw line in the win, but Fort Madison suffered through a final minute where the Grayhounds went on a 7-0 run to win the game.

Fort Madison trailed by as much as 11 in the first quarter, but battled back to knot the score at 28 with three minutes left in the first half. Burlington then went on a 10-4 run to close out the half and take a 38-32 lead into the locker room.

The Grayhounds hit a three pointer to open the scoring in the second half and went up 41-32, but Fort Madison would put together a 7-2 run of their own that spanned three minutes to cut the lead to four at 43-39.

The Grayhounds would then hold leads ranging from three to seven points until the final two minutes where the Bloodhounds cut the lead to 61-58 and then 61-60 with under a minute to play before the BHS shut the Hounds down until the buzzer.

Junior Jayden Fedler had 13 points on the night and freshman Dayton Davis scored 12 in the loss. Junior Parker Denning added four, while senior Brandon Keester hit a 3-ball in the third quarter for his only







runoff as well as determining the benefit to the corn.

"I wanted to find out which amount of manure would be the best on the corn," Mehmert said.

Mary Kate Bendlage, a 7th grader at HTC did a study on whether home-made honey or store bought honey was healthier for consumers.

Bendlage said she has a beehive at home and works it with her grandfather.

"We got it going about two years and we thought if we did this we'd have more fun and get to spend more time together so we started it.

She said they feed the bees sugar water but it has a it's downside.

"I found out pretty quickly that if you don't suit up properly you're gonna get stung,"

She said she's only been stung a few times, but it's fun to work on the hive with her grandfather.

She said by boiling the honey the homemade honey at 400 degrees as a form a pasteurization, helps it becomes a better product in terms of antioxidant bacteria. She tracked the impact of the different honeys on an apple and then tracked the results with an enzyme table.
