Lee County Sheriff off to busy start

MONTROSE - With just 150 days under his belt, at least four accidental deaths, and a homicide, Lee County Sheriff Stacy Weber says the whole county, figuratively and literally, needs to just slow down.

In a conversation following Monday's regular Lee County Board of Supervisors meeting, Weber talked about what being sheriff has been like since his election in November.

"I think the one thing that I'm most proud of, and this isn't meant to be selfish sentiment, but I'm really proud of the morale of this department."

Weber can usually be seen in a freshly pressed uniform, carrying a cold can of Coke, and always offers a firm handshake, a smile, and a business card emblazoned with his campaign slogan.

"Honest, Respectful Protection."

Weber said his first day in office set the tone. He was upset at his swearing in because one of his mentors, Buck Jones, didn't make the swearing in because Weber had given him the wrong location.

"That was a big deal to me. I wanted him there when that happened." Weber then said he scheduled a staff meeting and talked about his approach to the public and law enforcement. He said

he told them he wanted a reputation of honesty and respect.

"Even if it hurts the case, we're gonna be honest first and foremost," he said. "We're gonna treat every-

one with respect whether it's a traffic stop or a more serious crime."

But the meeting was cut a little short by a two-car head on collision on Hwy 2. And he was off and running.

"I didn't even have a coat

yet, Weber said. "I didn't even have a uniform that fit."

But as the day would go, the coat would be more important. Later in the evening, Weber and other Lee County Sheriff's deputies were called to the Montrose riverfront where two local fisherman fell into an icy river after their boat capsized. Again, day one.

"I came home that night and never felt more helpless. We couldn't do more than we wanted because we would have risked other lives on a very dangerous river."

Both men were recovered later in the spring, both accidental drowning victims.

In the weeks to come, a body would be discovered in Indian Path Park just south of the Des Moines/Lee County Line on Hwy 61, a confirmed homicide. In April, a vehicle

Google phishing scam hits locally

FORT MADISON - It started locally with an email from FMHS principal Greg Smith, but it turned out to be a worldwide phishing scam.

Fort Madison School District sent an out an announcement regarding an email attack originating from school administration and teacher accounts.

At the same time, Google was issuing a statement regarding the phishing scam and said they were looking into the matter.

According to the school's information technology Director Sebastian Seifert instructed locals to not authen-

ticate Google Doc emails.

"There is a phishing email going around. Do NOT authenticate third party apps to access your Google drive and offline contacts.

You must change your password and revoke rights to third party apps if you have authenticated the most recent phishing attack.

To revoke third party access please visit this site: <https://myaccount.google.com/permissions>.

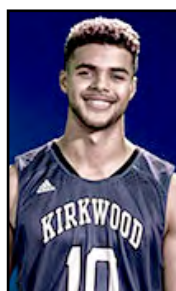
If you opened the email and tried to access the Google doc you need to change your password ASAP. You should also consider signing up for

Wentzien's growth yields opportunities

CEDAR RAPIDS - Just over three years ago Miles Wentzien was playing in a substate game in Muscatine and had the ball with six seconds left and his team down by two points in overtime.

The All-State Bloodhound took an inbound pass at the opposite end of the court and worked his way through a melee of red-jersied boys from Williamsburg, and pushed his way to the corner of the right free throw line. Everyone in the building, including the nine others on the court, were convinced Wentzien would find a shot. So much so, the senior was mobbed at that point. He could have forced a shot, and may have gotten the foul call, but he looked for a teammate.

He found Camden Chrisman who had an open-look, but the shot was partially deflected and the Hounds

were done. But it was the mindset of a senior who knew there was a chance he may get a call, but had the maturity to realize someone else may have a better shot. A very unselfish play that set a tone for a man now playing his favorite game and moving to the next level.

The sophomore from Kirkwood College in Cedar Rapids, an NJCAA Div. II school, has entertained offers from more than 20 NCAA schools over the past six months. He said he's narrowed his choices to one D-I school and a couple of D-II schools carrying with him two more years of eligibility.

"I really don't know what's next for me," Wentzien said. "Right now I have one D-I offer from American and two D-II offers at Winona State and Minnesota State-Moorhead. They just seem to be the right fit for me. I get along with the coaches and what the campuses have to offer. I just haven't made up my mind yet. I don't know much about Moorhead. I'm heading up there this weekend to take a look at that campus."

After leading the Bloodhounds, the Fort Madison native was named to the Des Moines Register Class

3A 2nd team All-State and quickly signed with Missouri Western. Wentzien said he wasn't ready for the college game and didn't heed the advice of those around him.

"I think, out of high school, I wasn't ready for the college game," he said Wednesday. "Everyone said there was a huge difference in the college game and I didn't understand that difference. After playing a few more years, I'm more comfortable. Missouri Western wasn't the best fit for me and it wasn't the best place to spend all four years."

So Wentzien said goodbye to Saint Joseph, Mo., and headed back to Iowa where he found coach Taylor Blum and a comfortable program that has helped him find how his skills can be honed, while developing a bigger sense of team. A feat not lost on a high school kid who dished off to teammate with the game on the line, when more than 2,000 people thought he was going to take the shot.

With Kirkwood, Wentzien said he found a coach and a team that worked... as well as success, as the 6'3" guard was named 1st Team All-Region and 1st Team All-American for the past season.

The Eagles made a run

at the NJCAA Div. II title losing to eventual tournament champion Southwestern (IA) in the region finals. Wentzien finished the season averaging close to 15 points per game, shooting 49% from the field including 35% from the 3-point arc and a spicy 90.2% from the free throw line, good enough for 4th overall in the nation at that level, according to the NJCAA website.

