Old Fort genealogy group hosts FamilySearch

FORT MADISON - Tracing your family tree has become a lot easier since more genealogical records have become available online. The largest collection of these is at FamilySearch with more than 6.3 billion records.

The Old Fort Genealogical Society will host Chuck and Fran Moulton from the Nauvoo FamilySearch Center on Monday, April 23 at 7pm at the Fort Madison Public Library. The Moultons will give a presentation about recent changes at the local center and a FamilySearch how-to for people curious about using it successfully to trace their own family history.

FamilySearch recently discontinued an 80-year-old circulation service that provided researchers an inexpensive microfilm and microfiche rental system. It has been replaced with a program to digitize billions of the world's historic records, making them almost entirely accessible online and at no cost.

- The Fort Madison Bloodhound boys soccer team edged Keokuk in a sudden victory session Tuesday night, 4-3.

Hound goalie Carson Donaldson was able to block a Keokuk penalty kick in the extra session to help seal the win. The Hounds outscored the Chiefs 3-2 in the penalty kick session after being tied 3-3 at the end of regulation.

The Hounds' Brody Rung scored the first goal for Fort Madison at the 27:30 mark of the first half on an assist by Chris Kistner. Rung got free again at the 34:40 mark of the first half on a pass by Miguel Trejo. The Hounds went up 3-0 when Austin Sexton took a ball from Kistner and found the back of the net with just 3:30 left in the first half.

Keokuk responded with their first goal of the night 30 seconds later, making the score 3-1 at the half.

The Chiefs scored again just 2:30 into the second half when a ball got by Donaldson on a penalty kick. At the 17:00 minute mark Keokuk tied up the game and neither team scored again in regulation, or the two 10-minute OT sessions, forcing

Fort Madison's top two seeds, Katie Larson and Miho Shirai, were both defeated 0-8 with Larson going to down to Fairfield's freshman phenom Yana Gaskell. Gaskell has yet to drop a game for the undefeated Trojans this year.

Shirai fell to Anatta Charoenkul who also is yet to lose a game this year.

"Their one and two spots are going to be tough for anyone to beat, so Katie and Miho had nothing to lose and just tried new things," Head Coach Amy Doherty said. At No. 3 singles, Johnson dropped Hermela Gebremariam 8-6, who was unbeated playing at No. 4 all season.






