Helping Hands for Harvey becomes a Puerto Rican aid effort

Texas aid workers told family they didn't want the load

FORT MADISON - The efforts of a Fort Madison High School student that garnered regional and statewide attention almost ended with a thud last week.

Lexi Miller, a student at Fort Madison High School, and her family started working back in August to collect donations for the Texas coast ravaged by Hurricane Harvey, in an effort dubbed Helping Hands for Harvey. The community and region rallied behind Miller and her parents Amy and Jimmie Hayes with collections being taken at the schools, area businesses and local events.

A Ruan semi-trailer was loaded with the goods on Tuesday afternoon with the help of about 15 volunteers. A house that was literally being used as a storage facility was unloaded in about two hours and then hauled down to the truck waiting in the former Sheaffer Pen parking lot.

But up until this week, the 3/4 of semi-trailer had no place to go. The groups that Miller and her mother had contacted to receive the goods no longer could accept them. Hayes said she was shocked and was afraid the effort may have tragically been wasted.

Miller said her mother started making calls and found out the places the donations were supposed to be going no longer were accepting them.

"I was kind of upset because we could have called them earlier but we waited longer to get more. I'm just glad she found someone," Miller said on Tuesday afternoon while loading the trucks.

"I just don't think they were interested any more at all. They said something about not being able to take the clothing because of possible health issues, but they wouldn't take any of the stuff."


But in the end she said it all is working out even better because now more people in different places will be able to benefit from the community's efforts.

FORT MADISON - The Lee County Sheriff is asking Lee County residents for help in locating a suspect in a non-injury shooting that took place Friday just north of Fort Madison near 330th Avenue.

The suspect's name is Tourmaria Resean Baynes, whose last known address was 1409 Avenue F in Fort Madison. Baynes is considered armed and dangerous.

A description provided by the sheriff's department lists him as a 5,11" black male who goes by the nickname or alias "Whammy".

He has brown eyes and black hair and weights approximately 165 pounds. He was born in Pasadena, California.

He has outstanding warrants for attempted murder and intimidation with a dangerous weapon in connection with the Friday shooting.

Lee County Sheriff Stacy Weber said a bullet was pulled from a vehicle that had been shot on Friday and local law enforcement, including the Fort Madison police, tried to locate a vehicle fitting a description given by the motorist whose vehicle had been shot at. No

other information on the shooting has been released. Anyone with information on Baynes' whereabouts should call the Lee County Sheriff's office at 319-372-1152 or 911 or contact Lee County Crime Stoppers at 800-392-8900. A reward may be available through Crime Stoppers for information leading to the arrest and conviction of Baynes.

•Check out IHAP maps and locations, where private landowners open their land to public hunting. Or visit the Iowa Hunting Atlas for all of Iowa's public hunting areas.

•Blaze orange -- wear at least on of the following with 50 percent or more solid blaze orange: hat, cap, vest, coat, jacket, sweatshirt, shirt or coveralls.

- •Purchase your hunting license and habitat fee, online from the DNR's license sales website, or from any license retailer.
 - •Have fun and be safe!

AFSCME head claims victory in recertification election

DES MOINES – AFSCME Council 61 President Danny Homan issued the following statement regarding the results of the October recertification elections:

"After over 24 hours of waiting for election results, I am proud to share that 100% of AFSCME-covered employees voted to retain their union, but because of a rigged law and an alleged voided ballot, we lost one bargaining unit of four employees by a single vote. This sweeping victory confirms what we've known since the gutting of collective bargaining rights in February: that unionized employees, both members and non-members, value their voice in the workplace and reject the actions of Kim Reynolds and legislative Republicans who turned their backs on working Iowans in February. I am confident that workers will once again claim victory in the November 2018 election when those politicians who stabbed them in the back are sent packing.

"While this process was unnecessarily challenging and unfair at every turn, I am immensely proud of our members and leaders who stepped up to earn every last vote. We worked hard to communicate the rigged system put in place to each and every eligible voter, and that work paid off. I congratulate the hardworking public employees who voted to recertify; this victory is all theirs."







Donations headed to Puerto Rico

forts people were putting into the project would go unrealized. When the project first started and Miller's family had found a place to deliver the goods, they told them it would be mid-October before the donations would be sent down, so she was surprised when she called to let them know they were coming and they were told they didn't want them anymore.

"I called down to groups we started with and they said they didn't need the donations anymore. And I was just floored. Floored. So I started calling churches and other places down there and nobody wanted the stuff."

Hayes then called a friend she had met when she lived in Florida in the military and a name popped up of someone who may be able to take the supplies. Hayes said her friend had heard of a businessman who was looking to fly goods into Puerto Rico.

"I told her that I had a whole house full and said, "Do you want it?" She said 'Sure, when can you get it here, and this was on

Friday."

Hayes said she immediately contacted Ruan Trucking, where her husband works, and they said they could get a truck down to Fort Madison on Tuesday.

"The community was so gracious to donate all this stuff and now it's like, nobody wants it. I was even contacting the islands where the eye of Harvey went and no one wanted it," Hayes said.

"I know Puerto Rico only has about 20 percent of the people with electricity back on. There's this business man down there, and I've never met the guy, but he has his own business and a jet and all this stuff is going into a hangar and he's gonna have it flown into Puerto Rico."

Hayes said she was ready to start contacting local shelters and other places who may need these types of donations.

Miller said she was very thankful for all the community did to help with the effort and had no idea the project would generate this kind of support.

"My mom helped me