"I've had a lot of people help me get where I'm at as far as basketball on the court. Coach Taylor Blum always had time for me with rebounding... putting me through drills. I've just had lots of good advice and opportunities from people to get to Kirkwood and have this kind of success."

He said it's always great to see locals from Fort Madison come to Kirkwood and watch him play.

"That's awesome and I really appreciate the support. Fort Madison has always given me a lot of love."

His growth as a player and finding a place where he's more focused on his goals has been a labor of personal drive, introspection, and determination. The 1st semester Academic All-American says it required admitting to his weaknesses and seeing how his mindset to that

development has brought about more confidence in his game.

"I think I've just critiqued everything I was ok at in high school and I'm better at now," he said. "And now a more overall mindset of what the team needs...when to score... when to pass and be aggressive and understand the game better and make the right reads. I can certainly still work on those. I'm not perfect by any means."

Wentzien will receive his Associate of Arts in business from Kirkwood at the end of this term. But he said his goal has always been to play in the NBA and/or overseas

and it's not something he's ever thought of deviating from.

"No. I have always had a dream to play in the NBA or overseas and that's my goal, but I knew I had to play college and now I'm really enjoying that."

This summer is still up in there for Wentzien who also excelled in baseball and golf while at Fort Madison. He said his plans will be dictated by what school's offer he accepts.

"If I go to American, I will have to be out there in June. There's a league out there with some professionals in it," he said. "The other two schools I could probably come back

home and will probably play in the PrimeTime League out of Iowa City."

The league features six teams filled with current Iowa collegiate players and other players from around the state and overseas. Wentzien said the league is more fun than work now. In 2016 he played with former Hawkeye Peter Jok on the LL Pelling/ Comfort Care Medicare team.

"It's more fun for me now. My first two years it helped me prepare for college, but now you get to work on your moves. You can only move against a cone so many times."

1. ask someone next to you if they received an email from you
2. change your password just in case"

Sam Boyer from C.U.R.E. Business Solutions said the phishing attack is more wide spread.

"All of our customers are getting it. Anyone who uses Google apps can be the sender, mostly schools because they all use it. Burlington Notre Dame's families got hit hard, but I know people that I sent Google docs too got it as well, its worldwide. Google has not blocked the scam so if people click the link they get it," Boyer said.

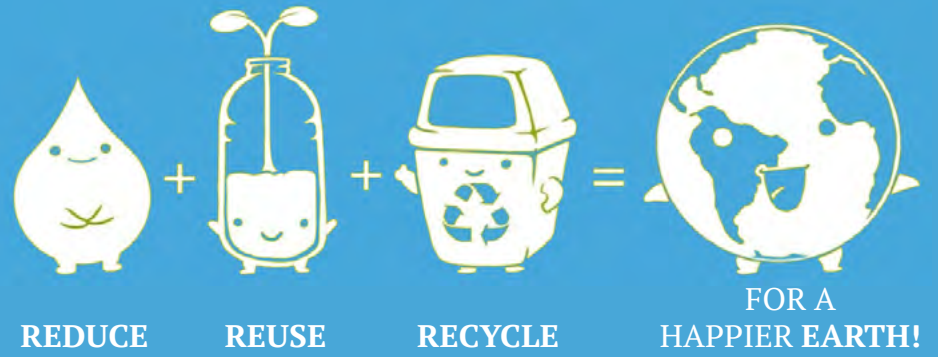

K-9 program, work-release early highlights

was pulled from the Des Moines River south of Keokuk, and two weeks ago a farmer was killed when a vehicle struck the back of his tractor ejecting him from the seat and onto the concrete.

All this within 150 days of taking his position.

As part of his election campaign Weber said he wanted to add a K-9 unit to the department and wanted to get more deputies on the road to pull more criminals off the street.

The jail population is up

an average 15-20 offenders per day with as many as 92 this past weekend, a dilemma that has eaten up the entire food account and has required an amendment to the Lee County budget to infuse funds back into the program.

Weber said repeatedly at campaign stops and in debates that he was going to focus on the "two percent that don't want to behave".

His K-9 unit lands in the country this week and heads to Arkansas for 4-weeks of training before heading to Fort Dodge for

4-more weeks of training with his handler. The county response to the addition of the K-9 unit has been sufficient enough to raise the initial funds needed to get the program up and running.

A new work-release program has offenders paying \$10/day to go to work with a bracelet on that tracks their whereabouts. According to Weber, the program is working and the incidents of offenders wandering off the work site has been drastically reduced.

So what's the future look like.

Weber said one of his main focuses is to get people to slow down on county roadways. Weber got a bit emotional when talking about the loss of life in the county just since his election.

"I want to get that one on one connection with people," he said. "I want them to know that it's our job to keep them safe, but we just have to slow down."

He's also focusing on building the reserve department and is currently reviewing interviews with the next group of reserve

candidates.

"They'll be out there in one of these uniforms and they'll be trained to handle issues. I want as many deputies on the street as we can get, and I want to be able to staff our detectives to solve crimes."

But it's his people that he focuses on heaviest. Weber said he insists that the entire department be treated, and conduct themselves, with respect. Be it from offenders and fellow staff.

"It's the image we have with the county that tells me if we're doing our job. We treat our offenders with respect, but they will

respect us, as well. There are few words we don't allow here in our jail, and if they use them, they know there are consequences."

But Weber's the first to say he's not the sharpest pencil in the box and moves credit for the successes of the department to his staff.

"I've surrounded myself with some really intelligent people. Chief Deputy Will Conlee, Craig Burch, and our jail administrator John Canida, are all top-notch professionals. I've yet to see a situation that they couldn't handle on their own."
